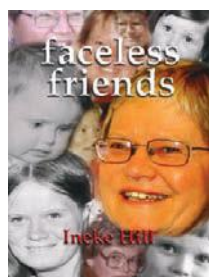

RAA announces grants to keep regional South Australians safe

RAA has announced grant funding for 18 community projects aimed at improving safety in regional South Australian communities.

Senior Manager Strategic Communications, Amanda Trainor said RAA is really pleased to be improving safety in South Australia's regional communities.

"RAA's Regional Safety Grants program supports a diverse range of sporting clubs and community groups across the state, from Smoky Bay to Paringa.

"The total grant pool of \$52,871 has been distributed between 18 worthy projects across the state including Kangaroo Island, and will improve the safety of rural South Australian communities," said Ms Trainor.

RAA will install a security system at the Waikerie High School to protect the premises following a number of recent break-ins.

Riding for the Disabled in Whyalla and the Yorke Peninsula will be replacing helmets with new ones that are correctly equipped for their lessons.

The Chiton Rocks Surf Lifesaving Club, which is located near Victor Harbor, has received a grant to replace their rusted trailer that carries and launches their inflatable rescue boat.

The Mid North Archers have won funding to install a fence to separate the Archery Club from the Karting Club.

In Murray Bridge, the Sporting Car Club and Motorcycle Club Inc. will build a first aid room on-site so spectators and competitors can receive immediate medical attention.

In Yankalilla, the Netball Club has received funding to change the position of their driveway which will ensure pedestrian safety by separating traffic from the sporting area.

Other funded projects include first aid equipment, security systems, fencing, and safety equipment for sport.

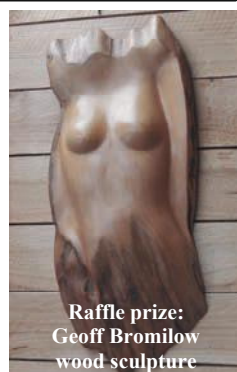

interested in following up on the film project with another TV segment for Ch 7.

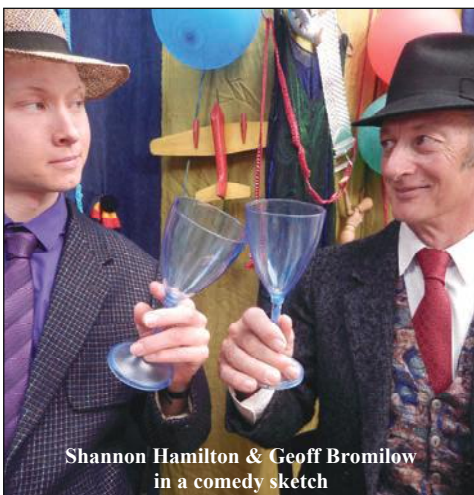

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Sketch Block

Professional artists are busy people and constantly in demand to share their special skills and talents both as teachers and exhibitors. Many spend several months in out of the way places and therefore are not always available. In saying this, our June tutor has never failed to answer our call and come up with the goods much appreciated and delight to our members. Our June session was under the tutorage of Lorraine Lewitska, water colour artist. On this occasion she provided us with two demonstrations. Her first subject was of two people and a dog walking, a simple but strong image and the second was that of a floral display and vase. In structuring her paintings Lorraine carefully drew the outline of her subjects and then indicated the areas of high light and shadow. Lorraine mixed her colours on the

pallet and used them basically as an under painting leaving the white of the paper as the highlight. She wet parts of her paper to allow her colours to merge. When dry she went in with the darker colours to bring out the shadows. Lorraine's application of the paint seemed a little chaotic compared with the precise drawing but it worked beautifully. Most colourists will wet and stretch the paper beforehand but on this occasion Lorraine painted directly on to dry paper only wetting areas she wanted as she painted. She limited her stroke whilst painting and allowed the paint and water to do their work and did not fuss about detail with pleasing results. Lorraine used the same technique when painting the vase of flowers. In the roses she stroked the paint in the natural direction the petals formed. Using pink red and green as the under

painting for flowers and leaves etc, then added darker colours for shadows but leaving splashes of white paper as reflected light. It was a most interesting session with many questions and answers. After lunch Lorraine provided individual tuition to our members.

Yankalilla Mens Probus Club

On the 5th June 1990, the Rotary Club of Yankalilla facilitated a meeting at Maison Fleuriu which resulted in the formation of the Yankalilla Mens Probus Club. The first President of the Club was the late Norm Aukett.

Our meeting on 7th June recognised the Anniversary of our formation with a shorter meeting to allow our partners to join us for a special lunch at the Yankalilla Hotel.

At the meeting, our newest member, Peter Whitford, gave an extended personal profile outlining his early life at Myponga and his later life as a stud dairy herdsman and his involvement in the wider dairy industry and local government.

The meeting was tinged with sadness as we remembered our longest serving member, Rex Rowley, who died on 2nd June after a 12 month battle with cancer. He joined the Club in March 1991 and was President in 2004-2005.

Rex was born in 1930 in Yankalilla and spent his early life at Myponga. Both his parents had died from tuberculosis by the time he was a teenager but, despite this setback, he completed an outstanding academic career culminating in a scholarship to the University of Adelaide where he majored in

Geology and Chemistry.

His Geology Professor was Sir Douglas Mawson who became Rex's hero. Rex developed a love of the outback and especially the Flinders Ranges from his involvement with Mawson. He gave a talk on Mawson's life at Meander Cottages in April this year.

Rex was involved in the mining or chemical industry for his working life which took him to all parts of the world.

Rex and Necia retired to Martin Road, Yankalilla in 1990. On their property they developed a sanctuary of native plant species and they both developed an encyclopaedic knowledge of native flora which led to their involvement in the Australian Native Plant Society and Nangawooka at Victor Harbor.

Everything Rex was involved in he approached with fervour, enthusiasm and determination but at the same time he was a modest and caring person. He was a devoted family man sharing his life with Necia, their 4 children and 6 grandchildren for over 60 years.

Rex Rowley was a gentleman.

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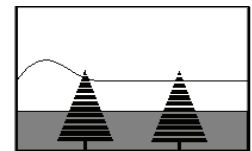
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Up And At 'Em!

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Parenting Mastery – you're not alone. Someone else has written about it!

It's all too easy to feel immense guilt as a non-bi-parent. It's also easy to naively think that you need to, or can, make-up for the absence of a bi-parent. As a step parent it is not a smooth journey. What's happening is complex and it often goes unacknowledged. I decided to see what is being written on the topic. I borrowed two publications from the local library, neither of which were recent, yet I found them to be honest and insightful. I have listed the titles below. Here is my brief interpretation (and common themes) of what I read:

- The non-bi-parent and bio-parent need to remember their partnership is strong and nurture this along with nurturing their blended family.
- Be clear on the role (and boundaries) of the non-bi-parent. This of course needs to be a mutual agreement and with the well-being of all in mind.
- Blending a family will take time

(usually years) for all to get along and feel loved, so don't expect it to happen overnight.

It's common knowledge that blended families are not uncommon. However this doesn't deny that a non-bi-parent can feel invisible at times. I knew I needed to be the adult and do the best I could to be a positive influence in my step-child's life. I remember how much harder this was when listening to comments by family and friends who disregarded my role. It really can be an emotionally isolating experience. Thankfully with time the love you have for your new family can help ease that which goes unrecognised.

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Grants to connect your school with nature

Applications are now open for schools to apply for more than \$70,000 in grants, offered through the Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges Natural Resources Management Board.

The NRM School Action Grants are available to primary, high and pre-schools in the Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges region, to learn about protecting our natural resources.

The grants can be used to fund projects and activities such as veggie and butterfly gardens, frog ponds, outdoor learning spaces and to support sustainable use of resources.

"These are fantastic grants that involves the whole school community including kids, parents and teachers. It's a great opportunity to extend and deepen how schools can become involved in sustainability," said Professor Chris Daniels, who is presiding member of the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges Natural Resources Management Board.

"These NRM School Action Grants support really practical, hands-on projects in schools that enthuse and empower young people to protect and improve our environment."

Professor Daniels said that Grove Kindergarten in Eastwood, for example, used an NRM School Action Grant to build a water garden and frog pond, assisted by families. This was a continuation of the pre-school's efforts to attract local native animals to their yard, following work done there to build 'lizard lounge' and 'bug hotel' habitats. As a result of having the pond on site, children can now observe the life cycle of a frog and explore the interdependence of living things," he said.

"With their Action grant, Galilee Catholic School at Aldinga Beach created an 8000m² indigenous outdoor learning habitat. The project brings together biodiversity, social cohesion and commitment to integrated, sustainable management of natural resources. The children are developing skills, knowledge & understanding of managing the landscape.

"A healthy environment underpins our economy and way of life, and schools have an incredibly important role in sharing with us all what is possible. These projects help students to develop the skills, knowledge and values to lead a sustainable lifestyles. "Our aim is for the grants to inspire in young people a lifelong love, appreciation and stewardship of the environment," Professor Daniels said.

Tree Scheme vital for SA's environmental future

Seedling orders for the Trees For Life 2016-17 growing season are now open.

Through the Tree Scheme program landholders can buy bulk seedlings for windbreaks, habitat for wildlife, stock shelter, and to combat salinity and soil erosion. With over 220 species available through the scheme from ground covers to large trees, there are lots of useful plants to choose from.

The Tree Scheme can help with species selection and provide seedlings at below market price. Participants can order materials to grow seedlings themselves or request assistance from one of our volunteer growers to raise seedlings over summer ready for planting in Autumn next year.

This year the scheme has introduced more flexibility with ordering options so landholders and groups can purchase two, four, six, eight or 10 boxes.

The forms have also been reformatted to make it even easier to choose the right plants for your project - identifying plant height, shape, soil type, drought tolerance and a description of its possible uses, including shelter, shade, encouraging pollinators, firewood or fodder.

Trees For Life seedlings are native to South Australia and planted in the area where the seed is collected.

"Offering seedlings that occur naturally in the region means they are well suited to local conditions, pose no risk of becoming weed species, and provide benefits for local wildlife and ecosystems," said Trees For Life Revegetation Services Manager Vicki-Jo Russell.

This winter, Trees For Life members are planting more than 450,000 local native seedlings for

farmland and revegetation projects in South Australia.

"The Tree Scheme has grown 32 million seedlings since 1981 by matching country landholders with volunteers willing to support them in their important efforts to revegetate," said Vicki-Jo.

The order season will close 31 July.

Council too reflects at this time of year and a report prepared for you, the rate payer (shareholder), to be informed of it's performance. I would like to reflect on some of the things the elected members set out to do, and I think they have done well.

In November 2014 this elected member body came together. 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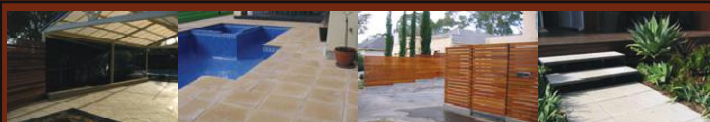

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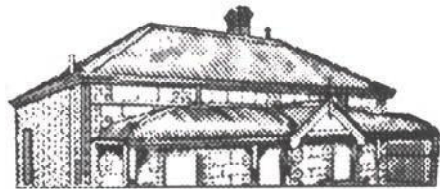
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Yankalilla Men's Shed

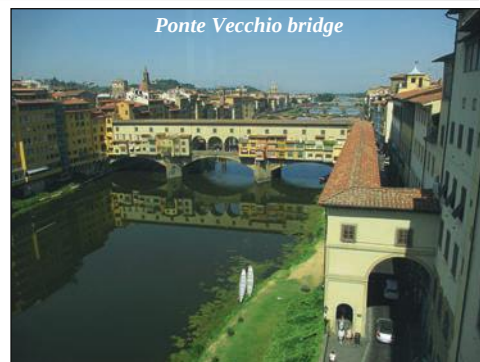

Living The Life Less Plastic

What has grown from 40 people in Perth to 25,000 people in 83 countries?

What inspired 33,000 views and 463 shares on Facebook in just two days? What do coffee shops in Cottesloe, Claremont, Mosman Park, Peppermint Grove, Subiaco and Victoria Park have in common?

It's Plastic Free July!

The Plastic Free July environmental initiative which began in Perth's western suburbs with 40 volunteers four years ago has grown into a global campaign involving more than 25,000 people, schools and businesses in 83 countries - and the challenge is again on offer to everyone this July.

Plastic Free July challenges people, schools, businesses and community groups to avoid single-use plastic for a month.

Co-founder of the campaign and Earth Carers Coordinator at WMRC, Rebecca Prince-Ruiz, says the success of Plastic Free July has taken its founders by surprise. "Although it's a simple concept, saying no to single-use plastic, such as shopping bags, drink bottles, disposable cups and straws can be challenging, it opens your eyes to how ubiquitous plastic is in our society and with it the many issues connected with it, not least the environmental consequences," she says.

"Unlike other materials like paper or glass, most plastic is downcycled, so it only gets recycled once, and recycle rates are as low as about 23%, so joining in the Plastic Free July challenge is a way of drawing attention to this major issue and doing something about it. Participants soon discover it's not a breeze, in fact it's extremely hard to avoid plastic packaging, but going on the Plastic Free July challenge has resulted in many people deciding to go plastic free permanently which is really life changing."

"No one person has the answers to

single-use plastic," adds Ms Prince-Ruiz. "But by creating Plastic Free July and providing a means for people to challenge our habit of accepting single-use plastic, we're enabling a way of life that more and more people want to live – shopping locally and more ethically, being more healthy, gaining greater engagement with the local community and living more lightly on the planet."

What's the problem?

- In the first 20 years of this century, more plastic was produced than in the entire 20th century
- Every piece of plastic ever produced still exists
- In Australia only 21% of plastic is recycled
- 8 million tonnes of plastic enters the ocean each year
- Marine debris affects over 690 marine species

What can you do:-

- Register @ www.plasticfreejuly.org – choose how long and how much plastic you are going to refuse.
- Get started – observe your habits, research alternatives, remember your reusables and take action.
- Share your journey – inspire others with your plastic free challenge.

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Weed Of The Month from Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group Flinders Ranges Wattle (*Acacia iteaphylla*)

Originally from the Flinders Ranges and Eyre Peninsula, this shrub is now a bit of a pest in parts of Australia, and indeed has been declared an environmental weed in some... probably because its seeds remain viable for long periods, and germinate readily! Being from an arid region, it is also very hardy. It is fast growing to about 2-4m tall, with upright branches and attractive bluey grey-green foliage. The foliage is not made up of true leaves, but like many acacias, phyllodes. These are very narrow and long (50-100mm), with a little gland at the base. They occur



alternately along the stems. The perfumed, lemon-yellow flower balls occur in clusters, mainly in spring.



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These are followed by blue-green seed pods that go brown in maturity. Pretty shrub, but can be a problem!

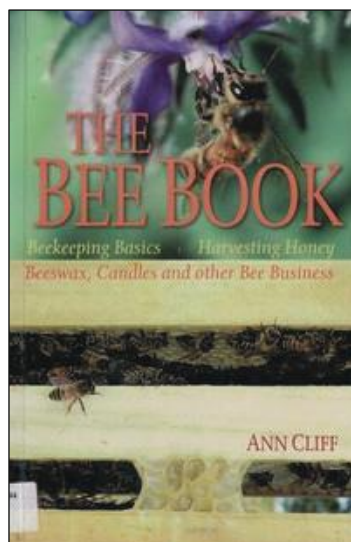

Honey has been an important food for people for thousands of years. Their desire for it led to the 'domestication' of bees, through crafting artificial beehives and manipulating the bees' food sources. But quite apart from the harvests of honey and wax, the life-giving role of bees in pollinating many

plants that people rely on for food, has made them the stuff of legend, mystery, worship and, nowadays, also controversy.

Although some people believe that our reliance on bees for the cultivation of food crops is much exaggerated (as some major staples like rice, wheat and even potatoes don't need them), there is no doubt that there are many crops whose very survival depends on bees. And that is why the recent, somewhat mysterious decline in bee populations around the world is so concerning to people who worry about the future of our natural environment.

Anyone interested in growing food, who wants to find out what a beehive or two will give them, even on such a small scale as the suburban backyard or the terrace-house garden, will find this book an indispensable introduction to keeping bees.

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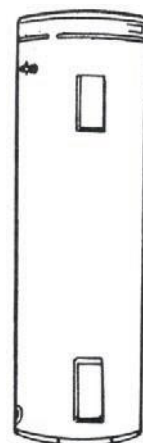

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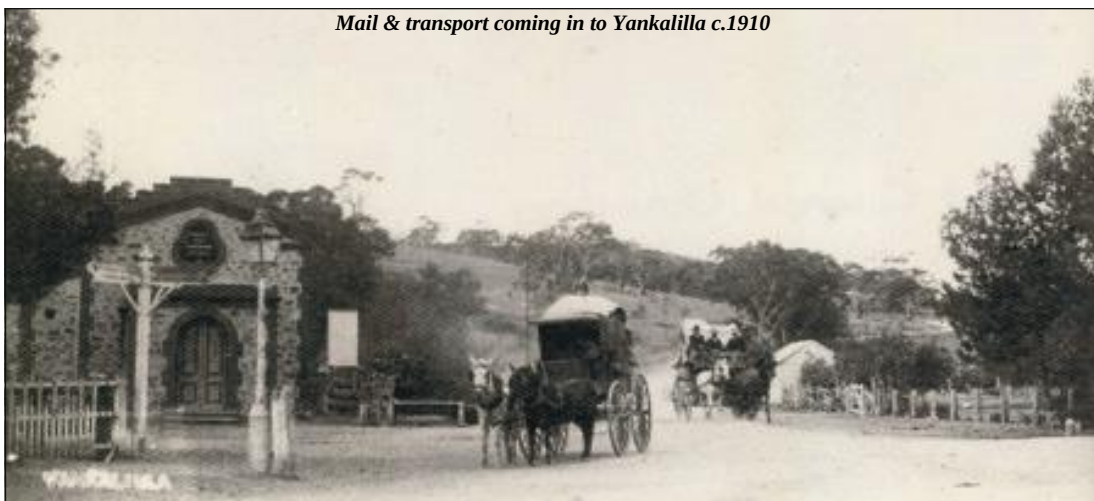
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Yankalilla Historical Society

In November 1852 the South Australian Government proclaimed an Act to appoint District Councils to administer local affairs. Local government in this area began by a proclamation constituting the District of Yankalilla on 5th April, 1854. The Councillors listed were William Randall, Septimane Herbert, G.F. Day, Thomas Sclanders, and Charles Thomas Hewett.

At the first meeting, held in the Normanville Hotel on 11th April, 1854, C. T. Hewett was elected chairman. At a subsequent meeting Jonathan Phillips was appointed District Clerk and William Croser as the pound keeper, an important office as surrounding land was unfenced, impounding occurring frequently. Revenue came from rates on occupied land, and grazing and timber getting licences on unoccupied land. Following some dissension within the council in 1856, the Rapid Bay Council was formed to administer an area from Little Gorge to Tunkalilla Beach and Cape Jervis. By 1867 the district was at its highest point of prosperity. The Council area was divided into five wards: Bald Hills, Carrickalinga, Inman Valley, Normanville, and Yankalilla, each having one representative.

In 1882 the population of the Yankalilla district was 1,789, whereas fifteen years earlier 2,000 people had lived within a six mile radius of Normanville. Declining crop yields had forced impoverished farmers to move on to other areas where large areas of land

suitable for agriculture had become available. This exodus resulted in financial stress, forcing the district councils to reduce costs.

By 1890 the Myponga District Council had joined the Yankalilla District Council, the two councils operating as a single body with its headquarters at Yankalilla. Four decades later, in May, 1932, the Rapid Bay District Council amalgamated with the Yankalilla District Council, operating from Yankalilla. With the combined revenue it was possible to buy the machinery then becoming available for road

making.

In 1957 the residents of Parawa were successful in their bid to have the Callawonga Ward annexed to the District Council of Yankalilla. The transfer of this ward to the Yankalilla Council has proved to be beneficial, bringing the major portion of the Western Fleurieu Peninsula under the administration of one local government body.

In March, 1985 the passenger/vehicle ferry facilities at Cape Jervis were opened by the Minister of Marine, R.K. Abbott M.P. The boat ramp, opened at the same time, was funded by the Department of Marine and Harbours and the District Council of Yankalilla.

Now that we are in our winter recess our next meeting will be on Monday, 12th September in the Yankalilla Council Chambers. On Wednesday mornings a member of this society will be in attendance at the Yankalilla Library between 10am and noon. Anyone wanting assistance with family research or who would like information on any other matter is welcome to drop in.

Keeping Fit: Sit 2 Stand

Independence assessments may test your ability to get in and out of a chair on your own. Now although you may not be at this stage of your lives yet, many of us are no longer maintaining our bodies which will help keep our independence.

The 'sit to stand' exercise is a great way to introduce practical leg strength into a routine as well as encouraging good posture.

- Start by standing in front of a chair
- With your weight through your heels, bend at the knees so your bottom reaches out behind you towards the chair.
- Your chest should remain high to help maintain good posture (don't slump)
- Control the movement the whole way down to the seat (don't just drop down onto it)
- Once seated, move your chest

over your knees while maintaining good posture.

- Then stand up using your thigh and bottom muscles maintaining a consistent gap between your knees.
- If you can repeat 10 times.

As always what has been suggested is general information and doesn't take into account an individuals limitations or needs. Please look for a medical opinion to see if this exercise is appropriate for you.
