COURSE CANCELLATION

LEADING READING FOR PLEASURE: BRIDGING RESEARCH AND PRACTICE FOR THE READING TEACHER

DESCRIPTION

AUDIENCE

All Primary School Teachers, TA's, ECT's & Senior Leaders

International research evidence indicates the power and potential of reading for pleasure for academic outcomes and children's social and emotional well-being. However, reading enjoyment is declining across 8–18-year-olds in the UK. This conference day, led by Prof. Teresa Cremin CBE and Debbie Thomas from the OURfP team in partnership with Peterborough LA, responds to this challenging reality and aims to engage and support professionals in developing children's choice-led recreational reading within and beyond school. Highlighting the pivotal role of Reading Teachers, this practical and thought-provoking day will offer research-informed ways forward to build communities of engaged readers and create rich cultures of reading.



Professor Teresa Cremin CBE

Professor Teresa Cremin CBE is Professor of Education (Literacy) at The Open University, UK, and co Director of the Literacy and Social Justice Centre which creates space for research, practice and advocacy to enrich educational opportunities for all. An ex-teacher and teacher trainer, Teresa's research focuses on understanding and supporting children's reading motivation and engagement, with particular attention to teachers' knowledge, practice and identities as readers and writers. Teresa is a Fellow of the EA, the AcSS, the RSA and Trustee of the UKLA and the Reading Agency. Teresa is also a Trustee of the UK Literacy Association, The Reading Agency and Love Reading and advises the DfE on reading for pleasure. She has published over 35 books on teaching literacy, including Reading and Writing for Pleasure: An Evidence-informed Framework for Practice with H. Hendry, S. Hulston and L. Chamberlain and Reading for Pleasure: International Perspectives with S. McGeown (edited) (both Routledge, 2025). Teresa leads a reading for pleasure research and practice coalition to support children and teachers as readers.



Debbie Thomas

Debbie Thomas One of only two Lecturers in Reading for Pleasure (RfP) in the UK, Debbie works in the Open University RfP research and practice coalition to enrich and promote RfP research and pedagogy. She does this in part through the flagship Reading Schools Programme and national network of OU/UKLA Teachers' Reading Groups. Her work is focused on translating research findings into practice with teachers, librarians, students, consultants, literacy charities and other partners. Currently, Debbie is involved in scrutinising the consequences of developing OU RfP pedagogy for children's engagement in reading and researching teachers' development as the Reading Teachers of tomorrow.

Ruth is the lead developer and author of the Oxford International Early Years Curriculum for 2–6-year-olds and leads the OUPEY training for schools internationally.

She has recently published an award winning third book, “A Manifesto for Early Years” to accompany her previous books, “A child centred EYFS” and “Early Childhood Theories Today” with her co-author Dr Aaron Bradbury. Ruth was named “Nursery World Trainer of the Year” in 2021 and an “International Edruptor” by ISC Research in 2022.

Ruth will also use the most current publications from the DFE and Ofsted to empower delegates to articulate their approaches to others.
