Head Coach Notes from Perry Northeast

Head coach Perry Northeast was pleased with his side's performance in the FAWNL Cup against Luton Town last weekend but confirmed there was still more to come from this group.



"We're fairly pleased with the performance; pleased in terms of getting over the line results-wise.

"The performance level I would say was moderate.

"We wanted to give lots of opportunities to lots of players, which is what this competition is about as well as trying to progress, so we are happy in that sense from a performance perspective.

"There was some nice football and the two goals we scored were directly from the style and the manner in how we wanted to finish an attack, so we're happy with that and I think the players are happy with that.

"What we would like to do moving forward is try to execute a level of consistency across a game to enable us to see games out in a more comfortable manner as well.

"So, that will be the learning from the day and we've had a nice conversation in the changing room directly afterwards and we'll look to ensure we can continue learning and progressing over the coming weeks."

City were put under heavy pressure in the second half but defended valiantly to get the victory over the line.

"I think on the whole, we were still calm and that's one of the main things when you're 2-0 up away from home in a cup competition; ensuring that we don't lose our cool in these situations.

"I think we did that well and the goal that they scored is always going to promote intensity towards the back end of a game but I think overall we managed it well.

"We do just have to tidy up some of our habits and some of our behaviours in some phases



of the game but we can look at that this week and ensure that we polish that up for Boldmere."

Both of the Canaries' goals came from clever interplay down the right.

Speaking on whether this area was targeted, Northeast said: "Yes, not necessarily just a weakness of Luton's but a way of finishing attacks so we can ensure that we have an end product that is worthy of a goal.

"The players are really trying hard to execute that within a training context and it came off twice in the game context, so we still want to demand more in this area.

"I know the players can offer more in this area, they know they can and that's not a negative comment, that's more a comment of excitement for what's to come."

On today's league action against Boldmere St Michaels, Northeast said: "It was full preparation for Boldmere as soon as last Sunday's game finished.

"As I've mentioned before, we treat every opposition with the same level of respect in every competition.

"We were obviously full focus on Luton before last weekend and now we've executed this game, we will look at Boldmere and how we can strategise to put in a good performance."

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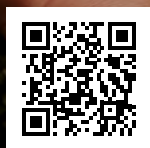
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Feature Interview:

Millie Daviss

We caught up with Millie Daviss last weekend following City's 2-1 win over Luton Town to discuss the squad's performance as well as opening her account for the season

"It was a tricky game. I think we had a game plan that at times we executed well and at other times we probably could have done a bit better in certain situations.

"Luton were a really good side, they compete well and we let them into the game in the second half. Obviously, they got their goal, but I think we took our two goals well and had a bit of momentum in the first half; second half maybe not so much.

"I think we dropped off a little bit.

"We probably had, in the first half, a bit more possession of the ball and kept it a little bit more.

"In the second half, we gave them a few chances and teams will punish us when that happens, so we have to just be prepared.

"We always have to be switched on, can't get complacent and try to be

unbeatable which is always the plan but we've got the three points and we're happy with that."

Daviss opened the scoring at Sharpenhoe Road with her first goal of the season.

"It was a really good bit of play down the right side and obviously, as left-back today, I decided to make a run into the box and it was really good to get on the score sheet.

"I think it was a first-time finish which was good for me, so I was happy with it.

"It's always good to get on the scoresheet, I don't do that often so it's nice to get one."

With attention immediately turning to City's match against Boldmere St Michaels, Daviss said: "We'll look at Boldmere and look at ourselves, have a think about what the best way to win that game will be.

"So, we just need to prepare in the best way possible, have a good intense training week.

"We're all on the same page with that.

"We know our intensity in training is excellent and we just have to continue pushing, working for each other, continue to push each other and hopefully we get the result that we want on Sunday."

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The Visitors: Boldmere St Michaels

This weekend we welcome Boldmere St Michaels to The Nest in only our second league fixture on home turf.

The Birmingham-based side arrive to Norfolk in 11th but only one point behind the Canaries.

They began their 2026/27 campaign with a win at home to Middlesbrough, Evie Hughes with the only goal of the game after 15 minutes played.

Boldmere then suffered a heavy defeat on the road to Stoke City, losing 5-1 in their first away game.

Natasha Bailey was on the scoresheet to pull one back for the visitors at the bet365 Stadium after the Potters had gone one up, but it proved to be a mere consolation goal.

The following week saw Boldmere lose out to Huddersfield Town, this time in a much more tightly contested tie that ended 4-2 to the Terriers.

Last weekend saw Boldmere return to winning ways with a 2-1 victory over Aston Villa Under-21s in the second group stage game of the FAWNL Cup.

Today's two sides last came head-to-head in 2023, when the then Division One Midlands side were drawn away to the Canaries in the second round of the FA Cup.

Despite a goal from Ceri Flye, Boldmere were 2-1 winners on the day.
