The Israel ParaSport Center has been a hub for adaptive and rehabilitative sports for 65 years. Founded in 1960 to support wounded veterans and children affected by polio, the 4-acre campus now serves nearly **3,500** Israelis with disabilities and their families through sports and social services. At The Center, children and adults build confidence, develop skills, and form lifelong friendships, while elite para-athletes train to proudly represent Israel on the world stage.

The Power of Swimming

For many, swimming is not just a therapeutic activity—it is a lifeline.

Years of experience and research confirm our belief that swimming serves as the foundation for adaptive sports, and at The Center every rehabilitative journey begins in one of our pools. The strength and confidence that is built through swimming serves as the foundation for exploring other sports and long-term success.

Beyond its physical benefits, swimming lets people of all ages experience the joy of movement, something many of our participants cannot do on land. In the water, limitations seem to dissolve, and they experience a sense of liberation as the ripples flow around them. This freedom of movement, combined with its ability to build strength, makes swimming one of the most impactful sports for people with disabilities.



The Luski Aquatic Center

Among its many state-of-the-art facilities, the Israel ParaSport Center has two pools: The semi-Olympic Atlanta Community Pool and the Children's Pool.

The Atlanta Community Pool was built in 1966, and just two years later, served as a venue for the third-ever Paralympic Games in 1968. In 2006, the pool was renovated, with a roof built over it, allowing for year-round use.

The Children's pool, located in The Jimmy Caplan Hydrotherapy Building, was constructed in the early 1980s and hosts our swimming school for children and essential hydrotherapy program.

Our pools serve nearly 1,000 people every week, providing freedom, therapy, and joy to individuals of all ages and abilities. Those who benefit from our pools include:

-  Young children from our kindergarten
-  People on the autism spectrum
-  Adults with cerebral palsy
-  Adults with visual impairments
-  Adults with Parkinson's disease
-  Nova Festival survivors and other [Shesek participants](#)



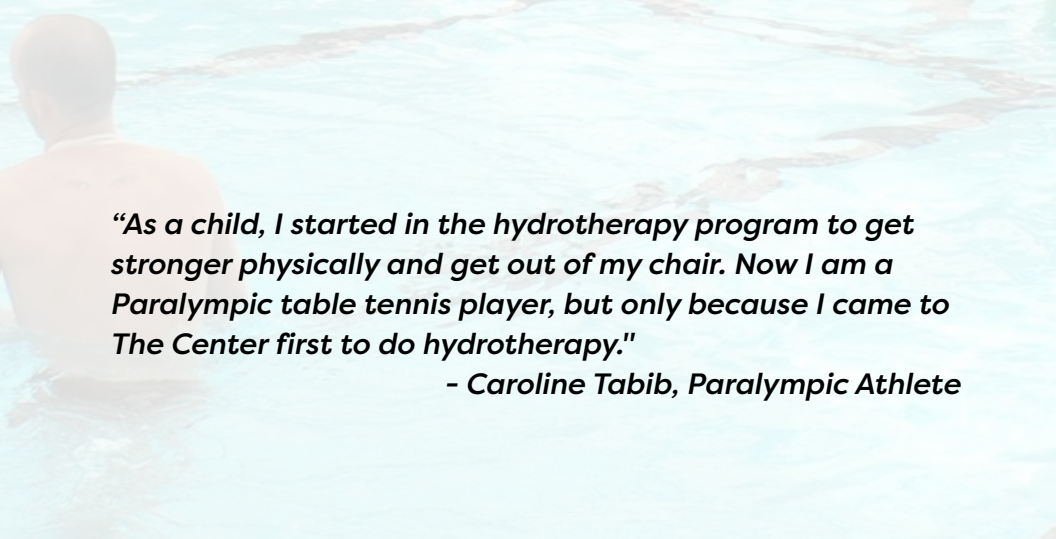

Revitalizing A Hub for Rehabilitation

Both the Atlanta Community Pool, housed in an aluminum structure with PVC sheeting, and the Children's Pool receive regular maintenance in order to keep them in operation. While The Center has done its utmost to maintain these structures, they are both over 50 years old and are in need of urgent renovations.

The Atlanta Community Pool has a mechanical room in a basement alongside the pool, and a heating system as well. The environment of the mechanical room is extremely corrosive, causing significant damage over time to not only the equipment but the structure itself.

The Children's Pool is used heavily on a daily basis, taking a toll on the pool's overall structure and its surrounding area.

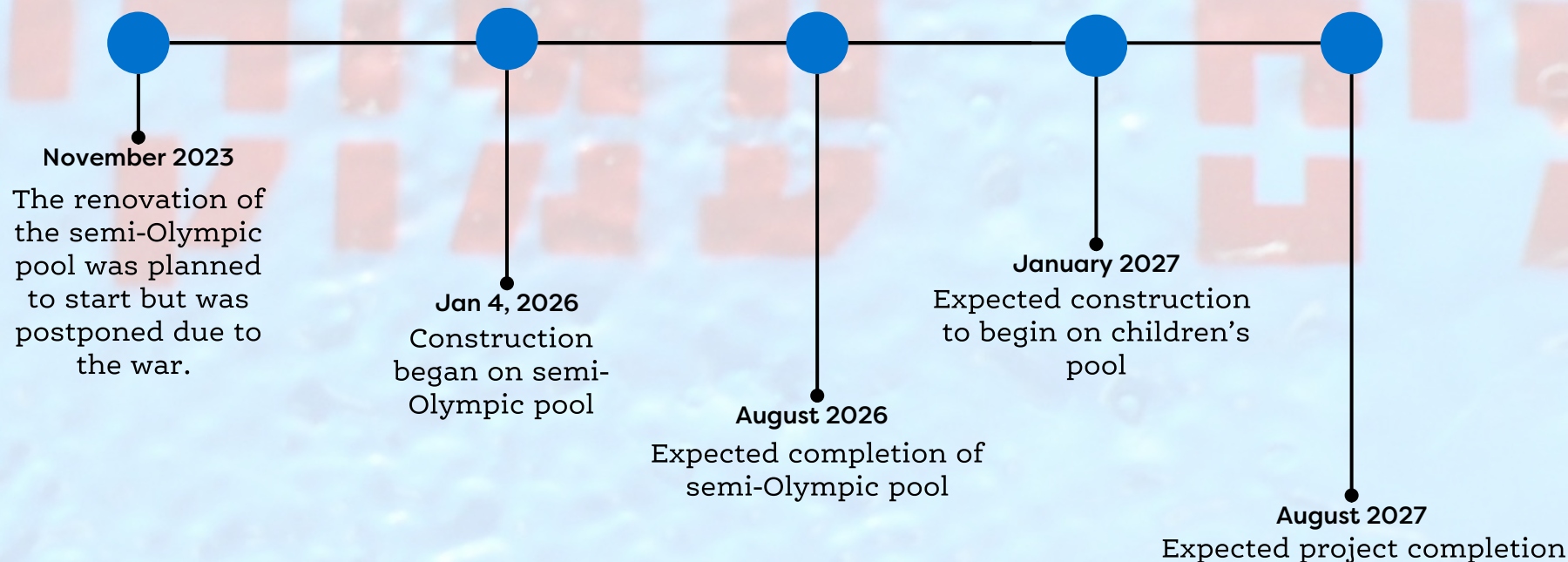
Revitalizing A Hub for Rehabilitation (cont.)

In order for The Center to continue to provide its essential swimming programs and to keep this important part of our community operating in the long-term, a complete renovation of both pools is being conducted.

This renovation will include:

- Resurfacing the pool basin and infrastructure of both pools
- Upgrading the mechanical systems: filtering, heating, pipes, controls
- Overhauling the basement mechanical room, including essential repairs and reinforcement of the building infrastructure
- Renovating the pool premises, from upgrading flooring and fencing to accessible doorways. These renovations will include further accommodations for people with disabilities and bringing the Aquatic Center into compliance with accessibility regulations.
- Renovating the changing rooms with new flooring, ceiling, showers, toilets and infrastructure.
- Installing solar panels to provide cost-efficient and sustainable heating

Funding Needs

Our project to revitalize the Aquatic Center was initially planned to begin in 2024, with an initial \$3.5 million raised, but, due to post-war financial turbulence, a surge in construction costs has slowed renovations down. In order for us to complete the project, we require a total of \$5.4 million. We are also seeking an additional 20% in order to create a maintenance fund for the pools, bringing our total need to \$6.5 million.

A generous donor has stepped up to help us reach our goal, donating \$1 million already while offering to match any donations toward the final \$2 million needed.

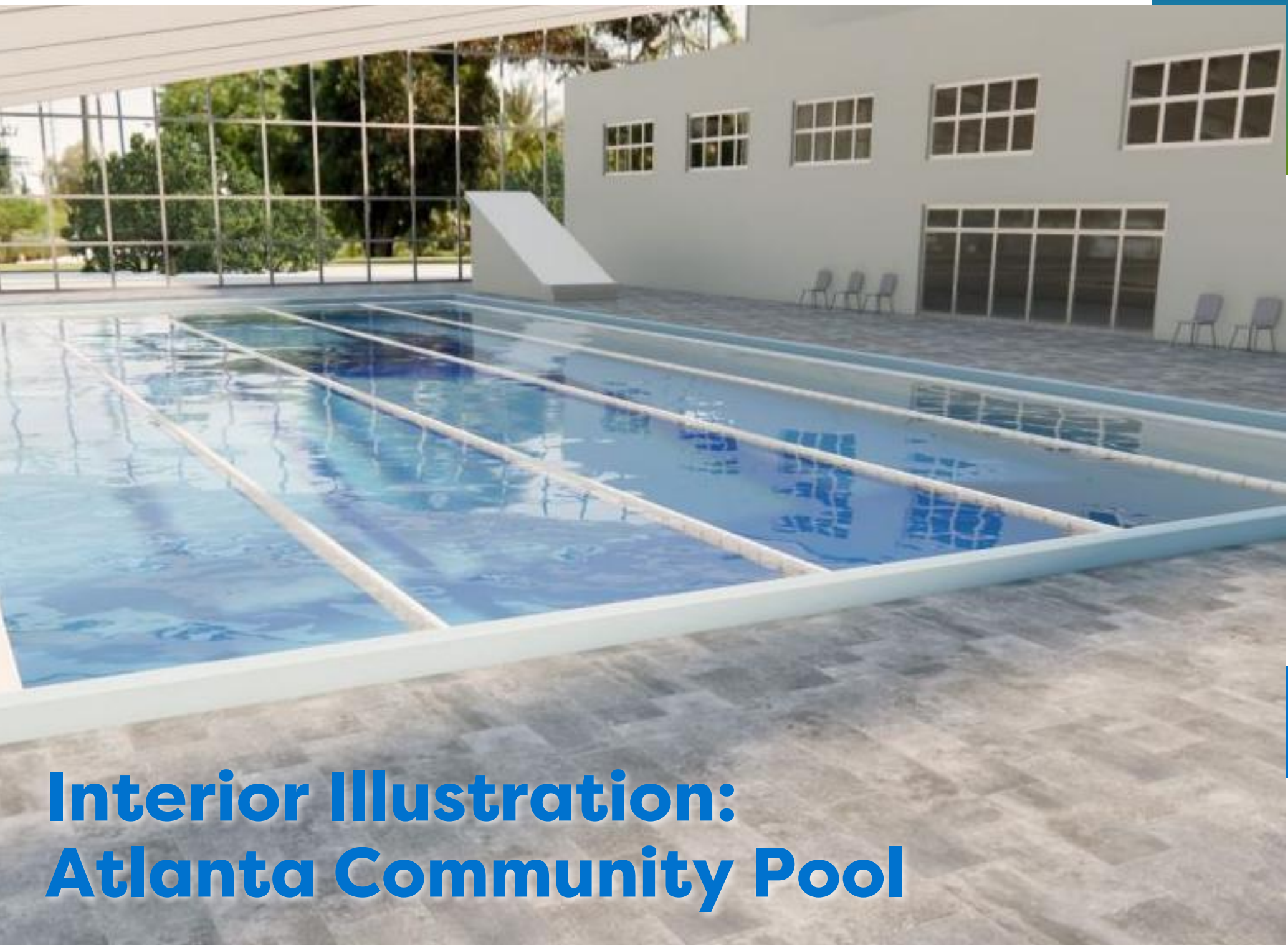

Swim Boulevard

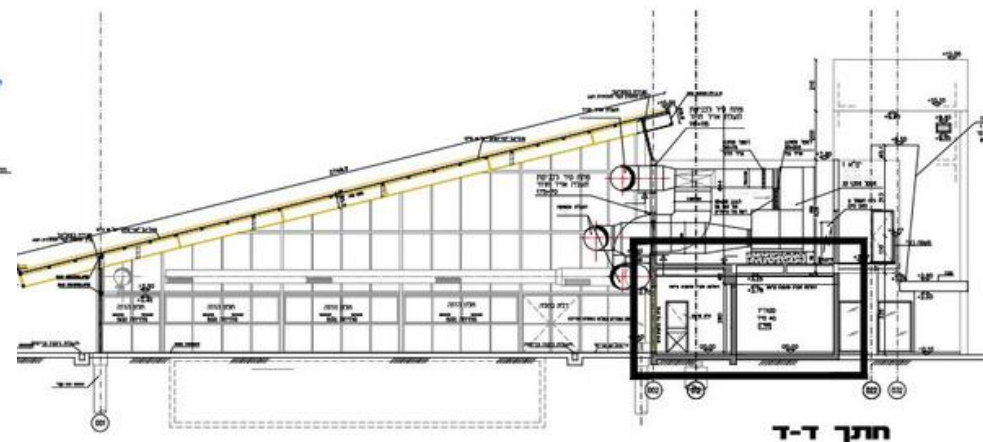
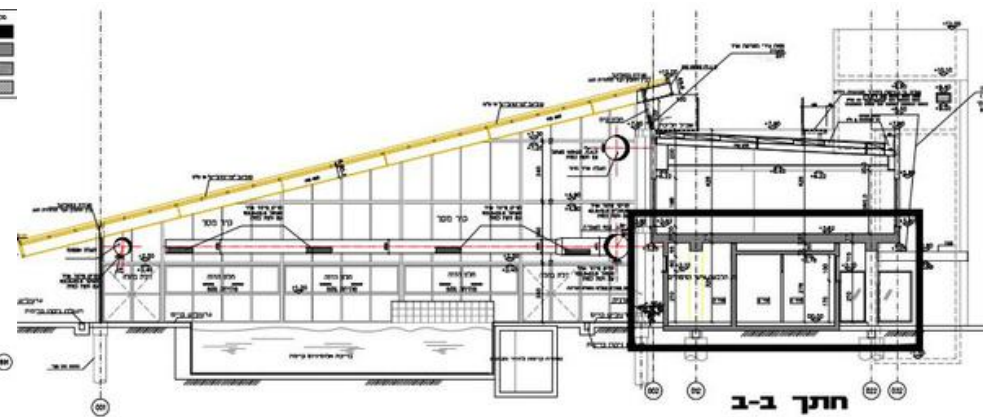
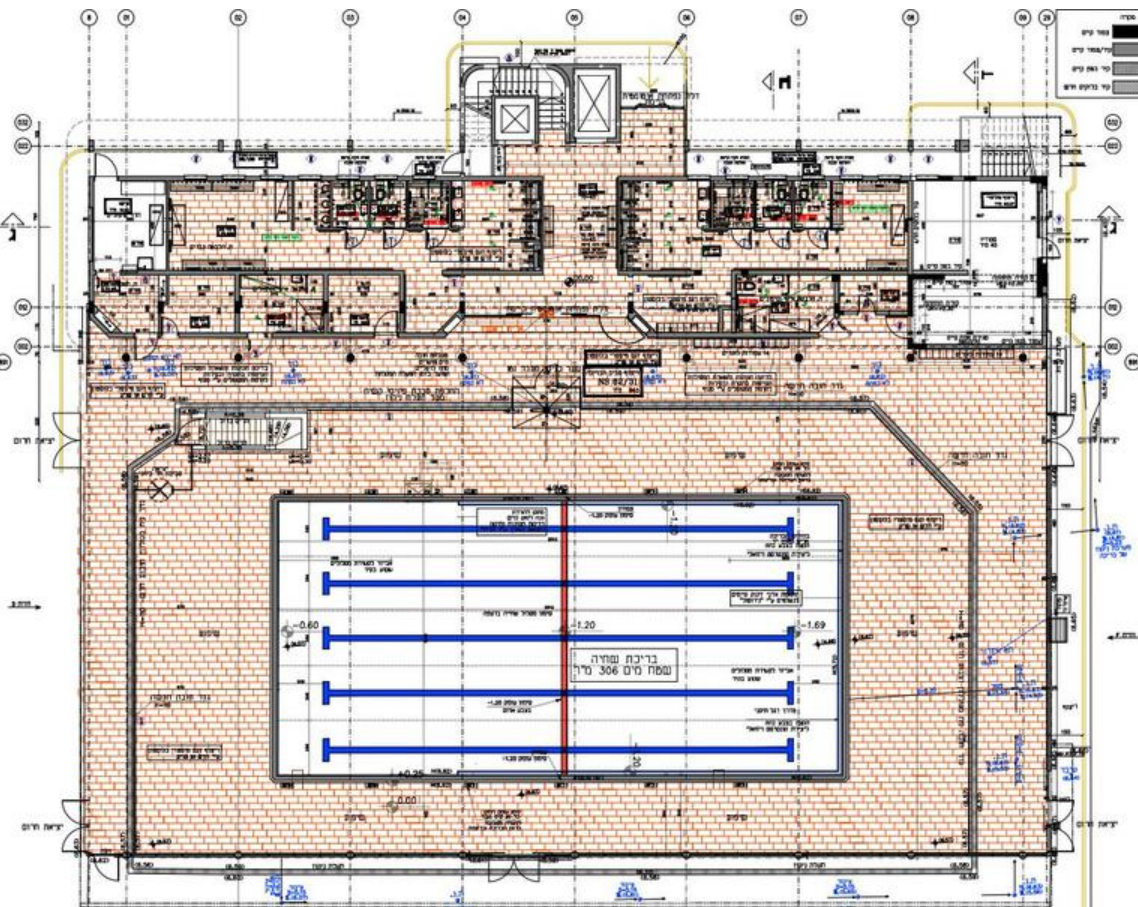

Interior Illustration: Atlanta Community Pool

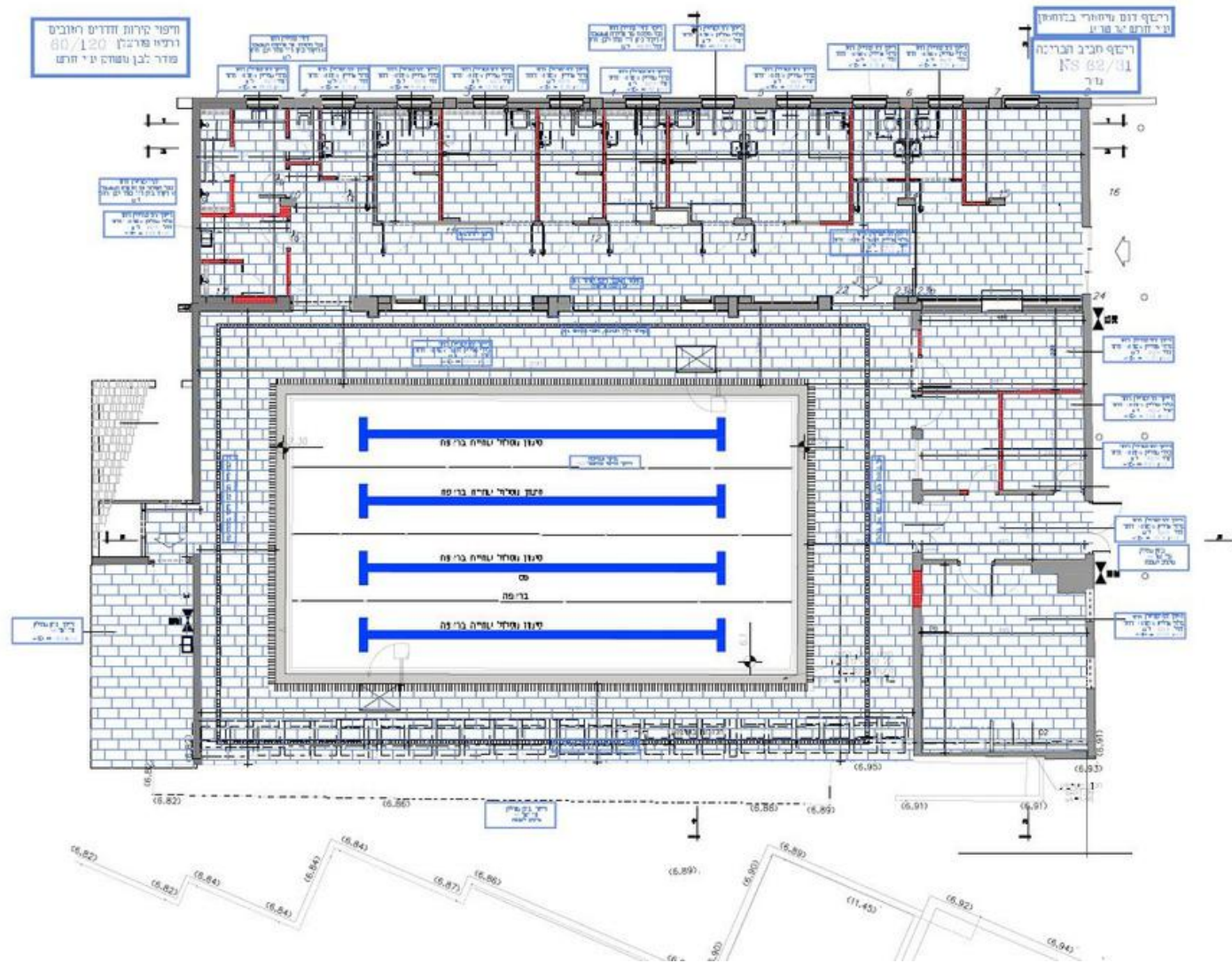
Architectural Plan: Atlanta Community Pool
