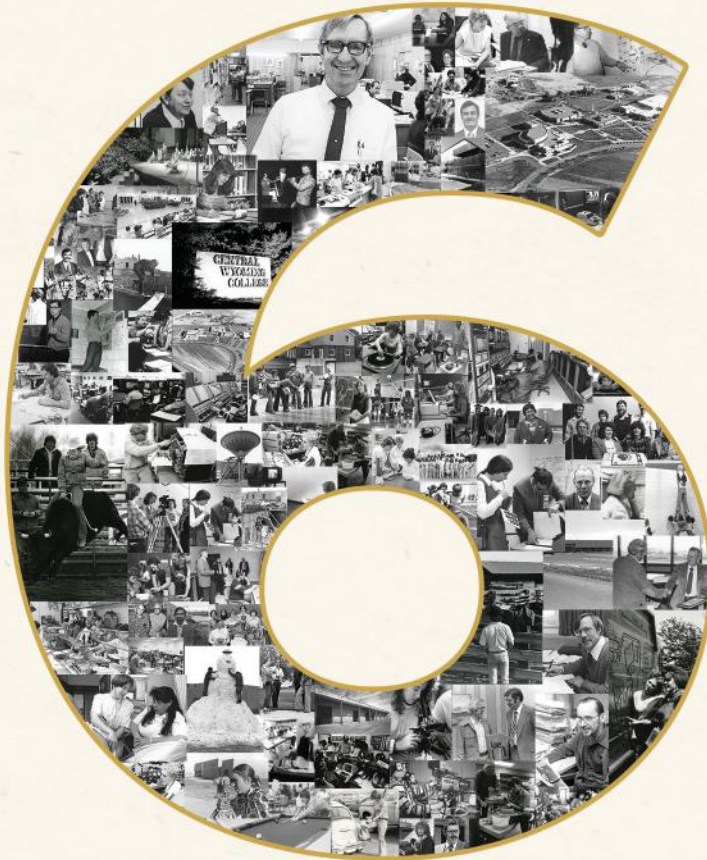
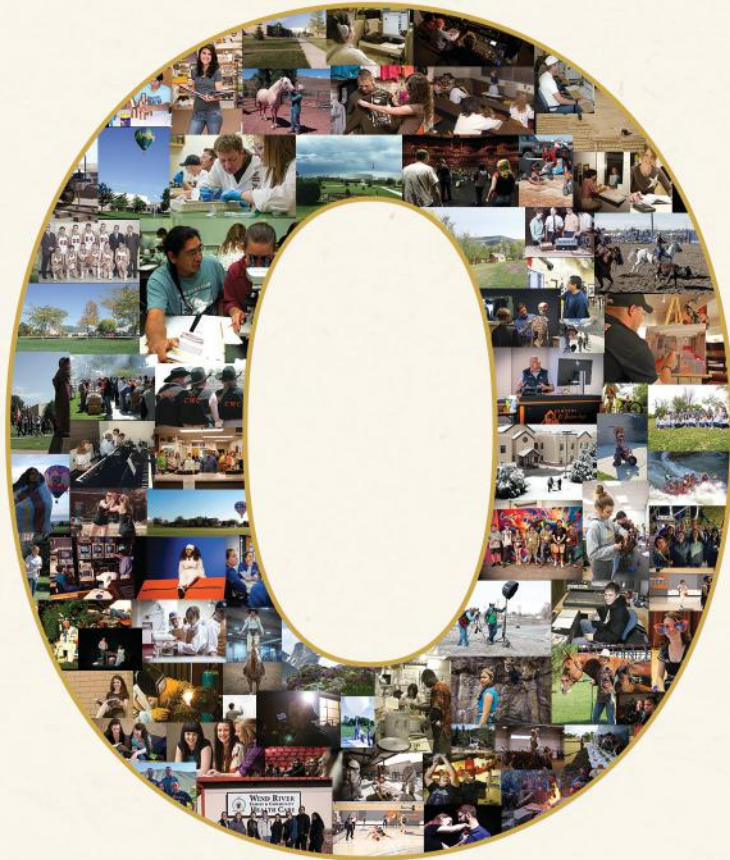

Central Wyoming College (CWC) is proudly celebrating its 60th anniversary in 2026, marking six decades of transforming lives and strengthening communities through education, leadership, and connection. Since opening its doors in 1966, CWC has grown into Wyoming's #1 community college and the #85 best community college in the U.S., according to Niche's Spring 2025 rankings.

CWC serves Fremont, Hot Springs, and Teton Counties by offering Associate's and Bachelor's degrees, along with a wide variety of certificate programs. The college includes a main campus in Riverton; an outreach center and the Alpine Science Institute in Lander; outreach centers in Thermopolis, Dubois, and on the Wind River Reservation; and a new campus in Jackson opening in Fall 2026, each designed to meet the unique needs of the communities they serve.

Central Wyoming College's mission is to transform lives and strengthen communities through learning, leadership, and connection. CWC is a designated Native American Serving Non-Tribal Institution (NASNTI) and serves the largest American Indian student population in Wyoming.

SCHOLARSHIPS

MONEY FOR COLLEGE YOU DON'T HAVE TO PAY BACK!

Central Wyoming College has more than \$1.4 million in scholarships to support you!

We offer a variety of institutional and program-specific scholarships; scholarships for activities, GPAs, High School Equivalency and scholarships from generous donors who support a wide variety of interests and career goals.

Scholarships are awarded on various criteria usually reflecting the values and purposes of the donor of the award. Scholarships can be based on merit, need, demographics, or career focus.

Student Scholarship Opportunity | This scholarship is for new CWC students beginning their post-secondary education or returning CWC students in need of assistance to continue their education.

Wyoming Works | This scholarship is for Wyoming residents in select technical programs that meet labor and economic development needs. Space and funding is limited. Students eligible for Hathaway do not qualify.

Wyoming's Tomorrow Scholarship | The Wyoming's Tomorrow Scholarship (WTS) is a state-funded scholarship program for Wyoming residents 24 years of age or older who wish to pursue a degree or certificate. Must register with Wyoming Dept of Workforce Services.

Hathaway Scholarship | The Hathaway Scholarship was established to help Wyoming's students prepare for and pursue their post-secondary education in the state.

Restart Scholarship | The Restart Scholarship helps eligible returning adult students complete their education by covering tuition and general fees for one 1-3 credit required course.

SCHOLARSHIPS

International Students are not eligible for any U.S. government aid programs. However, international students are eligible to receive scholarships. Scholarships are a form of financial aid that do not require repayment as long as requirements are met. CWC rewards international students for academic and personal achievements. These scholarships are usually based on high school/secondary school grade point average (GPA).

HEALTH INSURANCE

International students are required to pay for their medical care; it is not sponsored nor paid for by the institution. Central Wyoming College requires all international students to have adequate health insurance during their enrollment at CWC.

HOUSING

Central Wyoming College is one of the community colleges that offer campus housing. International students who enroll in CWC are encouraged to stay on campus.

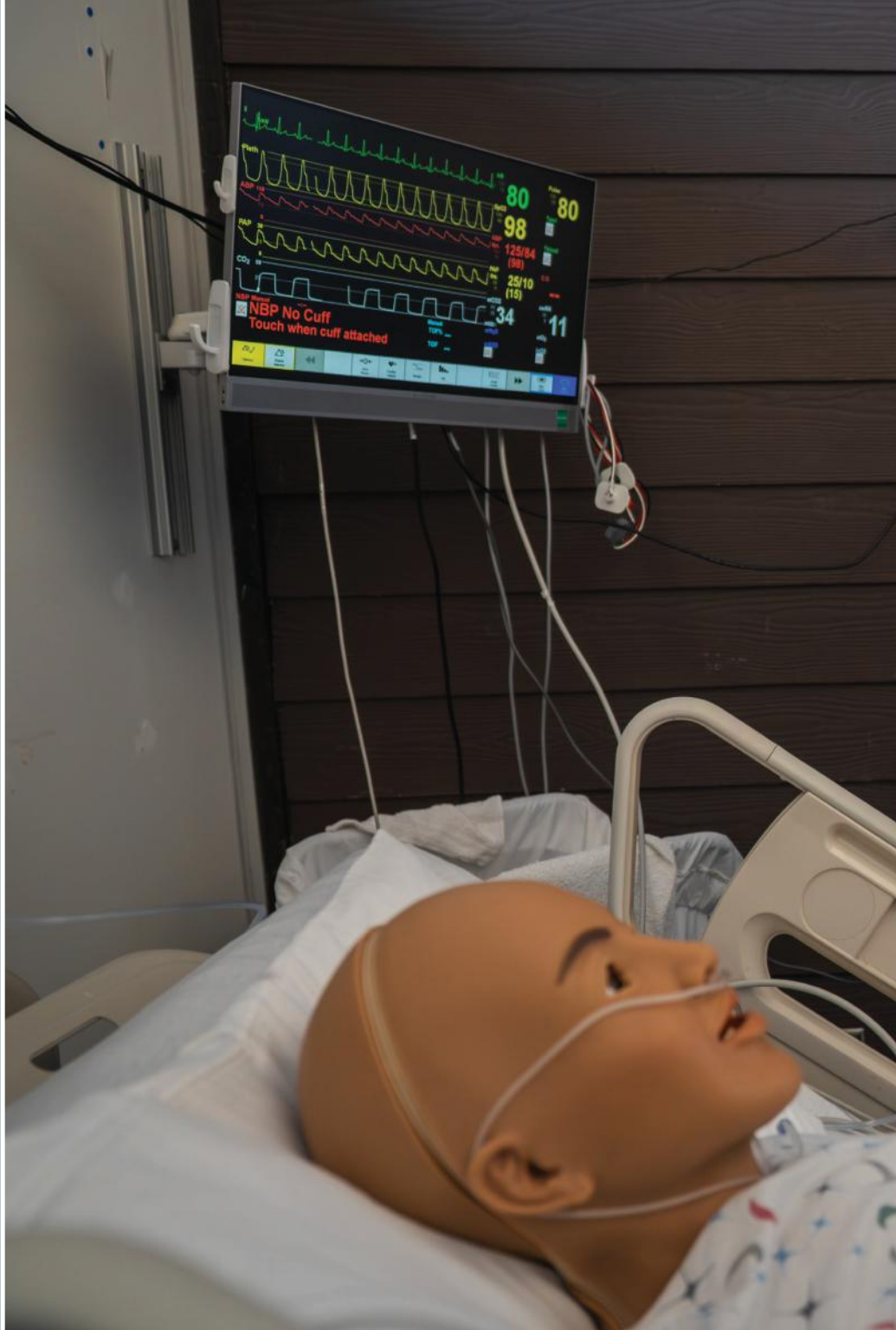
ALEX JACKSON

This expedition changed how I see science and the outdoors.

Central Wyoming College student Jada Antelope is trading the traditional classroom for the rugged spine of the continent. She will participate in the Great Divide Mountain Bike Route Expedition, a grueling 65-day, 2,700-mile cycling and research trek running from July 5 through September 9. Conducted in partnership with the Adventure Cycling Association, this 15-member expedition perfectly blends elite outdoor adventure, rigorous field science, and multimedia storytelling.

The journey connects directly with CWC's Alpine Science Institute (ASI) and programs like Expedition Science and Geospatial Technology. Antelope and Lewis will collect critical environmental data using portable sensors for the TEMPS Project, a climate initiative backed by the Wyoming NASA Space Grant Consortium and the Wyoming Innovation Partnership.

"This represents everything we strive to create at ASI authentic adventure, meaningful research, and life-changing opportunities," says Jacki Klancher, Director of Research and Innovation. "The skills she develop on the Great Divide will stay with her long after the ride is over."

When Sean Smith enrolled at Central Wyoming College, he didn't just want to study criminal justice, he wanted to experience it. Through CWC's Criminal Justice program, Sean has participated in ride-alongs with the Riverton Police Department, gaining firsthand experience alongside law enforcement officers and seeing what it takes to serve a community with professionalism, integrity, and compassion. Now, students like Sean will have an even greater opportunity.

Beginning in Fall 2026, Central Wyoming College will launch its new Police Academy, giving students the chance to complete Wyoming POST Basic Certification while earning hands-on training from experienced law enforcement professionals. Cadets will learn everything from criminal law and investigations to defensive tactics, de-escalation, emergency vehicle operations, and community policing, all while developing the communication, leadership, and decision-making skills today's officers need.
