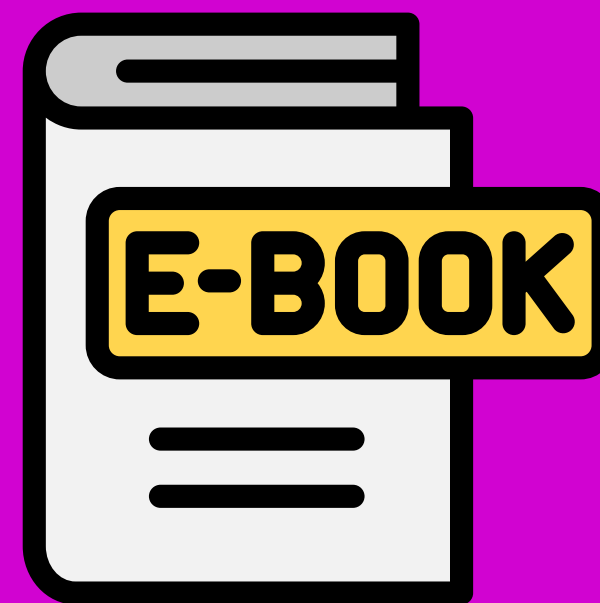
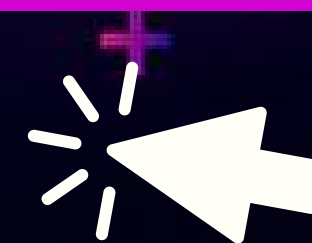

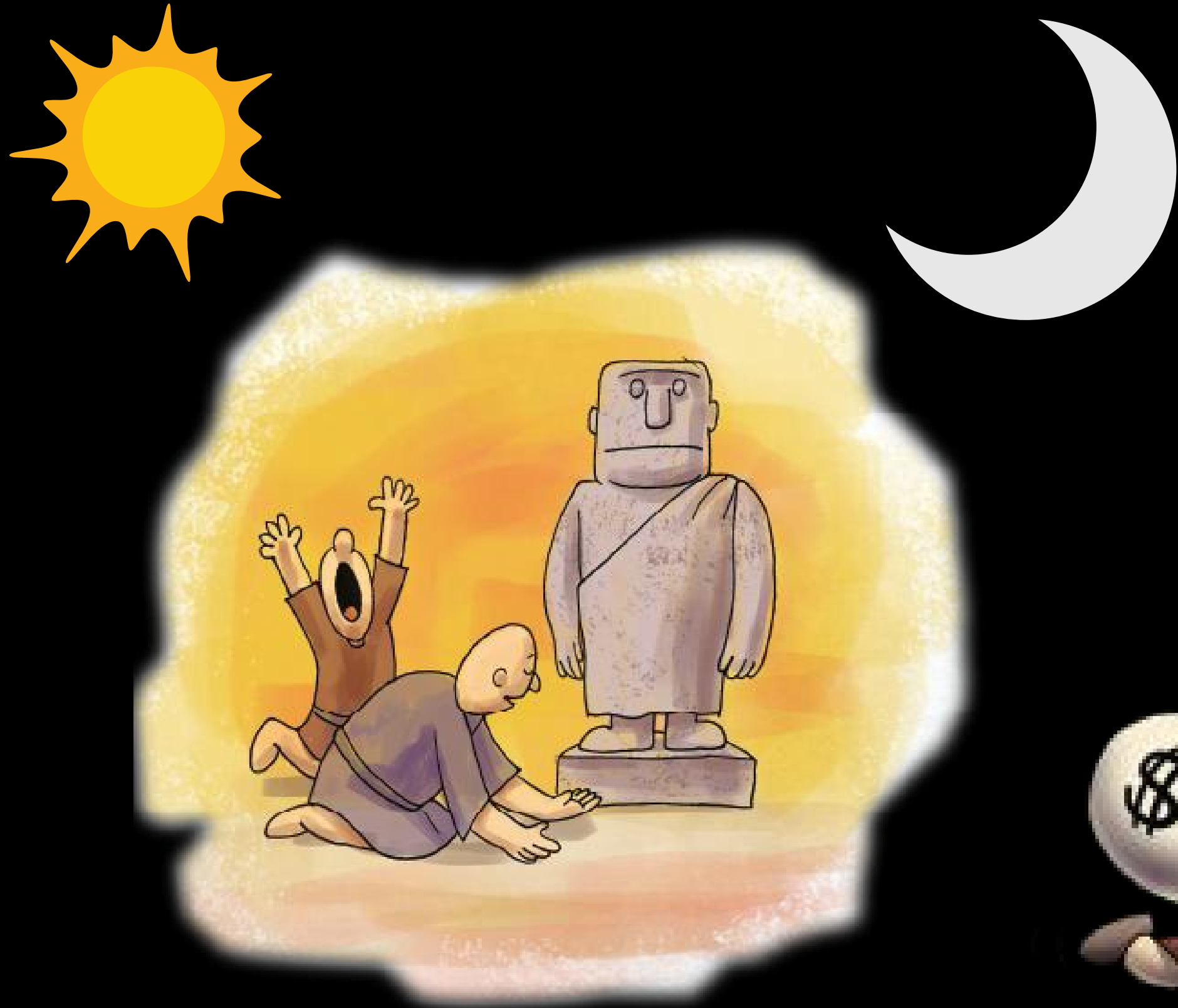
Bad, Bad People

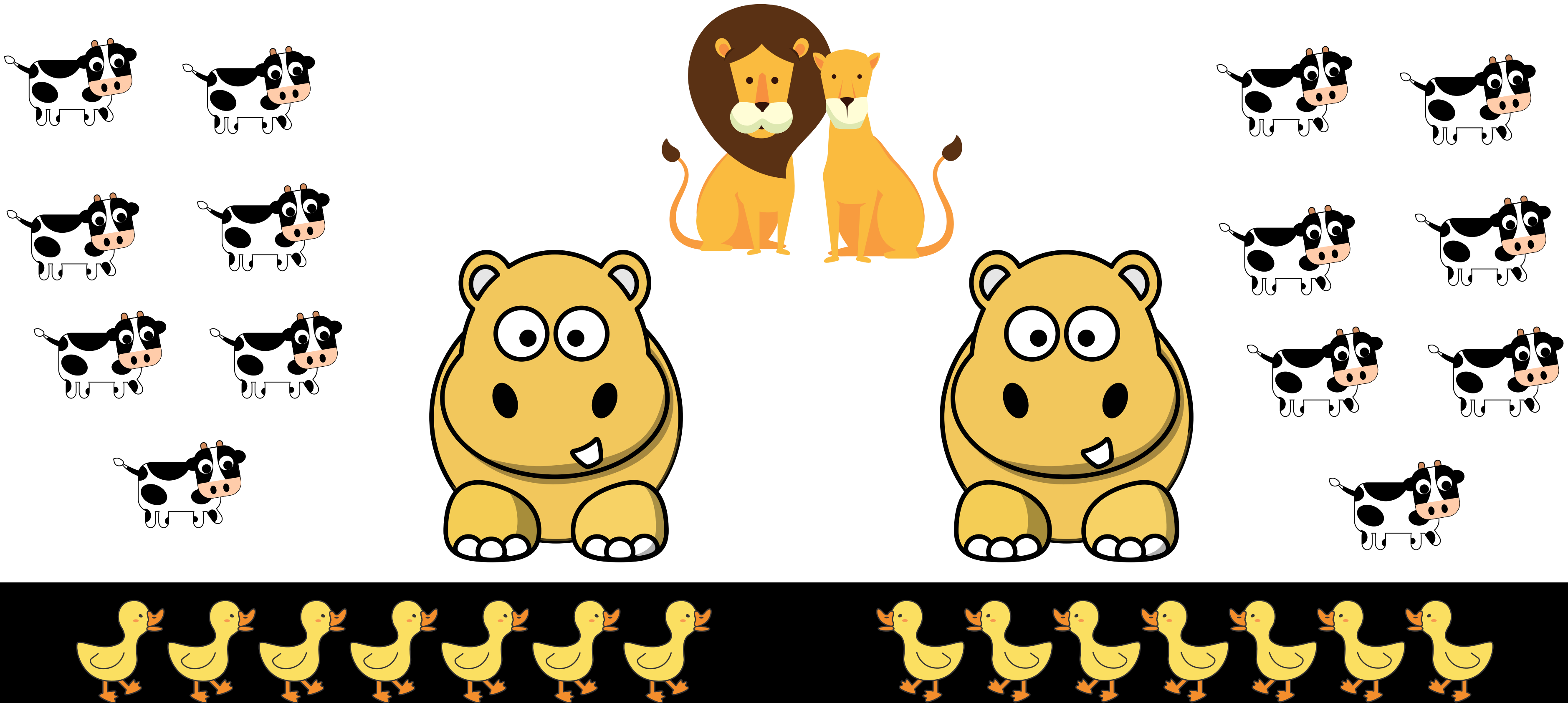
“It will be a giant flood!”

The Great Flood Begins

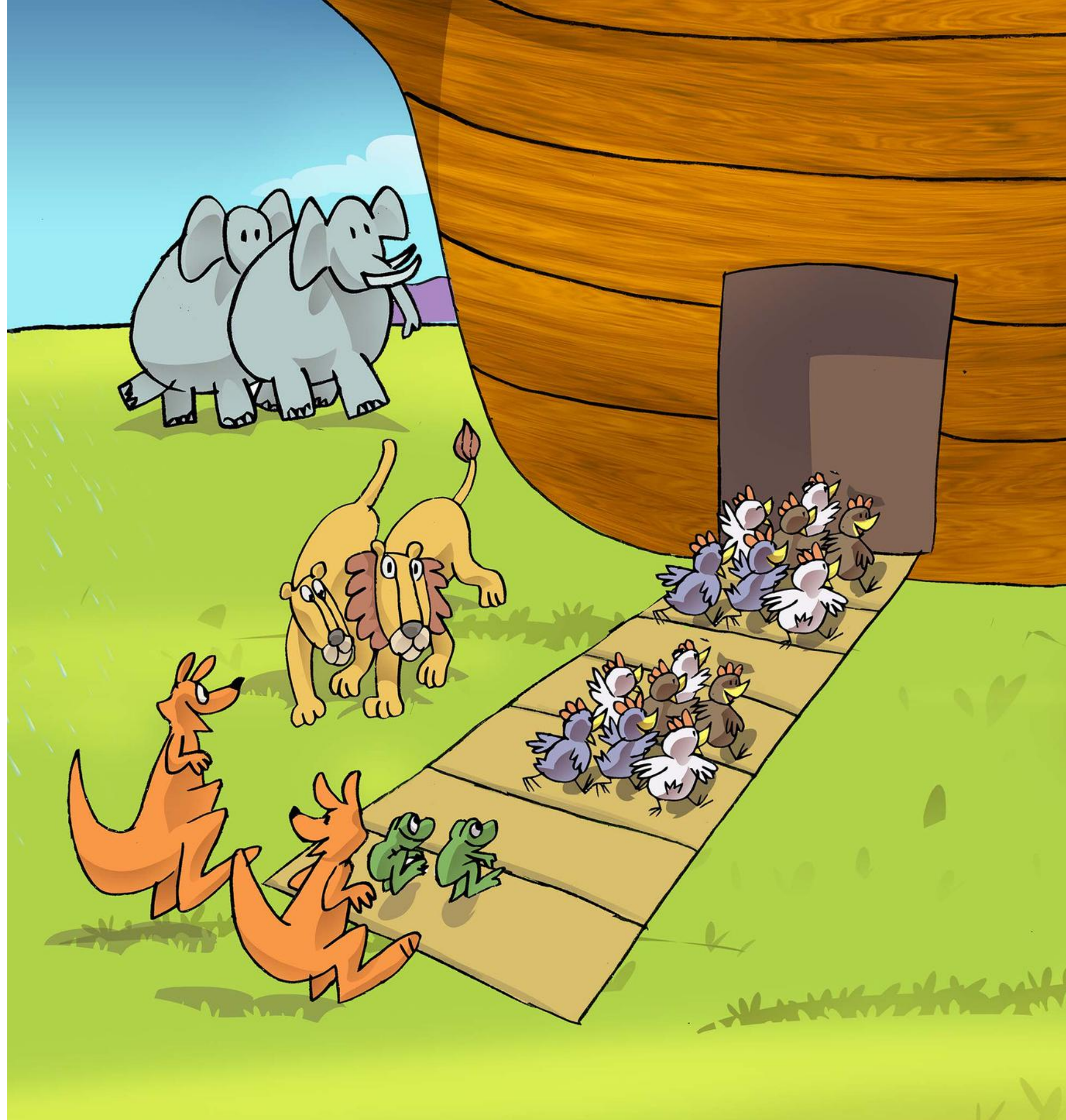
Days, months, and years passed. Finally, 120 years after he started building, Noach completed the Teivah.

the Teivah.



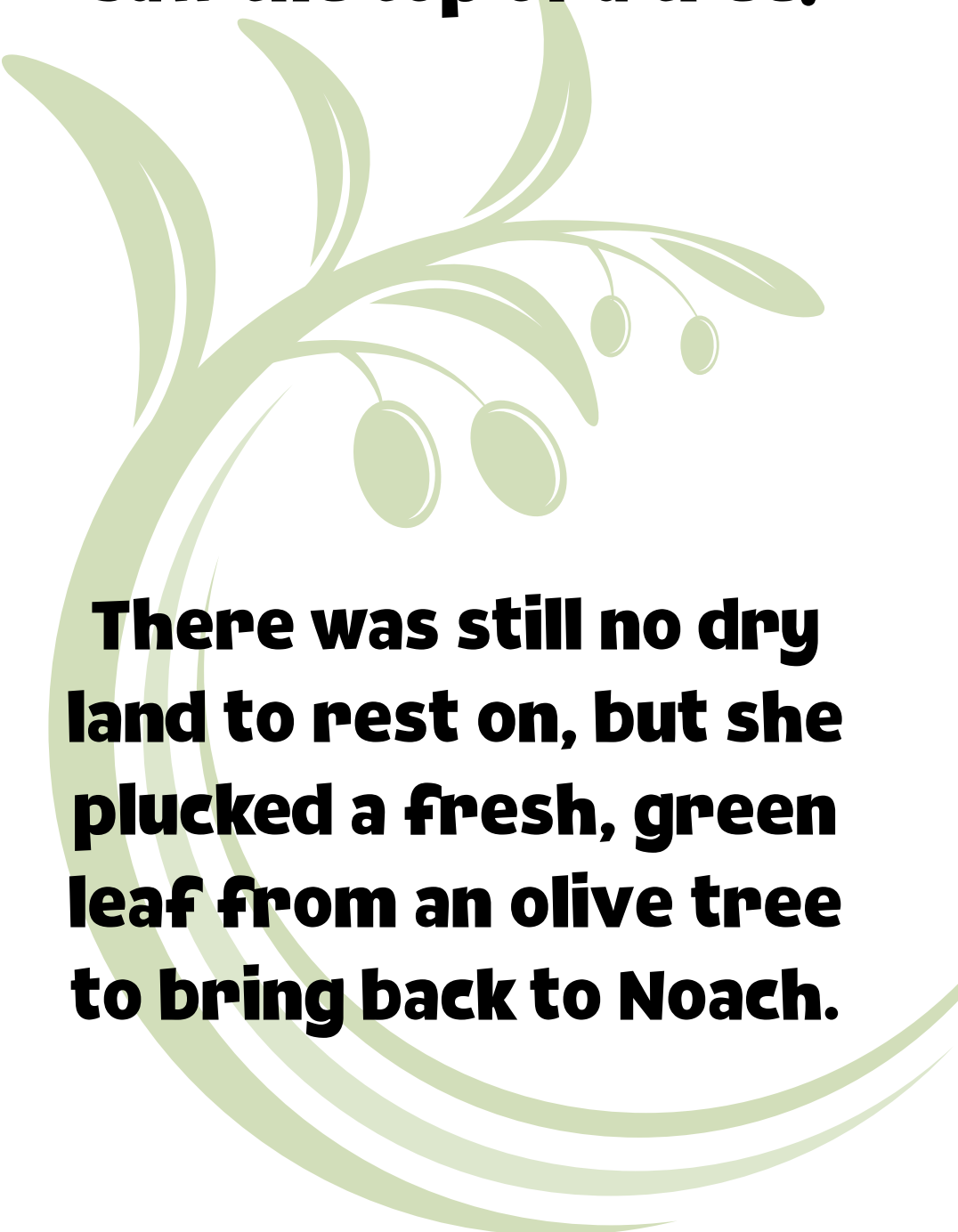

Many, many years passed after the Great Flood. Noach's sons had children, and they had children, and their children had children.

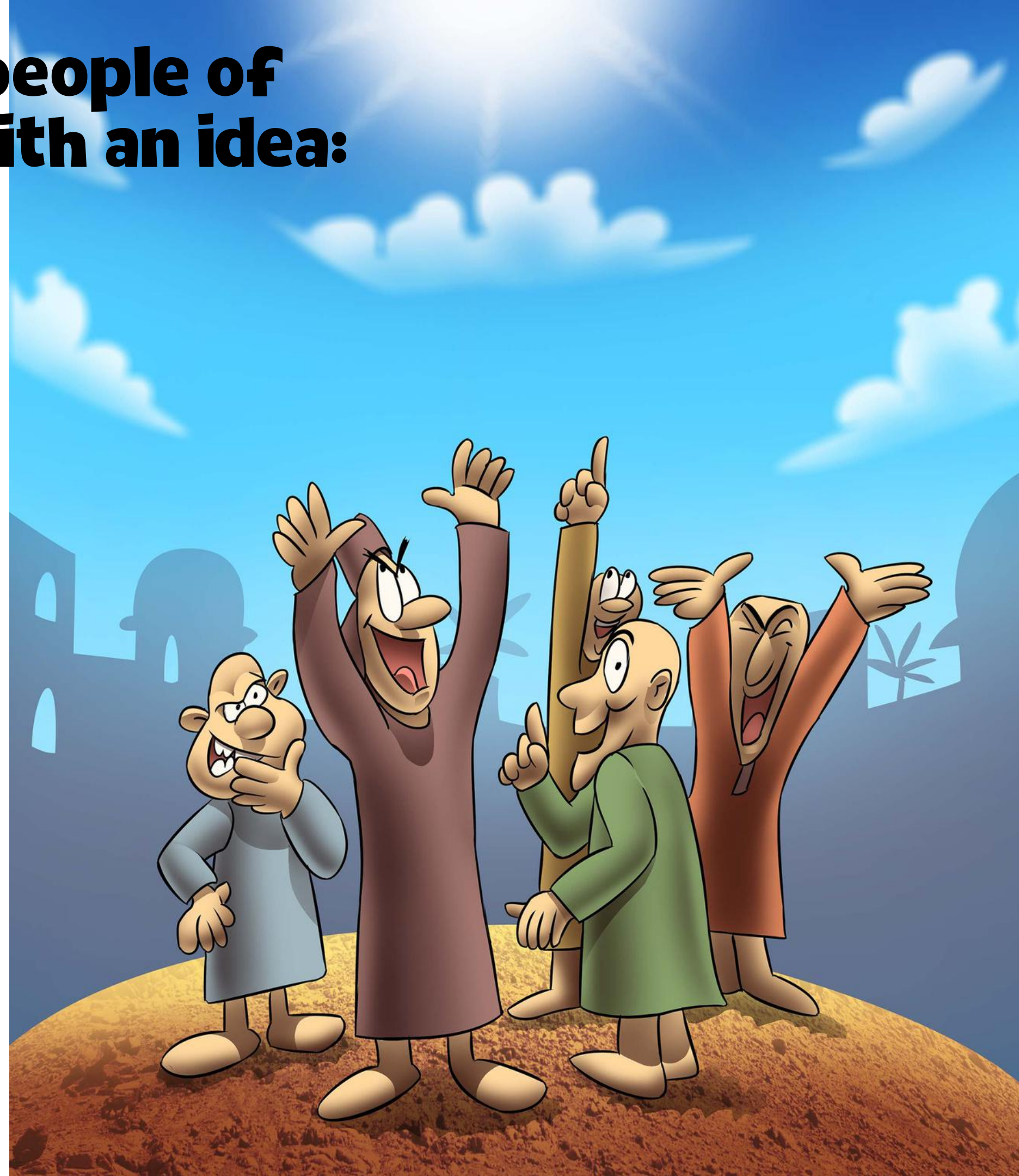


Everyone spoke the same language, Hebrew, and they all got along with each other.

The Tower of Bavel or The Tower of Babbble?

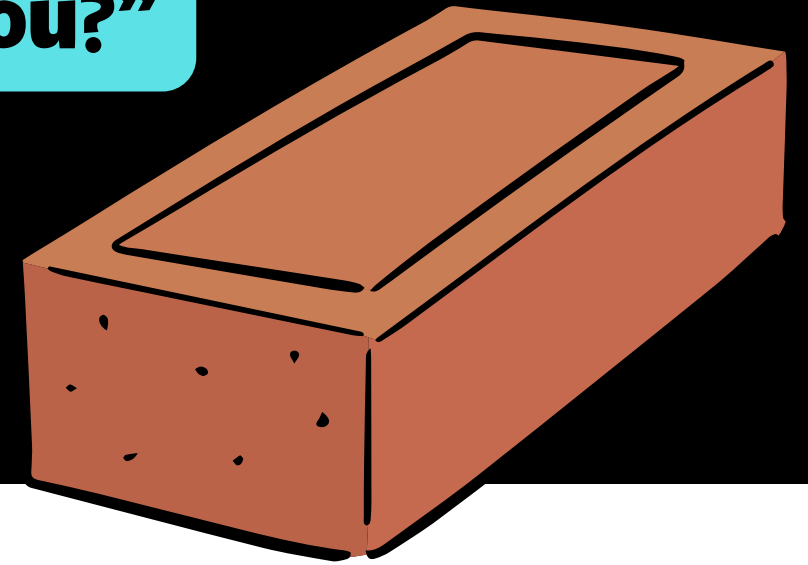
**HaShem stopped this

anyone else was saying.**



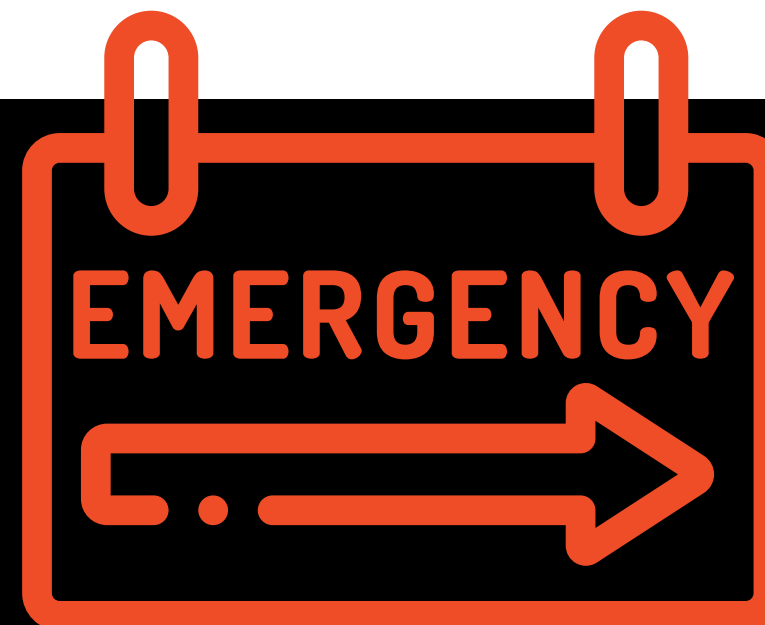
One worker would say to the next, “Hey, buddy, hand me a **brick**, will you?”

It was complete BABBLE – total nonsense – a lot of babbling away!

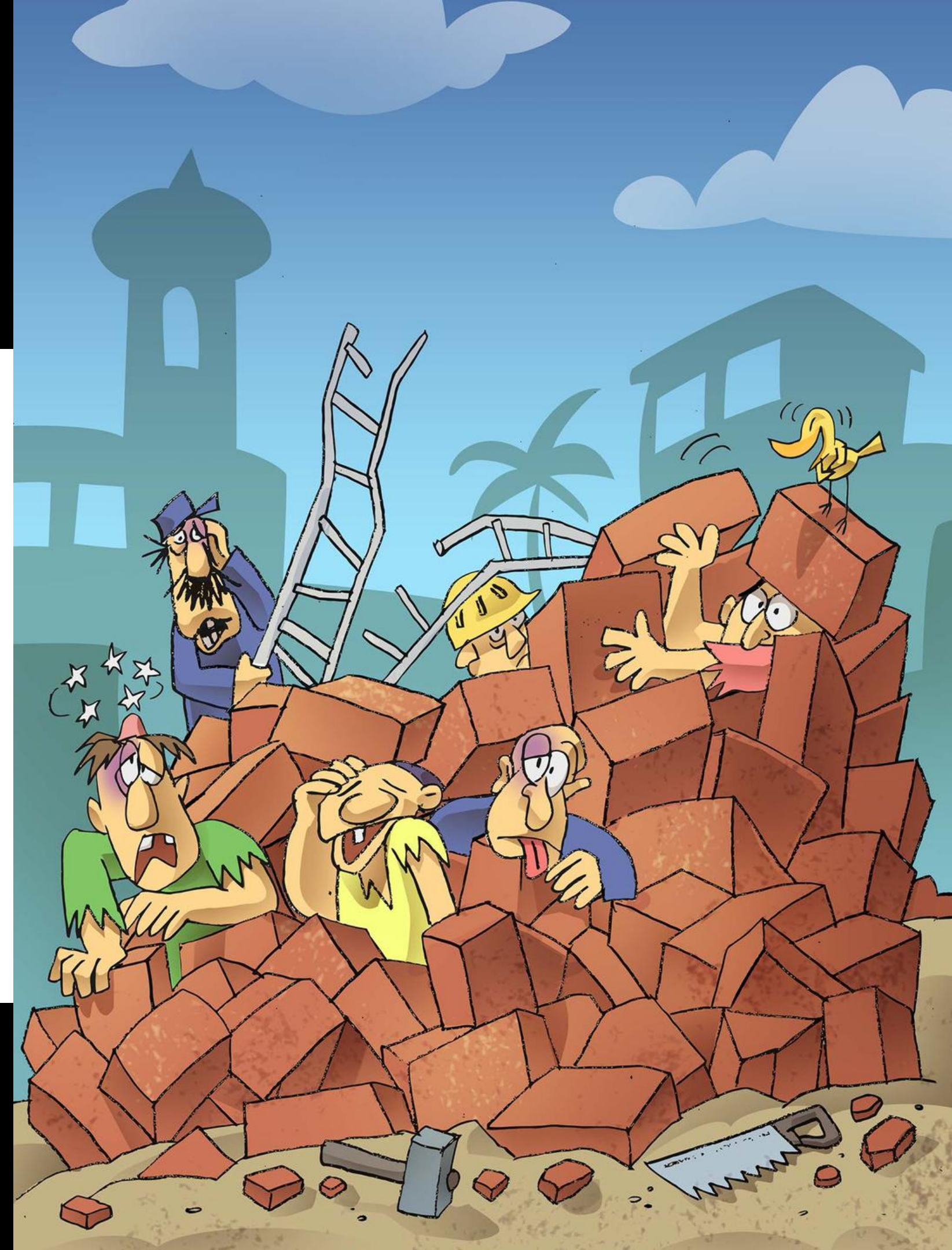

Will Avram get married?

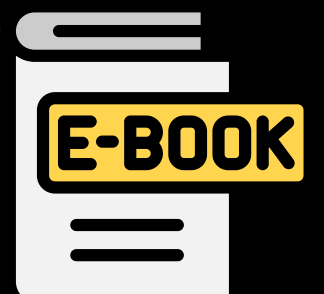
Will his wife's name be Mrs. Avram?

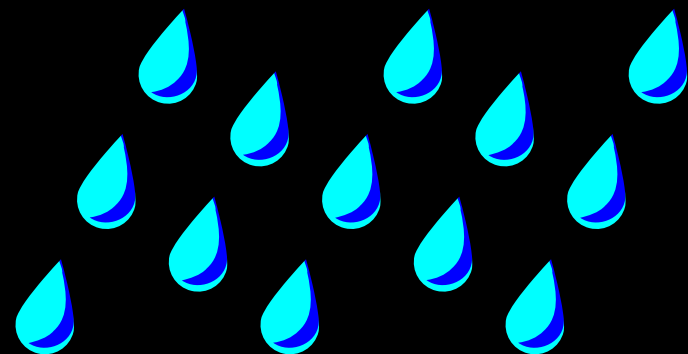
