Pastoral Letter from Brian Streeter

TREACLE

At a recent visit from a diocesan group to one of the churches under my care, one of the visitors asked me, “What is that book in the cabinet on the wall?”. I had no idea, having never taken much notice of it – it had simply always been there. “That is the Treacle Bible” came the proper response from one of the better informed members of the church – though no one knew what this meant.

Upon further investigation the “Treacle Bible” is historically significant. Dated at 1577, the Bible is not only old, but it is also known as the “Bishops’ Bible” as it was translated by bishops who were unhappy with the then current translation. The name the “Treacle Bible” comes from a poor translation of Jeremiah 8.22 where the Hebrew word for healing lotion is mistranslated as “treacle”, and is now commonly translated as “balm” – as in the Balm of Gilead.

There are other Bible translations that have poor translations or misprints. The infamous “Sinner’s Bible” informs the reader that, “thou shalt commit adultery”. King Charles I ordered that all printed copies which omitted the “not” should be destroyed – but some inevitably survived. As a consequence of these sorts of errors, there is a common misunderstanding or misinformed opinion that current translations of the Bible must contain many poorly translated words, misprints and/or copying errors. In fact, the very opposite is true.

In this very extensive area of biblical research, there have been shown to be differences between hand-copied versions of the Bible in the original Hebrew (the Old Testament) and ancient Greek (the New Testament). However, most of these copying errors are very minor, and none change the meaning of the message in any significant way. In fact, whenever the argument that the Bible is riddled with errors and contradictions is raised, then I am inclined to think that this more wishful thinking and that some desperately *want* this to be true. After all, the Bible and its message can then casually be dismissed.

But what does the Bible itself say about the message it contains? In Isaiah 55.11, the LORD God says through this servant, the prophet Isaiah:

“So shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it”

In other words, none of God’s words – including the Bible – are a mistake or superfluous. They have a plan and purpose for you and me, and they will achieve that plan – even when we misprint the odd word.

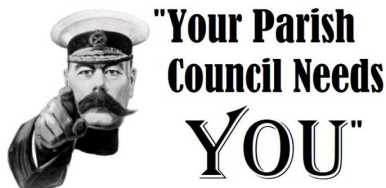

22nd: Dull, wet. Grasmere Sports. Opening of the Co-operative Festival at the Crystal Palace.

24th: Fair, cold, the first consecutive 12 hours without rain in August. Millom, Broughton, Coniston and Finsthwaite Horticultural Shows.

26th: J.McMahon of Preston swam from Grange to Morecambe, 12 miles in 3h 15m.

Are you looking to complete some home improvements? Or make your home more energy efficient? Be on the lookout for scams! Fraudulent schemes are on the rise, including 'free energy surveys' offering fake government rebates. Stay safe with our top tips...

1. Make sure you're working with a trusted trader or company

Do your research. If you can't get a personal recommendation from people you know, then check up on the company or website you're using.

2. Don't be rushed into a decision

If someone is pressuring you to make a fast decision or pay money without giving you time to do your research, it's most likely a scam. Comparing quotes with other companies will help you make sure you're getting a fair price.

3. Get a contract for the work

Always get a contract in writing before you give the go-ahead.

4. Pay by card, not cash

Avoid contractors who demand full payment up front, or only accept cash. If you pay by credit or debit card, you may be able to get your money back through the bank if something goes wrong. If possible, agree to pay in stages.

5. If a trader scams you, report it

Reporting scams helps stop the criminals responsible, and protects others from being scammed. Call the Citizens Advice consumer service on 0808 223 1133. They will pass on details of the scam to Trading Standards, and can offer further advice. Also report the scam to Action Fraud. They will issue a crime reference number, which can be helpful if you need to tell your bank you've been scammed. Visit the Friends Against Scams website to learn more about how to protect yourself from scams.

A THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH by Rev. David Gregg
AUGUST 1ST : LAMMASTIDE (FEAST OF FIRST-FRUITS)

In 1976 we went on a family holiday to the south of France. We went in a heavily laden Land-Rover, and a double puncture obliged us to camp overnight at Giens, our crossing point on the River Loire. It had a somewhat nondescript chateau overlooking the river, which was prominently featured on a poster in the camp office, where I went next morning to settle the bill. To my surprise it bore the caption, "Le Premier Chateau de la Loire." Well, to me, 'premier' indicated the *best*, so I asked the proprietor why? Was it the biggest or the oldest or (tongue-in-cheek, because we have seen Chenonceau – and a dozen other better-looking ones), the most *beautiful*? "No!" he said. "It's the first one that you come to if you are travelling downstream from Orleans!"

Before the Industrial Revolution, we all lived in an agricultural society. In Christian England, from Anglo-Saxon times onwards, the agricultural year was marked by three main festivals – *Plough Sunday* in January, marking the return of the labourers to the fields, after the Twelfth Night of Christmas festivities; *Rogationtide*, with the asking of God's blessing on the crops (in connection with the Ascension) and *Harvest Thanksgiving*, which began with Lammas on August 1st and ended with the great celebration when "all is safely gathered in".

Like the Chateau at Giens, the emphasis of LAMMAS (a contraction of LOAF-MASS) was on the FIRST - when a loaf made from the first corn of the wheat harvest was presented to the Lord with thankful anticipation of all that was to follow. We still have a remnant of the spirit of Lammas in the hymn, incongruously sung now at the *end* of the of the Harvest, "Now thank we all our God", with the lines:

And now, on this our festal day,
Thy bounteous hand confessing,
Upon Thine altar, Lord, we lay
The *first-fruits* of Thy blessing.
Bright robes of gold the fields adorn,
The hills with joy are ringing,
The valleys stand so thick with corn
That even they are singing.

(Another remnant, of course, is the beginning of the main school holidays, so that the children are available to gather in the harvest!)

The background to the Bible is likewise completely agricultural, as the parables of the Sower, and the Wheat and the Tares and the Angel-reapers at the "harvest" of the end of the age illustrates. And the place of "First-fruits" in the Biblical Tradition is instructive. In the Hebrew Scriptures we have the *actual practice*, related to our "Daily Bread", where the third of the great feasts (following the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread) was the Feast of the First Fruits, where, as at Lammas, and pointing forwards, to the Harvest thanksgiving at Pentecost, 50 days later, the first loaf was dedicated. It is linked to the support of the Temple ministry, and to the *Tithing* of a tenth of every element of the agricultural produce – and the wine! In the New Testament we get the *symbolic*, (parabolic and proverbial) use of the imagery, with Christ at His Resurrection designated as the "First-fruits of those who have died" (1 Corinth. 15:20) and the infant church as the first-fruits (at Pentecost) of what is to come in the fulness of time. Elsewhere, our new life in Christ is identified as the "first-

fruits of the Spirit”, leading to the ultimate cleansing of the whole of creation. (Romans 8:18-25). The Lord Jesus Christ, designated as the “Bread of Life” and commemorated in the Bread and Wine of the Eucharist, is a major over-arching theme.

What can Christian disciples learn (and practice!) from all this? At least three things come to mind:

Rededicating our whole lives to the LORD at Harvest time – a new beginning, including a reassessment and renewal of our own *tithing* etc.

Rejoicing in the Resurrection, and our place in ‘life eternal’, guaranteed by the Lord Jesus Christ as the first-fruits.

Thanksgiving for *all* that the Lord provides, by our regular participation in the Eucharist.

Praise be to God.

31st: Pray missionaries serving God far from home as they learn to share the good news of Jesus through the local language and culture.



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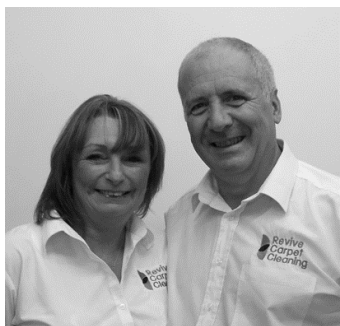
