Deepening Dependence on God



This internship began with MC² training, where the Lord taught me that discipleship is not accidental; it requires intentionality.

It means purposefully investing in people, walking alongside them, and helping them grow in their relationship with Christ. That foundation continued through the AIA-GCM partnership training and the outreaches that followed, where we shared the Gospel through the World Cup time.

Through these experiences and the ministry outreaches that continued throughout the internship, I began to understand more deeply what it means to surrender and simply be a vessel through which God's love reaches the nations, while faithfully

walking out the mandate given to us in Matthew 28:18-20.

It also opened my eyes to the urgent need for young people to be reached with the Gospel, and showed me just how diverse that reach can be — that it was never meant to be confined to one channel, but carried through every medium available to us.

There's a joy I won't forget in realizing that the person sitting beside you at a watch party could walk away having given their life to Christ.

More recently, a **Spiritual Disciplines** session reshaped how I understand ministry itself.



I was reminded that ministry should never become a substitute for my relationship with God, but the natural overflow of time spent with Him — a truth that has deepened a season of learning to depend more fully on the Lord and trusting that He is faithful in every stage of the journey.

Embracing Ministry as a Lifestyle



The Global Church Movement internship has been a meaningful season of learning, growth, and discovering more of God's heart for people.

It was more than just an opportunity to serve; it was a season that challenged me to step out of my comfort zone, grow in discipline, and understand that ministry is ultimately about **people and pointing them to Christ**.

One of the greatest lessons I have taken from this experience is that discipleship is intentional and relational. I learned that ministry is not simply about teaching or sharing information, but about walking alongside people, listening to them, encouraging them, and helping them grow in their relationship with God.

Through the **foundational Bible studies** with the youths, I witnessed how consistent investment in a few people can create meaningful spiritual growth.

The internship also strengthened my understanding of evangelism. I was reminded that **sharing the Gospel is not only a responsibility but also a privilege**. I learned to depend on the Holy Spirit, to be courageous in starting spiritual conversations, and to trust God with the results.

Another important takeaway was the **value of discipline and consistency in ministry**. There were moments when serving required patience, flexibility, and perseverance, but these experiences taught me that faithfulness in the small things matters. **God uses our willingness and availability, even when we may not immediately see the impact.**

I began my GCM internship on 26th March 2026, expecting to be trained.

I never expected God to transform the way I see ministry, people, and my own calling. I came into the internship desiring to grow spiritually, understand God's Word more deeply, become equipped in evangelism and discipleship, and develop as a servant of Christ. Looking back, I can confidently say that God did far more than I expected.

Another major highlight was being trained and then starting and leading an MC² class.

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I began this internship expecting to be trained. I leave having been transformed - and ready to keep reaching, discipling, equipping, and multiplying wherever God sends me.

Training to Transformation

The class now has 20 committed members who are putting what they have learned into practice. Together, they have reached **500+ people and seen 86 decisions for Christ**.

For me, this has been one of the clearest pictures of multiplication: being equipped and then equipping others. I have learned that ministry should not stop with me. What God places in my hands should be passed on so that the impact can continue beyond me.

Through AIA (Athletes in Action), I was also trained to share the Gospel with athletes and had the opportunity to train others.

Through this ministry, 10 football players committed to becoming part of a Foundational Bible Study. This showed me how God can use different platforms, including sports, to open doors for evangelism and discipleship.

As this internship comes to an end, I am leaving with a deeper conviction that the training may have a closing date, but the mission continues.

Wambui's Story

Stepping Out in Faith

During the internship, I was trained in MC², discipleship, evangelism, church and community engagement, and the importance of building relationships while helping people grow in faith.

Through MC², I learned the analogy of a farmer who sows a seed, watches it grow, and eventually harvests the grain.

God is the unseen worker behind the process. In the same way, we are called to go to new people and places, share the Gospel, disciple those who respond, and help establish Acts 2:42 communities through the power of the Holy Spirit toward 4G multiplication.



One of the highlights of my internship was mobilizing people for a mission event where 11 participants attended, **and five gave their lives to Christ.** This was a special moment for me, but I learned that leading people to Christ is only the beginning.

Through follow-up and FBS, I witnessed changes in their lives. Some began reading the Bible consistently, others grew in prayer and faith, and one started a small group to share Christ. The group grew from 11 to 16 participants.

I challenged them to disciple their friends and help them grow as well. Some who previously did not see the importance of church fellowship are now attending church and becoming more interested in fellowship.

Personally, I learned the importance of solitude, intentionally spending time with God, reflecting, listening, and slowing down. This gave me boldness and courage during difficult and good seasons.

The internship also challenged me to take a bold step of faith in partnership development. Approaching people, sharing my vision, and inviting them to support God's work was not easy, but it taught me to trust God and overcome fear. Looking back, I can only say, it has been God.



The internship has transformed how I **see ministry and strengthened my walk with Him.** Looking ahead, my desire is to go to people, make disciples, help those disciples make others, and pray for more labourers in God's vineyard, for the harvest is plentiful.

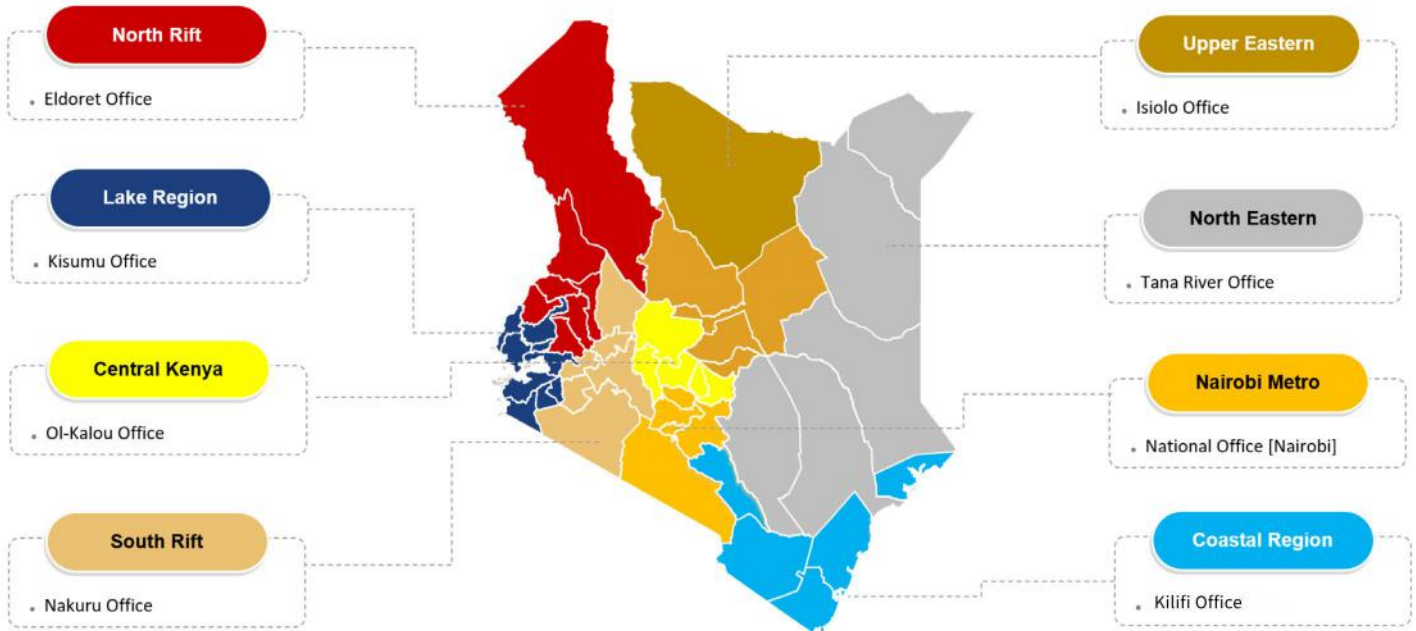
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
