OUR ORIGIN & VISION

Born from Chiara's Vision for North America

The Focolare Foundation was established in November 2024 - a milestone in the Focolare Movement's journey in North America. Its creation was inspired by Chiara Lubich's vision of "Operation Unity Washington DC" - her call, in the year 2000, to make the nation's capital a convergence point from which unity could radiate across the United States and, from there, to the world.

Rooted in that prophetic intuition, the Foundation was born not simply as a legal or financial structure, but as a response to a spiritual calling: to give lasting form to the ideal of unity in a country - and a moment in history - where bridges are urgently needed. It serves the Movement's communities, works, and initiatives throughout North America, sustaining their mission and accompanying the many lives shaped by the spirituality of unity.

The Foundation operates on two pillars:

Financial Sustainability

Long-term financial sustainability & unified fundraising, stewardship, ethical investment, and transparent management of resources.

Relational Impact

Fostering relationships, dialogue & missionary impact - the relational and charismatic heart of the Foundation's work.

This dual approach reflects our conviction that true sustainability requires both financial wisdom and deep human connections. The two are not in tension - they reinforce each other. A Foundation that is financially sound can act with the freedom that love requires. A Foundation rooted in relationship knows where the need is greatest.

The Focolare Foundation serves as a catalyst for change, providing financial support, resources, expertise, and capacity-building to empower communities and organizations while amplifying the impact of grassroots initiatives. We do not simply transfer funds - we accompany, connect, and build. We believe that every dollar given in the spirit of unity carries within it something more than its monetary value: it carries the intention of the giver, the trust of a community, and the hope of those it reaches.

THE HEART OF OUR MISSION

Communion of Goods

The Focolare Foundation is entrusted with handling the Communion of Goods on behalf of the Focolare Movement in North America - the lived practice of shared responsibility and mutual support rooted in the earliest Christian communities, ensuring that no one was in need.

This tradition continues today through the generosity of those who choose to participate. Every gift - whether large or small - is an expression of the spirit of love, unity, and mutual care at the heart of Focolare. Contributions are received as a sacred trust and directed toward the designated mission works.

In this way, each act of giving becomes more than a donation: it is a concrete gesture of communion, a powerful witness that a culture of giving is possible.

"When I arrived at my university from Rwanda almost 8 years ago, I did not know a single person in the US. When I found my Focolare community here in the Boston area about 3 years ago, I was reminded what it means to be a family. I know that if I call, someone will answer. I know that if I have news to share, people will rejoice with me.

And in the last year, I had two financial emergencies that demonstrated that there is sometimes also a concrete communion of goods in addition to the spiritual one. When I got stranded driving to the Mariapolis with my 4-year-old on the side of the road, people stayed on the phone with me.

And when my SNAP benefits were eliminated because of new regulations, my Focolare family helped me stabilize my food situation financially. Even if no one had been able to help, the love of our community would have circulated, and I know God would have taken care of us."

Easing the Burden

When Stella's husband Alex suffered a stroke requiring multiple surgeries and extensive physical therapy, she faced mounting out-of-pocket hospital bills. Through the Communion of Goods, the Volunteers' fund helped pay off the outstanding medical bills. After a year, Alex fully recovered and is back at work. "Stella is truly grateful for this help, which definitely eased her burdens."

Embraced as Family

Our community became aware of a family of refugees from Afghanistan who needed everything: a place to stay, furniture, food, and clothing. We set up a fundraiser over some months. EMERGENCY RELIEF PROGRAMS - 2025

Responding to Crisis, across Communities and Continents

When disaster strikes, the Focolare Foundation responds by channeling donor generosity directly to the communities the Focolare Movement accompanies on the ground. Guided by the conviction that love of neighbor becomes urgent and concrete in moments of crisis, our Emergency Relief programs work through trusted local networks to ensure that every gift reaches those who need it most - as a sign of solidarity from one family to another.

Los Angeles Fire Relief Fund

In January 2025, the Palisades and Eaton fires tore through Los Angeles County, destroying more than 10,000 structures in the largest urban burn California had seen in at least 40 years. In response, the Focolare Foundation launched the Los Angeles Fire Relief Fund to support the Focolare Movement's commitment to accompany those most affected - families who lost their homes, their livelihoods, or both. Rooted in the Movement's call to love one's closest neighbor with renewed attentiveness to those who suffer, the Fund channeled donor generosity directly to individuals and families rebuilding their lives in the aftermath.

This campaign has been closed in the summer of 2025.



Ramos Flores lived in his Altadena home for more than 20 years with his wife, adult son, and two grandchildren - all of it lost in the January 7, 2025 fires. On August 17, the Focolare Foundation presented Ramos with a check from the Los Angeles Fire Relief Fund on the empty lot where his home once stood. Deeply moved, he spoke of seeing the best of humanity in the generosity extended to his family.

Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem - Gaza

The campaign addresses the humanitarian crisis affecting civilians in Gaza, the West Bank, and East Jerusalem - struggling with limited access to food, water, and medical care. Support is channeled through the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, coordinated by AMU and the Focolare Movement Emergency Committee.

Immediate Assistance - Hundreds of displaced families are supported in church facilities. Ongoing distribution of essentials and medicines to the vulnerable.

Community Continuity - Holy Family parish provides refuge and education for displaced children.

Protection of Social Bonds - Local parishes and centers offer shelter and protection for those who lost their homes and livelihoods.

In partnership with Caritas Spes Ukraine - mobile clinics and home-care services in the Kharkiv and Vinnytsia regions, reaching communities most isolated and affected by bombardments.

Proximity care - Mobile clinics bring healthcare directly into homes, shelters, and displacement centers - overcoming logistical, economic, and security barriers.

Mental health - In a context marked by trauma, grief, and isolation, psychological support became integral - helping people find stability and trust.

Continuity - Constant presence built lasting relationships between healthcare workers and communities, protecting the dignity of the most vulnerable.

Founded in 1990 by Focolare Movement member Marisol Jimenez in Santo Domingo's Herrera neighborhood, Café con Leche has grown from summer volunteer programs into a permanent school educating more than 500 students from basic literacy through workplace skills - with backing from the Dominican government. In 2025, the school launched a music band for children with special educational needs, developing hidden skills, concentration, and motor abilities through violin and wind instrument classes.



"There is a classmate of mine who has many difficulties at home, so he almost never brings a snack. So I talk with my other classmates and we all share a little with him so that he can eat."

Through the initiative of Focolare volunteers in Canada, the United States, and elsewhere, ten new children joined Haiti's distance adoption program this year, bringing the roster to 115. The addition reversed natural attrition - down from 131 in 2024 to 105 entering 2025 as children completed the program - securing continuity and renewed momentum in its 33rd year. A testament to what mission-driven partnership across three countries can accomplish.

Support at a Distance is AFN's flagship program, rooted in the Focolare Movement's 1970s tradition of family-based solidarity. It serves orphans, refugees, street children, and children from poor families through integrated support in nutrition, education, and medical care. Now evolved into sustainable community development, the program lets supporters back an individual child or an entire project, accompanying communities toward autonomy and freedom.



Born with hearing difficulties, Zaid struggled to fit in at public school - until he found the EHIS center in Aleppo, supported by the Focolare Movement's Seeds of Hope program. Among children who shared his experience, he made friends and, word by word, began to speak more clearly. Asked what he wanted to say to his mother, he answered:

"I may be weak, or not speak well, but because you are with me, mom, I am very intelligent, my friends love me, and they tell me my smile is beautiful. Thank you, Mom."

Design proposal for the ICUPJ

The International Center for Unity & Peace in Jerusalem (ICUPJ) fulfills a vision Chiara Lubich first expressed in 1956 at the site of St. Peter in Gallicantu on Mt. Zion - tradition's setting for Jesus' prayer "that they may all be one" (John 17:21). Built on four pillars - spirituality, study, dialogue, and formation - the Center will serve as a space for interreligious and intercultural encounter in the Holy City, open to visitors and residents alike, and dedicated to peace education among Christians, Jews, and Muslims.

The Focolare Forum is the Focolare Movement's US platform for interreligious, interchurch, and intercultural encounter, advancing the charism of unity through dialogue, study, and joint action. In 2025, the Forum's flagship initiative was the Sustainable Peace Networks Forum, which convened leaders, grassroots activists, NGOs, and institutional voices from diverse churches, religions, and cultural traditions. Focolare Movement President Margaret Karram delivered the opening address, and participants committed to co-developing a shared "Peace Protocol," alongside a broader process to build a "network of networks" for grassroots peace.

The Forum also sustained year-round dialogue with Muslim and Jewish friends and deepened collaboration with a growing network of partner organizations - universities, NGOs, peacebuilding coalitions, and faith-based institutions - fostering a culture of encounter, mutual care, and shared responsibility for peace.

Economy of Communion (EoC)

Business doesn't have to be selfish. Business can be a gift. The Economy of Communion (EoC) is a global network of businesses inspired by Chiara Lubich, who launched this initiative in Brazil in 1991.

Today, more than 750 businesses worldwide voluntarily share a portion of their profits with those in need and invest in their communities - putting the human person, not capital, at the center of enterprise. The EoC is a living expression of the "culture of giving" - the same spirit that animates the Communion of Goods.

The Foundation supports EoC formation activities in North America and the EoC Project at Creighton University, a three-year initiative at the Heider College of Business made possible by a grant from the John Templeton Foundation, developing free educational resources to form a new generation of business leaders for whom profit serves a greater purpose.

Washington, D.C. Hub



Everything begins with Chiara Lubich's remarkable intuition. During her 2000 visit to the US she articulated: "In these lands of abundance, variety, and division, the Focolare's mission is to bring together and create communion and give a soul to plurality." She saw Washington DC as a convergence point.

This campaign translates that vision into reality: building or acquiring Focolare community houses, a hospitality space, and meeting rooms. These spaces will offer a lasting home for formation, community life, dialogue and encounter in the heart of the city.

Focolare Movement Endowment Fund



The Focolare Foundation is built on the lasting legacy of the Focolare Movement's little city "Mariapolis Luminosa" - a place that brought the ideals of unity and love to life for countless individuals and families across North America.

The pending sale of the Mariapolis Luminosa property will provide the foundation for a permanent endowment that will sustain the Movement's mission for generations to come. Contributions are invested to generate income, which funds program expenses in the long run - ensuring financial stability so the Movement's work can continue.

EXPANDING THE MISSION

Looking Ahead - New Horizons of Unity

In 2026 the Focolare Foundation expands its reach with new programs that carry the charism of unity into fresh contexts - accompanying young adults in discernment at home, and standing with vulnerable families across the world. Each new initiative is a response to needs the Movement has heard and a sign of what generosity makes possible.

US & Canada Programs: Focolare Discernment Experience

Launched in 2026, the Focolare Discernment Experience accompanies young adults seeking clarity around major life decisions and personal vocation, grounded in the spirituality of the Focolare Movement. In a culture of noise, distraction, and pressure to decide quickly, the program offers something countercultural: time, silence, companionship, and a path for listening to God's voice.

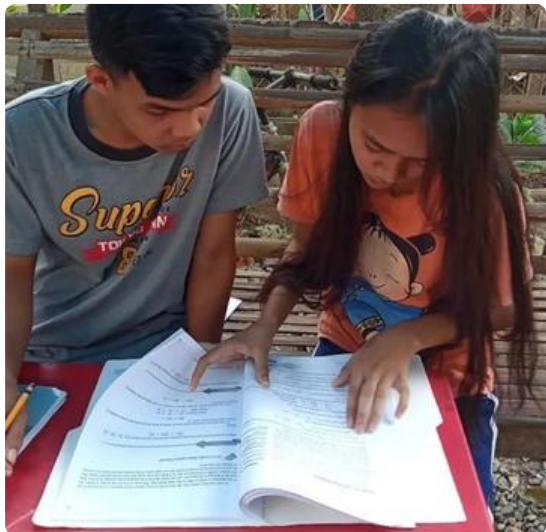
Through five monthly live-in weekends of prayer, mentoring, and reflection - culminating in a mission experience - participants encounter the Focolare charism as a model of attentive discernment. They walk alongside peers and mentors through questions of faith, relationships, work, and purpose. Two Focolare communities in Houston, Texas have been opened to support this mission.

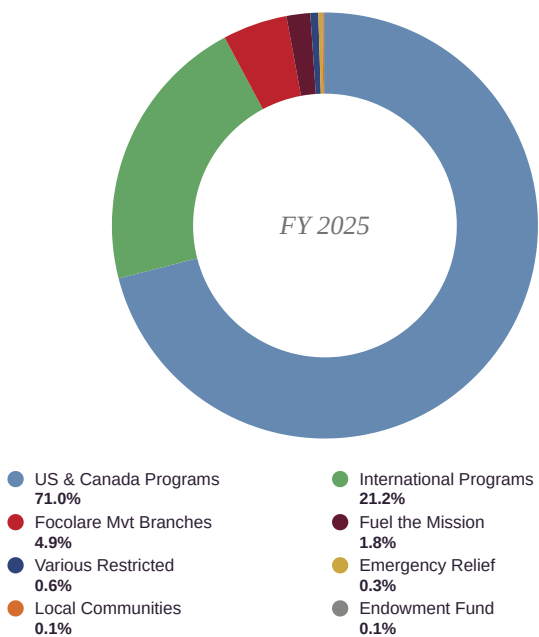

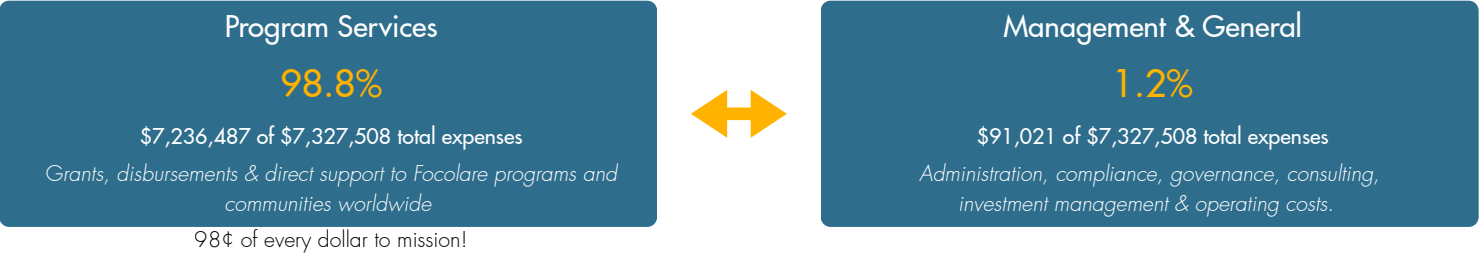

A Word on Stewardship

The Focolare Foundation is committed to transparency and responsible stewardship of every gift entrusted to us. In 2025, 98 cents of every dollar spent went directly to program services - grants and support to Focolare communities and initiatives in North America and worldwide. We are a qualified charitable organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, recognized under the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Group Ruling GEN 0928.

Contributions are tax-deductible to the extent provided by law. The Foundation maintains separate restricted accounts for each fund to ensure that designated gifts reach their intended purpose. Investment assets are held and managed through the Catholic Community Foundation of Minnesota (CCF), a mission-aligned custodian consistent with our values.
