Coronach

Tucked along the southern edge of Saskatchewan, just north of the United States border, Coronach is a community built on resilience, industry, and connection to the land.

Founded in the early 1900s, Coronach grew alongside the surrounding agricultural landscape and the development of coal mining and power generation in the region. These industries shaped the community's development, supporting generations of families and playing a key role in its growth.

Located just minutes from the Canada-United States border crossing into Montana, Coronach has long played a role in linking people, trade, and travel across the southern prairie border.

The community's name itself carries a unique story. Coronach was named after a champion racehorse that won the Epsom Derby in 1926. The name reflects a spirit of strength and distinction that continues to define the community today.

Beyond its industrial history, Coronach is known as the gateway to the Big Muddy Badlands, one of Saskatchewan's most unique and storied landscapes. This rugged terrain has long been associated with outlaw history, including tales of hideouts and frontier life that continue to capture the imagination.

Coronach blends its working roots with a strong sense of community pride. Whether through its history, its connection to the land, or its role as a starting point for exploration, it remains a place where past and present meet in meaningful ways.

Rockglen

Set among rolling hills in the Wood Mountain Uplands, Rockglen is a community shaped by landscape, history, and discovery.

Located along Highways 2 and 18, just north of the Canada-United States border, Rockglen sits within one of the few unglaciated areas in North America. This unique geological history has left behind a land rich with hidden treasures, including petrified wood and fossils that continue to draw interest today.

Established in 1927, shortly after the arrival of the railway, Rockglen quickly became a central hub for the surrounding region. Nestled in a small valley, the community grew as a service centre for nearby farms and ranches, supporting generations of agricultural families.

Long before settlement, the area was an important gathering and hunting ground for First Nations. The region is also connected to the story of Sitting Bull, who sought refuge in the area during the late 1800s.

Early settlers, including British, French, and Scandinavian families, established cattle and sheep ranching in response to the rolling terrain and soil conditions. Over time, Rockglen became a place where people came together for business, services, and community life.

Today, Rockglen reflects both its deep history and its unique landscape. It is a place where the past is visible in the land itself, and where the stories of those who lived here continue to shape the community.



Willow Bunch



Set among the rolling hills and coulees of southern Saskatchewan, Willow Bunch is one of the oldest communities in the province, with a history that reaches back to 1870.

Founded by Métis settlers who moved west from the Red River region, Willow Bunch became an important early settlement rooted in culture, connection to the land, and community. The area was originally known as Talle de Saules, named for the abundant willow trees that shaped both the landscape and early life in the region.

Over time, the community grew as waves of settlers arrived, including strong French-Canadian influences that remain part of its identity today. Agriculture and ranching became central to life in the region, while the surrounding coulees and open land helped shape a way of life closely tied to the natural environment.

Willow Bunch is also known for its larger-than-life history. It is the home of Édouard Beaurpré, one of the tallest men ever recorded, whose story continues to draw interest and curiosity. The community's museum and heritage spaces reflect this rich past, preserving the stories of early settlers, Métis culture, and life on the southern prairies. Today, Willow Bunch stands as a place where history is deeply woven into the landscape. Its roots, stories, and cultural influences continue to shape the community, offering a glimpse into one of Saskatchewan's earliest and most enduring settlements.



Bengough

Located along Highway 34 in the rolling prairie of southern Saskatchewan, Bengough is a community shaped by agriculture, history, and a strong sense of place.

Founded in the early 1900s, Bengough grew as a service centre for the surrounding farming region. Generations of families built their lives here, establishing deep roots in grain farming and ranching that continue to define the area today.

The town itself was named after John Wilson Bengough, a prominent Canadian editorial cartoonist and publisher known for shaping political commentary in the late nineteenth century. This connection reflects a period in Canadian history when storytelling and public dialogue were beginning to take form through print and illustration.

The land around Bengough has a much longer history. It was used by Indigenous peoples for generations before settlement, and later became home to a diverse mix of settlers who helped shape the community through agriculture and perseverance. As the region grew, Bengough became a gathering place for services, business, and community life.

Today, Bengough remains grounded in its agricultural roots, where history, landscape, and community continue to shape everyday life on the southern prairies.



THINGS TO SEE & DO

Big Muddy Tours

117 Centre Street, Coronach, SK

Big Muddy Tours is the only guided excursion of the Big Muddy with exclusive access to protected historic locations. Hear stories of when the buffalo used to roam and infamous outlaws, such as Sam Kelly, evaded the law, all while experiencing the unique landscape of the Badlands. Visitors will use their own vehicles, while the guide hops in to provide a guided tour through interpretation and stories of the local history. Tours must be pre-booked.

Westmoreland Coal Mine Tours

Coronach, SK | 306-994-6813

See 2 of the largest draglines in Canada, powered entirely by electricity, that are used to remove the overburden and expose the coal seams. The coal is dug up by loader, then loaded on 150 Ton capacity coal haulers. It is delivered to the crusher, from there to the load haul out. From there it is transported by train on Poplar River's privately owned train.

Coronach District Museum

Step back in time at the Coronach District Museum, housed in the town's historic hospital. Since 1987, it has showcased the lives of early settlers, farmers, and miners in the region. Each restored room - from schoolhouse to kitchen - features artifacts, photographs, and stories that bring southern Saskatchewan's heritage to life. A must-visit for history lovers and curious travellers alike.

Bridging Eras Mural Tour

Explore the story of Coronach through the vibrant colors and captivating scenes of our "Bridging Eras" Mural Walking Tour! This self-guided tour takes you through four unique stops across town, each featuring a mural that celebrates different chapters in our community's history. From the determination of our early settlers and the growth of the railroad to the innovations shaping our future, each mural captures the spirit of Coronach across generations.

Poplar River Community Park

**5 km east of Coronach on Highway 18, Coronach, SK

Poplar River Community Park is located on the Cookson River and offers a variety of campsites and amenities. Boating, swimming, fishing and water sports are common recreation activities. There are 30 campsites in total: 15, 30, and 50-amp, and non-serviced sites. The campsites have clean, modern washrooms with coin-operated showers. Non-potable water is available on site along with a dump station. There is an event building available for rent to host your next gathering.

Rockglen Visitor Centre, Museum & RV Park

207 S Railway Avenue, Rockglen, SK

OPEN: May long weekend - September long weekend

Historic two storey railway station built in 1928, reflecting the central role of the railway in Rockglen's early development. The station served as the community's main transportation hub for decades before being relocated in 1982 to preserve its history. Today, it operates as the Rockglen Visitor Centre, offering local information, exhibits, and displays of artifacts, art, and crafts from the area.

Yost Wildlife Federation Hike

2 km south of Rockglen, SK | GPS 49 09 47.00" N, 105 57 16.10" W

A scenic hiking trail located south of Rockglen, offering elevated views across the Wood Mountain Uplands. The trail provides opportunities to experience native prairie landscapes and observe local wildlife in their natural habitat. With open skies and rolling hills, it is a peaceful place to connect with the land. It is part of the network of local hikes that highlight the region's natural beauty. Self guided.

Burning Hills Hike and Viewpoint

3.5 km south of Rockglen, SK | GPS 49 09 09.85" N, 105 56 34.00" W

This hiking area offers panoramic views from some of the highest elevations in the region. Visitors can take in sweeping prairie landscapes, unique geological features, and dramatic valley views. The area is known for its striking scenery and photo opportunities. It provides a strong sense of the scale and beauty of the South Country. Self guided.

Buffalo Jump at Fife Lake

Northeast of Rockglen, SK. 11 km northeast of Rockglen off highway 2

GPS 49 12 24.80" N, 105 52 46.88" W

A historic Indigenous hunting site located near Fife Lake, where buffalo were once driven over the edge as part of traditional hunting practices. The site reflects the ingenuity and deep understanding of the land held by early Indigenous peoples. Today, it serves as an important cultural and historical landmark. Visitors can view the landscape and imagine its use centuries ago.

Effe Mattson Nature Walk & Archaeological Centre

207 S Railway Avenue, Rockglen, SK

This interpretive walking area highlights the unique geology and fossil history of the Rockglen region. Visitors can learn about ancient plant and animal life preserved in the unglaciated landscape, including discoveries such as mastodon remains. The site combines education with outdoor exploration, offering a deeper understanding of the area's natural history. It is an ideal stop for those interested in fossils and prairie ecosystems.

Rockglen Meteorite Impact Crater

Northeast of Rockglen, SK. 6 km east off highway 2

GPS 49 13 57.69" N, 106 03 44.13" W

A rare geological feature, this small but distinct crater is believed to have been formed by a meteorite impact many years ago. Measuring approximately 65 feet in diameter, it still retains a visible raised edge created by the force of the impact. While modest in size, the site offers a unique opportunity to view a natural event rarely preserved in the landscape. It is one of the more unusual stops along Rockglen's local tour route.

RockIn Beach Regional Park

7 km East of Rockglen on highway 2 along Fife Lake

Located east of Rockglen, this lakeside park offers a relaxing destination for water based recreation. Visitors can enjoy boating, fishing, bird watching, and camping, with a range of serviced sites available. The lake is also an important habitat for wildlife, including bird species such as the piping plover. With its mix of recreation and natural beauty, it is a popular summer destination in the region.

Bengough & District Regional Park

Adjacent to Bengough off highway 34 | **OPEN: May 1 - October 1**

The Bengough Regional Park is a small, well-treed main campground with a choice of tenting sites, 29 full hook-up sites, and 17 newly developed seasonal sites with 15, 30 or 50 amp power, water and sewer hook-ups. The 25-metre outdoor pool hosts aquatic and summer recreation programs, and features a hot tub. The park also boasts a 9-hole sand green golf course with a modern clubhouse and driving range, playground areas in the campground and by the pool, hiking trails, beach volleyball court, ball diamonds and horseshoe pits. Park amenities include potable water, modern washroom and shower facilities, camp kitchen, shade structure, dumping station, as well as a picnic tables and fire pits at all serviced sites. Free Wi-Fi is available in the main campground.

Bengough & District Museum

140 1st Avenue West, Bengough, SK

Local museum showcasing the diverse history of Bengough and surrounding area, with displays highlighting agriculture, early settlement, schools, businesses, and everyday life on the prairies. Exhibits include Indigenous and Hudson Bay Company artifacts, as well as collections of tools, household items, and historic equipment that reflect the region's past.





Willow Bunch Museum

Located in a historic former convent built in 1914, the Willow Bunch Museum showcases the rich history of the town and surrounding region. Spread over multiple floors, the museum features exhibits on Métis culture, early settlement, local families, and the story of Édouard Beupré, the Willow Bunch Giant. With a wide collection of artifacts and displays, it offers a detailed look into one of Saskatchewan's oldest communities and the people who shaped it. French tours available.

Jean Louis Legare Regional Park

1.6 km Southwest of Willow Bunch off highway 36

A natural, well-treed park, the Jean Louis Legare Regional Park features a campground with a variety of campsite options, a children's playground, a picnic area with shelter and a gazebo. Also located in the park is the Willow Bunch Golf Course. This championship, 9-hole grass greens golf course, with licensed clubhouse, provides club and power cart rentals, golf supplies, rental facilities and paved cart paths. The newly renovated outdoor pool along with a play park and picnic area are located in the nearby town of Willow Bunch.

Big Beaver Nature Centre

Located next to the regional park, the Big Muddy Nature Centre and Museum features animal, bird and rock displays, souvenirs and Indigenous artifacts.

The Old Porch Gallery

Along highway 18 in the Big Muddy | 306-267-4987

Located on the Circle Y Ranch in the historic Big Muddy Valley, The Old Porch Gallery showcases local history, art, antiques and artifacts. Tamela Burgess artworks and her history book of the Big Muddy Valley are for sale. Drop-ins are welcome, but appointments are preferred. The Old Porch Gallery can accommodate bus tours throughout the summer. Agricultural group tours are available by appointment. Hours: Seasonal

St. Victor Petroglyphs Provincial Historic Park

2.4 km south of St. Victor, SK

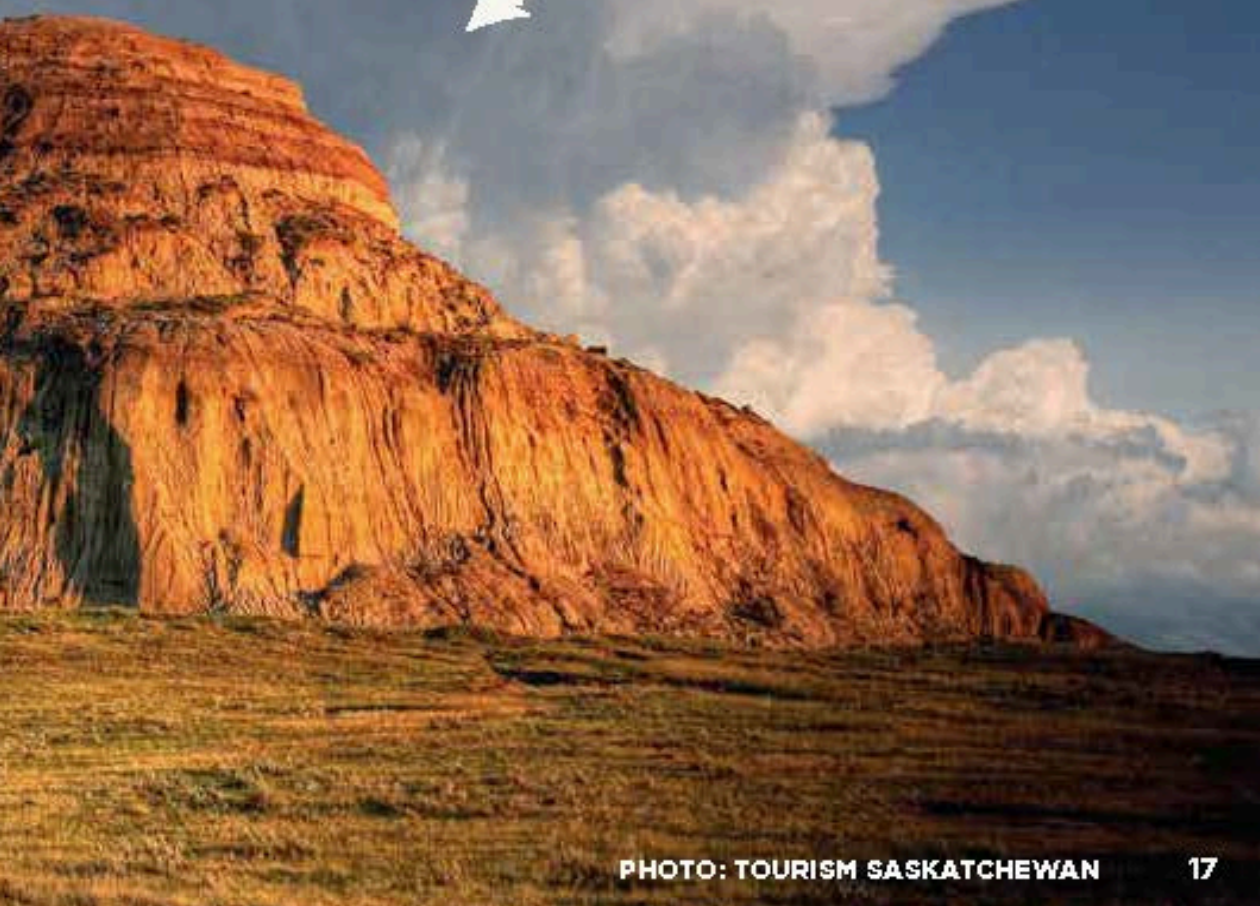

Ancient Indigenous rock carvings located on a sandstone outcrop in the Wood Mountain Uplands. The site features over 300 petroglyphs, believed to have been created between 500 and 1700 AD, offering insight into the spiritual and cultural practices of early Indigenous peoples. Unique as one of the only horizontally carved petroglyph sites on the Canadian prairies, visitors can view the carvings from a designated lookout while taking in the surrounding landscape and its significance. Because they are located on a horizontal surface, the petroglyphs have worn away with time, so they are best viewed on a clear day in the morning or evening when the sun is low.

Castle Butte

22km south of Bengough on Highway 34 and 5 km west on grid road Watch for signage Accessible to the public June 1 to November 1

Explore the iconic Castle Butte in the Big Muddy Badlands, a notable Ice Age relic standing 60 meters high with a 0.5 km circumference. This sandstone and clay structure has historical significance for Indigenous peoples, the North West Mounted Police, and early settlers. Accessible to the public from June 1 to November 1, Castle Butte is situated on private land, emphasizing the need for environmental respect during visits.

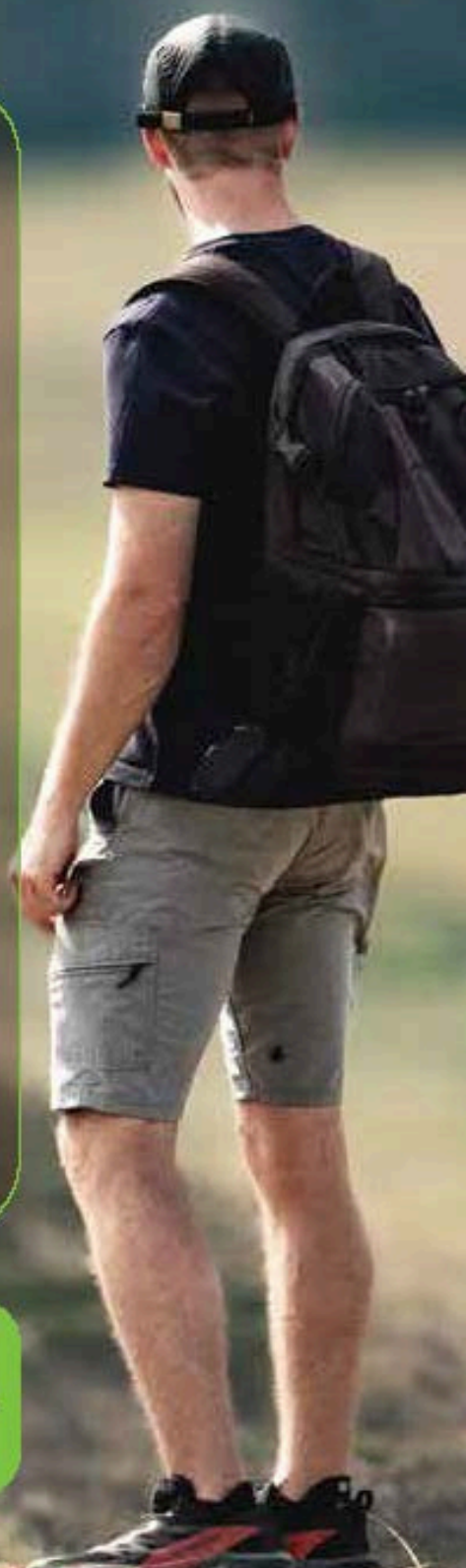

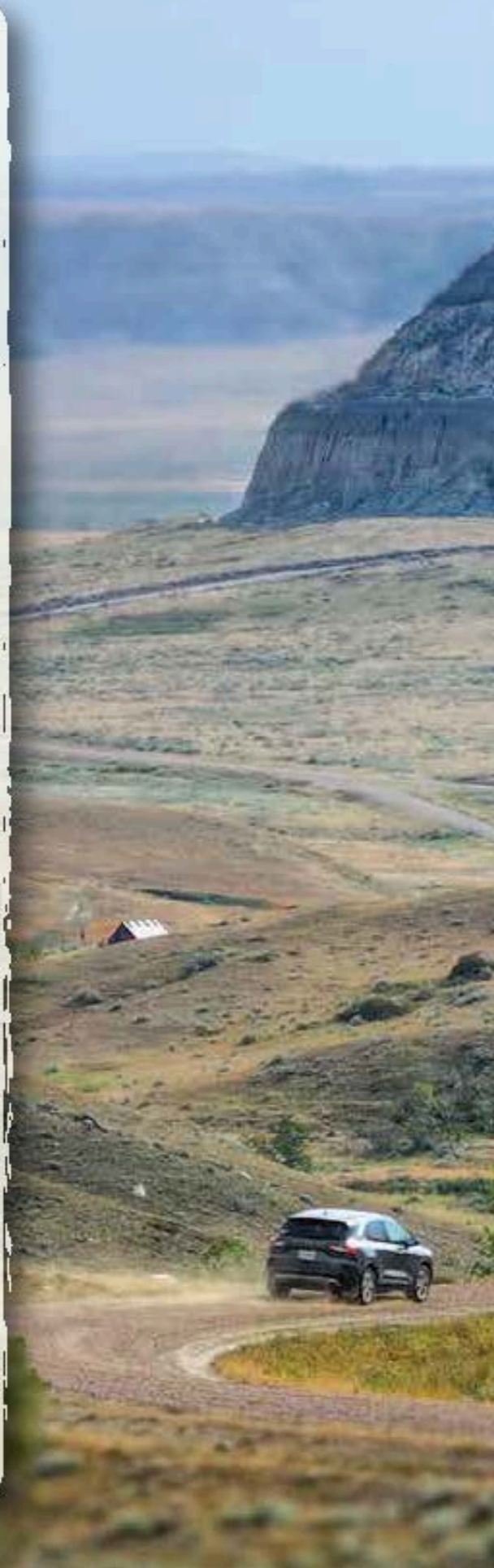
