Pastoral Letter - Rev^d Brian Streeter

MONEY

“Money” — there, I have said it, the dirty word, the word that so many do not want to mention, and certainly do not want to talk about.

Whether that be standing on the doorstep with a charity fundraiser, or studiously avoiding the same in the high street. Whether that be filling in the end of year tax form or re-negotiating our utilities contracts. The money in our lives is something we do not want to address, or at least we want to think about as little as possible.

And yet money is a significant part of our lives whether we are comfortable with that fact or not. Without money the state and its institutions cannot function, and neither can our day-to-day lives. Whether it be physical, that is cash, or digital, that is our cards and increasingly our mobile phones, then money is a necessity.

Talking of digital money, the more keen-eyed among our readers may have noticed a few posters pop-up on church buildings, and at the entrances to our churchyards. These are displaying QR or Quick Response bar codes that when scanned by a mobile phone take you to a donation website. These QR code posters are there to enable donations to our churches and for the upkeep of our churchyards.

Even if you have not spotted to the posters, you may have seen the QR code in last month’s magazine for donations to the ongoing costs of printing? And it works, as people scanned and donated — one donation was for £500.00, thank you!!!

And in the coming months the churches are all signing up to the national Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) which allows for people to register to regularly donate money. This donation is also annually adjusted for inflation (with the donor’s permission) and automatically deals with Gift Aid adding an additional 20% to the donation.

Jesus, himself spoke about money and possessions on many occasions—more than about heaven, hell, or prayer. And this was not because money was in itself that important, but because our attitude towards money and how we handle money reveals a great deal about ourselves and our motivations. As Jesus said,

“Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also”
Matthew 6.19-21

In the coming months, I will be writing in the magazine—probably an insert—to explain the work of our churches, their place in our communities, and the costs involved in keeping them open and running. Yes, I will be speaking about “money”.

Additionally, we will be rolling out the PGS to our communities. Please sign-up and regularly donate. Your £5.00 a month will ensure that we will be here to serve our communities in the future.

GP services to be maintained in Coniston

People living in Coniston will continue to have local access to a GP practice following the agreement to open a branch of a neighbouring practice in the village.

Following successful negotiations with local service provider Cumbria Health Limited, NHS Lancashire and South Cumbria Integrated Care Board (ICB) has announced that a branch site of Central Lakes Medical Group, part of Cumbria Health, will open in Coniston from **1 July 2026**.

It follows a period of uncertainty after the contract to provide services at Coniston Medical Practice was handed back to the ICB following the retirement of local GP Dr Katharina Frey. A procurement exercise failed to identify a willing bidder to take over the long-term provision of services in the village, which have been temporarily maintained on a caretaker basis by the Morecambe Bay Primary Care Collaborative.

The opening of the branch will ensure general medical services continue to be provided in the village.

Craig Harris, chief commissioning officer at the ICB, said: "The people of Coniston were clear to us from the start. They wanted a service to be available in the village, as it had been for many years, and it has been our desire to deliver that from day one.

"It took us some time to get to where we are now, but I am really pleased that we can make this announcement that GP services will continue to be available in the village for the years to come.

"I would also like to thank the Morecambe Bay Primary Care Collaborative for stepping in to support patients during this interim period."

Andrew Woodhead, practice manager at Central Lakes Medical Group, part of Cumbria Health, said: "We are really pleased to be able to support the continuation of GP services in Coniston and help maintain local access to care within the village. As part of Cumbria Health, we are committed to supporting sustainable primary care services for rural communities and we look forward to working closely with patients, staff and local partners as we become part of the Coniston community."

On **30 June 2026**, all patients of Coniston Medical Practice will be dispersed to Central Lakes Medical Practice or their nearest practice, which will assume responsibility for the around 1,000 patients currently registered. Patients transferred to Central Lakes Medical Group will be able to access services at any of the Group's sites, as well as a newly opened branch surgery in Coniston.

The service will continue to be provided from the current Wraysdale House premises until a suitable alternative premises can be developed.

Proposals on how the service will operate are still being finalised, however it is anticipated the branch site will be open three days a week in Coniston. Patients will be able to access all Central Lakes Medical Group sites, including those in Hawkshead and Ambleside, should they have an urgent need when the branch site is not available.

Around the Parishes: Lowick

Lowick Parish Council

Road Closure due to New Water Main

The United Utilities water main from the Red Lion, past the church and up to Woodgate has been problematic for many years. The old pipe regularly burst due to age, and not being able to handle the higher pressure. Lowick Parish Council pushed to have this repair prioritised.

Work to replace this section with a new pipe is ongoing, resulting in an extended road closure. The project is unfortunately behind schedule. Work recommenced on **June 1st** and should now be completed by **mid August**.

Red Lion Junction

Over the years there have been many accidents here. There is poor visibility for cars joining or crossing the main road coming from over the bridge or past the Red Lion resulting in people blindly pulling out. In addition, drivers on the main road are often not aware of the junction and cannot see cars about to pull out. Accidents occur when cars on the main road overtake close to this junction.

The Parish Council have been in discussions with the Westmorland & Furness Council Highways Department for a number of years regarding this problem and have now come to an agreed solution. There will be new signage to highlight the hidden junctions, and double white lines on the main road either side of the junction to prevent over taking. This work is due to be completed by the **end of July**.

In addition there may be changes to speed limits following public consultation but these have not been agreed yet.

Blawith and Subberthwaite Parish Council

Councillors are awaiting the Westmorland and Furness (W&F) review of community governance. The Council has made it plain that it wishes to work more closely with Lowick Parish Council, because many of the issues we face are common to us both.

The Council regularly reports pot holes to W&F who are now responsible for maintaining the roads in the Parish. Several pot holes have been repaired but the repair does not always last.

A member of the public spoke and raised the issue of speeding traffic on the A5084 during times of light traffic. The Council has requested a Speed Indicator Device (SID) be placed in Blawith and has written to W&F to request a 20mph speed limit. **It will discuss the response to this, and any further comments received, at its next meeting at 7pm on Monday 13th July in the Village Hall at Water Yeat. Residents of the Parish are welcome to attend and speak.**

We are reliably informed that some of the younger members of the community have already put them to good use!

Colton Parish Open Meeting Thank you to everyone who came along to the Colton Open Meeting at Haybridge Nature Reserve. Special thanks to Colin Barr and John Atkinson for sharing their knowledge and stories about the area and its wildlife, and to Carole Dickinson for the delicious cakes. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet together, share ideas and discuss matters of importance to our community.

Some of the issues we expect to be focussing on in the coming year are:

- **Emergency planning** – supporting residents and communities to be prepared in case of emergencies such as extreme weather, damage to roads and other infrastructure, loss of power or communication networks.
- **Planning** – ensuring that we support ‘thriving communities’ and fulfil our statutory duty of protecting biodiversity.
- **Bouth Playground and village green** – working with the local residents, who are currently considering all different the options for the future of the village green.
- **Illegal off-road driving** – working with Westmoreland & Furness Council, the Police and other local partners to protect some of our unique and fragile environments that are being damaged by illegal off-road driving.
- **Recruiting more Councillors!** We still have vacancies for the central part of Colton Parish and the East Ward, which is Finsthwaite, Lakeside and surrounding areas. Please get involved if you can; we need your support to make sure we are working for the whole community.

Community Champions At the heart of Colton Parish Council's Emergency Plan is the recognition that many people step up as ‘good neighbours’ to make sure those of us who need a little more help are not left stranded for example, when the power



goes off or local roads are flooded. Now Colton Parish Council is looking to build on these informal networks to help everyone feel more prepared for future emergencies, whatever they may be.

We are looking for people who lead local community What's App groups in the Colton parish area, or people who would like to set one up for their patch. Ruskin was one of the largest private collectors of minerals in 19th Century and gave invaluable collections to public institutions, schools and universities. With loans of remarkable specimens, Treasures of the Earth explores his love of stones and their meaning to him. The exhibition coincides with the publication of The Mineral World of John Ruskin by Roy Starkey. Roy will be giving a talk about his research during the exhibition and other related events are being planned over the Summer. On display until 25th October.

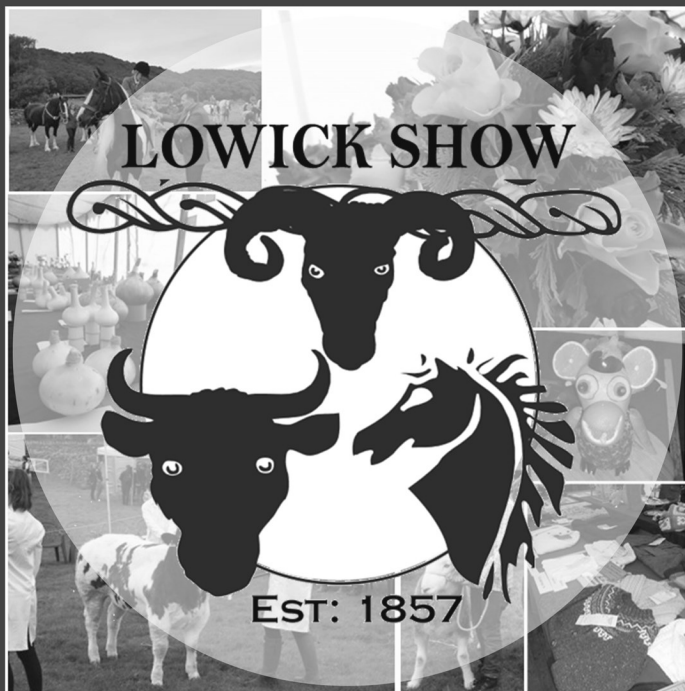

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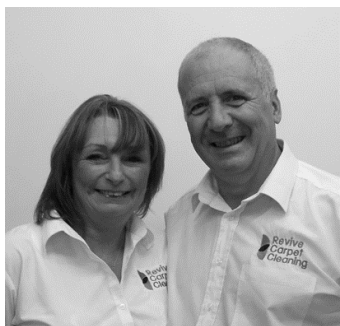
