Dearne & District equalled a 35-year-old Northern Counties East League record as they came from behind to defeat Retford 3-1 and claim a 20th successive league victory.

Jamie Austin's hat-trick inspired the Goldthorpe side to another remarkable triumph, matching the record set by Guiseley in 1991.

The latest win came against one of the fancied sides in the division. Like Dearne, Retford were Step 6 champions last season, lifting the United Counties League Division One title after surpassing the 100-point mark and losing only four league games.

Dearne now sit second in the table, level on points with Bottesford Town and separated only by goal difference. Bottesford are the only other side still boasting a perfect league record.

League action takes a back seat this weekend as Dearne prepare for the first FA Cup tie in the club's history. Intriguingly, they travel to another Step 6 title winner from last season in Runcorn Town.

The Cheshire club stormed to the North West Counties League Division One South championship in 2025-26, suffering just one defeat in 34 league matches, while Dearne's

title-winning campaign spanned 42 games.

Worsbrough Bridge Athletic are also enjoying an unbeaten start to life in the Premier Division and currently occupy fourth place.

After a draw last weekend, the Briggers produced a dramatic midweek comeback to win at Pickering Town. Trailing 2-0, they pulled a goal back through Keelan Grist on the stroke of half-time before Charlie Austerfield and Harrison Marvin completed the turnaround.

Bridge are also in FA Cup action this weekend, hosting Trafford at the Totally Training Stadium on Sunday.

Sheffield FC remain unbeaten in the United Counties League following a goalless draw at Gresley Rovers. They have the only local FA Cup derby this weekend when they host Parkgate on Friday evening.

Meanwhile, Armthorpe Welfare have made a perfect start to life in Northern Counties East League Division One, recording two wins from two. Their latest success came in Tuesday night's derby victory over Athersley Recreation.

Wombwell Town also celebrated a significant milestone, ending a run of 32 matches without a win by beating Brigg Town 4-2 on Saturday.



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GRASSROOTS STARS EARN COUNTY HONOURS

Handsworth FC and a host of dedicated volunteers, coaches and officials from across South Yorkshire are set to be recognised after being named among the winners of the Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA Grassroots Football Awards.

The awards, presented by Howdens, celebrate the individuals and organisations whose commitment, passion and hard work help grassroots football flourish across the Sheffield and Hallamshire region. Earlier this year, 238 nominations were received before an independent judging panel selected winners and highly commended recipients across 12 categories.

Leading the honours list was Handsworth FC, which collected the Club of the Year award.

While the club's senior men's sides compete in the Northern Counties East League and Sheffield & Hallamshire County Senior League, Handsworth's influence extends far beyond the adult game. The Sheffield club provides football opportunities for hundreds of players across its junior, youth, girls', women's and senior sections, supported by a large network of volunteers, coaches and officials. Its commitment to player development and

community football has helped establish it as one of the region's leading grassroots organisations and earned recognition from the awards judges.

Worksop Boys and Girls JFC received the Highly Commended accolade in the same category following another impressive year of youth football development.

Among the coaching winners, Matthew Morris and Jonathan Clarke of Rotherham United Community Trust were named Coach of the Year in the Disability Pathway category. Chelsea Smith of Silver Strikers WFC collected the Female Pathway award, while Kirkburton JFC's Matthew Pattison was recognised as Male Pathway Coach of the Year.

Grounds Team of the Year went to William Burden of Wickersley Youth JFC, recognising the dedication required to maintain facilities for players throughout the year. The Sheffield & Hallamshire Flourish League was named League of the Year for its work providing inclusive playing opportunities within grassroots football.

Volunteers were also prominently recognised.

Beighton Magpies' Wayne Royle collected the New Volunteer of the Year award, while Brodsworth Main FC's Joshua Allen was named Young Volunteer of the Year. Club Doncaster Titans' Emma Jackson received

the Positive Behaviour Award in recognition of her contribution to creating a positive and inclusive football environment.

Junior referee Danny Scott was named Match Official of the Year, highlighting the vital role officials play in ensuring grassroots football can take place every weekend.

One of the standout individual honours went to Laura Burnett of Wathletico Women, who received The Lioness Award.

Wathletico has emerged as one of the region's success stories in recreational women's football, creating opportunities for women of all ages and abilities to enjoy the game. Based in the Rotherham area, the club has developed a strong community spirit through football participation, charitable fundraising and social initiatives, helping attract new players into the sport and promoting the continued growth of the women's game.

The Lioness Award recognises individuals who have helped create opportunities for women and girls in football and made a significant impact within their community. Wathletico has previously been recognised by Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA for its work in expanding access to the female game and building an inclusive football environment.

Another prestigious honour went to Keith Watkin of Bran-

ton FC, who received the Bobby Moore Award. Widely regarded as one of the highest accolades within the Grassroots Football Awards programme, it is presented to individuals who have demonstrated exceptional service and dedication to football over many years.

Several South Yorkshire figures also earned Highly Commended recognition. They included Sheffield Shakers FC's Lee Hardy, West End Terriers FC's Kelly Curran, Brodsworth Welfare FC's Chris Toyne, Club Doncaster Titans volunteer Alwyne Mundy, Ridgeway Lionesses' Ian Westwood, Bramley Sunnyside Juniors FC's Alexandra Dudson, Ecclesfield Red Rose JFC's David Solway and Sheffield United Junior Blades volunteer Stefan Pop.

The Grassroots Football Awards form part of England Football's nationwide campaign to celebrate the volunteers, clubs, leagues, coaches and officials whose efforts keep community football thriving. The winners will be formally honoured at Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA's annual Grassroots Football Awards Evening in November, when volunteers, friends, families and members of the football community will come together to celebrate the people who make the grassroots game possible.

Sheffield Collegiate and Thorncliffe & Wentworth will meet in next Wednesday's South Yorkshire Alliance Works Midweek Cricket League play-off final at Abbeydale Park (6pm) after convincing semi-final victories.

The FA Women's National League season begins next weekend (Sunday 16th August), while the local teams in Regional and County Leagues are set to start their League campaigns in September.

Meanwhile, pre-season friendlies produced some high scoring games. Gracie Lucas 2, Evie Manley 2, Stacey Buxton and Ella Mortimer were on the mark for Rotherham United in the 6-1 home win over Dronfield Town for whom Zoe Bratley scored a late consolation.

Millie Guest bagged a hat trick for Rossington Main Reserves who won 7-0 at West End Terriers where the other goals were singles by Katie Jack, Ysabel Love, Rowan Newman and an opponent.

Ellie Chadburn netted five for Parkgate

in their 10-0 victory at Dearne & District. Barnsley lost in a behind closed doors game against Middlesbrough. Rossington Main's home game against Doncaster Rovers Belles was cancelled because of injuries in the home camp, but Rossington are hoping to re-schedule the game for later in the month.

Maisie Everitt, who has moved from Belles, scored four for YP Women in their 11-0 victory over Millmoor Juniors. Daisy Oxley 2, Hannah Baker, Charlotte Bennehan, Fran

Brown, Isobel Foster and Poppy Sturch were also on target.

Brodsworth Main drew 0-0 at Handsworth Reserves, while Brodsworth's Reserves, newly formed, drew 1-1 at home to Aston Swallownest. Sheffield Wednesday won 4-3 at Altofts.

Meanwhile, The draws for this season's Women's FA Cup Preliminary Round and First Round Qualifying were announced on Friday and featured all the entrants from tier six (the lower of the two levels in the eight Re-

gional Leagues) and tier seven (County Leagues).

Teams from tier five (the Premier Divisions at Regional League) enter at the Second Round Qualifying Stage which is scheduled for Sunday 20th September.

A fortnight later, in the Third Round Qualifying, it is the turn of tier four teams to begin their quest for Cup glory.

Those three rounds will see all bar one of the local teams, who have entered, take part in this season's competition. The last to enter

will be Sheffield United who are exempt until the Third Round Proper.

This season's final is set for Saturday 15th May, 2027. All the other rounds are scheduled on a Sunday, though several ties are likely to be played elsewhere on the weekend due to live TV coverage.

Prize money has been increased for five of the first six rounds. While some of the increases may not seem much, the sums do make a difference to the teams below the professional Women's Super League (tiers one and two).

Brodsworth Main, one of the new teams in this season's competition, have been drawn at home to Thackley.

YP Women, whose headquarters are at Dar-nall, have a new base for their home games in Glapwell and they are spending much time and effort into getting the ground fit to host

their tier six fixtures this season. Their Cup debut is away to Oughtibridge War Memorial.

Dinnington Town, another team making their debut, visit Cherry Burton who lost 8-0 at Stocksbridge Park Steels last August.

Other Preliminary Round ties involving local teams are Millmoor Juniors v Forge Way, Dronfield Town v Golcar United, Chesterfield Community Trust v Sheffield Wednesday and Brandesburton v Rossington Main.

The draws for the first several rounds are regionalised and one can clearly identify the South Yorkshire based element in a group of 15 ties.

Those 15 pairings were joined by the five teams, who received Preliminary Round byes, in the First Round Qualifying which produced just the single clear cut tie in Handsworth v Stocksbridge Park Steels.

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FA CUP TRAIL BEGINS

The long road to Wembley gets under way this weekend with eight clubs from the South Yorkshire football scene entering the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Cup.

Whilst none of them are likely to be walking out under the arch next May, a good run in the world's oldest national cup competition can provide a welcome financial boost and help clubs plan for the future.

For a regionalised draw, there is remarkably only one local derby and that kicks off the action on Friday evening at the Home of Football Stadium.

Sheffield, who have made a solid start to life in the United Counties League with four points from two away trips, host Parkgate, who have struggled in the opening weeks of the campaign. The Steelmen have suffered three successive defeats, including a crushing 4-1 reverse at Penistone Church last weekend.

Penistone themselves face a daunting trip to Liversedge, who completed the Northern Counties East League title and League Cup double last season.

However, Saturday's tie will be the hosts' first competitive fixture of the season and Penistone will travel in confident mood following

last weekend's victory over Parkgate. They will also be hoping for a better outcome than the 4-1 defeat they suffered when the two sides met at the Clayborn Stadium in February.

Dearne & District will be hoping to maintain their 100 per cent start to life in senior football when they contest the first FA Cup tie in the club's history.

After victory at Retford last Saturday, they travel to Cheshire to face Runcorn Town meaning games against fellow Step 6 winners from last season on successive weekends. Their hosts cruised to the North West Counties League Division One South championship after losing just once all season.

Founded in 1967, the Sandy Lane outfit opened their Midland League Premier Division campaign with a 4-2 victory over Lye Town and will present another stern examination.

Rossington Main also head to Cheshire as they take on 1874 Northwich.

The supporter-owned club earned promotion through the Midland League play-offs last season and are now competing at Step 4 level in Northern Premier League Division One West. They also enjoyed a notable FA Cup run in 2024-25, beating



Stocksbridge Park Steels before reaching the Second Qualifying Round where they eventually lost to National League North side Guiseley.

Formed in 2012 by supporters of Northwich Victoria, 1874 Northwich have quickly established themselves as one of the North West's most respected community clubs. They will face a Rosso side who will be hoping for a repeat of last season's outstanding cup runs in both the FA Cup and FA Vase.

Handsworth are the only local side with home advantage on Saturday as they welcome Prestwich Heys to Oliver's Mount.

Founded in 1938, the Greater Manchester outfit is one of the North West's historic amateur clubs and finished seventh in the North West Counties

League Premier Division last season. After many years in local football, The Heys rejoined the North West Counties League in 2016 and secured promotion to the Premier Division in 2021-22.

Their only outing so far this season ended in a 4-1 defeat at Burscough.

Another North West Counties League Premier Division side heads into the county on Sunday when Hallam begin their FA Cup campaign against Irlam at Sandygate.

Founded in 1969, the visitors finished sixth last season and have established themselves as regular challengers towards the upper reaches of their division. Irlam also possess recent FA Cup pedigree, reaching the Second Qualifying Round in 2019-20 after eliminating Stocksbridge Park Steels along

the way.

The two clubs met in the competition in 2023-24 when a draw at Sandygate was followed by a convincing Irlam victory, 5-2 in the replay. They opened the new season with a 1-1 draw at South Liverpool, rescuing a point with a stoppage-time equaliser.

The quartet of North West Counties League opponents is completed on Sunday when newly-promoted Worsbrough Bridge Athletic return to the competition after 25 years away.

The Briggers host Trafford at the Totally Training Stadium after securing promotion to the Northern Counties East League Premier Division for the first time in the club's history last season..

Trafford arrive with considerable pedigree. Despite suffering relegation from Northern

Premier League Division One West at the end of last season, the Greater Manchester outfit have significant Step 4 experience and have previously reached the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Cup.

They began the new campaign in impressive fashion with a 3-0 victory over Longridge Town and will provide another tough test for South Yorkshire opposition.

Stocksbridge Park Steels received a draw through the round and will host the winner of the tie between Wythenshawe and Padiham in the Preliminary Round on 22 August where we hope we will also have seven other clubs still in the competition.

*Sunday's FA Cup matches provide the perfect opportunity for groundhoppers to take in two games in one day, including a Montagu Cup tie in the world's oldest football competition whose final is still played at its original venue. The morning schedule features seven last-16 matches, plus a rearranged first-round tie, which can be followed by a 2pm kick-off at Worsbrough Bridge or a 3pm match at Hallam. 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EAST DIVISION HARDER THAN EVER

Relegated big hitters, ambitious newcomers and major summer changes across the league mean the Northern Premier League East Division looks as unpredictable as ever ahead of the 2026/27 campaign.

If pre-season talk is to be believed, just about half the division fancies its chances this year.

That is nothing unusual in the Northern Premier League East Division, but there does seem to be a genuine lack of stand-out favourites heading into the new campaign. Last season's leading pair, Redcar Athletic and Emley, have moved on after winning promotion, leaving a vacancy at the top and no shortage of clubs eager to fill it.

Matlock Town will feature prominently in plenty of pre-season predictions despite a chaotic summer. The Gladiators reached the play-offs last season before a remarkable managerial saga unfolded. Graham Drury's brief spell in charge ended almost before it began, Ryan Cresswell returned alongside Ricky Ravenhill and then stepped away to take up a coaching role at Doncaster Rovers, leaving Ravenhill in sole charge. Despite the off-field upheaval, Matlock have recruited aggressively, bringing in players including Brandon Bradbury from Hallam, Levi Andoh and

Jesurun Uchegbulam as they look to turn last season's near miss into a promotion-winning campaign.

Another club certain to attract attention is Morpeth Town. Relegated from the Northern Premier League Premier Division alongside Stocksbridge Park Steels, Morpeth arrive in the East Division carrying the weight of expectation that inevitably follows a club of their size and support. Few will be surprised if they are challenging towards the top end of the table from the outset.

The promoted clubs also look stronger than many newly-arrived sides.

Liversedge bounced straight back to Step 4 after winning the NCEL Premier Division title and arrive determined to re-establish themselves at this level. Beverley Town make history by stepping into Step 4 for the first time after their promotion-winning campaign, while Guisborough Town and West Auckland Town head south from the Northern League carrying momentum and confidence after successful seasons of their own.

Elsewhere, several



established East Division clubs will believe their time has come.

Bradford (Park Avenue) remain one of the division's biggest names and continue their attempts to climb back up the pyramid. Dunston are consistently competitive and difficult to beat, while North Ferriby, Consett, Pontefract Collieries and Garforth Town all possess enough quality and experience to believe they can become play-

off contenders. None would regard a top-five finish as unrealistic.

The transfer market has also been busy.

Liversedge have strengthened with the signing of experienced defender Luke Hendrie, Grimsby Borough have recruited former Brentford player Josh Clarke, Lincoln United have brought midfielder Leo Priestley back to the club and Silsden have added Portuguese midfielder Belchior Ro-

drigues as clubs across the division continue to fine-tune their squads.

For South Yorkshire supporters, attention naturally focuses on Hallam and Stocksbridge Park Steels.

Hallam begin their second season at Step 4 level following an encouraging 12th-place finish and a summer of significant change. Long-serving manager Craig Denton has departed after six successful years and has been replaced by brothers Danny and Richard Paterson. New arrivals have bolstered the squad, returning favourites are back at Sandygate and there is a growing belief that the Countrymen can push on from last season's solid debut campaign at this level.

Stocksbridge, meanwhile, are trying to ensure relegation becomes a temporary setback rather than the start of a decline. Jordan Lemon begins his first full season in charge after overseeing a major rebuilding job during the summer. The Steels have brought in a number of new faces, are celebrating their 40th anniversary year and will be aiming to

make themselves part of the promotion conversation rather than dwell on last season's disappointment.

One of the most intriguing aspects of the division is the sheer variety of clubs involved.

Former Football League names sit alongside ambitious community clubs. Relegated sides are desperate to bounce back, promoted teams are keen to prove a point and established East Division outfits have spent the summer plotting a route into the play-offs.

That makes predictions difficult.

Matlock have quality but have endured managerial turmoil. Morpeth arrive with expectation. Liversedge carry momentum. Bradford (Park Avenue) remain a major name. Hallam are entering a new era and Stocksbridge are rebuilding.

Put simply, there are more questions than answers.

And that is exactly why the Northern Premier League East Division could prove to be one of the most compelling leagues in non-league football this season.

LEMON'S NEW ERA

Stocksbridge Park Steels begin a new chapter under Jordan Lemon as they look to bounce back from relegation and make a strong challenge in a fiercely competitive Northern Premier League East Division.

Stocksbridge Park Steels head into the 2026/27 season determined to put last year's disappointment behind them and begin a new chapter in the club's proud history.

The Steels suffered relegation from the Northern Premier League Premier Division last season, but there is a growing sense of optimism around Bracken Moor as preparations continue for the new campaign.

This year is also a landmark one for the club as Stocksbridge celebrates its 40th anniversary, marking four decades since the merger of Stocksbridge Works and Oxley Park.

Over those 40 years, the Steels have consistently punched above their weight and established themselves as one of South Yorkshire's most respected non-league clubs.

The club's reputation for developing talent is well known throughout the game.

Former players including Lee Mills, Harrison Biggins and

Jamie Vardy all spent time at Stocksbridge before progressing into the professional ranks, while countless others have used the club as a platform to higher levels of football.

Media manager Adam Allcroft believes there is a cautious optimism around the club ahead of the new season.

"There's been a mood of cautious optimism," he said.

"Even if many of us expected it, relegation hurt last year and with it being Jordan Lemon's first summer in charge we're all excited to see what he can do."

Lemon and his staff have been busy during the summer as they reshape the squad for life in the East Division.

Several eye-catching additions have arrived at the club, including Harry Spooner and Oliver Metcalfe, while the return of Charlie Oglesby has also been warmly welcomed by supporters.

"The recruitment has been impressive and everyone is very

happy with the return of Charlie Oglesby," said Allcroft.

"There is some apprehension because of the relegation, but we're all looking forward to getting back in action."

While attention naturally focuses on matters on the pitch, the club has also continued making progress behind the scenes.

One of the significant achievements of the summer has been work to ensure the ground meets Step 3 grading requirements despite the club now competing a level below.

"We managed to get our ground up to Step 3 ground grading standards, which was a fantastic achievement by everyone involved," explained Allcroft.

The club hopes to announce further developments as celebrations continue throughout its anniversary year.

For supporters, there is a feeling that the new season represents an opportunity rather than a setback.

A new management team, fresh faces within the squad and a chance to compete near the top end of the division have all contributed to an encouraging atmosphere around the club.

"I think this is a real fresh start for us," said Allcroft.

"Jordan Lemon and his assistant Joe Tomlinson have poured their passion into the club on the playing side and, no matter what happens, there will be no lack of effort.

"There's plenty of talented players in the team and I think we can make a really good effort of the division."

The East Division looks set to be highly competitive once again, but Stocksbridge believe they have the quality, experience and infrastructure to challenge.

With an historic anniversary to celebrate and a fresh chapter beginning under new leadership, there is a genuine belief that the Steels can give supporters plenty to cheer in the months ahead.

Steels Voice Ready For New Season

For most clubs in South Yorkshire this weekend, competitive football makes its eagerly-awaited return.

From the Steel City’s two biggest clubs, who are in League Cup action, down to non-league football, teams across the county are preparing for the start of the new season.

At Stocksbridge Park Steels, it’s the chance to respond to last season’s relegation. Following their shock promotion from the Northern Premier League East Division in 2024/25, the S36 outfit returned to that level at the first time of asking, despite a valiant effort at attempting to remain as a step three side.

Speaking to media manager Adam Allcroft, he explained the backstory about how he became involved with the Steels. As the saying goes, when one door closes, another opens.

“It was 2020, I was redundant from my job, and I was looking for something to do,” Adam explained. “I’d been doing a bit of freelance football writing for an EFL website for a few years and thought I’d go more into that.

“But non-league football’s about; they’re always going to need help. Stocksbridge Park Steels has always been of interest to me because I’ve seen them in the local newspaper and news every so often.

“So I thought I’d try and help out. I got in touch with them, got put into this role, and I’ve been doing it ever since.”

Finding your way into this career

is becoming increasingly difficult, as I can attest. Hearing each individual story of how a person starts their journey in the industry is always fascinating, and Adam is no different.

“The best way to learn things is to consistently do it, whether you do that through university or any other medium. If you are a journalism student, you need to volunteer. You learn far more out in the real world dealing with deadlines and the pressures that come from the outside.

“We’ve grown a lot. Before, I think we struggled to get a lot of stuff out just because there weren’t the people to do it. There are a lot of volunteers who would put their effort into reports, but I came in after having the experience studying journalism at university, so I was able to do that.

“Over the years, I’ve created video highlights, video content and radio commentaries. It’s just been about delivering things we’ve wanted to do at the club beforehand, but now can be delivered on a very consistent basis.”

Football commentary is often described as the pinnacle for any aspiring journalist. It’s as much about the service provided to supporters as it is about the general enjoyment for the commentator themselves.

“The fans seem to enjoy it, which I think is the most important thing. I do sometimes get things said back to me, especially regarding our promotion. I try to have a bit of humour because football is an entertainment at

the end of the day.

“What I try to do is make sure that people who can't make it to the matches still feel involved in the match in some way. That's non-league; it's about having that closeness with the supporters compared with professional football.

“If I can offer that through my commentary, that's fantastic for everyone.”

One of the hardest things to do in any walk of life is recognise when mistakes have been made, and try to rectify them. Sometimes, that isn't the answer, and those errors are important in building you up to become the person you are. In Adam's instance, the latter applies.

“I wouldn't actually trade back any of the mistakes I've made because that's how you learn not to make them in the future, in my opinion. Anyone can look back on an interview they've recorded and think they should have phrased things slightly differently because of the reaction they might give. I don't say there's anything major that I really regret.

“There's always a lot going on. You want to have the social part because it's non-league; you want to enjoy it more than anything, or else what's the point? You put out a really good product for the fans there with social media, commentary and everything else on matchdays, making sure your own emotions don't get too tied up in it.

“I love the club, I adore it, but I've still got to go on X [formerly Twitter] in a fair manner, even if we're losing. That can be quite tricky sometimes

when you want to be angry. Whether it's a poor performance you're upset with, or decisions that have gone against you in some way.”

Looking forward, not just to the new season, there is plenty for a media manager to consider. The days of printed media are slowly dying, though they still exist to a much greater extent in non-league football.

However, for Adam, it's all about having an open mind to the latest trends.

“It's about keeping an eye on where the rest of the world's going with it and just trying to improve it as it goes. The thing about media is that five years ago, I didn't think TikTok was going to keep on being as massive as it was

“You don't see what's coming in media; you've just got to try and pay attention to it, hop on to trends that will be useful for you and then see what the next big thing will be. In the next six years, we could have a new social media platform go massive and have a completely different way of doing things. It's something that never stops.

“The fans might want a different way of media being delivered, and we're always trying new things. Every media department in the entire country of any club are trying different ways through that thing.”

It's a trip to Heaton Stannington on Saturday afternoon for matchday one of the new campaign for the Steels. We all wish them the best of luck as they aim to embark upon another memorable campaign at this level.

Penistone Church opened their account for the season in emphatic fashion with a 4-1 victory over Parkgate.

Three Premier Division matches ended level.

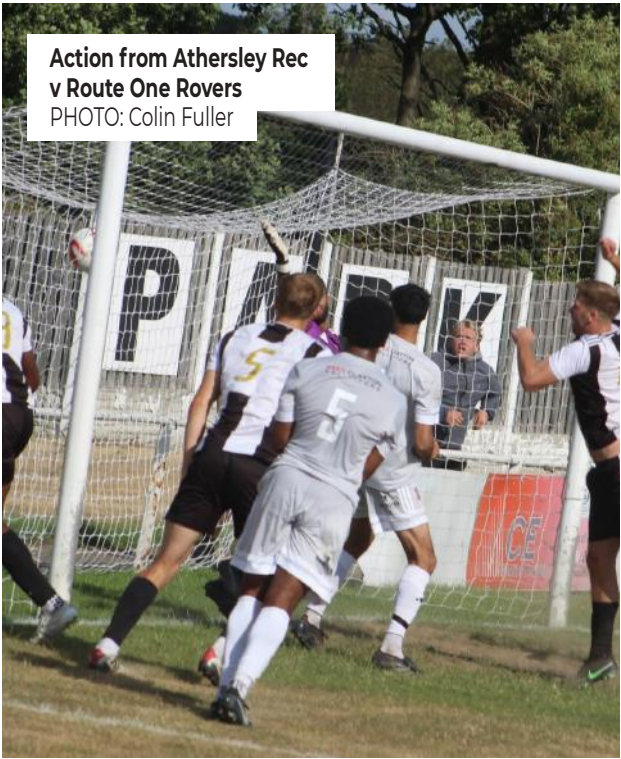

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DRONFIELD DERBY JOY

UNITED COUNTIES LEAGUE

Dronfield Town enjoyed a perfect week to kick-start their United Counties League Division One campaign, collecting back-to-back victories and climbing into the early promotion picture.

After last week's opening-day defeat at Cotgrave, Chris Millington's side have responded in impressive fashion, first snatching a dramatic late win over Pinchbeck United before following it up with a derby victory over Swallownest.

The first success arrived at Stonelow Stadium on Saturday and it was achieved the hard way.

Pinchbeck took an early lead through Brenden Parker and Dronfield's task became even tougher when Ryan Watters was sin-binned shortly before half-time. Town dug deep, however, and gradually took control of proceedings.

Their persistence was rewarded when Max Rhodes headed home from a Matty Ord free-kick 11 minutes from

time, before Callum Mawbey popped up deep into stoppage time to power home a dramatic winner and seal a 2-1 success.

That set the stage perfectly for Tuesday night's local derby against Swallownest.

Dronfield again had to come from behind after George Walker's penalty gave the visitors the lead early in the second half. The response was impressive. Aston Thompson levelled with a header before Max Rhodes converted from the penalty spot to put Town in front.

Swallownest's task became even harder when Spencer Sheppard was dismissed after collecting a second yellow card and Dronfield looked home and dry when Luke Walker added a third five minutes from time.

Charlie Baird reduced the deficit in stoppage time but Town held on for a 3-2 victory and local bragging rights.

Those six points have transformed the mood around Stonelow Stadium. After the frustration of conceding four goals in defeat at Cotgrave on the opening day, Dronfield have

quickly demonstrated both resilience and attacking quality.

While Dronfield were celebrating a maximum return, Sheffield FC continued their unbeaten start in the Premier

Division North with a hard-earned point at Gresley Rovers.

The 0-0 draw lacked the fireworks of Sheffield's opening-night win at Sherwood Colliery, but Vill Powell was quick to admit his side were below their usual standards.

"We weren't nowhere near our levels," admitted the Sheffield manager afterwards.

Played in front of a healthy crowd at the Moat Ground, the game was a competitive and often scrappy affair in which clear-cut opportunities were limited.

Powell felt Sheffield's own play contributed to many of the difficulties they encountered.

"A lot of the problems they caused were created by our sloppiness," he said.

Club still came close to snatching all three points and Powell felt a late penalty appeal could have gone their way, but ultimately accepted that a share of the spoils was about right.

"Nil-nil on reflection over the game and everything else was a fair result."

The draw means Sheffield have taken four points from their opening two matches and are still yet to concede a league goal.

Maltby Main experienced contrasting fortunes over the course of the week.

The Miners produced one of the most impressive away performances of the weekend when they travelled to Clifton All Whites and returned home with a commanding 4-0 victory.

Shaun-Michael Tai continued his bright start to the campaign with two goals, while Sam Limber and Roman Myers also found the net as Maltby swept their hosts aside.

That result lifted Maltby into the upper reaches of the table ahead of Wednesday night's trip to unbeaten leaders Clipstone.

A tight contest produced few genuine chances but Clipstone struck a significant blow just before the interval when Drew Allwood found the breakthrough. Maltby remained in the contest throughout but saw their hopes ended when Thomas Bramall added a second late on in a 2-0 defeat.

Despite the loss, it still represents a respectable return for a side that has taken four

points from its opening four fixtures and already shown it can be a match for anybody in the division on its day.

For Swallownest, it proved a more frustrating period.

Jamie Housley's side were beaten 2-0 at home by Stapleford Town on Saturday before suffering derby disappointment at Dronfield three days later.

The back-to-back defeats have checked the momentum built by their opening-day victory over Sleaford Town, although there were still encouraging signs in the attacking contributions of George Walker and Charlie Baird during the derby clash.

Elsewhere in Division One, Clipstone have emerged as the early pace-setters with a perfect return from their opening three matches, while Southwell City and Shirebrook Town have also made strong starts.

The Premier Division North is beginning to take

eventually finished on exactly 231-9 after their 50 overs.

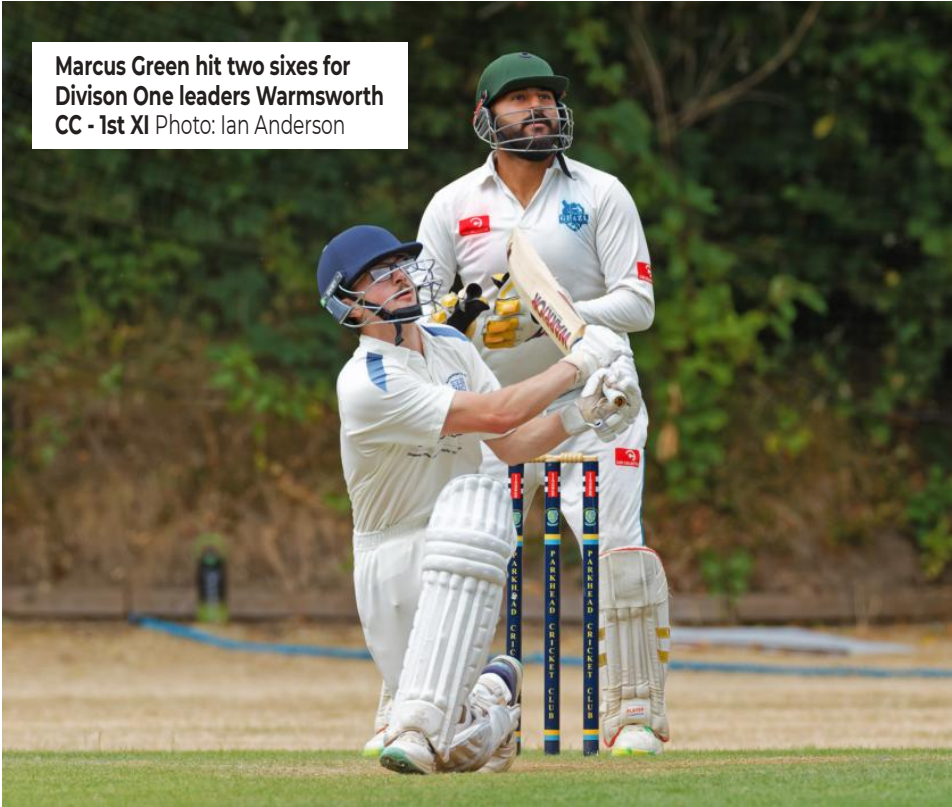

Sheffield Stars riders Laura Watson and Lizzie Rigley are European Champions after England lifted the ICSF Nations Cup at Wednesfield.

Both were unbeaten from their four races, scoring 16 points, as England finished on 78 points, well clear of silver medallists Poland (59) and bronze medalists Wales (50). Laura (captain) and Lizzie (vice-captain) are now European, British and double World team Champions.

England completed a clean sweep of the Nations Cups, winning the Junior, open and Veteran's titles also.

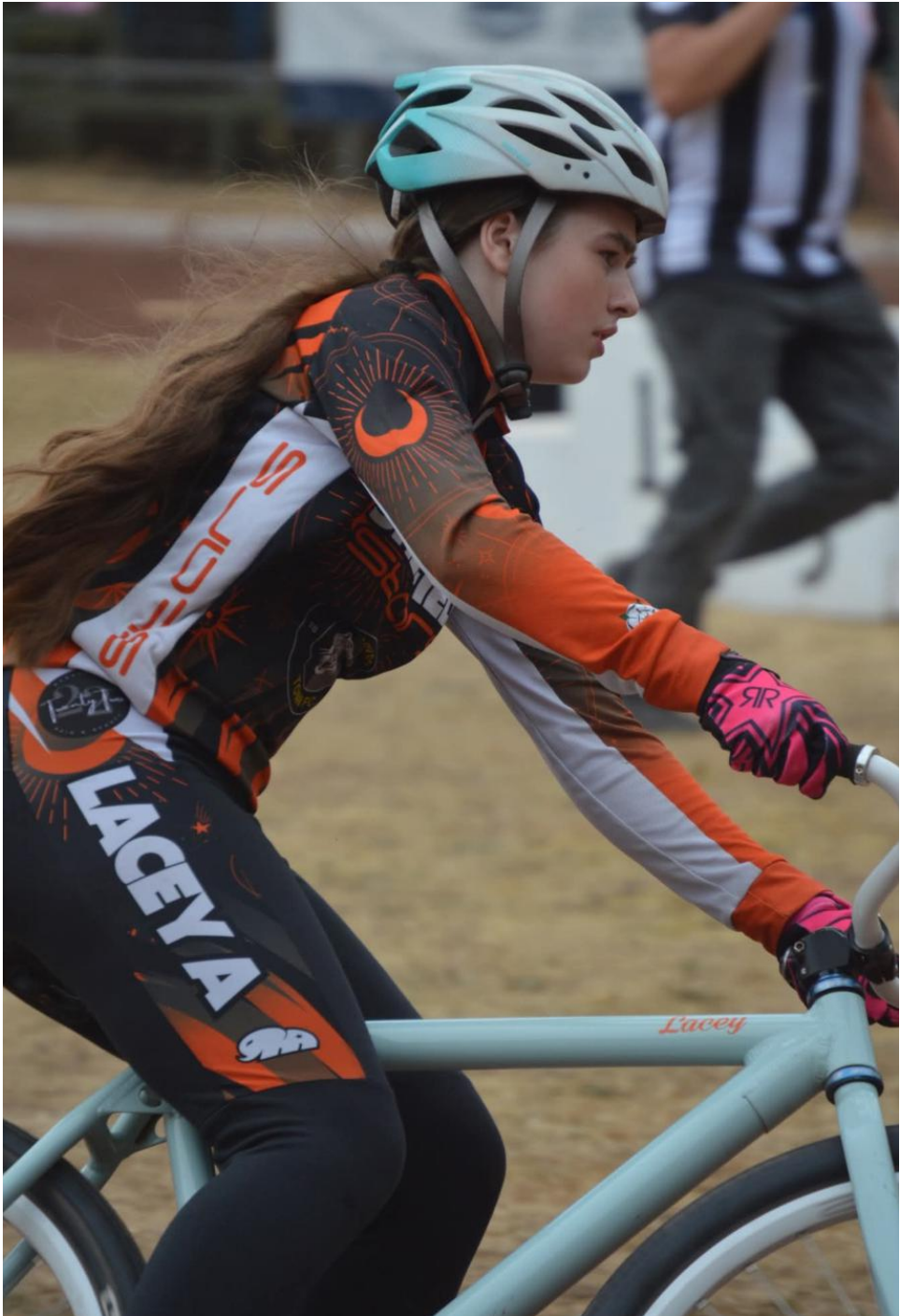
The European Championships didn't bring any more success for Sheffield. Laura, Lizzie and Lacey Ackroyd all progressed comfortably from the Women's Indi-

vidual semi-finals.

All three won at least one race in a very competitive Final. Lizzie (two wins) finished in fourth place with 17 points, just one point away from the podium. Laura scored 14 and Lacey scored 11. Lacey was not helped by a crash in her last race.

Oliver Banyard (15) was the youngest finalist in the Junior (under 18) competition. He progressed from the qualifying races with 35 points out of 40, the seventh best score.

He won his first race in spectacular fashion, but then disaster struck in his second race. Challenging for the lead against two riders (who eventually finished with silver and bronze) he took a big crash after clipping wheels. The fall saw him have to withdraw from the racing under the concussion protocol, due to hitting his head on the track surface.
