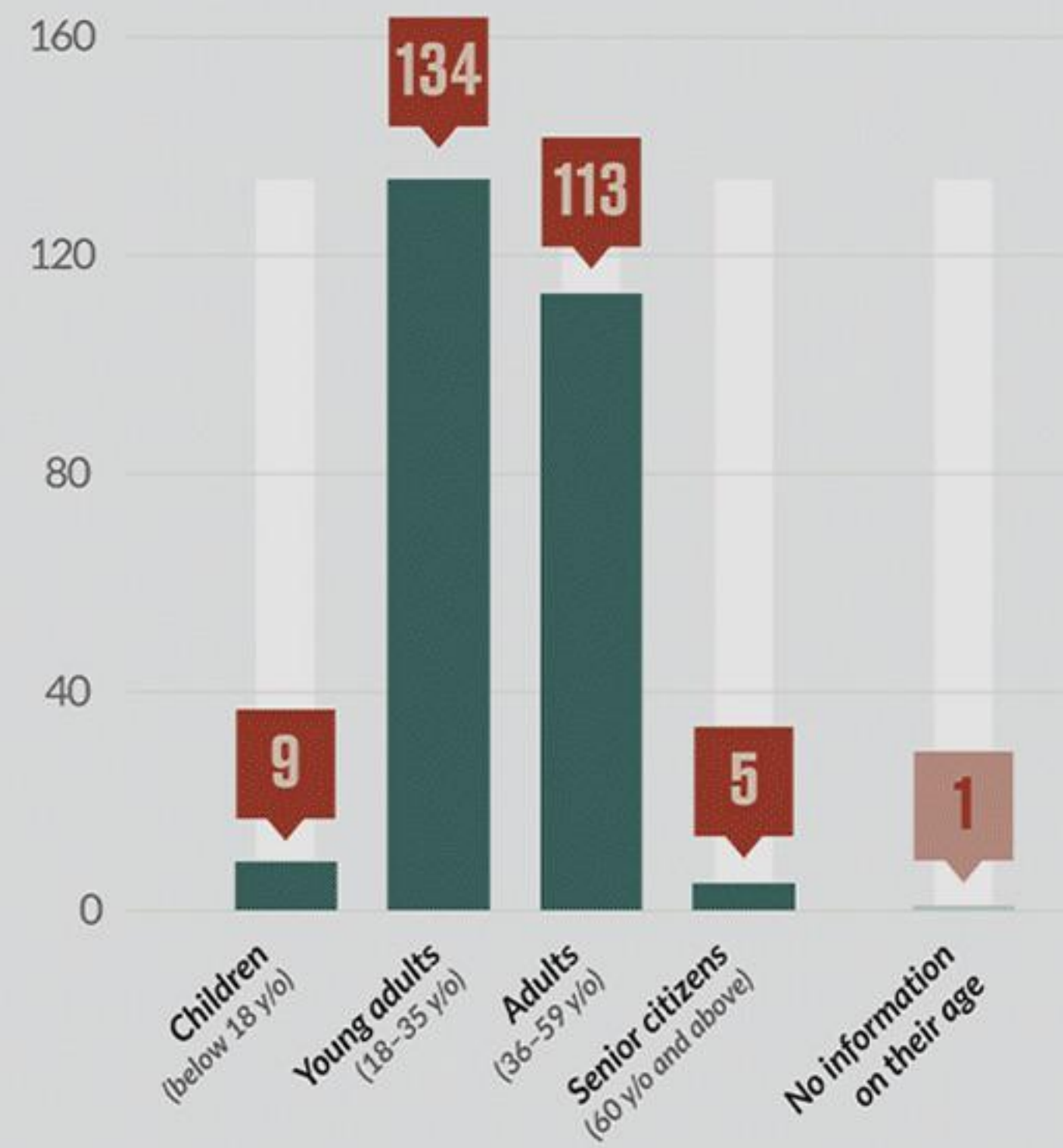

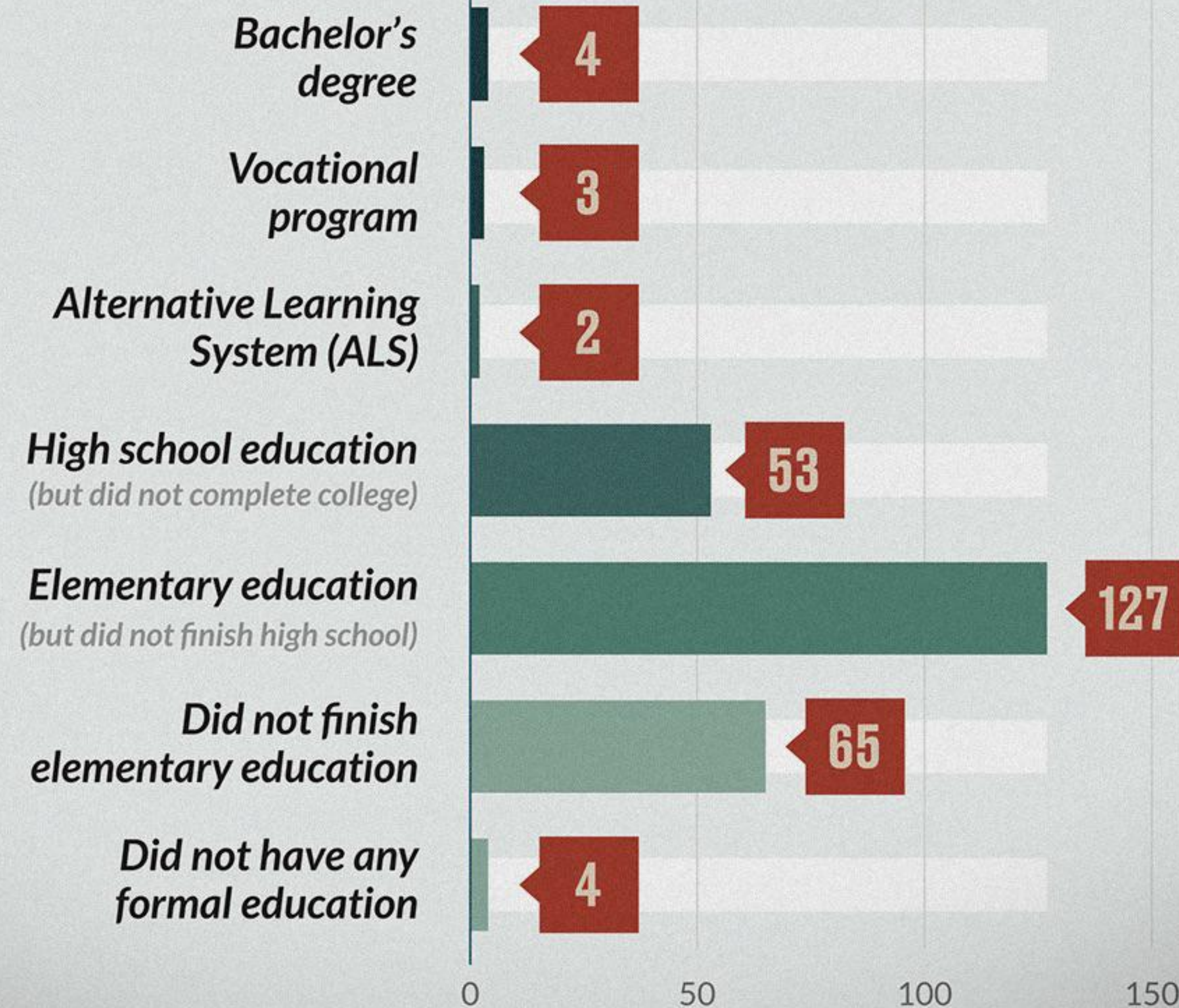

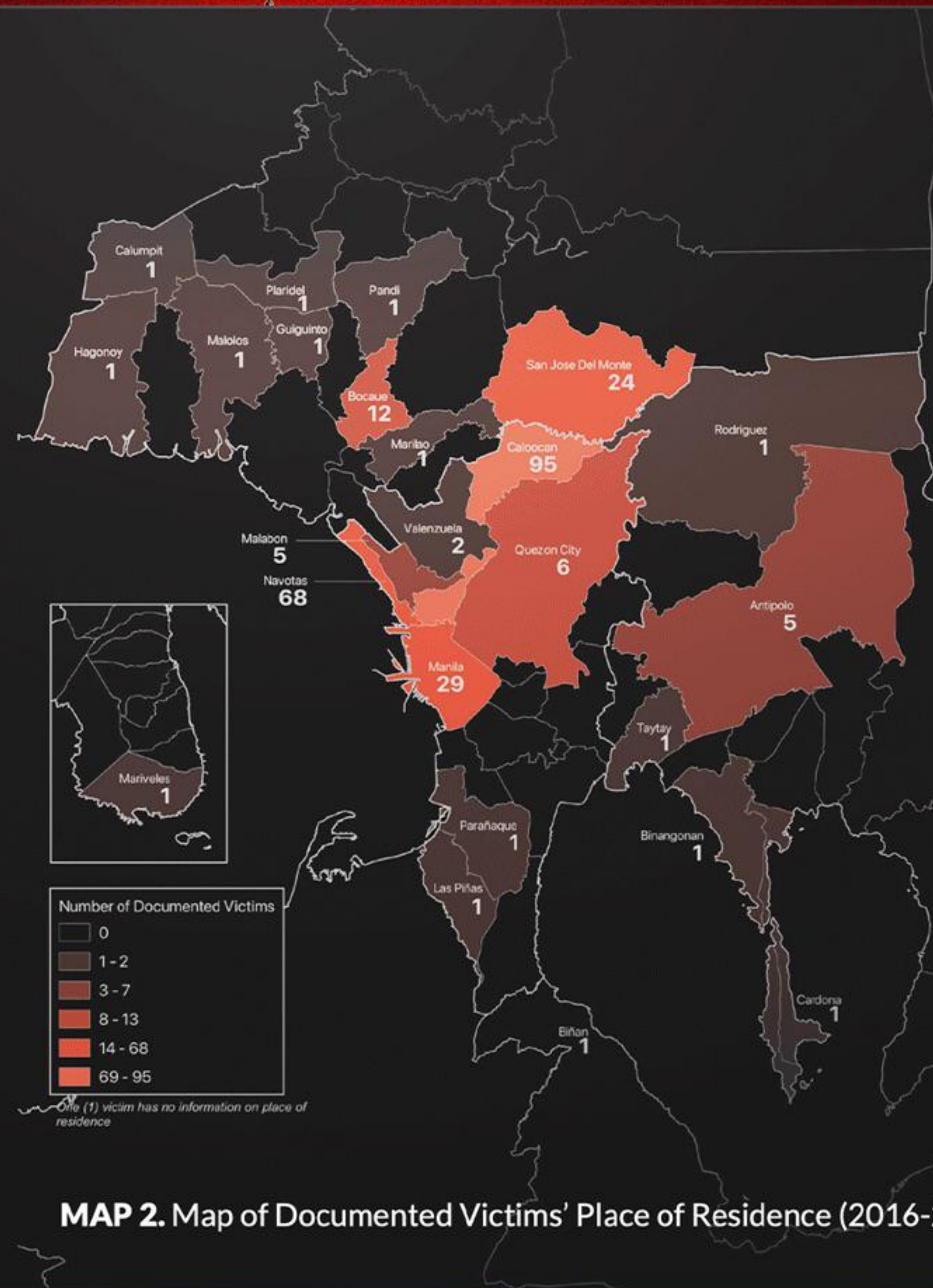

MAP 2. Map of Documented Victims' Place of Residence (2016-2025).

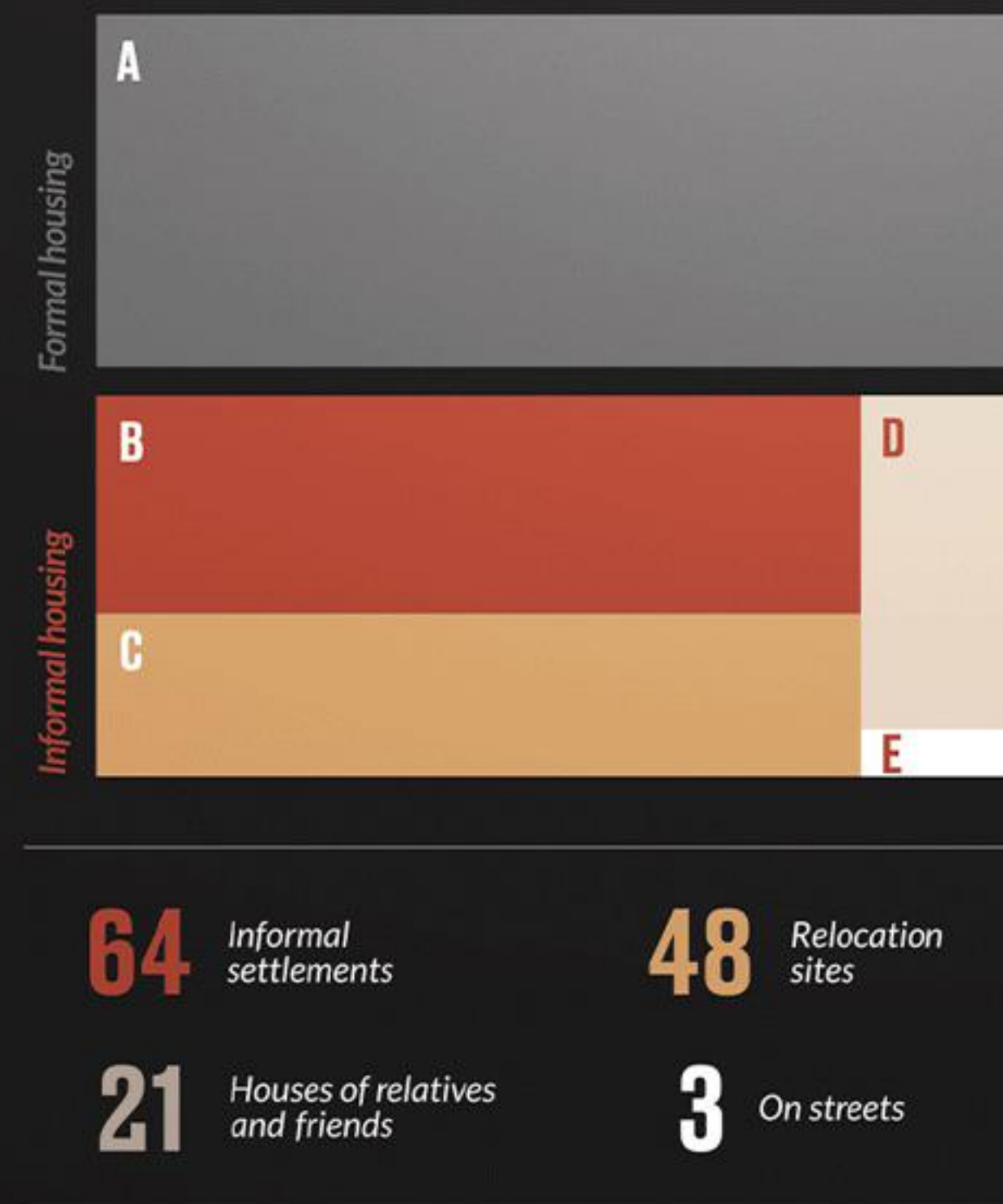
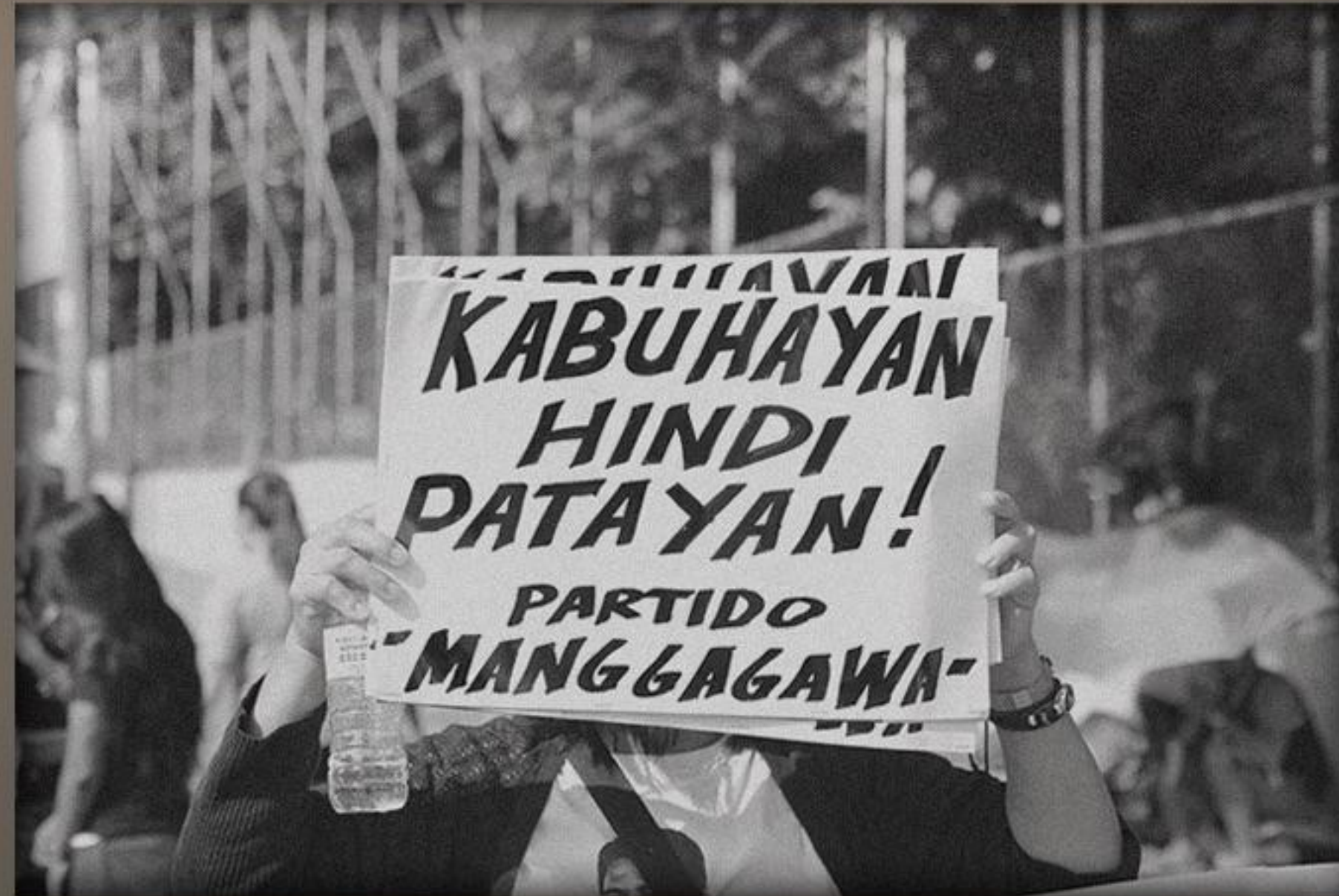


FIGURE 9. Victims' Place of Residence.

- 87** victims had no known links to illegal drugs



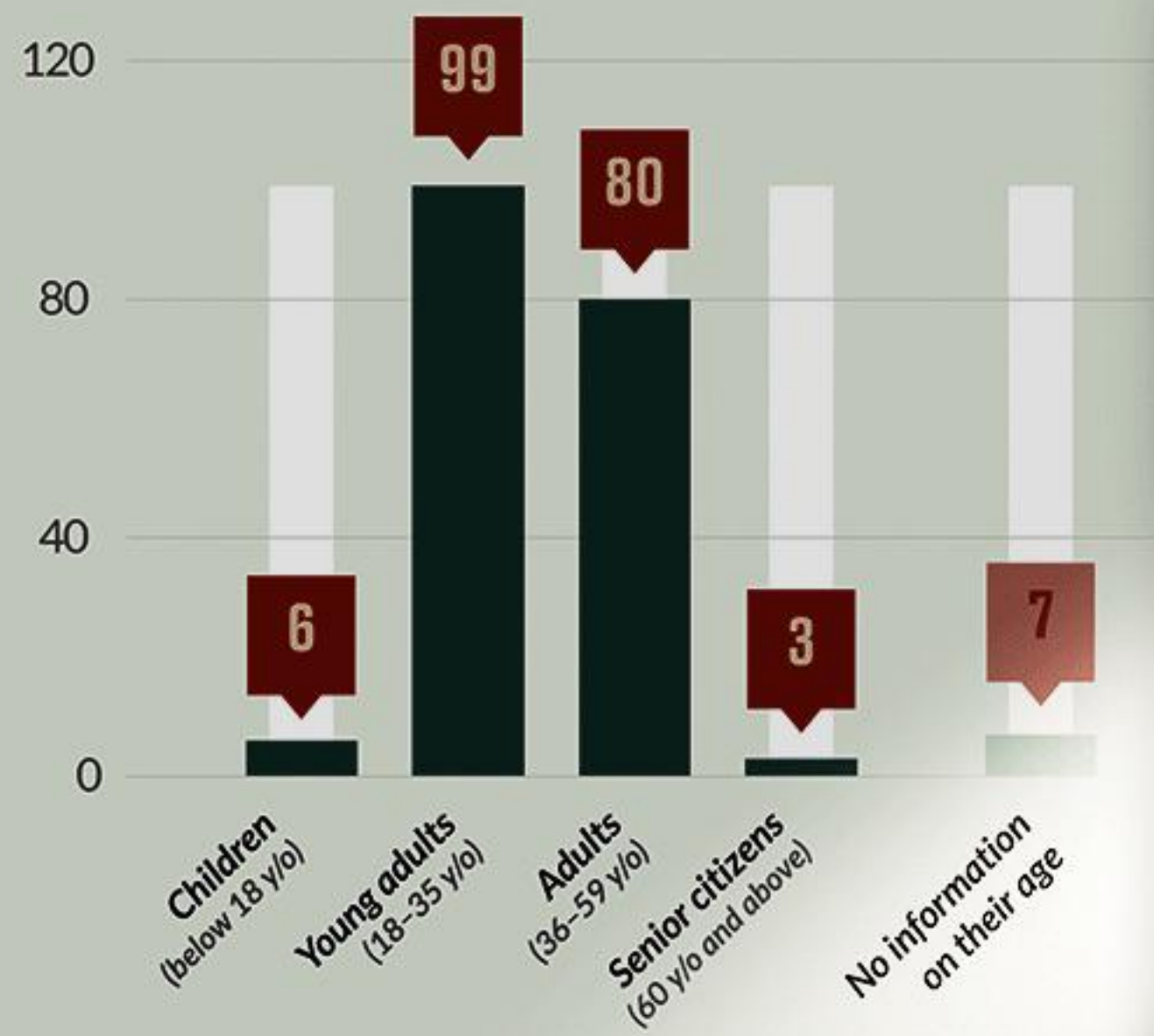
