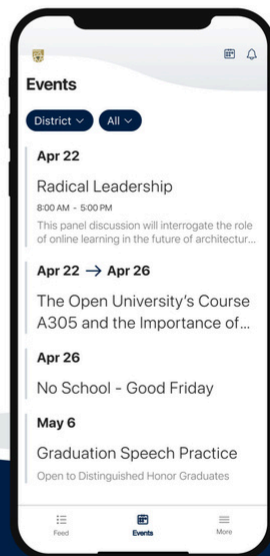
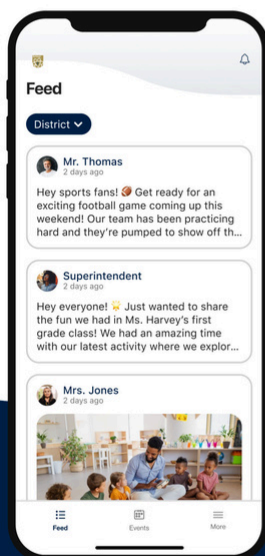

- Gifted & Talented (GT) – Our Gifted and Talented program challenges advanced learners through enriched curriculum, creative problem-solving, and project-based learning.

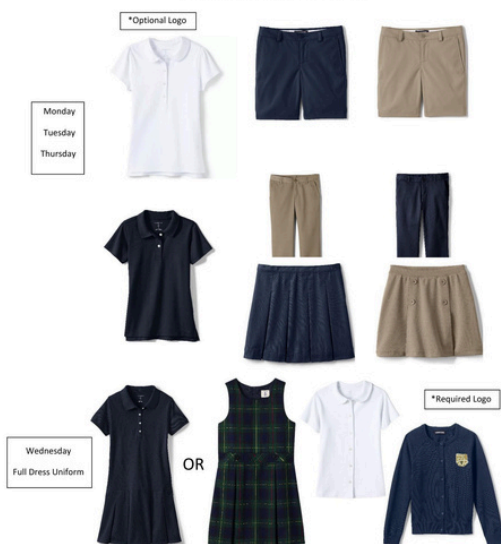
