Your Campus

The Hex



The Hex Student & Learning Centre is located at the heart of the College campus and is home to our student support teams. It is a quiet space for LMC learners to access a wide range of support and to focus on their independent study.

It is split into 2 areas: the Learning Zone and the Support & Inclusion Zone.

Learning Zone: a quiet space with PCs, laptops and physical resources for you to undertake independent study. Support is on hand from our friendly staff to help with study skills, IT support and access to a wide range of learning resources.

Support & Inclusion Zone: this is where our support teams are based and is a dedicated space for 1-1 meetings with our Pastoral Mentors, Careers Advice and Guidance team, Behaviour and Inclusion Mentors, Student Money Advisors and Student Engagement team. You can drop-in for an informal chat or book an appointment for more in-depth support.

There is a water fountain for you to refill your bottles in the Support & Inclusion Zone but no other food or drink is permitted in the building.

The Courtyard

The Courtyard is a peaceful, vape-free outdoor area covered by a canopy for you to relax and unwind all year round. This area also holds our 200th Birthday artwork from local artist Chas Jacobs, go and check it out!

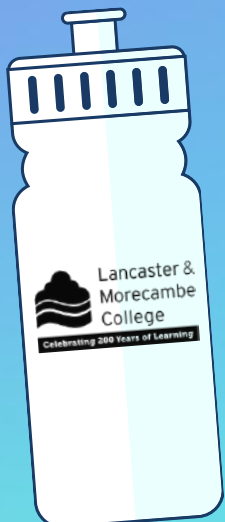

Green Leaders

This exciting new project will offer you the opportunity to take part in a range of climate action activities which will enhance your knowledge of local and global environmental issues and help build skills essential for your future career.

This 6-month, intensive programme will empower young adults to develop their own fully-funded climate action project in response to a local problem. You will attend a 3-day residential to build confidence and knowledge, meet local groups and employers and be mentored by a Green Action facilitator from Lancaster University who will support you to plan and deliver a relevant project (£500 funding is available for each participant).

It will run from January-June each academic year. You will attend an initial delivery day in January visit local projects in February and meet employers and a 3-day residential in March. The rest of the time you will be working with your mentor to research, plan and deliver your climate action project.

Green Passport

This 3-day programme is based around the interests and career choices of participants and covers a broad range of topics such as: fast fashion, digital footprint, sustainable tourism, biodiversity, sustainable food production.

You will meet employers and organisations, and develop a project linked to a subject you are passionate about. The HE programme is 2 days and will be held at Lancaster University.

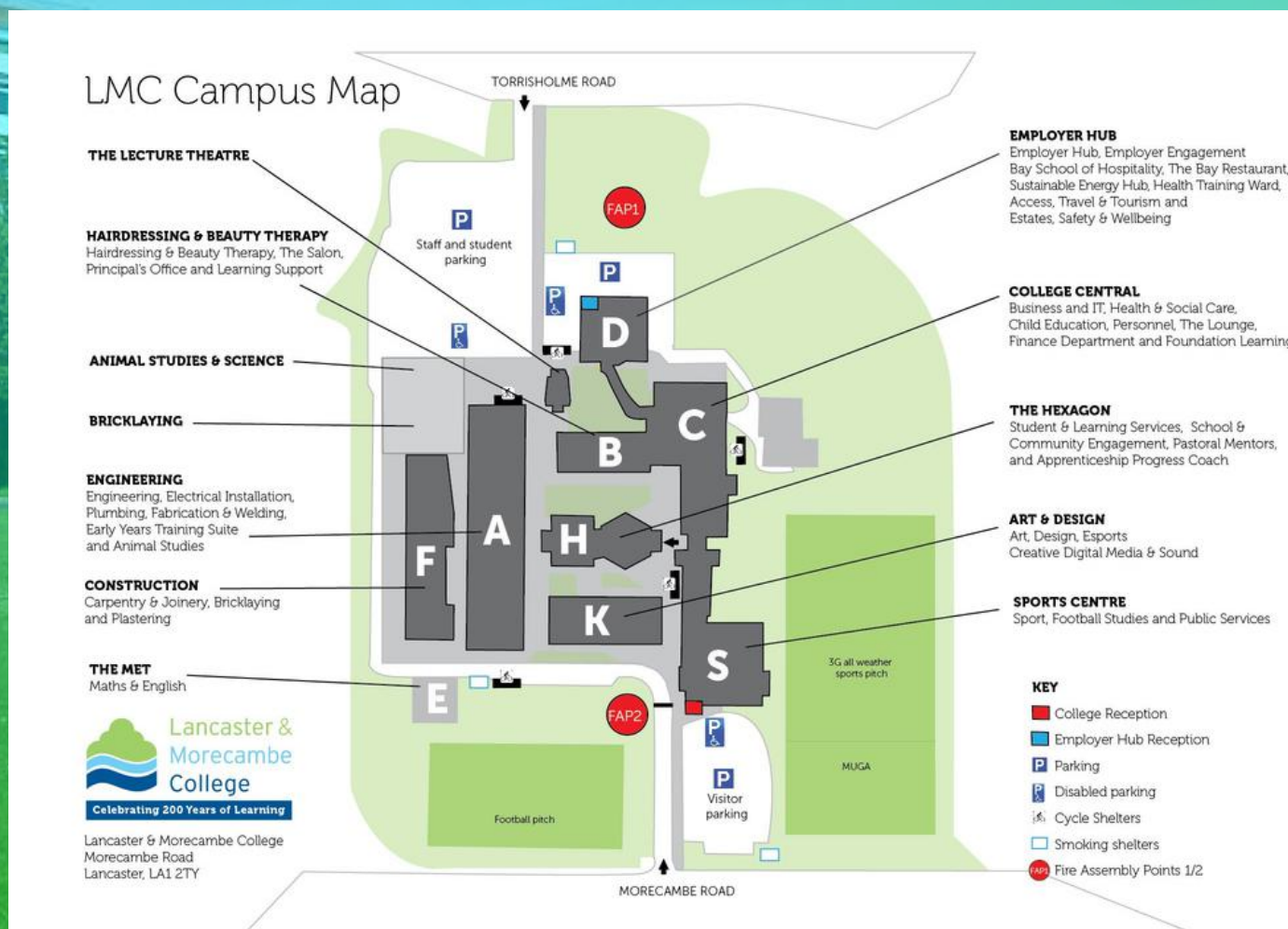

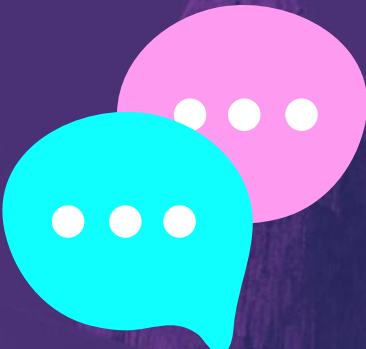

Worried about the cost of going to College?

Lancaster & Morecambe College have a range of financial support from the **Learner Support Fund** to help our learners who may find it difficult to cover the costs of participating in education. Depending on your circumstances, we can help you access financial support tailored to your needs:

- Free Meals
- Kits, Uniforms, Trips

Learner Support Fund

You can apply for **LMC Learner Support Fund** if:

- You are studying a full-time course and/or substantial part-time course (30 hours or more).
- Your total household income is **less than £38,000 or £45,000 for travel only**, (combined earnings from employment and means-tested benefits like Universal Credits).

16-18 Vulnerable Bursary

You can apply for the **16-18 Vulnerable Bursary** if:

- You are 16 and under 19 and in care or recently left local authority care
- You are in receipt of Universal Credit and financially supporting yourself,
- You are in receipt of DLA/PIP AND Universal Credit under your name.

Higher Education (HE) courses (HNC, HND, Degree) and Apprenticeships are not eligible for the Learner Support Fund.

For HE courses, you will need to apply for support through Student Finance England **gov.uk/get-undergraduate-student-loan**

For Apprentices, please speak to a Student Money Advisor in the Hex

FUNDED BUS PASS

LSF-funded Stagecoach Bus Pass

You are eligible for a Learner Support Fund (LSF) funded Stagecoach termly bus pass if you live more than 1.5 miles from College (measured using Google Maps walk), are studying a full-time course, and your household income is less than £35,000 (before tax) including income from means-tested benefits. This bus pass can only be used during term time.

LSF-Funded Stagecoach bus passes are only available to eligible students who are not on the College bus route. However, we can offer discounted termly Stagecoach bus passes to buy from The Hex for all students who are not eligible for funding. Please see below for the Stagecoach bus pass prices:

Cumbria and Yorkshire Students

Our buses are free to students from Cumbria and Yorkshire who are studying on a full-time course. However, you will need to get to the nearest allocated free bus stop.

Students Living South of Lancaster

You are eligible for a free Stagecoach termly bus pass if you live in Galgate or further south and are studying on a full-time course.

Apprentices

Apprentices may be able to get support for travel costs to College and the workplace - please contact the Student Money team on 01524 521469 to find out more.

Supported Internships

If you are on an Internship, we can support your travel costs if you live more than 1.5 miles from College or your placement (measured using Google Maps walk) and your household income is less than £35,000 including income from means-tested benefits.

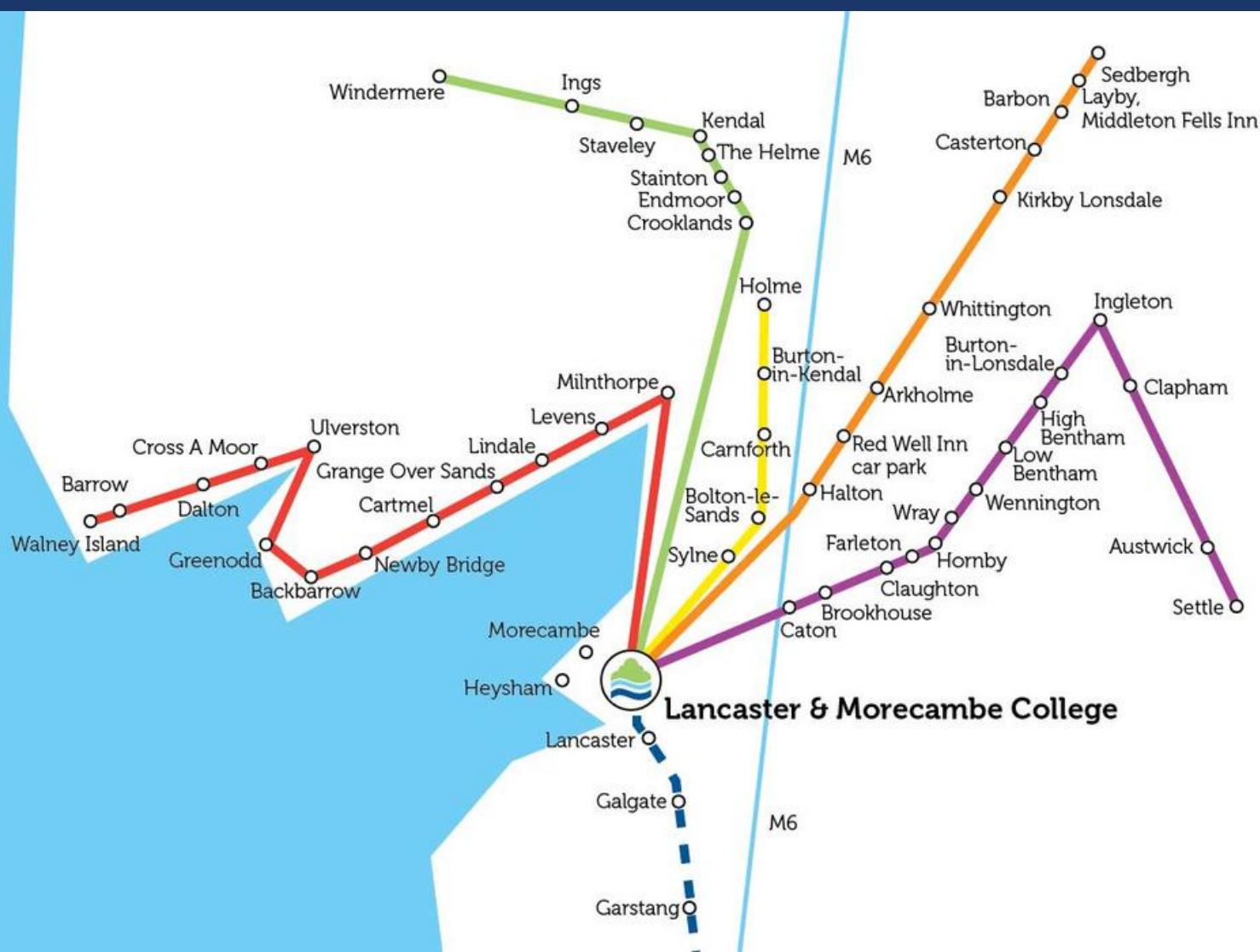
FREE BUS SERVICE

We provide a free bus service to students who live outside Lancaster and Morecambe and are studying on a full-time course or an apprenticeship. Buses will operate from Monday, 1st September. For a detailed list of our free bus routes, please visit: lmc.ac.uk/bus

Before you enrol with us, you can use your induction letter from College as ID to get on the bus. After you enrol, you'll be issued with a College ID card and lanyard which you will use on the bus. You can only use your specific free bus route (you can't use every route). Your allocated bus stop will be printed on your ID Card.

Students who live in Lancaster and Morecambe are expected to make their own way to College, though if you live more than 1.5 miles from campus you may be eligible for a funded bus pass. We have a number of places to store your bikes for those wishing to cycle to campus, as well as free on-site parking for students who drive to College.

To ensure all our learners reach their potential, LMC expects learners to agree and adhere to a simple code of conduct linked to our values, to prepare you for your next steps.

As a learner at LMC you agree to:

- Behave in a polite and considerate manner at all times
- Treat everyone with respect in person and online
- Wear your LMC lanyard
- Attend all of your planned sessions
- Be punctual – be in the right place at the right time
- Report absence via hotline or online before planned session
- Complete all your work to the best of your ability by agreed deadlines
- Take responsibility for your own learning
- Behave safely at all times and do not put others at risk. Do not behave in an aggressive or intimidating manner
- Keep your college clean – don't litter
- Not eat or drink in classrooms or workshops – apart from bottled water
- Not use mobile phones in class unless directed
- No audio/video recording of staff or students without consent, or sharing of digital material of staff or learners
- Wear suitable clothing or correct uniform/kit if required
- Bring all required equipment
- Not bring alcohol, drugs, drug paraphernalia or dangerous items to college
- Not use or consume alcohol or non-prescription drugs prior to or during timetabled sessions
- Only vape in outdoor areas at a distance away from College buildings and open windows, which is considerate to non-vapers. This means a clear distance around entrances/exits into buildings to allow people to pass without walking through vape emissions.
- Not carry vocational tools that could cause harm such as tools, knives, razors or scissors onto or around college unless explicitly authorised for supervised training
