We live in a time of flux. In his remarks before the UN General Assembly on 10 March, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., called this a time of “profound global upheaval”, one where institutions designed for peace are tested by conflicts, geopolitical rivalries and complexities of modern challenges. In that address, the President declared the unequivocal and unwavering commitment of the Philippines, a founding member of the United Nations, as a force for good: a partner pathfinder and peacemaker; shaper of solutions; and voice for principled diplomacy.

This global context brings the Philippines and Germany closer together. For between us, we foster deeply shared values, as democracies, as responsible global actors and as bilateral partners. Momentum is high on many fronts. A new agreement on defense cooperation was signed less than a year ago. Mutual trust and confidence are stretching the frontiers of cooperation in areas such as good governance, maritime safety and security, climate action, and green energy transition.

Bilateral economic relations point to an upward trajectory, riding on the wave of unprecedented interest in Southeast Asia and Europe in doing more business together. Germany is expanding its footprint in the Philippines, as it becomes more engaged in ASEAN’s 690-million strong market. The Philippines’ ASEAN Chairship this year has its sights set on ASEAN’s future, with deliverables aimed to make the ASEAN Economic Community more integrated, prosperous, resilient and future-ready.

Negotiations between the Philippines and the European Union on a Free Trade Agreement are drawing to a close. This deal is a springboard for taking the level of Philippines - Germany trade forward, for it to achieve greater scale and depth.

Having been an important driver of this bilateral relationship, the German-Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (GPCCI) is well-positioned to propel our economic ties to break new grounds, connect more stakeholders, and reach its fullest potential.

I trust that the GPCCI will rise to the occasion with fresh ideas, foresight and ambition.

President Year Review

Over the past year, German-Philippine business relations have continued to strengthen through sustained engagement, high-level exchanges, and meaningful collaboration across sectors. This reflects both the depth of our bilateral partnership and the Philippines' growing role as a strategic partner for Germany in the ASEAN region.

The year began with a strong focus on reinforcing institutional partnerships and advancing our advocacy agenda. In June 2025, we engaged with the Department of Trade and Industry, aligning on priorities for investment promotion and industry development. Our expanding partnership with the Anti-Red Tape Authority further underscored our commitment to improving the ease of doing business. In May 2025, GPCCI participated in the AHK World Conference in Berlin, a key platform for exchanging best practices and positioning the Philippines within the global AHK network.

A major milestone was the Green Jobs Forum in July 2025, which brought together stakeholders to advance discussions on sustainability and workforce development. During the forum, we formalized our partnership with TESDA through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding, reinforcing our shared commitment to skills development and green employment. This momentum continued with the Dual Training Summit in September 2025, strengthening efforts to align industry needs with workforce development. Through initiatives such as the Skills Experts Program and Training of Trainers, we expanded local capacities and launched the first Industrial Mechanic Program in the Philippines. Complementary programs such as ProRecognition continued to support workforce mobility and global competitiveness.

Throughout the year, our sector-focused conferences on medical technology, energy, water, and food and packaging provided platforms for dialogue and business exchange. In total, the Chamber facilitated around 300 targeted business meetings, bringing German and Philippine companies together. These were complemented by the continued work of our committees, which remain central to our advocacy efforts. Through the Policy and Advocacy Committee, we contributed to key policy discussions, including CREATE MORE and engagements with the Department of Labor and Employment. Meanwhile, the Information Technology Committee advanced conversations on the digital economy and data infrastructure, while the Joint Maritime Committee strengthened industry collaboration.

Our role as a knowledge partner was reinforced through the release of key publications, including the Philippine Country Brochure, the Spring and Fall 2025 World Business Outlook and the German-Philippine Business Insights editions in June and December 2025. These outputs provided timely, data-driven insights to support business decision-making and policy dialogue, alongside our continued contributions through sectoral white papers.

The highlight of the year was Mabuhay Germany 2025: In High Spirits, held in November 2025, which brought together a broad spectrum of stakeholders and showcased the strength of our bilateral partnership. We thank our 55 exhibitors and partners, as well as the 25,000 visitors who joined us for a vibrant and engaging weekend.

At the same time, we expanded our network with 30 new members and strengthened engagement through formats such as our 'Kaffee Klatsch' gatherings —creating closer, more informal touchpoints with our community.

We began 2026 with continued momentum, marked by the Joint Maritime Conference in January, advancing cooperation in the maritime sector. This was followed by high-level engagements in February 2026, including the visit of German parliamentarians from the Committee on Labour and Supply Chains and German Minister of State Florian Hahn. These engagements reaffirmed the strong partnership between Germany and the Philippines, particularly in labor mobility, supply chains, and sustainable economic cooperation.

In parallel, the Philippines' ASEAN Chairmanship created further opportunities for regional engagement. GPCCI participated in key platforms such as the ASEAN Editors & Economic Opinion Leaders Forum and the ASEAN Business Environment Forum, strengthening our role in regional economic dialogue and positioning the German-Philippine business community within broader ASEAN developments.

Beyond the Philippines, we brought our services closer to Germany through consultation days in Magdeburg and Frankfurt, supporting companies exploring opportunities in the Philippine market. Engagements within the broader AHK network, including exchanges with Thailand and in Shanghai, further expanded our global perspective.

Across all these efforts, our work has been made possible through close collaboration with our members, key partners such as the German Embassy Manila and the German Club, and government stakeholders, including the Department of Trade and Industry, the Board of Investments, the Asian Development Bank, TESDA, and ARTA. Together, these initiatives reflect a forward-looking approach to strengthening German-Philippine economic relations and supporting sustainable growth.

As I conclude my term, I extend my deepest gratitude to our members, partners, and stakeholders for your continued trust and collaboration. It has been a privilege to serve this dynamic community and to contribute to the advancement of German-Philippine economic relations. Being the first Filipina President of the Chamber is both an honor and a responsibility—one that I hope will inspire greater representation and leadership in the years to come. Thank you for your continued support, and I look forward to seeing the Chamber thrive in the years ahead.

While the anticipated visit of the German Federal President was unfortunately postponed due to geopolitical developments, the very prospect of such a visit reflects the strengthening visibility and relevance of the Philippines in Germany's global outlook.

With the election of a new Board during AGM, we look forward to renewed momentum, fresh perspectives, and continued strategic direction for the Chamber. We also anticipate further strengthening our partnerships with government institutions, continuing to deepen cooperation in areas that are most relevant to our members and the broader business community. Alongside this, our committee work remains a key pillar of our efforts, ensuring that industry voices are heard and that our initiatives stay aligned with real, evolving needs.

In the year ahead, we are committed to delivering events and initiatives that are both timely and meaningful for our members and stakeholders. From returning crowd favorites such as the upcoming Mabuhay Germany Ambassador's Cup (Golf Tournament), to more forward-looking and timely engagements, including a security delegation and conference later this year (a topic we have not previously explored), we aim to create platforms that foster meaningful dialogue, fresh perspectives, and tangible opportunities for German and Philippine businesses. 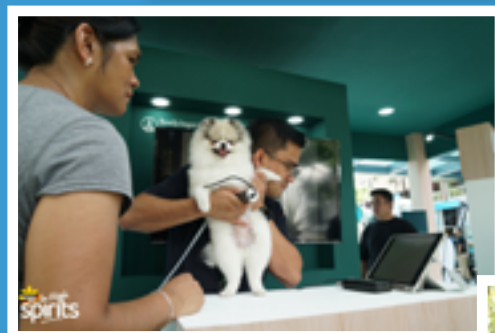

Mabuhay Germany: In High Spirits

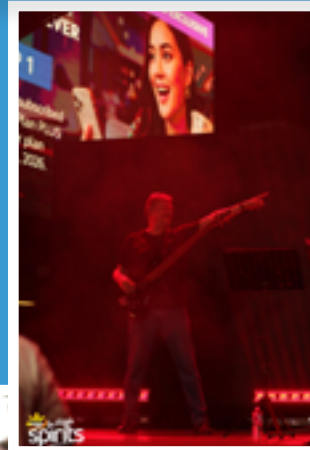
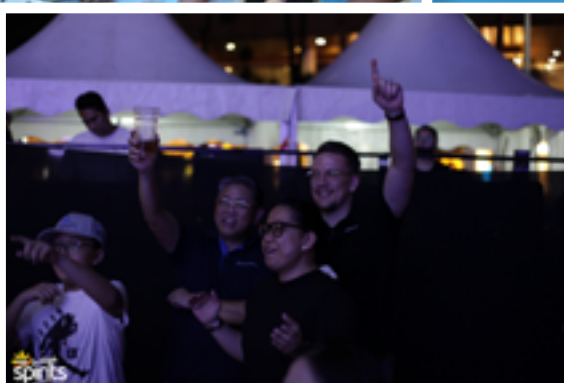

TRADE PROMOTION HIGHLIGHTS

Promoting German Technology and Solutions

GPCCI implements a range of public projects each year under various trade promotion initiatives of the German government. As part of these programs, the Chamber continuously monitors market developments and business opportunities in the Philippines and regularly submits project proposals to German partner institutions. Throughout the year, GPCCI implemented several exciting projects that showcased German innovation and created new opportunities for collaboration with Philippine partners. These initiatives typically take the form of business delegations and industry-focused missions that introduce German technologies, solutions, and expertise to the Philippine market while fostering partnerships between German and local stakeholders across diverse sectors.

DRIVING INNOVATION IN PHILIPPINE HEALTHCARE

Medical Technology and Digital Health Mission May 5-8, 2025

Seven German medical technology companies explored business opportunities in the Philippines. More than 88 B2B meetings were arranged enabling direct engagement with prospective local partners. The program included a Doing Business briefing with the Board of Investments, the Food and Drug Administration, and the Department of Health, complemented by hospital visits and a conference that provided valuable insights into the industry landscape. Driven by a growing population, hospital expansion, and increasing demand for digital healthcare solutions, the Philippine medical technology market continues to offer strong growth potential for international providers.



ADVANCING RENEWABLE ENERGY PARTNERSHIPS

German Smart Grid & Energy Solutions Mission June 23-26, 2025

Seven German SMEs specializing in smart grid and RE solutions presented themselves to the Philippine industry. The event brought together 80 stakeholders, including industry leaders, government representatives, and sector experts, who actively engage in discussions and networking sessions. GPCCI organized 70 B2B meetings to facilitate partnerships and support market entry. With ambitious renewable energy targets and rising electricity demand, the Philippines presents growing opportunities for international companies offering smart grid and energy integration technologies.

STRENGTHENING GERMAN-PHILIPPINE COOPERATION IN WATER TECHNOLOGY

German Water Technology Mission November 24-27, 2025:

Ten German companies participated in the Water Technology Business Delegation to the Philippines. 87 B2B meetings with potential partners were organized, 100 conference participants acquired and group meetings with the big 2 water concessionaires organized. The project was strongly supported by the local industry associations and representatives. Increasing urbanization and aging infrastructure are driving significant investments in water supply, wastewater treatment, and resilient water infrastructure across the Philippines.

Supply Chain Diversification Efforts June to July 2025

The 4th ASEAN Purchasing Initiative brought together German procurement representatives and qualified suppliers from across Southeast Asia to explore new sourcing opportunities and strengthen resilient supply chains. As part of the initiative, the German-Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry supported the promotion of the program in the Philippines and facilitated the participation of Philippine suppliers. Philippine companies were invited to present their manufacturing capabilities and engage in targeted B2B meetings with German buyers seeking reliable sourcing partners in the region.

MOVING TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE FOOD AND PACKAGING

German Food & Packaging machinery Delegation February 9-12, 2026

Six German firms specializing in food and packaging machinery visited the Philippines and had a total of 60 B2B meetings, a site visit to a local production facility, and a conference with industry executives, government officials, and technology specialists. As the Philippine food sector grows and sustainability becomes a key focus, technologies that promote sustainable practices are essential for regulatory compliance and enhancing the country's transition toward a circular economy.

Germany Trade & Invest (GTAI) is the international business promotion agency of the Federal Republic of Germany. GTAI supports Germany's small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) with a wide range of export promotion measures. GTAI's business analysts regularly report on 150 countries and provide the knowledge base for planning and conducting foreign business activities. 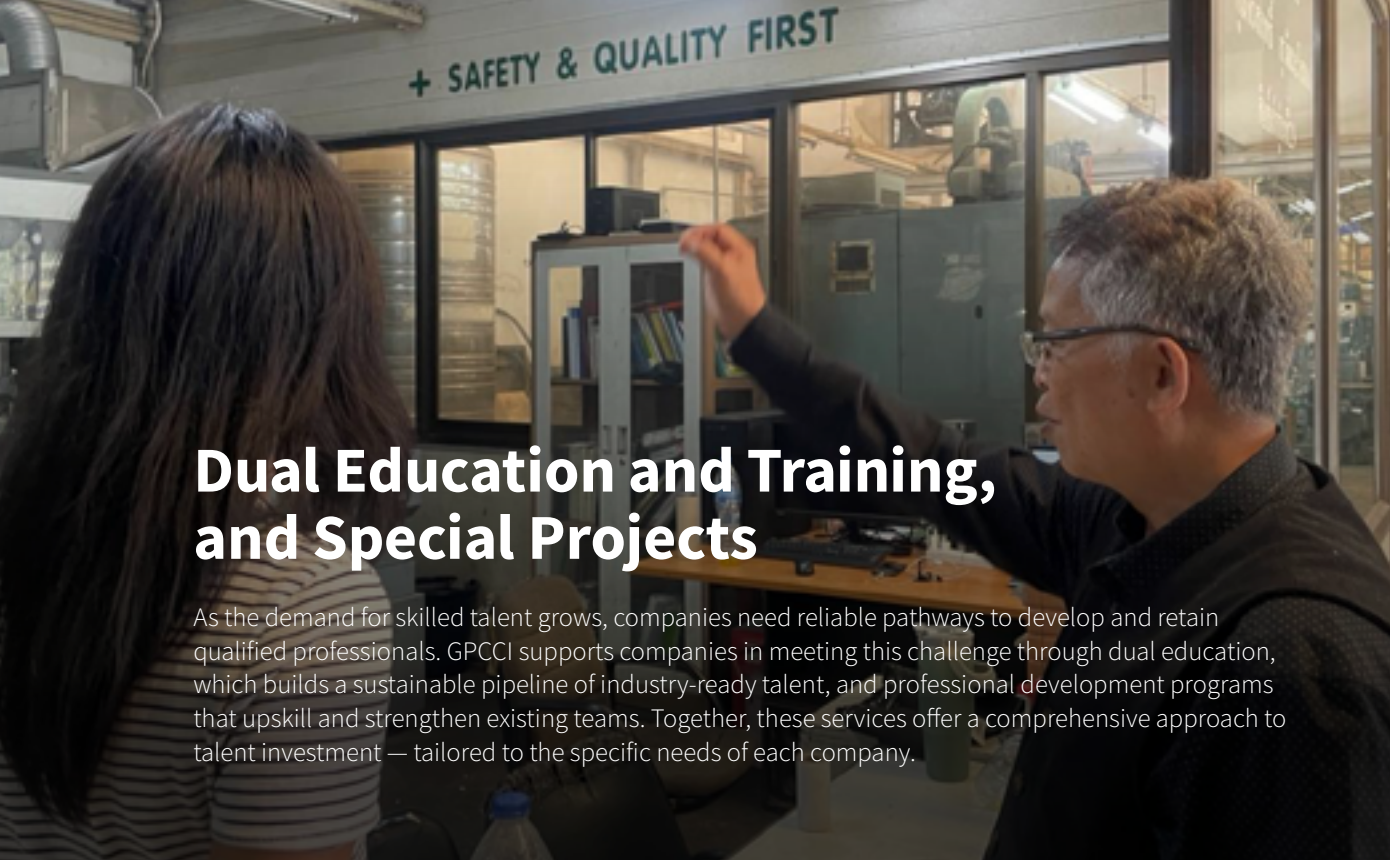

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS HIGHLIGHTS

◀ **Championing German Business and Strengthening Policy Dialogue in the Philippines**

The Government Affairs Department of the German-Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (GPCCI) continued to reinforce its role as a trusted bridge between German businesses and Philippine policymakers through sustained, strategic engagement. By convening high-level dialogues, activating committee-led platforms, and producing policy-relevant knowledge outputs, GPCCI advanced discussions on key issues such as investment, digitalization, healthcare, sustainability, and workforce development. At the core of these efforts was a clear commitment to championing the interests of German companies operating in the Philippines, while contributing to a more enabling, transparent, and forward-looking business environment.

ADVANCING POLICY DIALOGUE THROUGH HIGH-LEVEL ENGAGEMENTS

Throughout 2025, GPCCI convened and participated in high-level engagements with key Philippine government institutions and international partners to support policy alignment and bilateral cooperation. Strategic dialogues with agencies such as the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT), Department of Finance (DOF), and Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) provided platforms to exchange perspectives, clarify regulatory developments, and address business concerns.



These engagements were complemented by close coordination with the German Embassy Manila and international organizations, including the International Labour Organization (ILO), reinforcing a shared commitment to sustainable economic development, skills formation, and inclusive growth. By facilitating these exchanges, GPCCI ensured that German business perspectives are meaningfully integrated into ongoing policy and regulatory discussions.



Advancing Key Policy Areas Through Strategic Initiatives

In 2025, GPCCI led and supported a range of strategic initiatives addressing priority policy areas critical to German-Philippine business relations:



Sustainability and Green Transition:

Through flagship events such as the Sustainability Forum and the Green Jobs Forum, GPCCI facilitated dialogue on climate action, renewable energy, and workforce transformation, while strengthening institutional cooperation with TESDA on green skills development.



Healthcare Policy and Systems Strengthening:

Multi-sectoral roundtables on cardio-renal-metabolic diseases and stroke care brought together government, industry, and patient groups to address systemic gaps and advance integrated healthcare strategies aligned with the Universal Health Care framework.



Digitalization and Data Governance:

Dialogues on data protection, e-governance, and digital infrastructure highlighted the importance of cybersecurity, regulatory clarity, and digital transformation in strengthening the Philippines' competitiveness in the digital economy.



Investment Climate and Economic Reform:

Engagements on the CREATE MORE Act and broader economic reforms provided clarity on incentives, taxation, and regulatory developments, supporting a more competitive and investor-friendly environment.



Workforce Development and Labor Policy:

Through continued collaboration with TESDA and DOLE, as well as engagement with international partners, GPCCI promoted dual training, green skills development, and improved regulatory frameworks for foreign employment.

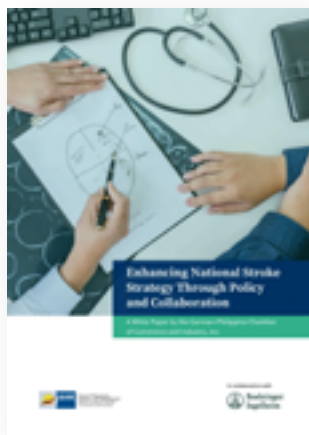

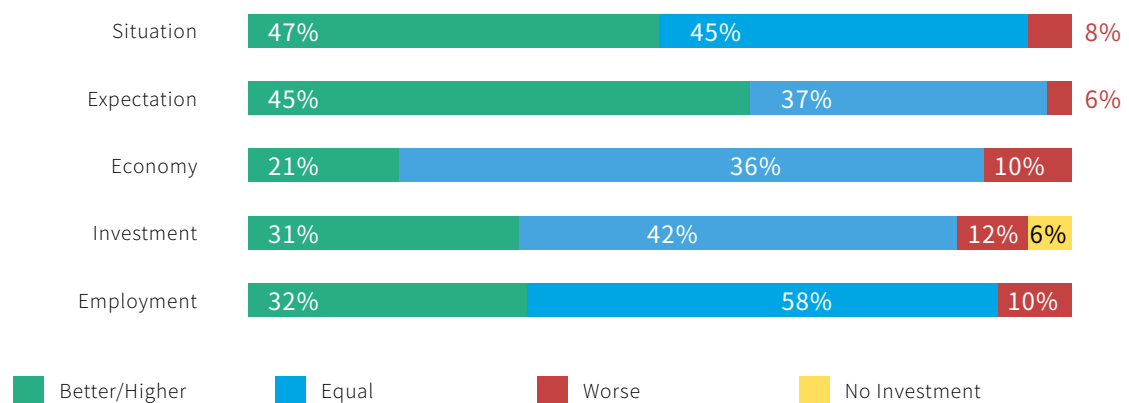

GPCCI remains committed to equipping businesses with data-driven insights and strategic guidance through its publications. The World Business Outlook (WBO) Survey provided a snapshot of German business sentiment in the Philippines, highlighting optimism in market stability and investment growth, while also identifying challenges in regulatory compliance and workforce development. Following the Industry 4.0 Forum, GPCCI released a White Paper analyzing the Philippines' digital transformation journey, emphasizing the need for cohesive national policies and workforce upskilling, while showcasing Germany's role in advancing automation and industrial innovation.

AHK BUSINESS OUTLOOK SURVEY: FALL 2025 RESULTS



To support foreign investors – especially from Germany, GPCCI published the 2024 Philippine Investment Guidebook, offering market insights, legal frameworks, and sector-specific opportunities for German businesses entering the Philippine market. Additionally, the German-Philippine Business Insights (GPBI) publication continued to provide expert analyses on trade, investment trends, and regulatory updates, helping businesses navigate the evolving economic landscape. These publications reinforce GPCCI's role as a leading resource for business intelligence, shaping policy discussions and investment strategies between Germany and the Philippines. At the same time, the survey underscored key structural challenges, including

regulatory uncertainty, legal predictability, skills shortages, and tax administration concerns—highlighting areas where continued policy reform is critical. These insights directly informed GPCCI's advocacy priorities, reinforcing the importance of transparent governance, regulatory consistency, and workforce development. In parallel, GPCCI produced policy-oriented white papers on priority topics such as avian influenza and national stroke strategy, offering evidence-based recommendations to support government decision-making and industry alignment. The Chamber also provided timely analyses of major policy developments, including the 2025 State of the Nation Address, translating national priorities into actionable insights for the business community.

Advocacy through Committees

Report of the Treasurer

The Chamber began 2025 with positive outlook, supported by numerous projects in the pipeline. These included the flagship event - Mabuhay Germany™, Dual Training activities through Skills Expert Program, ProRecognition and Hand-in-Hand Projects, member and stakeholder engagement efforts, various committee-led initiatives and the delegation of German businesses to the Philippines. In anticipation of increased activity, the Chamber strategically expanded its workforce to support growing operational demands.

The Chamber continues to foster closer partnerships between German businesses and the Philippine national government through forums. These forums serve as dynamic platforms for dialogue, collaboration, and relationship-building. By facilitating stronger connections and understanding between these key stakeholders, this initiative aims to promote sustainable growth and mutual prosperity. In 2025, the Chamber is working closely with the German Embassy in the Philippines to champion Green Growth and Climate Action.

In June 2025, the Chamber was awarded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Climate Action the Skills Expert Program which will run until 2027. The project aims to establish practical, dual vocational training based on German standards in partner countries. The Chamber is in close collaboration with partners and government institutions to successfully run this project.

Despite the economic uncertainties and challenges encountered throughout the year, our financial management practices and strategic decision-making have proven effective in ensuring a balanced financial outcome. The success of the Chamber would not have been achieved without the unwavering support and collaboration of its stakeholders.

First of all, a strong and vibrant membership base with many loyal and committed sponsors. We wholeheartedly thank our partners of 2025: Allianz PNB, BDB Law, BDO, Boehringer Ingelheim Philippines, Centro Manpower, Aumovio Philippines, Eastern Communications, FLS Group Philippines, GlueUp (technology

Secondly, the close and trustful cooperation with the DIHK and the global AHK network. This collaborative partnership allowed us to anticipate financial trends, exchange best practices among AHKs worldwide, and access to invaluable advice and flexibility when needed. To further strengthen the cooperation, more employees were seconded to DIHK in 2025 to undertake targeted training programs.

The third aspect was the strong service orientation of GPCCI's portfolio. The Chamber's commitment to providing high-quality, value-added services tailored to the needs of its members and stakeholders has been instrumental in driving customer satisfaction and long-term loyalty.

The Chamber will continue to work to foster closer partnerships between German businesses and the Philippine national government. To counter inflation, the Chamber announced the yearly increase of membership fees starting 2026. The Mabuhay Germany™ will continually be launched in 2026 through Golf Tournament. The Hand-in-Hand for International Talents Project ended in 2026, which is earlier than planned. The Chamber is confident to see another financially solid year.

The numbers of the 1st quarter are promising which was driven by the successful launching of the first Joint Maritime Conference last 29 January 2026.
