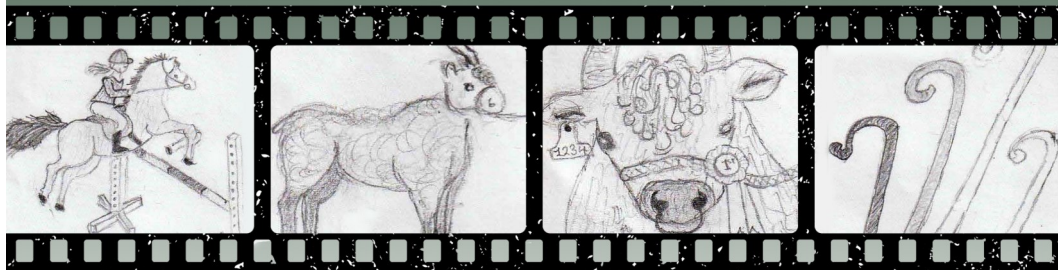

Pastoral Letter - Rev^d Harry Welch

Dear Friends,

I confess to having more than a passing interest in politics, both here in the UK and in the USA. Both governments have been in a state of upheaval with the UK repeatedly changing leader and the USA having a unique presence in the Oval Office in Donald Trump; such is the fruit of democracy.

In conversation, I bemoan the fact that there seems to be a dearth of statesmen and women in politics today. By this I mean seasoned politicians with the experience and expertise to influence and guide through important decisions for the good of the country; decisions that would enhance the common good, not just the ego or pockets of the few.

As a Christian I pray for our country and its politicians. I also take as a guide the Anglican Prayer Diary which widens the scope of prayer to include anywhere there is an Anglican Christian presence in the world. This Prayer Diary is published on our diocesan website and is available to consult or download for private use. I often look up those mentioned to see if I can find out something specific to pray over. Recently I looked up the Anglican Church of Melanesia website. They too have experienced political change and turmoil. The Bishop, The Rt Rev Leonard Dawea, called upon the clergy and all Christians to 'rise up'. This not in armed conflict but in spiritual growth and maturity and he gave some goals for the believers to aim for as follows:

"We ought to rise:

From	Hatred	to	Love
	Division	to	Unity
	Corruption	to	Integrity
	Selfishness	to	Service
	Fear	to	Faith
	Complacency	to	Renewed Discipleship

This would be good starting point for any Christian wishing to pray for politicians, for such qualities, nurtured in the heart, will produce maturity and wisdom.

But this is not a journey just for politicians: every Christian should 'rise up' where, anywhere in their Christian life they, under self-assessment, find themselves harbouring more of the traits in the left-hand column than the right.

Let us pray for all politicians, and for ourselves as we rely on God to guide us through these unusual times. Even so, come Lord Jesus.

Around the Parishes: Colton

Colton Parish Council News September 2026

It was great to meet so many people at Rusland Show. We really appreciate all your comments and feedback.



A few common issues continue to come up; concerns about the state of local roads, potholes, verges, litter and inconsiderate parking in popular tourist places.

As always, Colton Parish Council is working with partners, including the Westmorland & Furness Council's Highways Department and our local community policy officer to ensure that local problems are brought to the attention of the appropriate authorities. We also work closely with Councillor Suzanne Pender to help her put our concerns on Westmorland & Furness Council's agenda.

There are some things we can all do to help:

- For issues on lanes and minor roads in the Colton Parish area you can email us on clerk@coltonparishcouncil.gov.uk and we will assess if the Parish Lengthsman can tackle the problem. If not, we'll refer it to Westmorland & Furness Council.

When it comes to verges, both Highways and the Parish Council take the same view; safety is the priority, so where overgrown verges are a potential hazard, or causing other problems, they will be cut back, but if this is not the case, they will be managed to support wildlife and biodiversity. Sometimes this involves cutting back the growth closest to the road but leaving a strip uncut. This means they might look 'untidy' to human eyes, but they are playing an essential part in boosting nature recovery.

Please note, highways are only responsible for overhanging trees growing on the verges themselves, but if the trees or hedges are growing from an adjacent field or garden, they are the responsibility of the landowner. You can report them, but we have limited powers to do anything. If you are a landowner, please monitor trees and hedges on your property that may be affecting road users and arrange to have them cut back.

Emergency Planning

Colton Parish Council is working across the patch to help build community resilience in case of emergency. Whether we're faced with weather events, power cuts, fire, health or environmental crises, the same principles apply:

When there is an immediate risk to life, or a crime is taking place, call the emergency services on 999 first.

For all other scenarios, do your best to be prepared in advance. Over the coming months we will be delivering an emergency planning leaflet to help you do this.

Key points include:

Prepare your family by making sure you all have all the contact numbers you need; make a plan for getting everyone out of your home safely if needed; gather essentials including phone charging packs and medications and consider keeping them stored in a bag in case you need to evacuate in a hurry; keep your important documents stored in a safe place that is easy to access, in or close to your grab bag.

If anyone in your household has a long-term health condition or disability, is a young child or over the state pension age, register on the Priority Services register with the utility suppliers see <https://www.thepsr.co.uk/>

Join your local community WhatsApp group to keep up to date with communications. If there isn't one, consider setting a group up. The Parish Council can help you find out about your local group and who your 'Community Champion' is or we can help you get started. Please get in touch.

Torver Parish Council

It may seem a little strange for Torver Parish Council to be thinking about the problems of flooding during an extended period of drought to rival the infamous summer of 1976. However, the rains will surely return and once again we will look up to the High Common and wonder just how much water is heading our way. In recent

years there has been a suspicion that the flow down from Wide Close has been increasing during very heavy rainfall, resulting in the risk of flooding in the village centre. The parish council have carried out surveys and assessments of the many paths that water finds its way down through the village, and now we also have a remote camera installed to provide live video information from up on the fell. Before the winter, we also hope to have a village rain-gauge to provide local rainfall information which can then be viewed on our parish council website.

At our next public meeting Torver Parish Council will be deciding on expenditure which would benefit our village the most. There have been suggestions of a speed indicator sign, repair or replacement of the noticeboard, water testing of the beck, bus shelter window repairs, hedgehog signs and many more ideas. We very much welcome suggestions from parishioners about what their priorities are and how they would like community funds to be spent.

Coniston Surgery

The Coniston Patient Group met to review the first month of the new surgery arrangement as a satellite to Central Lakes Medical Group (CLMG) based in Ambleside, within Cumbria Health a social enterprise company.

In general the transition seems to have gone smoothly with only a few hiccups although some patients have had difficulty accessing the surgery by phone for repeat prescriptions. Andy Woodward, the practice manager for the combined practice confirmed that Dr Anna Maughan has been at the surgery Monday and Tuesday and Advanced Clinical Practitioner Helen Tirvengardum on Friday. He also confirmed that all the current patients records have now been transferred to the Ambleside system, which will simplify the booking of appointments etc.

One issue was the taking of blood samples which cannot be done routinely at the surgery as there is only one examination room, so options are offered elsewhere within the group. They can be done if necessary on a full appointment, but that is not ideal as it uses up appointments. There is ongoing work on confirming a replacement surgery which would solve the blood test problem and we will update as soon as possible.

The CLMG catchment area has been extended to include Coniston and discussions with the NHS have now also included Torver in the catchment area. Patients in Torver should apply to register via Ambleside.

One of the advantages of being linked to Ambleside is that we will benefit from additional expertise:

- A wider clinical team including GPs ACP, roaming paramedics, care coordinators, and GP's with special interests
- Additional appointments on other sites when Coniston is closed
- Continuity of care with multidisciplinary Team

- Place them on a balcony, terrace, shed roof or outdoor space
- Connect the plug-in solar inverter into a standard 3 pin socket
- Start generating your own electricity, which you can use instantly to power your home – so you don't need to buy as much electricity from the grid'

'The government has greenlit some changes to wiring regulations, which'll mean that systems under 800W can plug safely into domestic sockets without needing an electrician. This is expected to go live from summer 2026. And retailers such as Lidl are already preparing to bring plug-in solar panels to the UK.'

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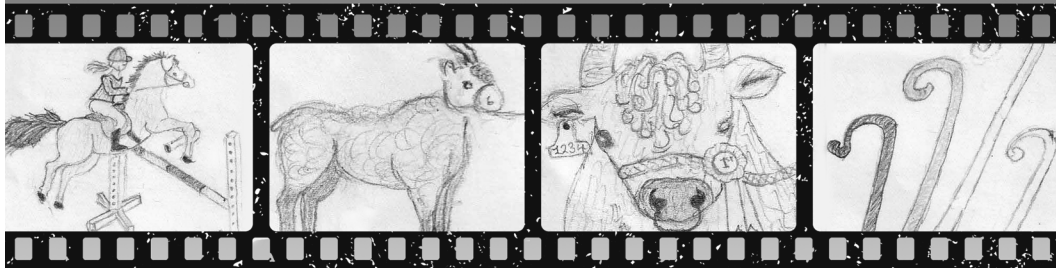

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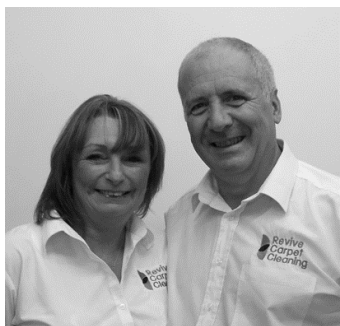
