Grades 6-12. Students submit original stop motion videos, demonstrating creativity, artistry, and technical skills. Winners are recognized at CRRL's Stop Motion Video Contest Viewing Party.

Trebuchet Contest

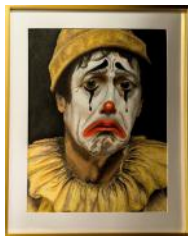

Access Services • The library provides additional support, accessible collections, and a newsletter for those with special needs.

Book Groups • Enjoy growth and connection through book discussions for all interests. Book Group in a Bag (page 1) is also available for adults.

Kanopy and Kanopy Kids • Streaming video includes educational, documentary, and classic and foreign films. Kanopy Kids is curated for children, focusing on ages 2-8.

Lectures, Films, Art Exhibits, Author Talks, and Concerts • Special events offer educational and cultural experiences that enhance the quality of life for people of all ages.

Lifestyle Classes • Hands-on and virtual classes deliver exploratory learning, such as consumer protection, personal finance, gardening, cooking, sewing, and health and wellness.
