A NOTE FROM PASTOR STEVE



Dear Church Family,

Jesus put it plainly: "the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45). If that is what our Lord came to do, then his example of service is meant to shape our lives as those called to be his hands and feet in the world.

Some of this service happens inside the walls of the church, and it matters more than we often say aloud. Someone arrives early to brew the coffee. Another rocks a baby in the nursery so a young mother and father can hear a whole sermon for the first time in months. Someone folds the bulletins. Yet another helps greet people as they arrive at church. The list goes on and on. Peter writes, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms" (1 Peter 4:10). Every one of those quiet tasks is God's grace passing through human hands.

But the church was never meant to be a place where service remains boxed in. Paul reminds us we were "created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). Most of those works are waiting outside the sanctuary door, in the neighborhoods, schools, workplaces, and hospital rooms.

So friends, keep serving inside the church and letting Christ's love in you spill over into acts of service in the community. Continue to be FOR Melbourne.

Faith & Games: Finding God in Unexpected Places

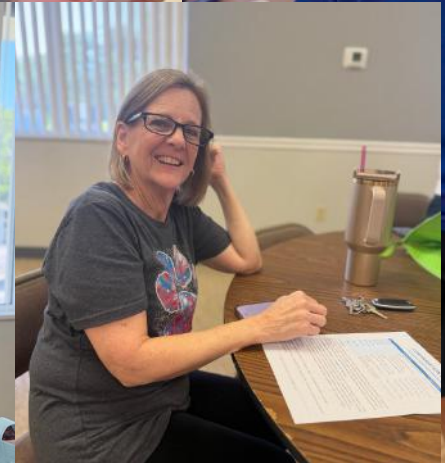
Ever feel like life is one big game? One wrong move and your tower comes crashing down.

Why Do I Need Another Shirt, Mug, or Button?

Fair question. Your closet's probably fine on t-shirts, and your cabinet's not exactly short on mugs. So why pick up another one from the FOR Melbourne table?

Here's why: it's not really for you.

The next FOR Melbourne shirt, mug, or button you buy doesn't have to sit in your drawer; it can become a gift. Keep an eye out this week for someone being FOR Melbourne in the community: the barista who remembers your order and your name, a neighbor who mows the yard next door without being asked, or a store clerk who treats every customer like they matter. When you catch it, hand them something from the table and tell them why. "Hey, I just love that you are being FOR your neighbor. We need more of that in the world."

And here's the part that keeps giving: every purchase supports our work in the community. The profit from each shirt, mug, and button goes straight back into the FOR Melbourne mission. Through this fund, we show up in tangible ways across our city. So when you buy one, you're not just picking up merchandise. You're funding the next act of service, and handing someone a reason to ask what FOR Melbourne is all about.

So — need another shirt, mug, or button? Maybe not. But someone in your path this week might need to know they were seen.
