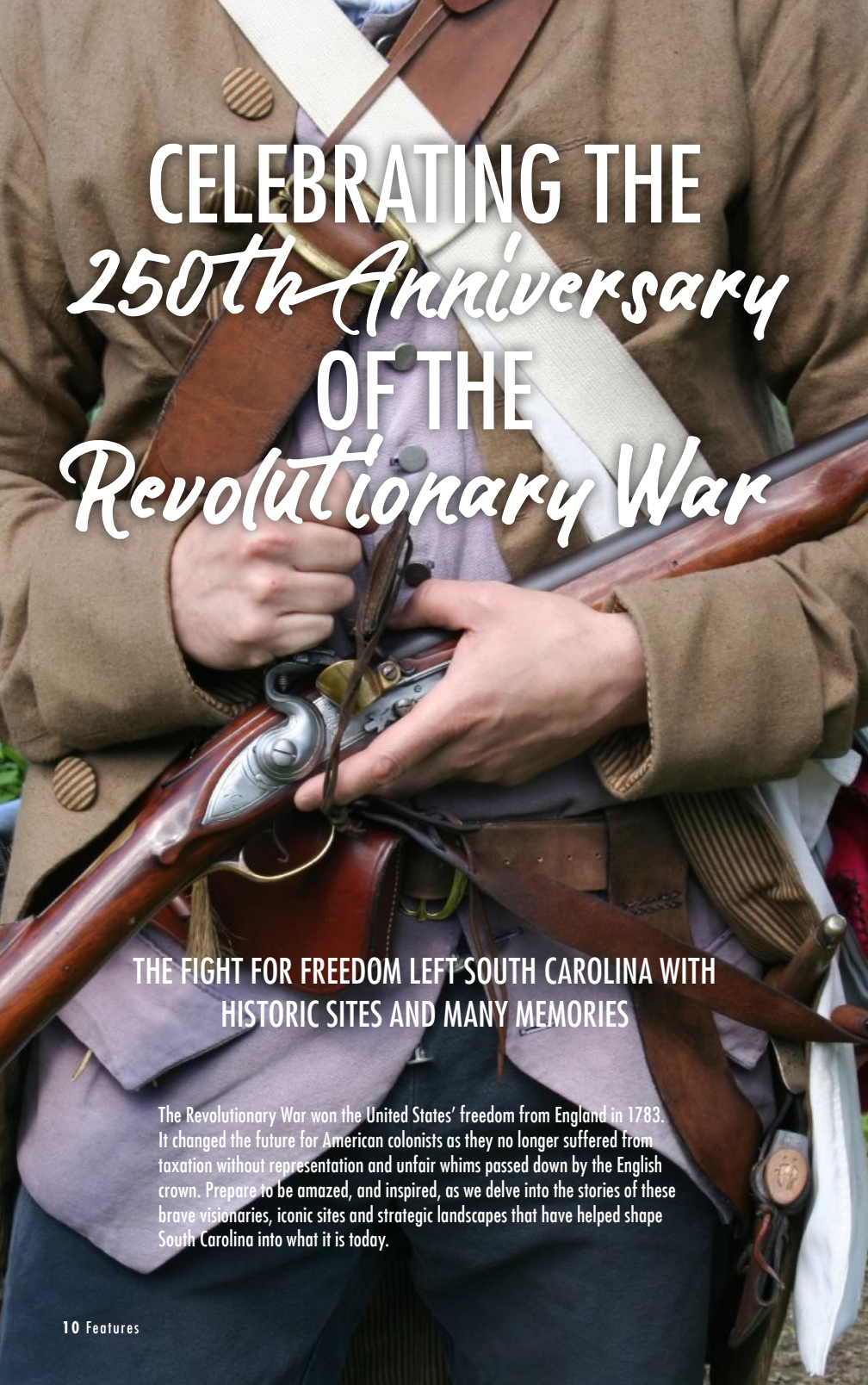

CELEBRATING THE *250th Anniversary* OF THE *Revolutionary War*

THE FIGHT FOR FREEDOM LEFT SOUTH CAROLINA WITH
HISTORIC SITES AND MANY MEMORIES

The Revolutionary War won the United States' freedom from England in 1783. It changed the future for American colonists as they no longer suffered from taxation without representation and unfair whims passed down by the English crown. Prepare to be amazed, and inspired, as we delve into the stories of these brave visionaries, iconic sites and strategic landscapes that have helped shape South Carolina into what it is today.



OLD SHELDON CHURCH

Old Sheldon Church

This building was constructed in 1753 and was formally known as Prince William Parish Church. Built by William Bull, this muster point for the rural Beaufort District Militia members north of the Broad River was burned during a raid by Gen. Augustine Prevost in 1779. Inside, you'll find the crypt is the burial place of Col. William Bull, a co-founder of Georgia along with Gen. James Oglethorpe. It was reportedly used as a hiding place for 8,000 pounds of gunpowder confiscated from the HMS *Philippa* off Daufuskie Island. More than half of that gunpowder was later sent to Gen. George Washington to aid in the Siege of Boston in winter 1775.

Battle of Bloody Point

One of the first confrontations, fought on July 9 and 10, 1775, this battle is also known as the Bloody Point Naval Action or The *Philippa* Affair. Members of the Beaufort District Militia, accompanied by two South Carolina Militia scout boats and a Georgia Patriot schooner named *Liberty*, confiscated 16,000 pounds of gunpowder and other munitions from the HMS *Philippa* off Daufuskie Island's Bloody Point.

Thomas Heyward, Jr. Tomb

On Feb. 1, 1779, after destroying many Hilton Head homes of Patriots, a British shore party of boats anchored in the Broad River. They came ashore and burned Thomas Heyward's White Hall plantation home across the Euhaw Creek then moved to Laurel Bay to burn Patriot Gen. Stephen Bull's home after being instigated by Bull's neighbor, Tory Andrew DeVeaux. Just off Highway 462 in Ridgeland, you can visit the burial place of Thomas Heyward Jr., signer of the Declaration of Independence, located on the family land of Old House Plantation.

Battle of Port Royal Island

Fought on Feb. 3, 1779, this battle was also known as the Battle of Beaufort or the Battle of Grays Hill. Americans stopped the British from attacking Charleston in this first land-based victory. The Americans fought with about 325 Continentals, militia and volunteers to defeat 200 British troops. Among these Americans were Edward Rutledge and Thomas Heyward, Jr., artillery officers and signers of the Declaration of Independence, and Jim Capers, an African-American drummer who went on to serve in many major battles including Yorktown.

Battle of Purrysburg

On April 29, 1779, 220 South Carolina Regulars led by Col. Alexander McIntosh were camped in and around the town of Purrysburg. They were surprised by two battalions of the 71st Scottish Highlanders and British Light Infantry. The next day, thousands of British troops under Gen. Augustine Prevost arrived. McIntosh and his men retreated to the Black Swamp to join about 1,000 troops with Gen. William Moultrie. Moultrie's men pulled back to Tulifinny Hill, fought at the Battle of Coosawhatchie and then went to defend Charleston.

Isaac Hayne's Tomb

In July 1781, Isaac Hayne retracted his neutral stance and led a troop to capture a former Patriot general who had accepted British protection. The pursuing British cavalymen captured Hayne soon afterwards. To prevent others from violating their neutrality, a British military tribunal condemned Hayne as a traitor, and executed him in Charleston on August 4, 1781. The British withdrew from South Carolina in defeat in 1782. Isaac Hayne was buried in the garden of Hayne Hall. The plantation's ownership changed, but the Hayne family retained access to the cemetery. South Carolina recognized Hayne's sacrifice by erecting a monument at the site in 1929. In 1963, the state acquired the cemetery so that it could be preserved by the South Carolina State Park Service as a historic site.

Pon Pon

In summer 1781, Tory soldiers roved the wooded areas around Charleston. Patriot Col. William Harden was in charge of a small militia force south of the Pon Pon River. He requested assistance from Brig. Gen. Francis Marion to help him against the Tories. Marion got to the village of Round "O" on August 22, and sent out spies to collect information. He learned that 100 Tories under Col. William "Bloody Bill" Cunningham were assembling on the banks of the Pon Pon River (present-day Edisto River) to gather with other British and Hessian regulars and Loyalist militiamen. Marion quickly prepared an ambush to prevent the juncture. That ambush became the battle of Parker's Ferry.

Battle of Parker's Ferry

On August 30, 1781, the American Patriots got into position in the thick woods of a swamp around 40 yards from the road, within a mile of Parker's Ferry. The Patriots sent a few light horsemen ahead as decoys. The British force approached in the late afternoon; a Tory sentry noticed a white cockade which was the mark of Gen. Francis Marion's men, in a soldier's cap in the woodline. A battle ensued and pushed the Tories back toward the ferry. British Maj. Thomas Fraser led his cavalry into a trap; the British lost approximately 25 men and 80 more were wounded, while Marion's men were barely harmed.

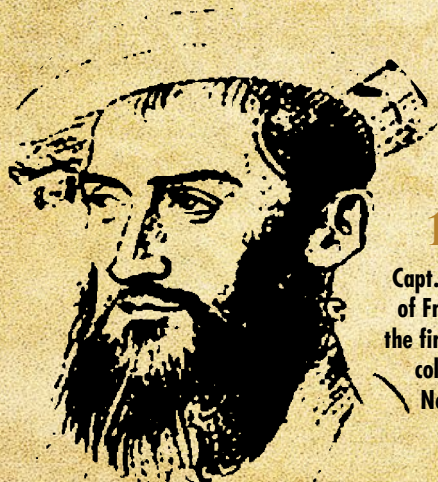

As we share a taste of our home with you, don't forget to indulge in plenty of palate-pleasing, farm-fresh produce, fresh- and salt-water seafood, and Lowcountry, original recipes.



ENJOY HISTORY, OUTDOOR ADVENTURES, SHOPPING AND SEAFOOD

Beaufort/Port Royal/Sea Islands



Because of the deep, safe harbor, two of the first European settlements in what would become the colony of South Carolina were established in the mid-1500s. Beaufort and sister-town Port Royal offer visitors a glimpse of historic sites and homes of the antebellum South. Navigate beautiful trails, wetlands and boardwalks, or get your exercise shopping in the area's antique stores and boutique shops. Historic home bed and breakfasts offer a slice of past decades, along with a comfy place to rest your head.

Beaufort's Parris Island is home to the United States Marine Corps Recruit Depot. Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort serves as a vital operational base for F/A-18s, F-35Bs and their support squadrons. Naval Hospital Beaufort completes the valued military presence in this part of the Lowcountry.

The Sea Islands surrounding Beaufort are a coastal escape where golden beaches, swaying palmettos and winding salt marshes set the scene for a classic Lowcountry getaway. These islands are more than just a stunning retreat — they're a place where history, culture and nature intertwine in the most beautiful way.

St. Helena Island offers a glimpse of Gullah culture at Penn Center — one of the first schools to educate former slaves. The Reconstruction Era National Historic Park paints the picture of life after the Civil War with multiple sites. One of the unique aspects of the region is its deep connection to the Gullah people, descendants of Africans who have preserved their language, traditions and way of life for generations.



WHERE THE WORLD IS YOUR OYSTER AND THE MAY RIVER BRINGS SUMMER DELIGHTS

Bluffton/Okatie



Bluffton began as a riverfront oasis for planters to escape the plantation atmosphere. That same summer-resort vibe continued to grow in the area as trade skyrocketed among Hilton Head Island, Beaufort and Savannah.

Bluffton was incorporated in 1852, then shortly after, Civil War destruction left The Heyward House, Campbell Chapel AME Church and the Church of the Cross as some of the only remaining structures. The Heyward House, an 1840's example of early Carolina farmhouse style, has become Bluffton's Welcome Center.

As you search out the city's pearls, don't miss the Bluffton Oyster Company, part of the area's seafood scene since 1899. It's the only remaining business of the five hand-shucking operations

located in Bluffton from the late 19th century to the early 20th century.

Among the eclectic art galleries of Old Town Bluffton, don't miss the Oyster Factory Park nature trail along the waterfront. This park features a playground, firepit area, picnic spots and bathrooms. You'll also find the Garvin-Garvey Freedman Cottage, built by former slave Cyrus Garvin.

Another trail throughout Bluffton continues the celebration of the arts. The Shell Art Trail features 21 large shells painted by local artists. Print your passbook at lowcountryoystertrail.org, check your map, then set out for a shell hunt, learning lots of fun oyster-centric facts along the way. Find your flair in this area that celebrates creativity, honors history and makes summer fun a top priority.



FIND YOUR FOLK ARTS AND CRAFTS FIX, PLUS KAYAKING AND CANOEING IN COLLETON

Colleton County/Walterboro



Whether you love history, shopping, folk arts and crafts, wildlife sanctuaries or canoeing and kayaking, Colleton is calling you.

Colleton County gets its name from John Colleton, as he received a land grant from King Charles II in 1663. And this area has been brimming with history and natural wonders ever since. One such site is on the Combahee River where you'll find the Harriet Tubman Bridge. Tubman led over 300 slaves to freedom through the Underground Railroad. She also played a pivotal role in the Combahee River Raid.

Walterboro became a summer retreat for nearby plantation owners during the late 1700s. Check out some of the architecture of the time at the Bedon-Lucas House. This area also boasts the South Carolina Artisans Center — a retail outlet for South Carolina's finest folk art and crafts. This artist's haven features a beautiful gallery in an eight-room Victorian home.

But if the great outdoors are more your style, Colleton County has got something for you too. Nature preserves like Donnelley Wildlife Management Area, Bear Island Wildlife Management Area and Walterboro Wildlife Sanctuary offer incredible outdoor opportunities. No matter your interests, Colleton County has you covered.



CULTURES COLLIDE TO CREATE AN UNFORGETTABLE EXPERIENCE

Daufuskie Island



Native Americans lived on Daufuskie Island from 10,000 years ago, up until the 19th Century. Artifacts remain to celebrate the island's original culture to this day. The Spanish arrived in the late 1500s. English colonists' plantations began popping up around the late 1600s, and early crops included indigo and longtime staple Sea Island cotton.

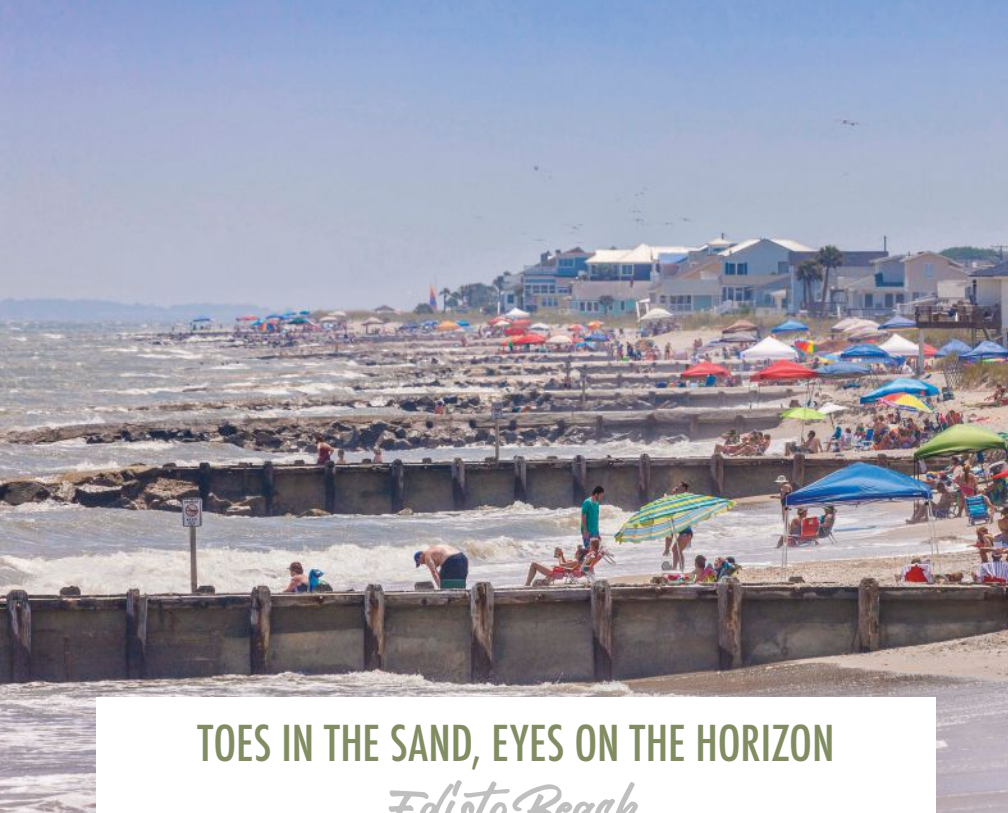
During the Civil War, Union soldiers camped on the island from 1861–65, then the island was mainly home to freed slaves. Those African Americans kept their culture going strong; we still see Gullah culture preserved on Daufuskie, in folk art, singing, storytelling and more.

The 1970s brought the island national attention with

the film "Conrack", based on Pat Conroy's book, "The Water Is Wide."

The island's two styles include plantations with paved roads, plus local areas with dirt roads. Today's Daufuskie features museums, an artisan village with sustainably farmed animals, area produce, arts and crafts, plus Daufuskie Blues — indigo dyeing that continues in the historic tradition.

Check out the Robert Kennedy Historic Trail to walk these iconic sites, along with cemeteries, a logging railroad line, the Gullah Learning Center and much more. This island truly embraces the cultural patchwork that makes it unique and memorable. Stay a while, celebrate, relax and enjoy!



TOES IN THE SAND, EYES ON THE HORIZON

Edisto Beach



Let the wind carry your cares away along the sunswept banks of Edisto Beach. Embrace the natural landscape — you'll find no high-rise condos or hotels here. Just pristine beaches and low-level rental properties along this 4.5-mile stretch.

Bring your powers of observation because this beach is a shell, fossil and shark's tooth collector's paradise. Also keep an eye out for loggerhead sea turtles. Be careful not to disturb their nests during late spring and summer months.

Scintillating seafood stands ready to fill your plate. Visit a local restaurant, or stop by a seafood market to cook your own fresh catch of the day. You can also book a trip with a charter captain, or fish in the surf along the beach.

Don't forget The Plantation Course at Edisto to satisfy the golf lovers in your life. Accessible to the public, the course is located inside the Wyndham Ocean Ridge Resort and features fine fairways, gorgeous greens, a clubhouse and restaurant.

Inland areas offer a canopy of moss-draped live oaks, plantations, tidal creeks, salt marshes, freshwater ponds and museums. Plus check out the regalia of reptiles at the Serpenterium. Edisto Beach State Park has been helping vacationers find family fun since 1935. Enjoy camping on the beach or marsh, visit the boat ramp and dock, or check out the interactive exhibits at the Environmental Learning Center.



ENJOY ARTIFACTS, ARCHITECTURE AND FESTIVALS

Hampton County/Hampton/Varnville

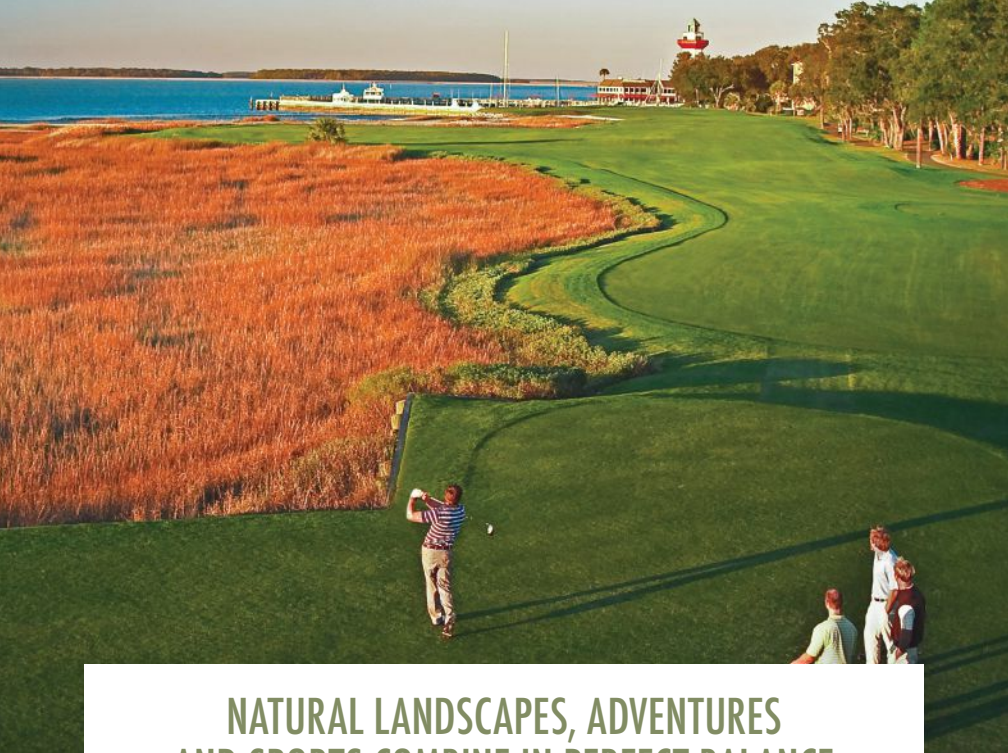


Hampton County is where history, events and the great outdoors collide in the best possible way. Memories of the area's first residents, Native Americans, remain in the winding rivers — the Salkehatchie, the Combahee and the Coosawhatchie — whose names echo their legacy. Hunting for artifacts is a beloved pastime, but if you'd rather see a collection without the digging, the two Hampton museums have you covered.

Each town in the county boasts its own charm — and sometimes its own quirks. In Brunson, you'll find the world's only stilted, octagonal town hall. (Why not?) Hampton's Art Deco-inspired Palmetto Theater is a blast from the past, while Varnville might feel oddly

familiar — “Forrest Gump” fans, take note! For a deep dive into nature, head over to Webb Wildlife Center or Lake Warren State Park.

Festivals are also a big deal here. The Hampton County Watermelon Festival has been going strong since 1939. In Yemassee, locals pay tribute to everyone's favorite seafood delight at the annual Shrimp Festival. Take your pick of the finest produce when you shop at local farmers markets. Whether you're drawn to history, small-town charm or lively festivals, Hampton County promises unforgettable experiences.

Hilton Head Island

Frampton Plantation



The Frampton family received land in modern-day South Carolina from the British Crown in the early 18th century. The original Frampton House was built on 4,000 acres in what is now Beaufort and Jasper counties. They primarily grew cotton and rice on the property.

As division between the southern and northern United States grew, John Edward Frampton signed South Carolina's Declaration of Secession, which took the state out of the Union. In 1861, Gen. Robert E. Lee built an earthwork gun emplacement to help protect the railroad supply line. The mounds are still visible in the backyard today. Sherman's March to the Sea meant disaster for the Frampton House. It was burned, along with several buildings on the property, in 1865.

Frampton rebuilt his family's home in 1868; the home featured seven fireplaces, lathe and plaster walls, a second-story porch with French doors and a half-round bay window in the front parlor. Many renovations have been made over the years. The Lowcountry Tourism Commission acquired the property in 1993, saving the house and centuries-old live oak trees from destruction.

This iconic structure is now the Lowcountry Visitors Center & Museum — open to the public to be enjoyed and appreciated for many more generations, thanks to grants, donations and a hefty helping of sweat equity.

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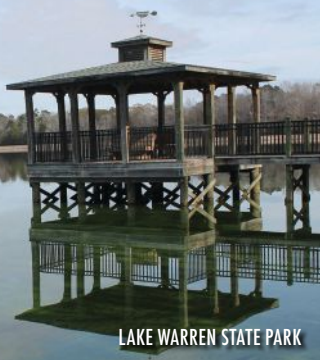

Mother Nature saved some of her finest work for South Carolina's Lowcountry. This remarkable region is packed with cool, untouched spots where you can watch the world slow down as the tides roll in and out. Wildlife management areas celebrate rural landscapes — bringing an array of plants and animals into view. Quirky cypress knees pop up from waters, long-legged herons tiptoe through marshes and beautiful barrier islands guard beaches where giant loggerhead turtles return year after year!

The ACE Basin is a spectacular 350,000-acre preserve where the Ashepoo, Combahee and Edisto rivers combine to meet the Atlantic. As the East Coast's largest estuary, this wilderness area is home to an incredible variety of wildlife that shares these protected waters with excited paddlers and photographers.

Want to spot an alligator sunning on a muddy bank? Visit Lake Warren State Park with its forested trails that transport you to another world. Or explore Walterboro Wildlife Sanctuary's fascinating "braided creek" swamp on boardwalks that follow Colonial-era stagecoach routes through mystical bottomlands.

And don't miss the epic birding opportunities at Webb Wildlife Management Area in Hampton County, the Cypress Wetlands trail in Port Royal and Savannah National Wildlife Refuge in Hardeeville. Check out the purple gallinules, ibis, egrets, herons, blue- and green-winged teal, ringneck and wood ducks, bald eagles, hermit thrushes, yellow-rumped warblers and red-winged blackbirds, among others.

For family fun, check out the Edisto Serpentarium's fascinating collection of reptiles or Blue Heron Nature Trail in Ridgeland, where kids can spot turtles and wading birds from observation decks perfectly positioned for wildlife viewing.

Whether you're kayaking the Combahee River, hiking beneath massive oaks or perusing the cypress wetlands, the Lowcountry's wild side promises adventures you won't forget!

NATURALLY AMAZING PLANTS
AND ANIMALS ABOUND HERE



FLORA:

The South Carolina Lowcountry unfolds like a botanical masterpiece, home to some of the most enchanting flora you'll discover. Nothing captures the soul of this region quite like the majestic live oak trees draped in ethereal Spanish moss, creating nature's own cathedral arches across historic pathways.

These magnificent sentinels reach 80 feet skyward while spreading their weathered limbs 100 feet wide, growing steadily up to 2 feet yearly. Their sprawling horizontal branches, nature's perfect playground, have witnessed centuries of history, with some ancient giants estimated to be over 1,000 years old.

After rainfall transforms the landscape, resurrection fern performs its captivating metamorphosis along oak branches, shifting from brittle brown to vibrant emerald when moistened — a magical sight for nature enthusiasts.

These diverse ecosystems nurture fascinating rarities, including carnivorous pitcher plants thriving in secluded bog gardens. Native camellias showcase their exquisite blooms throughout winter, with over 130 varieties adorning places like the Coastal Discovery Museum.

Maritime forests shelter robust slash pines, iconic cabbage palmettos and ancient sand dunes along

the shoreline. Limestone bluffs bordering the Edisto River cradle rare flora found nowhere else, while mysterious cypress trees rise from blackwater depths like sentinels of the swamp.

From historic plantation alleys to pristine wilderness, the Lowcountry's remarkable plant life creates a distinctive tapestry that defines this extraordinary region, inviting exploration in every season.

FAUNA:

The South Carolina Lowcountry pulses with wildlife around every marshy bend. Loggerhead sea turtles return to our beaches each summer, digging nests in moonlit sand to continue their ancient cycle of

life. Meanwhile, alligators bask along sun-dappled waterways, prehistoric creatures perfectly at home in our tangled wilderness.

The distinctive rhythmic tapping of the rare red-cockaded woodpecker echoes through pine forests, carving living quarters within standing trees. Breathtaking roseate spoonbills create splashes of pink against emerald marshes as they sweep their uniquely shaped bills through shallow waters.

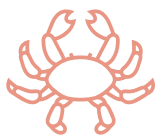

HUNTING SEASON

If you like eating venison, and spending time in the peace and quiet of the great outdoors, look no further. The Lowcountry has the longest white-tailed deer hunting season in the country. It lasts from August through December: the legal hunt times are one hour before official sunrise and one hour past official sunset. Hunters have many options during gun season. Archery, muzzleloaders, crossbows and pneumatic weapons may all be used during gun hunts.

Be sure to study the regulations before you hunt. All deer must be tagged before removal from the kill site. They must also be reported to the South Carolina Game Check system before processing.

WHITE-TAILED DEER

White-tailed deer abound throughout the wooded areas of the Lowcountry. Their coats are reddish tan with short and wiry hair during spring and summer. During fall and winter, they become gray with long hair over their thick undercoat. White patches usually surround the eyes and line the throat, stomach, underside of the tail and inside the legs.

Average adult males weigh about 175 pounds and females are usually around 120 pounds. Weight and size can vary greatly. Life expectancy is approximately 10 years in the wild.

Deer prefer a mixture of trees, shrubs, vines, grasses and other plants in their habitat. Their diet mainly consists of acorns, fruits, wild herbs and crops during plentiful times, but they can subsist on twigs, leaves and buds.

Mating season typically lasts from mid-October to mid-January, with the height in mid-November. Fawns arrive in April, May and June. They begin daily walks with their mothers about three to four weeks after birth.

FORREST GUMP FILMING LOCATIONS SWEETEN THE LOWCOUNTRY LANDSCAPE



FILM BUFFS, PREPARE FOR A VISUAL FEAST



Though “Forrest Gump” portrayed the fictional town of Greenbow, Alabama, the magic that captured hearts worldwide was filmed primarily among the moss-draped oaks and tidal marshes of coastal South Carolina. Even 30 years after its release, visitors still flock to these hallowed grounds, seeking to walk where Forrest once ran.

Your pilgrimage begins at historic Stoney Creek Independent Presbyterian Chapel in McPhersonville. Built in 1833 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, this charming sanctuary served as the Four Square Gospel Church where Forrest prayed for his shrimping fortune. The chapel’s weathered white exterior and simple elegance speak to the timeless beauty that drew filmmakers to this sacred spot.

“Life is like a box of chocolates.” So is this cinematic journey as you travel 20 minutes to Varnville, the quaint town that embodied Forrest’s childhood hometown. Though the iconic Gump house no longer stands, built hastily for filming and dismantled afterward, you can still visit Bluff Plantation, where the entrance remains visible. About 30 miles away, this sprawling 8,000-acre estate also housed Jenny’s ill-fated childhood home, dramatically destroyed during filming — a haunting chapter in their intertwined story.

In Walterboro, just a short drive away, the former Walterboro Academy (now the Colleton Civic Center) served as Greenbow Elementary, where young Forrest’s destiny began to unfold. As you walk these historic halls, imagine the pivotal moment when Forrest’s future was shaped by that memorable intelligence testing scene.

The heart of Forrest’s journey beats strongest in beautiful Beaufort. Listen for echoes of “Run, Forrest, run!” as you cross the Woods Memorial Bridge — not the mighty Mississippi as portrayed, but the picturesque Beaufort River — where Forrest’s epic run paused for a famous interview. This historic swing bridge, one of few remaining in South Carolina, now hosts the annual “Run, Forrest Run 5K,” celebrating both cinematic history and community spirit.

Venture to Lady’s Island to glimpse Bubba’s modest home, a private residence overlooking Lucy Point Creek, where many shrimping scenes were filmed. The waters here still teem with the “fruit of the sea.” Shrimp boats dot the horizon, continuing a tradition celebrated in film and local culture alike. Continue to Gay Fish Company, which supplied all the shrimp for production and whose dock witnessed the christening of the Jenny.

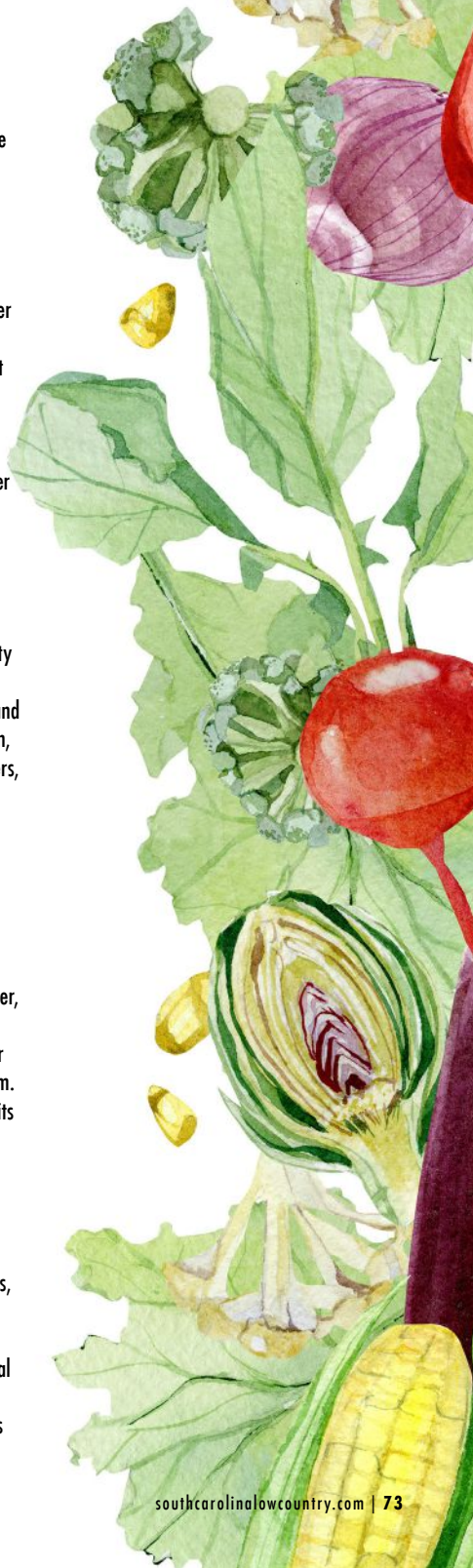
PICK-YOUR-OWN PRODUCE

You don't have to wait for farmers markets if you'd rather dig right in. Here's a sampling of local you-pick farms. Check out places like Breland Hill Farm, Dempsey Farms and Okatee River Brand Produce.

Breland Hill Farm is a multigenerational family farm housed in a repurposed tobacco barn. This Colleton County gem's offerings include boiled peanuts, strawberry pies, eggs, salads and parfaits, plus seasonal you-pick treats and market items like strawberries, butter beans, watermelon, cantaloupe, sweet corn, tomatoes, cucumbers, bell peppers, yellow squash, butternut squash, spaghetti squash, okra, apples, oranges, onions and potatoes.

Dempsey Farms, near Hunting Island State Park, Harbor Island and Fripp Island in Beaufort County, offers strawberries in April; summer and fall seasons include assorted lettuces, cabbage, bok choy, kale, collards, tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, sweet potatoes, cauliflower, beets, onions, turnips, eggplant, squash, zucchini, okra, pumpkins, shelled peas and butter beans. They also offer hayrides on some fall Saturdays from 10:30 a.m.—3 p.m. This working family farm has been growing delicious fruits and vegetables for more than 60 years.

Okatee River Farms in Bluffton is a small family farm offering big, bold flavors. Summer usually brings local honey, along with shiitake mushrooms, tomatoes, peaches, okra, corn, pears, potatoes, green beans, onions, pink-eye peas, white acre peas, plums, squash, zucchini, eggplant, bell peppers, cucumbers, butter beans, brown crowder peas, boiled peanuts and blackberries. Occasional Lowcountry loafs add delicious sourdough breads, cinnamon rolls and cookies to the plethora of possibilities in Beaufort County.

COUNTRY *Tomato* SANDWICHES



Fresh soft white bread or crusty sourdough slices

Duke's mayonnaise

Heirloom or any fresh-from-the-garden summer tomatoes, washed and thickly sliced

Salt and pepper

Spread mayonnaise on 2 slices of bread. Top 1 piece of bread with 2 to 3 tomato slices, salt and pepper to taste, then top with remaining bread. Garnish with fresh basil.

RAW *Oysters*



A dozen Lowcountry oysters shucked and left on the half-shell

Saltine crackers

Hot sauce, cocktail sauce or fresh lemon

Slide the oyster onto a saltine cracker, or slurp directly from the shell. Top with your choice of hot sauce, cocktail sauce or a squeeze of lemon juice and enjoy.

SPRING *Strawberry* SALAD



Assorted green- and red-leaf lettuce,
rinsed and drained
4 large fresh strawberries, rinsed and sliced
Blue cheese crumbles
Roughly chopped pecans
Thinly sliced red onion
Poppy seed dressing

Combine all ingredients in a bowl and
lightly toss to incorporate.

Poppy seed dressing
1/2 cup white vinegar
1/3 cup sugar
1 teaspoon grated sweet onion
1 teaspoon ground dry mustard
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup oil
1 tablespoon poppy seeds

Combine first 5 ingredients in a food processor.
Gradually add oil and continue to blend. Pour into a
small bowl and add poppy seeds. Whisk to combine.

GRILLED *Watermelon*



Seedless watermelon, cut into 1-inch thick
triangular wedges (do not remove rind)
3 tablespoons lime juice
3 teaspoons lime zest
1/4 cup honey
1/2 cup feta cheese
1/2 cup finely chopped cilantro

Whisk lime juice, zest and honey together
in a small bowl. Heat grill to high.
Brush the honey-lime mixture on both
sides of watermelon wedges. Place the
watermelon on grill for 2 to 3 minutes per
side until grill marks form. Remove from
heat. Garnish with crumbled feta cheese
and cilantro.
