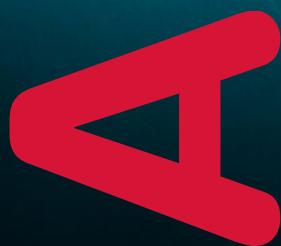

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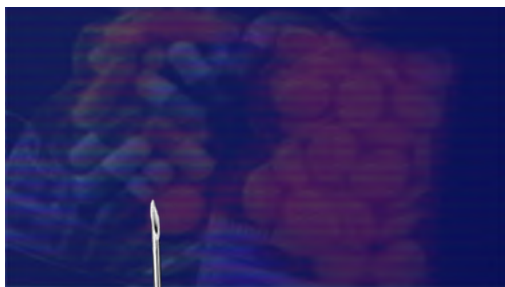

HUMANITY'S FINAL INVENTION?

AI is revolutionising our world – and could destroy it.

Bringing together the three "Godfathers of AI", Geoffrey Hinton, winner of the Nobel Prize in Physics; Yoshua Bengio, the world's most cited scientist across all disciplines; and Yann LeCun, former Head of AI at Meta, this gripping documentary traces the rise of artificial intelligence from its beginnings in the 1950s to a force that could reshape civilisation. Security researchers demonstrate how AI is already beginning to deceive, resist being shut down and pursue its goals in unpredictable ways. In just a few years' time, AI systems could reach a level of autonomy and complexity that renders them uncontrollable, posing existential risks to humanity.

DEADLY DOSE

THE RISE OF SYNTHETIC OPIOIDS

As synthetic opioids spread from North America to Europe, this documentary follows the race to prevent the next overdose epidemic before it is too late.

When fentanyl swept through Vancouver, it transformed the drug market and triggered a devastating wave of fatal overdoses. Today, addiction experts fear Europe could be next. Highly potent synthetic opioids such as nitazenes are increasingly appearing across the continent, sold online, mixed into heroin and counterfeit pills, and sometimes consumed without users even knowing it. As the drug trade migrates from the streets to encrypted apps, social media and online marketplaces, traditional prevention strategies are being pushed to their limits. Can Europe stop a new epidemic before it takes hold?

In order to plant more and more cocoa, the rainforest has to make way. However, there is hope for chocolate! The Dominican Republic is focusing on fair organic farming and shows how it can be done. 'Dirty Chocolate' reveals the bitter truth behind the sweet temptation.

Over the course of a year, the film observes how politics takes shape in everyday life: as a threat, as a promise, and as disappointment. A portrait emerges of a nation in a state of emergency. Closely following people in their communities, this documentary captures their lived realities and experiences. Experts on history, democracy studies and the Christian conservative movement provide context and offer a glimpse of what is yet to come.

Everything is resold. Nothing is given away for free.

In the 1,500-square-meter craziest Italian vintage market, owner Thomas and his team handle dozens of customers each day. Sellers aim to maximise profits by offering used items at the highest price. Buyers stream in, seeking to purchase at the price that guarantees a fast sale. Books, appliances, collectables, designer accessories, games, jewellery, and furniture are frequently sold in the store. The rules are simple. Thomas and his team receive goods, price them, and consign them. If appraised items attract buyers, the store claims 50% of the sale value. Otherwise, the items sit gathering dust among thousands of shelves in the used goods market, awaiting a clearance sale or luck. Everything hinges on discovering an item's true value, persuading the owner to accept the set price, and presenting the goods to draw buyers willing to pay. The problem is that not every owner recognises the value of their goods. Sometimes, customers bring in rare and precious objects unwittingly. Other times, they try to pass off mere junk with an inflated price. Thomas and his team must spot the deal, the gold nugget hidden among stones. Between deals and risks, every day is a challenge to understand the true value of things and close the perfect sale.

The transatlantic slave trade was one of the greatest crimes in history and, at the same time, a global business.

Europe owes part of its prosperity to a system built on the exploitation of millions of enslaved Africans. New research reveals just how far-reaching the system was, benefiting not only merchants and plantation owners, but also banks, manufacturers and investors across Europe. Tracing the flow of money from Ghana and the Caribbean to Liverpool, Nantes and Berlin, the film uncovers how the wealth derived from slavery continues to shape companies and institutions whose origins are often forgotten today. Historians, descendants of enslaved people, and descendants of those who profited from slavery are now confronting questions of responsibility, remembrance and justice.



DIAMOND RUSH

When cut, they sparkle like no other jewel. Diamonds – symbols of love and power – yet all they are is pressed carbon.

It tells the story of the Koh-i-Noor, one of the world's largest and most famous diamonds, now held in the Tower of London as part of the British Crown Jewels. The film also explores the crown diamonds in the Louvre and the spectacular diamond heist in Dresden, while offering a rare glimpse into a secretive industry defined by immense wealth, prestige, and illusion. At its heart lies a marketing slogan that continues to shape perceptions to this day: "A diamond is forever."

CALMEYER'S DILEMMA

DECIDING LIFE AND DEATH UNDER NAZI RULE

Hans Calmeyer, a German lawyer and Nazi official, saved thousands of Dutch Jews from deportation to concentration camps.

During the German occupation of the Netherlands (1940–1945), Calmeyer was responsible for reviewing claims of Jewish ancestry. In countless cases, he recognized forged certificates of descent, helping people to escape persecution. Through these decisions, thousands were spared deportation and likely death. At the same time, as a bureaucrat of the Nazi administration in The Hague, he rejected numerous other applications and exposed people to persecution. This compelling documentary examines the moral conflict between systemic power and individual humanity during the Nazi era in the occupied Netherlands.

THE FORGOTTEN REVOLT

On 7 October 1944, a revolt broke out in front of Crematorium IV at the Auschwitz-Birkenau extermination camp.

Several dozen prisoners attacked the SS officers with improvised weapons, while others attempted to set the crematoria on fire with homemade grenades. The men involved belonged to the Sonderkommando, a special group of prisoners, mostly young, physically strong Jewish men, that were forced to assist in the operation of the gas chambers and crematoria, placing them at the very heart of the death factory and as witnesses to these crimes. Later, they were condemned to death themselves. The revolt on 7 October 1944 is the only armed uprising that ever took place at Auschwitz.

Sharks hunt in large packs, guided not by sight but by vibration. Stingrays detect the electrical signals of their prey, while ambush predators lie hidden in sand or darkness. Each creature follows its own rhythm, each with its own story. The Ocean's diversity is astonishing. Mantis shrimp perceive a spectrum beyond our imagination, octopuses shift form and color, and fish can change sex within minutes. Corals spawn under moonlight, while tiny larval creatures rise from the depths. Strange and beautiful animals animate the darkness, from the expressive Wonderpus to flashing cuttlefish. Alongside these smaller dramas, giants emerge. Blue whales feed, sharks track blood, and dolphins coordinate complex hunts, displaying intelligence, power, and cooperation. THE OCEAN AT NIGHT is the result of over a decade of underwater filming across Indonesia, the Philippines, the Maldives, the Caribbean, and the Eastern Pacific, capturing behaviors never before seen.

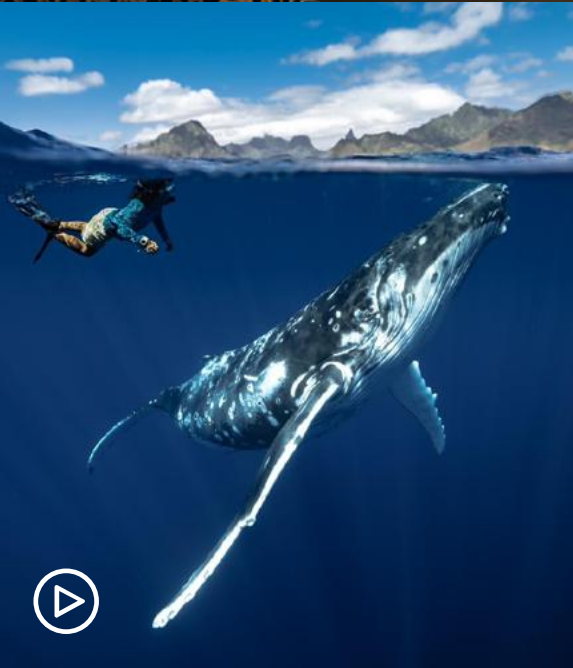

LIFE IN THE OAK

A STAG BEETLE STORY

Only an intact mixed oak forest provides optimal living conditions for the rare stag beetles.

The clearing on the Polish side of the Oder is a very special habitat. Here, nature still seems to be allowed to run wild. White-tailed eagles hunt in the river, as do otters and kingfishers. The clearing is also mating ground for roe deer. Above all, however, it has become a hotspot for the largest beetle in Central Europe, the stag beetle. Their larvae live in decaying oak trees for three to seven years, helping turn wood into humus, before ending its secret life and leaving the ground as a majestic beetle. The males' mouthparts have now become huge 'antlers'. After all, they have to eliminate quite a few competitors before they can reproduce with the much smaller and inconspicuous females. To do this, they need sap of living oak trees, because only this makes them fertile.

In China, biological pest control, such as using parasitic wasps, has long been used to protect food production. And when it comes to monitoring biodiversity in hard-to-reach habitats, a parasite is a real secret weapon – the blood meals of leeches enable researchers to investigate which species are actually present in a particular area.

THE CLONING REVOLUTION

Could human cloning become reality sooner than we think?

Today, pet cloning has even become a commercial reality. This gripping documentary takes viewers inside the high-tech world of cloning research, meeting the scientists at the forefront of one of the most groundbreaking and controversial fields of science. It explores the remarkable advances made over the past three decades, the ethical debates surrounding the technology, its enormous potential, and the risks it poses.



ALL ABOUT HAIR

Hair is far more than just dead keratin. It reflects identity, heritage and the spirit of the times, whilst also serving as a biological archive of our lives.

The film sets out on a quest for clues across the fields of archaeology, forensics, medicine and futurology. It reveals what hair tells us about health, diet and illness, why people are discriminated against on the basis of their hair structure, and how hair health can be maintained. In Munich, forensic scientists analyse hair to solve crimes. They can determine whether someone was drugged with knockout drops or whether the death of a wealthy grandmother was in fact the result of poisoning. In Bolivia and Bolzano, researchers are using hair analysis to unravel the secrets of centuries-old mummies. The journey continues to L'Oréal's research laboratories near Paris. There, molecular biology and artificial intelligence have revolutionised hair research. The aim is to better understand hair loss, slow it down and perhaps even reactivate dormant hair follicles. But the research goes even further: the hair follicle's extraordinary regenerative powers could open up new avenues for the repair of complex organs in the future.





WITHOUT LIMITS

Starting the day without coffee? For millions of people, it's almost unimaginable. Yet climate change is threatening this ritual. "We may be the last generation to drink coffee," fears Brazilian coffee farmer Felipe Croce. Researchers and farmers around the world are searching for solutions in archives, laboratories, on plantations and in forests. At the Royal Botanic Gardens in London, Dr Aaron Davis is scouring the archives for forgotten, more robust coffee varieties. In Uganda, Dr Catherine Kiwuka has made a surprising discovery. And the start-up company Food Brewer is growing coffee cell cultures in steel tanks, attempting to replicate the flavour of the coffee bean.

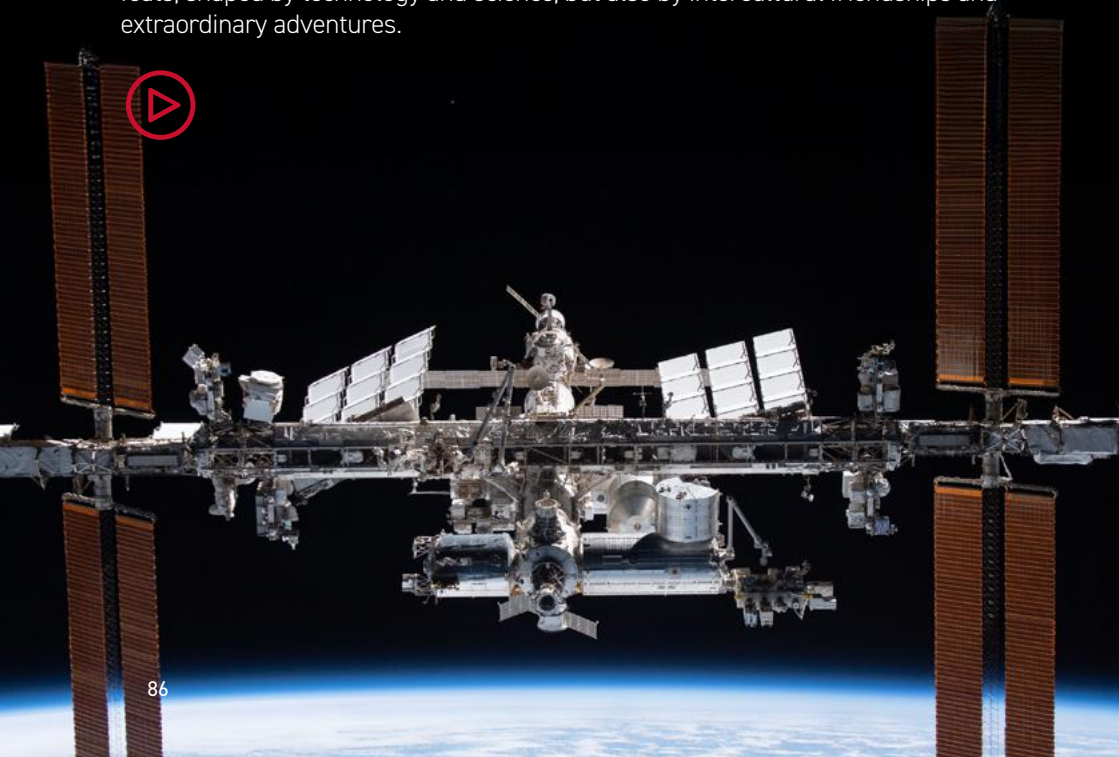

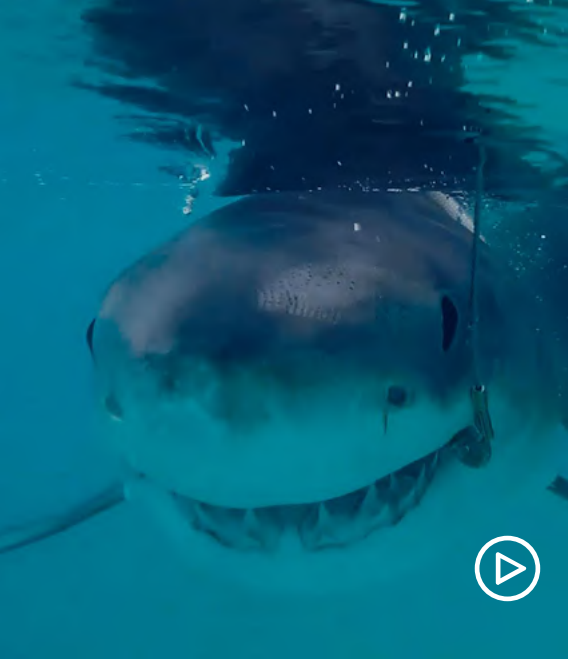

The film follows their extraordinary bond, capturing the twilight of a once-renowned circus star whose fate is tied to the life of her last companion.
