The St Ives September Festival of Music and The Arts has come a long way since its beginnings in a back kitchen on Teetotal Street, in 1977. Born from a collaboration between local artists and musicians — including members of the Penwith Society of Artists and the International Musicians' Seminar, of Prussia Cove — the first Festival, in September 1978, was already bold in its scope, featuring everything from folk and chamber music to dance, fine arts, animated film, poetry, arts and crafts, theatre, and open studios.

Today, the Festival continues to thrive, offering a lively mix of music, arts, and cultural events, alongside free street entertainment on both Saturdays. Loved by locals and visitors alike, it remains a highlight of St Ives' calendar.

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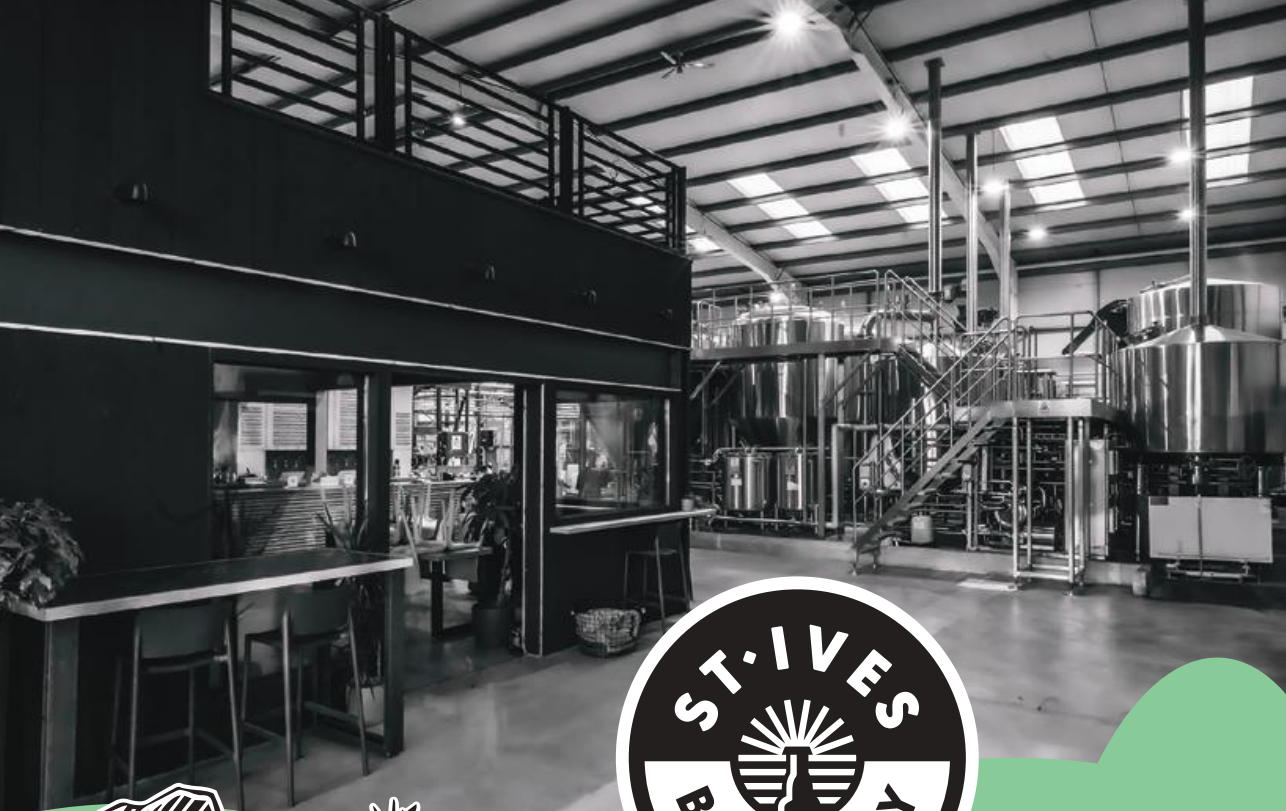
