- Empowering student choice and enabling informed decision making.
- Ensuring good agent governance and professionalism.
- Promoting ethical agent practices, professional knowledge and competency.
- Increasing transparency and accountability.

It sets out the standards and best practices that agents and counsellors representing UK education providers must follow. Key selling points

- We offer a truly UK boarding experience to international students as they are fully integrated into the life of the school. Sidcot is in the countryside, so it is peaceful and safe, but it is close to city life in Bristol, only 30 minutes from the School by car.
- Bristol is the shopping capital of the South West of England and has a rich maritime history.
- Good transport links – Bristol International Airport is a 10-minute taxi ride.
- We are a Quaker School and believe in strong values, focused on truth, equality, peace and sustainability.
- We welcome students of all faiths and none and within reason, make every effort to accommodate the requirements of different faiths. For example, we can arrange a taxi to attend a particular church, or we can cater for faith-related dietary requirements.
- We want everyone to reach their full potential and live adventurously - making the most of the opportunities offered.
- We offer over 100 extra-curricular activities like fencing, chess club and life drawing.
- We have a flourishing Equestrian Centre in the heart of the School.
- Food is very important at Sidcot. We have a modern dining room with a wide range of meals served by our outstanding catering team. We also have a coffee shop on campus.

Younger boarders

- Boarding starts at age 11 – we provide extra care and nurturing in smaller, cosy boarding houses to help children, away from home often for the first time, to settle in quickly.

Flexible One-Term Experiences

- We understand that some students may be hesitant about choosing a full time boarding school, and want to try the experience before fully committing. Indeed, some students are only interested in a short-term, immersive experience to fully develop their English. For these students, our flexible, one-term programmes can be truly beneficial.

English Intensive Pre-GCSE Pathway

- The Pre-GCSE Pathway programme for children between the ages of 12-14, has been designed to offer younger international pupils a holistic pre-GCSE curriculum with a strong emphasis on English skills development, and will provide excellent preparation for the GCSE course at Year 10 (14+) entry.

Two Year GCSE Course

- Students aged 14 will join Year 10 and will study up to eleven subjects at GCSE level. Doing the GCSEs in two years allows students to really settle in and develop their language as well as their friendships.

One Year GCSE Programme

- Year 11 Pathway offers a one-year intensive GCSE programme with higher and standard streams. This programme helps international students prepare for the Sixth Form and includes a unique Global Studies course that broadens understanding of UK culture and history and develops useful life skills.

Sixth Form

- We offer A Levels, BTECs and the IB Diploma in the Sixth Form. We help students to choose the right option for them. Students do not have to wear uniform in the Sixth Form.

What type of student is right for Sidcot?

Sidcot is for parents who are looking for a British school:

- with strong values where international diversity and a sharing of cultures is celebrated.
- where all students are treated the same and international students are welcomed and integrated fully in the school community.
- which encourages their son or daughter to work hard to get the best results that will encourage their child to take part in school life and try new things.
- which is a traditional boarding school with clear rules and expectations of behaviour.
- with excellent facilities in the countryside, but very close to a major UK city.

What is a Quaker School?

When you visit Sidcot you will immediately notice the friendly atmosphere. We believe that all students are equal, whatever their gender, race, culture, class, ability or circumstances.

How will your child benefit from an education in a Quaker School?

- By being encouraged to work hard and make the most of opportunities, both inside and outside the classroom.
- By learning in an atmosphere of friendliness and openness, where relationships are based on trust and on the expectation of sensible, thoughtful behaviour.
- By having the opportunity to develop academically, personally, socially and spiritually.

Our students are encouraged to live adventurously. The strong Quaker concerns of internationalism, of active participation in global as well as local issues, lead to involvement with the community outside, environmental projects, expeditions abroad and charity events.

The co-curricular programme in a Quaker School is the most varied amongst independent schools, as we believe education is about developing the whole person.

The Quaker Meetings

The whole school community meets together in a 'Morning Meeting' once a week. This is a time when all staff and students share a period of quiet reflection - a rare opportunity for peace in today's noisy and hectic world. The meeting helps students to learn the habit of self-reflection, and experience the power of shared silence. There is also a Quaker Meeting on a Sunday which boarders can attend if they wish to.

History

Originally established in 1699 as a Quaker's boys' school, Sidcot opened to girls in 1808 and is one of the oldest co-educational boarding schools in the UK.

Facilities

Sidcot's campus has a mixture of stunning historic buildings and some outstanding modern facilities. As well as superb sporting grounds, a 25m indoor swimming pool, an all-weather pitch, basketball courts, a gym and an Equestrian Centre, we have professional standard facilities for arts and media.

Our Art School includes studios for painting, sculpture, photography and a digital media suite. The Music School has a dedicated performance hall, practice rooms, recording studio and music technology suite.

The Drama Studio can be used for both theatre performances and film.

Sidcot School has five boarding houses, a Health Centre, dining room and a coffee shop (The Hub) on campus.

Sidcot's campus is very conveniently laid out so students do not have to walk far between lessons and to get to their boarding houses or sports facilities. Because of our rural location and our modern approach to security, students feel very safe.



Sixth Form Centre

Transforming a historic building at the heart of our School site, our new Sixth Form Centre is a beautiful new study and social space designed to prepare our Sixth Formers for life post-18.

Our Sixth Form Centre combines cutting-edge learning technology with proven pedagogical techniques aligned with our School emphasis on collaboration and encouraging a love of learning. With dedicated spaces for our International Baccalaureate (IB), BTEC and A Level teaching as well as Futures support, our Sixth Form is a kind,

purposeful place where young people develop their skills for a life of active, responsible citizenship. The Centre also benefits from full integration between Lower and Upper Sixth with shared quiet and social study hubs, and a large social space (including a kitchen).

With sustainable construction and student-led design choices for improving function and décor, the Sixth Form Centre was built purposefully to improve student wellbeing and potential, and has proved a successful addition to our outstanding facilities.

Integration

The Sidcot School community is culturally diverse, with students from a variety of backgrounds creating a rich and vibrant social environment. Sidcot is home to over 600 students mainly from the UK but also from around 30 countries across the world.

International students are fully integrated within the life of the School and we value their contribution to school life.

Your students will be going to a British school with an international and global outlook. This is one of the reasons why UK parents choose Sidcot – they want their children to grow up alongside students from all over the world.

Programmes offered

We welcome international students on the following programmes:

Years 7 to 9 for students aged 11 to 13:

They will study a range of subjects and this is a good time to lay foundations for the future.

Years 10 & 11 for students aged 14 to 16:

Two year GCSEs.

Year 11 Pathway for students aged 15+ or for those whose English is too weak for the Sixth Form:

One year GCSE programme. Our programme is streamed in the higher and standard streams depending on students' ability in Maths and English.

Sixth Form – Years 12 & 13 for students aged 16+:

A Levels, BTECs or the IB Diploma.

EAL Support

We also offer specialist EAL support, either through 1 to 1 sessions or group classes. We support in Sixth Form with IELTS as required.

Boarding

Our aim in boarding is to ensure that each boarder experiences:

- A happy and stable 'family' environment.
- A structured routine within the demands of school work and the need for time to relax.
- The opportunity to take part in activities.
- Encouragement and support in meeting the requirements of Sidcot's curriculum.
- The support of House Staff with advice whenever needed.
- Freedom from bullying and any form of abuse.
- The opportunity to grow and develop as an independent and self-reliant person.
- Equal opportunities in ethnic, cultural, linguistic, religion, gender and disability matters.
- A healthy lifestyle, particularly with respect to alcohol and drug abuse, smoking and healthy eating.

Health Centre

The School has a fully staffed Health Centre, which is open Monday to Friday from 08:00 to 18:00.

Boarders can receive day-to-day care from the nurses, who are all fully qualified. House Matrons support the nursing staff, and all resident staff have received First Aid training.

The Health Centre hosts doctors' surgeries once a week during lunchtime.

Consent to Treatment

If a boarder requires special medical treatment, every effort will be made to obtain the prior consent of the parent or guardian or UK guardian, or the student if they are aged 16 or over. Should this be impossible in the time available, the Head or his deputy, acting in loco parentis, are authorised to give consent to treatment (including anaesthetic or operation) as may be recommended by the School doctor.



Admissions

Documents required at enquiry stage

When you send an enquiry to Sidcot, we need to have the following information about your student:

- Full name of student.
- Date of birth.
- Copies of the latest school reports with English translation.
- English certificate if applicable.
- Copy of passport.
- What the student wants to study.
- Special learning requirements documents, if applicable.

Once we've received the items above, we will review the information and invite families to submit an application form if we feel the student is suitable for the chosen course.

The following documents need to be submitted with a completed application:

- A student's passport.
- A student's birth certificate.
- Both parents' passports.
- The latest school report.
- Any special needs/learning support reports, if applicable.

After we have received the application form and the documents above, we will send details for the online testing and interview.

Testing

It is important that we assess students' ability to ensure that they are placed in the right programmes. We have recently improved our testing to speed up the process. We test all students' English using Password English Language Testing.

We will send you the login and we request that this is done under exam conditions. We appreciate your help with this. We also like to interview all students and this can be done in person when the student visits or via MS TEAMS. We only test mathematics in the Sixth Form if applicable.

Summary of testing:

Years 7–10 and Year 11 Pathway: All students take an English and Maths test and will be interviewed. Tests will take place prior to arrival for class placement purposes.

Year 12: All students will take an English test and will be interviewed. Maths will be tested if students are planning to do the following subjects: maths, accounting, chemistry, physics, or economics. All students taking IB will be tested in maths.

Admissions

Visits

We encourage students to visit and experience the atmosphere for themselves. We are happy to arrange a personal visit to Sidcot and to welcome your potential students to the School.

We recommend that visits should take place Monday to Friday in term time to experience the school when both day and boarding students are around. The visit will involve an interview with the Head, or one of his deputies and will include a tour of the campus and a boarding house.

Families may also book 1:1 meetings with a member of teaching or boarding staff to have a better understanding of Sidcot and discuss the best courses for the student.

Offer documentation

Once the enquiry documents have been received and the student has been assessed, an offer is made by email. Along with the offer, an acceptance form, an invoice for the deposit, a guardianship letter of undertaking, and a medical card will be sent. The acceptance form should be completed by the parents and returned to the School when a student accepts their place, along with the deposit payment and the completed medical card.

The Boarders' Handbook is sent to the student so they have full details of life as a boarder prior to the beginning of term.

Visas / CAS

All students who hold non-British or Irish passport coming to study at Sidcot for more than 6 months, must apply for a Child Study Visa. Our visa support services are provided by Sable International, a UK immigration law specialist. The CAS will be issued once the visa application has been finalised and is ready for submission. A students' eVisa will be linked to their passport at the point of visa application. It will be necessary to update their passport details on their UKVI online account before travelling to the UK, if a new passport is issued during validity of eVisa.

Students coming to study or visit the UK for a short-term Taster programme (under 6 months) will need to apply ETA (Electronic Travel Authorisation) to enter the UK.

If your student is a national of a country who needs to apply for a tourist visa to enter the UK, this will not apply.

Guardianship

It is a condition of entry that all students from overseas have a mature and responsible UK guardian. This may be a friend or relative in the UK over the age of 25 or a specialist guardian agency. Guardians play an important part in the care of international students. A guardian is there to support in an emergency, to attend parents' meetings and report back and arrange transport at the beginning and end of terms. Please refer to our Guardianship agreement for more specific information.

Sixth Form and clothing

One of the privileges of being a Sixth Form student at Sidcot School is that students are not required to wear a school uniform and they can wear their own clothes. However, they will need to wear sports uniform (which can be ordered online) and professional formal dress on Mondays and for some School events.

Futures advice and university preparation

Helping students prepare for life after school is a priority at Sidcot. We have a full time Futures Advisor who works with Senior School students to support long term choices and decision making. All students have access to impartial careers and educational guidance and the latest resources. External speakers are also regularly invited to offer students the benefit of their experience and extensive UCAS support is provided to students applying to both UK and overseas universities. Members of the school community are invited to join Sidcotians Connect - a networking database that enables users to seek mentoring, work placements and internships.

We help students with every aspect of their education to help them follow their chosen pathway whether this is Oxbridge preparation, work experience, UCAS, writing their personal statements or applying to a university in a different country. Students at Sidcot are encouraged to be ambitious and adventurous. When they leave us we want them to feel they have the confidence to choose what is right for them in life.

Communication with parents

We make every effort to keep parents and agents up to date with useful dates and information as well as news of what is happening at school. We send parents weekly newsletters and updates to keep them well informed of all that is happening in the school.

Practical information

Location and getting to Sidcot

Sidcot is in the South West of England only 30 minutes from the city of Bristol and 1 hour from Bath. On the edge of the village of Winscombe, Sidcot is situated in an area of outstanding natural beauty. The coast at Weston-super-Mare is 20 minutes away.

Winscombe

Winscombe is a small village that is a 10-minute walk from Sidcot. It has a lively high street with a wide variety of local shops and some takeaway restaurants that our students enjoy.

Weston-super-Mare

Weston-super-Mare is a 15 to 20 minute taxi ride from Sidcot. It is on the coast and has a good shopping centre. Boarders can go here at the weekends.

Bristol

The centre of Bristol is a 30-minute taxi ride from Sidcot. It is a great city with a lot of cultural things to enjoy. Cabot Circus and The Mall at Cribbs Causeway are both shopping outlets that are very popular with our students.

By air

Bristol International Airport is only 10 to 15 minutes from Sidcot making travel to European airports easy with airlines such as Air France, EasyJet, Flybe, KLM and Ryanair. London Heathrow is around two hours from Sidcot and taxi transport can be arranged to pick up and drop off at Heathrow.

By rail

Rail links to London are excellent as Sidcot is only 30 minutes from Bristol Temple Meads Station.
