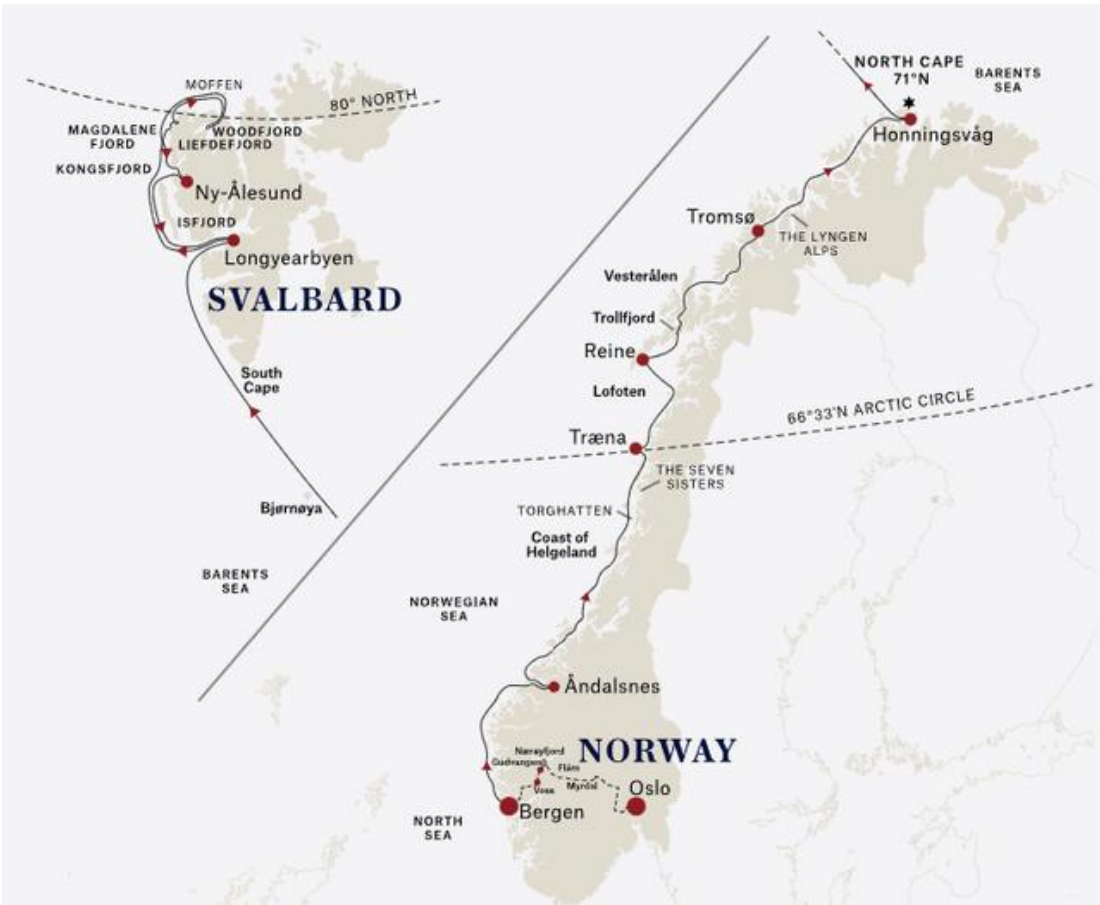

DAY 1

Oslo

Arrival in Oslo



Arrive in Oslo and take time to discover Norway's vibrant capital, where history, culture, and modern life meet. Explore the Bygdøy Peninsula with its fascinating museums, stroll through Vigeland Sculpture Park or Ekeberg Park for art and city views, and don't miss the Munch Museum, home to Edvard Munch's iconic painting *The Scream*. With lively neighbourhoods like Grünerløkka and the Barcode district filled with cafés and restaurants, Oslo offers the perfect mix of charm, creativity, and flavour to begin your Arctic Norway and Svalbard adventure.

DAY 2

Oslo

‘Norway in a Nutshell’ Begins

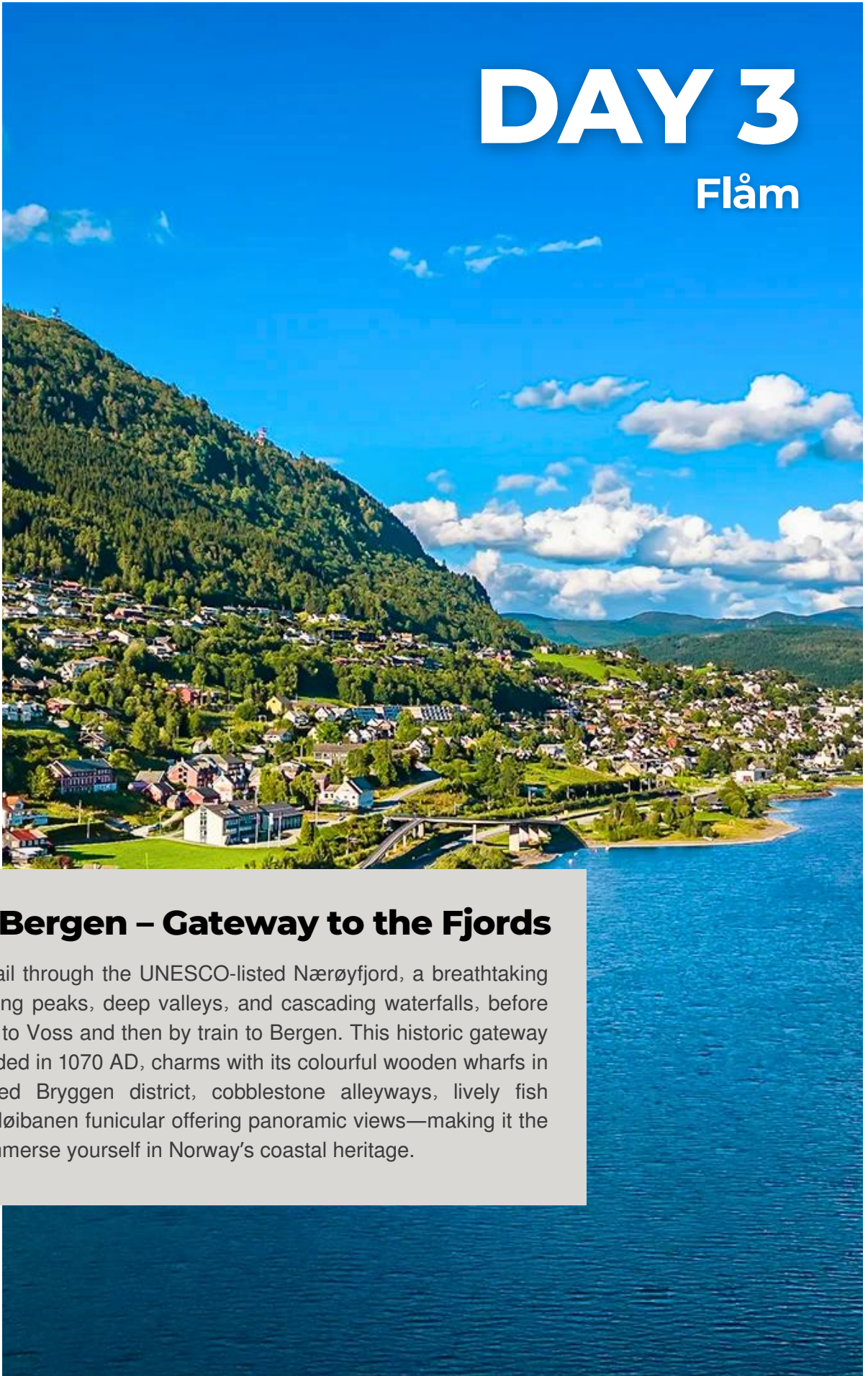
Begin your Norway in a Nutshell adventure with a train ride from Oslo to Myrdal, passing farmland, forests, and mountain peaks before boarding the world-famous Flåm Railway. This spectacular journey descends over 900 metres through valleys and waterfalls, offering some of Norway’s most dramatic scenery as you arrive in the fjord-side village of Flåm.

Once in Flåm, discover the town’s charm at your own pace. Visit the Flåm Railway Museum to learn the story behind this engineering marvel, then relax with a visit to the local brewery, sampling craft beers while enjoying serene fjord views. With its mix of natural beauty, history, and flavours, Flåm offers an authentic glimpse of Norway.



DAY 3

Flåm



Arrival in Bergen – Gateway to the Fjords

After breakfast, sail through the UNESCO-listed Nærøyfjord, a breathtaking passage of towering peaks, deep valleys, and cascading waterfalls, before continuing by bus to Voss and then by train to Bergen. This historic gateway to the fjords, founded in 1070 AD, charms with its colourful wooden wharfs in the UNESCO-listed Bryggen district, cobblestone alleyways, lively fish market, and the Fløibanen funicular offering panoramic views—making it the perfect place to immerse yourself in Norway’s coastal heritage.

DAY 4

Bergen

All Aboard the Svalbard Line

Spend the morning with a little more time to enjoy Bergen's charm before transferring to the Hurtigruten terminal. Relax in the guest lounge and chat with staff about optional excursions that may still be available, then step aboard to begin the next stage of your journey.

Once on board, you'll be welcomed by the Expedition Team, who will guide and host you throughout your voyage north to Svalbard. Settle into your comfortable cabin, meet fellow travellers, and enjoy your first meal at sea as the ship departs. Out on deck, raise a glass to watch Bergen's colourful skyline fade into the horizon, marking the start of your Arctic adventure.



DAY 5

Åndalsnes

Alpine Village by the Fjord

Set against the backdrop of towering mountains and fjords, Åndalsnes is a charming coastal town that captures Norway's love of the outdoors. Here you can embrace friluftsliv with a rewarding hike to the Rampestreken viewpoint, or opt for a gentler experience by riding the Romsdal Gondola or journeying along the dramatic Trollstigen Pass by bus. However you explore, Åndalsnes promises unforgettable views of the Isfjord, Romsdalsfjord, and the stunning peaks that surround them.



DAY 6

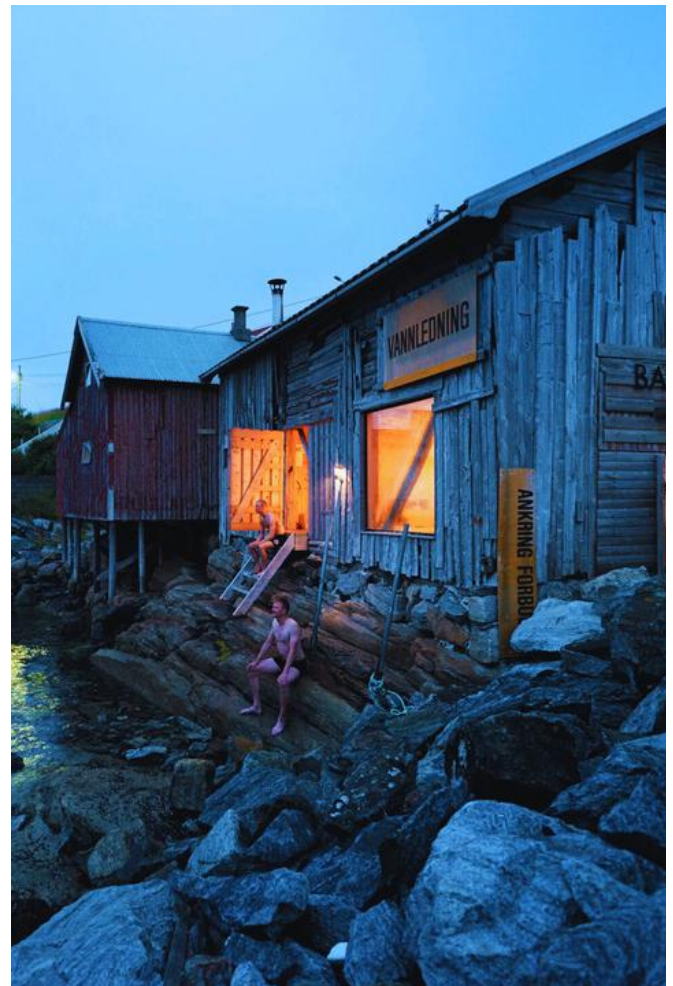
Træna



Norway's Oldest Fishing Community

At the edge of the Arctic Circle, the remote archipelago of Træna welcomes us with its unique blend of nature and tradition. Explore the village as it opens exclusively for our visit, with highlights including the church, Petter Dass chapel, and the local museum. You may also choose to join a hike, take a cultural walk, or enjoy an invigorating sauna followed by a dip in the Arctic Ocean.

Later, as we sail onward, we'll cross the Arctic Circle itself and celebrate this special milestone with a traditional ceremony on board, marking our passage deeper into the north.





The Tip of Lofoten

Sailing into the Lofoten Islands, you'll be greeted by dramatic peaks rising from the sea and villages that seem lifted from a postcard. We dock in Reine, a picture-perfect fishing village where red rorbuer cabins dot the shoreline beneath towering mountains mirrored in the water.

From here, you may join an optional excursion to Å, one of Norway's best-preserved fishing villages. Explore the Norwegian Fishing Village Museum to learn how fishing has shaped life in Lofoten for more than 250 years, offering an authentic glimpse into the region's maritime heritage.

DAY 8

Tromsø



Gateway to the Arctic

Known as the gateway to the Arctic, Tromsø combines rich polar history with a lively modern spirit. Once the starting point for daring Arctic expeditions, today the city invites you to explore its culture, architecture, and natural surroundings. Spend the day discovering highlights such as the striking Arctic Cathedral with its vast stained-glass window, or take the Fjellheisen Cable Car up Storsteinen Mountain for panoramic views of fjords and peaks. With optional excursions ranging from city walks to scenic tours, Tromsø offers a perfect blend of history, culture, and breathtaking scenery.



DAY 9

Honningsvåg

At the Top of Europe

This morning we arrive in Honningsvåg, the northernmost city on mainland Norway and the gateway to the legendary North Cape. Here you can choose from a variety of excursions—ride to the plateau by bus or quad, join a guided hike with the Expedition Team, or gain insight into life at 71°N. Standing 307 metres above the sea, the North Cape offers awe-inspiring views across the Arctic Ocean, just under 1,000 miles from the North Pole.

As we sail onward, take in the dramatic sight of the cliffs from the sea before the ship heads into the Barents Sea, leaving the Norwegian mainland behind and venturing deeper into the Arctic frontier.



DAY 10

North Sea crossing

Towards the Arctic Frontier

As we cross the Barents Sea, the vastness of the Arctic frontier surrounds you, with a full day at sea to relax and recharge. Enjoy insightful lectures on Svalbard's Arctic desert environment, and step out on deck where the chefs will host another special tasting while the Expedition Team points out areas of interest along the way.

This is the perfect time to slow down and make the most of the ship's amenities—whether it's a sauna session, a workout, browsing the library, or simply savoring a quiet coffee with endless sea views. In the afternoon, attend a briefing on the rules that help protect Svalbard's fragile ecology, then perhaps organize your photos or share your best shots with fellow guests. It's a day to reflect, prepare, and enjoy life on board before the adventures ahead.



DAY 11

Longyearbyen

Arrival in Longyearbyen

Today we reach the remote beauty of Svalbard, sailing into Spitsbergen where rugged mountains and Arctic tundra create a striking landscape. At over 78°N and less than 1,500 kilometres from the North Pole, this land of endless summer light offers crisp air and surprisingly mild temperatures, warmed by the northern Gulf Stream.

By afternoon we arrive in Longyearbyen, perched on the banks of Isfjord, and transfer to our hotel. In the evening, travel through Adventdalen to Camp Barentz for a special Arctic experience featuring local flavours and fascinating stories about polar bears, wildlife, and life in Svalbard.





DAY 12

Longyearbyen

Hybrid-Electric Catamaran: Wildlife & Glacier Tour

After breakfast, set out on an unforgettable wilderness and glacier tour aboard the hybrid-electric MS Bard, a quiet and eco-friendly catamaran designed to bring you close to Svalbard's raw beauty. As we glide past dramatic glaciers and remote coastlines, keep watch for wildlife and take in sights such as the ghost town of Pyramiden in the distance and the historic bay of Skansbukta.

Upon returning to Longyearbyen, enjoy some free time to relax, explore the town, or stop by a local café before gathering for a special Arctic tasting menu at Huset. Featuring creative Nordic cuisine and locally inspired ingredients, this renowned restaurant offers a memorable conclusion to another remarkable day in the Arctic.

DAY 13

Longyearbyen

A Day at Leisure

Spend the day at your own pace in Longyearbyen, the world's northernmost town. Wander along its colourful main street lined with cafés, shops and small galleries, or visit the Svalbard Church – a serene meeting place for locals and travellers alike. The Svalbard Museum offers fascinating insights into Arctic life, wildlife and exploration, while short walks around the valley reveal starkly beautiful views of surrounding mountains and glaciers.

In the evening, enjoy dinner at Funktionærmessen Restaurant in Funken Lodge, renowned for its elegant Nordic cuisine and panoramic views over the town. Later, return to Funken Lodge for a peaceful overnight stay.





DAY 14

Longyearbyen and Isfjord



Chasing New Horizons

Begin the day with breakfast at the hotel and enjoy some free time in Longyearbyen, whether visiting local museums, browsing Arctic outfitters, or simply strolling through town. Over lunch at Funken Lodge, the journey ahead is introduced in a warm and refined setting that captures Svalbard's heritage.



In the afternoon, board the MS Serenissima to set sail along the west coast of Spitsbergen. With its small size and classic expedition style, the ship provides access to areas larger vessels cannot reach, bringing you closer to glaciers, seabird colonies, and marine wildlife. As we cruise through the Isfjorden system, look for signs of Arctic history along the shores and keep watch for walruses, seals, and other creatures of the High Arctic.



DAY 15

Magdalenefjorden



Into the Arctic Wilderness

Your first full day of expedition cruising takes you deep into Svalbard's remote and dramatic landscapes. Weather and ice permitting, we'll make two landings, beginning in Magdalenefjorden, where glacier-carved mountains surround an inlet rich in history. Here, remnants of former whaling stations and burial grounds recall the hardships of early Arctic exploration, while bird colonies and the chance of spotting Arctic foxes bring the wilderness to life.

In the afternoon, we sail along the isolated and beautiful North West Corner, one of Svalbard's most striking regions. If conditions allow, a second landing will provide another opportunity to step ashore, explore the pristine environment, and observe the unique wildlife of the High Arctic.

Wildlife at 80° North

Our second full day of expedition cruising takes us further north through Svalbard's remote fjords, with two landings or excursions planned to focus on wildlife and remarkable Arctic scenery. Exploring Woodfjorden and Liefdefjorden, we'll encounter landscapes ranging from vast red sandstone valleys to glacier-fed bays, home to walrus, seals, whales, puffins, and thriving seabird colonies.

If conditions allow, we'll venture beyond 80° North, a symbolic milestone on our Arctic journey. From here, we may approach Møffen Island, a protected reserve known for seasonal walrus haul-outs, offering the chance to observe these impressive creatures from the water under strict conservation guidelines.

DAY 17

Ny-Ålesund

Fjords, Glaciers and Research

Today we explore both the natural wonders and human presence of the High Arctic with two scheduled landings. In Kongsfjorden, surrounded by towering mountains and glaciers, we step ashore for a guided tundra walk, where you'll gain insight into the region's geology, hardy plant life, and the effects of a changing climate.

Later, we arrive in Ny-Ålesund, one of the world's northernmost settlements and a hub of international Arctic research. Docking directly at the pier, we'll have time to wander through the historic community, visit landmarks tied to early polar expeditions, and learn about the scientific work taking place today. Don't miss the chance to send a postcard from the world's northernmost post office—a memorable keepsake of your journey this far north.





DAY 18

Longyearbyen

Farewell to the Arctic

This morning we return to Longyearbyen and disembark, with a transfer arranged to town and then onward to the airport. As your Arctic journey comes to a close, take with you the memories of dramatic landscapes, rare wildlife, and the unique spirit of Svalbard—an adventure to cherish long after you've left the High North.

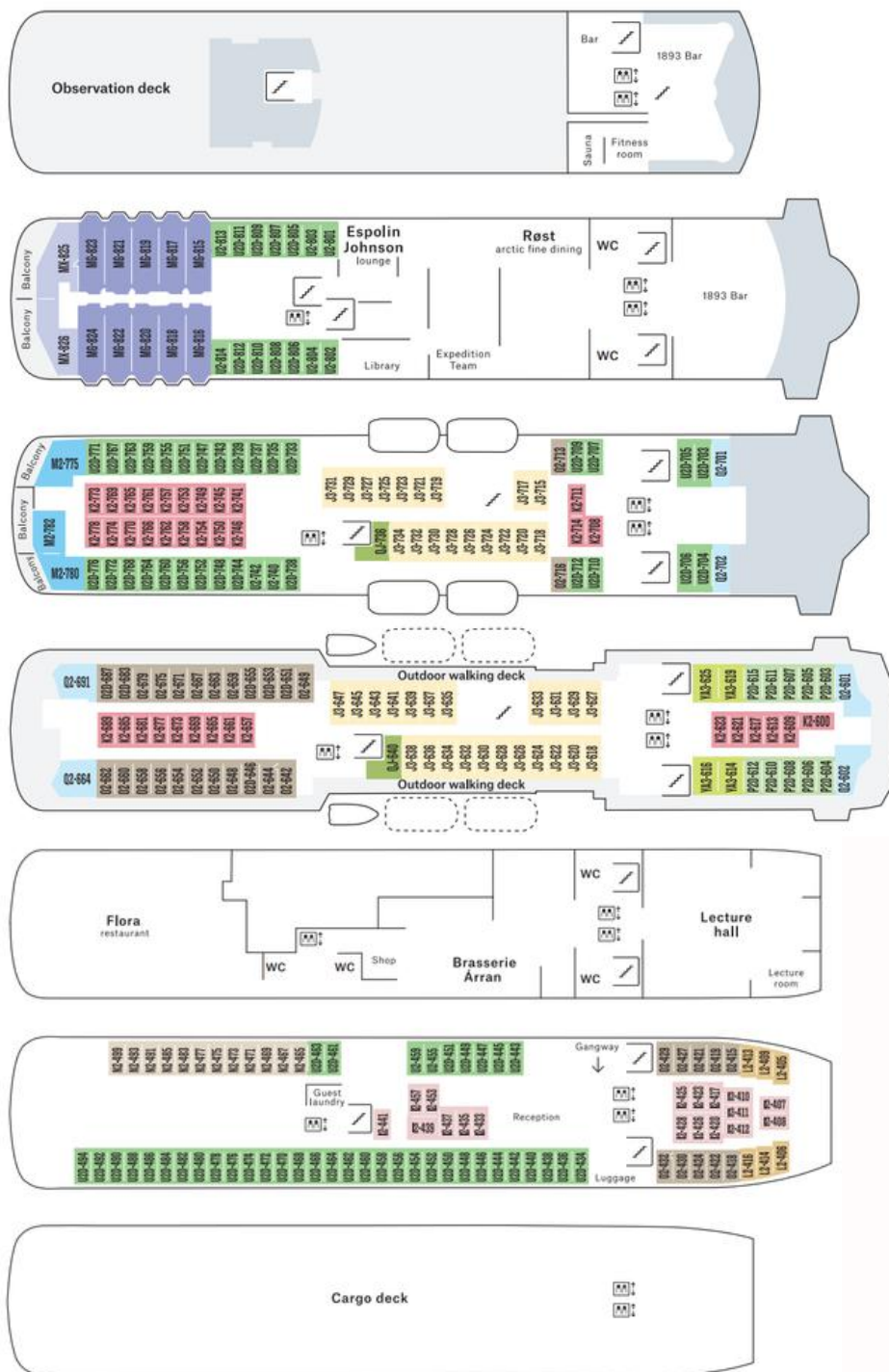
MS TROLLFJORD
