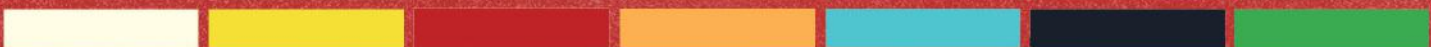

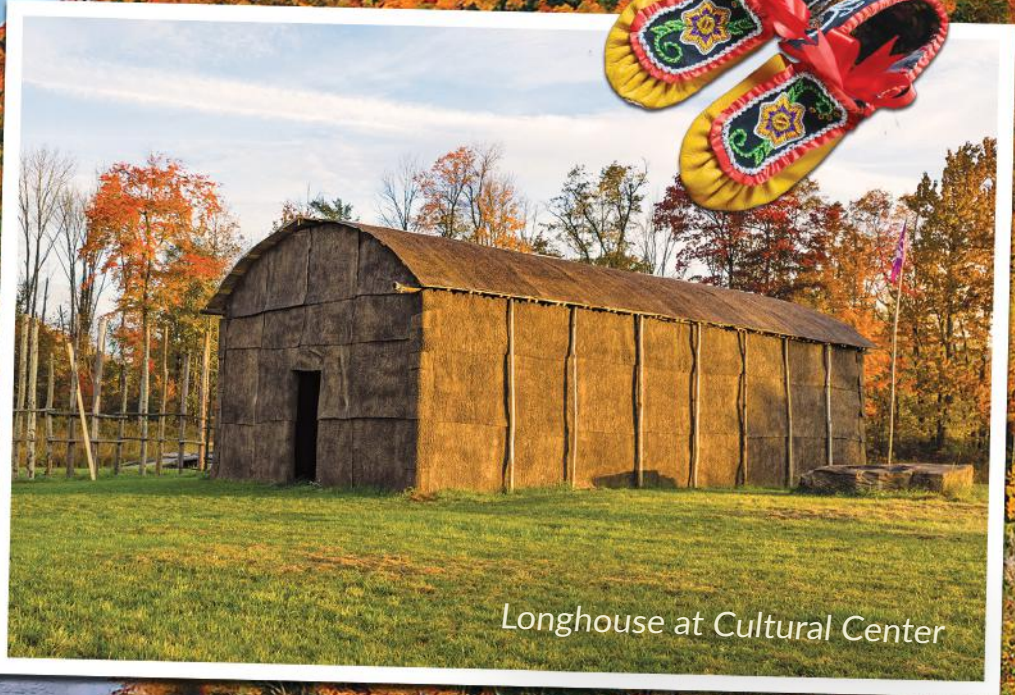

Traveling throughout Western New York you will witness the beauty of the Allegheny Mountains as the hills roll endlessly. You can hear the peaceful water flowing down the Ohi:yo' (Beautiful River) or the rapids of the mighty Cattaraugus Creek. In the serene landscape is the home of a Native Nation known as the Onöndowa'ga:, the People of the Hills, or more known as, the Seneca.

Today, the Seneca Nation has a population of over 8,500 members. The Nation supports its people with a variety of cultural, educational and economic efforts. The economic impacts benefit surrounding communities.

GAKWI:YO:H FARMS

The Haudenosaunee were once hunters and gatherers, and as time evolved, we had to adapt to a sustainable practice of horticulture due to our dwindling land base, while maintaining our traditional way of life.

A fully funded Seneca Nation initiative, Gakwi:yo:h Farms puts an emphasis on reconnecting to the land through Agriculture.

Come experience our agricultural practices at Gakwi:yo:h Farms. Reconnect with our Haudenosaunee roots, by experiencing the land and promoting our relationship with our traditional foods.

Historically, the Seneca occupied territory throughout the Finger Lakes area in Central New York, and in the Genesee Valley in Western New York, living in longhouses on the riversides.

The Seneca were the largest of six Native nations which comprised the Haudenosaunee Confederacy or Six Nations, a democratic government that pre-dates the U.S. Constitution.
