Pastoral Letter from Revd Brian Streeter

HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II

In the Book of Genesis in the beginning of the Bible we hear in picture language of the LORD God creating all that we know and see. And as He creates, the LORD God sees what He has created as says that “it is good”. However, when the LORD God finally makes humanity, He looks and says, “it is very good”. Humanity is therefore often called the “crown of Creation”, the pinnacle of God’s creative imagination.

In the Book of Revelation at the end of the Bible we hear in similar picture language of the throne room in heaven. And in one scene we are told:

“And whenever the living creatures give glory and honour and thanks to the one who is seated on the throne, who lives for ever and ever, the twenty-four elders fall before the one who is seated on the throne and worship the one who lives for ever and ever; they cast their crowns before the throne” – Revelation 4.9-10

The crown is a symbol of authority, and our former monarch, Queen Elizabeth II was crowned in 1953 to symbolise this authority bestowed on her. In fact, one recent serialisation of the life of the Queen was simply called “The Crown”.

However, it has been said that the Queen never felt at ease with the symbolism of authority that the crown projected, and seldom wore the crown – not least because it was so heavy! Nevertheless, the Queen was less reticent about her Christian faith and was said by some to be very happy “to wear her faith on her sleeve”. And many have witnessed this openness and confession of the Queen’s faith being amply demonstrated in many Christmas Day speeches.

So why all the talk about crowns? Well, one former chaplain to the Queen recalls that she told him that “when one day I pass and meet the Lord Jesus, then I will lay my crown at His feet”. This, one can imagine, would be to symbolise both a handing over her mantle of authority and of having completed her service to the Lord Jesus and the people.

The excerpt from Revelation above echoes this sentiment of the Queen, where the twenty-four elders or kings “cast their crowns before the throne” upon which the Lord Jesus sits with all authority, majesty, and power.

But in our recent period of national mourning and at the Queen’s state funeral, we gave thanks for 70 years of service, because the Queen, like her role model – the Lord Jesus – understood that leadership is not primarily about authority, majesty, and power, but about service.

Jesus is often called the Servant King, and Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II was in the same manner a servant queen – truly Queen Elizabeth the Faithful.

Coniston Parish Council

The last month has seen the loss of Queen Elizabeth II. This was marked by the community of Coniston coming together to pray for the late Queen and to sign the Book of Condolence being hosted at St Andrew's Church. This book will be forwarded to the Lord Lieutenant for Cumbria, consolidated with other official books of condolence and then sent to Buckingham Palace before being archived.

The accession of King Charles III was marked by Cllr Tracy Coward and Cllr Heather Troughton reading the accession proclamation outside St Andrew's Church on Sunday, 11th September.

There have been a number of other projects undertaken. This includes working on the Emergency (Resilience) Plan. One of these projects involves the Parish Council working with local organisations to design a package of initiatives to address the challenges faced by the local community during a period of unprecedented increases in the cost of living, with particular focus on food and fuel security. It is hoped that by the end of October these measures will be put into place, and the parish informed of what is available and how to access support.

Colton Parish Council report

Colton Parish Council joins with all our local communities in expressing our sadness at the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Greening Colton

Over the last few months Colton Parish Council has been working with Rusland Horizons to enrich the biodiversity in four patches across our Parish. The project has been funded by Cumbria County Council as part of a much bigger initiative to create, improve or restore verges, hedges, and small plots of land close to the roadside.

So far, with the help of lots of fantastic volunteers from the local community, we have planted native wildflowers seeds in the polytunnel at Abbots Reading, which we will use in future schemes.

We have also planted native wildflower plugs on the green next to Oxen Park Reading Room, to help attract and support butterflies and other insects.

All the seeds and plugs used were chosen because of their local origins and their ability to thrive in local conditions.

We joined with the family and friends of Tim Fleming to help create a traditional mixed species hedge. This will not only function as a home for birds, small mammals, and insects, but provide a wildlife corridor and help to restore an eroded track.

There are two more sites in the pipeline. Opportunities to get involved will be published on the Rusland Horizons' website in due course, see: <https://www.ruslandhorizons.org/>

In the meantime, if you want to see for yourself, you can go along to Oxen Park Reading Room, grid reference SD317873, or the footpath at Thwaite Moss, Rusland, grid reference SD340 898.

A THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH by Rev. David Gregg

OCTOBER 6TH/19TH : BIBLE TRANSLATION

The Church's calendar for October brings the celebration of two wonderful Christian men. On 6th it is William Tyndale, the martyred translator of the whole bible into (Tudor) English, on whose work the Authorised Version and its subsequent revisions is based. On the 19th it is Henry Martyn, the East Indian Company chaplain, who worked himself into an early grave by bringing the New Testament and the Psalms to Persia and India in at least three different languages!

But Translation can have its fun. The panel for the New English Bible, working on the parable of the Prodigal Son, came up with several suggestions in place of "the fatted calf", and one of them, who passed each day through Smithfield Meat Market, said he would ask one of the meat porters whether any of their word selections was used to describe a bullock or a heifer that was ready for the pot. The cockney who was approached looked down the list and scratched his head. "Nah, guvnor," he said. "We use technical terms 'ere. We call 'em '*fatted calves*'!"

And in an attempt to translate the Psalms into modern Friesian (I am assured that the joke works exactly the same as it does in English!) the proposal to substitute the phrase "The wrong ones" in place of the more archaic "The wicked" seemed to work okay in Psalm 1 verse 1:

"Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of *the wrong ones*."

But it came unstuck as a translation for the same Hebrew word in Psalm 3 verse 7:

"You (O LORD) have broken the teeth of *the wrong ones*."

Bible Translators have to compromise, because there is no such thing as a word-for-word translation. (I once heard a sermon, in a Brethren Assembly, about how very important the words in italics were in the King James Bible! The preacher was most disappointed when I pointed him to the preface which says they have been *added* to make sense of the English, and have *no* equivalent in the original Hebrew and Greek!) So, in English, there is a whole spectrum of translations which range from the pedantic and the conservative (the Revised Version is the most extreme example) right through to the out-and-out *paraphrase*, based on the principle of 'dynamic equivalents' – that is to say, trying to find words that do the same thing in the culture you are translating into as the original did in its own culture. ("Jesus said, 'I am the rice of life?' in Chinese, for instance.)

My favourite example is to compare the treatment of 1 Samuel 24:3. The Revised Version has, "Saul went in (i.e. into the cave) *to cover his feet ...*", which is almost exactly what it is in Hebrew, because it refers to your loose robe spreading out over your feet if you stoop down. Most (polite) English Versions have, "Saul went in *to relieve himself ...*" – a fine English euphemism. But the (American) 'Living Way' (a self-confessed paraphrase) has, "Saul went into a cave *to go to the bathroom ...*"!

But all godly versions have their uses. I generally prefer the New Revised Standard Version for public reading (because it is a modernised form of the Authorised Version); for young people or those new to Christian faith, the Good News Bible is arguably the best introduction – although, despite what it says, it *is* a paraphrase; the New International Version may be the best general all-round one -

it falls right in the middle of the spectrum; for those who don't know Hebrew or Greek, the Revised Version is still the most pedantically accurate, if you can manage devotional Victorian English, and for my own private devotions, alongside the original Hebrew and Greek texts, I tend to use the English Standard Version.

These all, of course, have their shortcomings, but the most important thing is to read the Scriptures every day, praying that the Holy Spirit will interpret them to us, and build us up in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

15th: Pray for prison chaplains sharing the liberating message of the Gospel.
