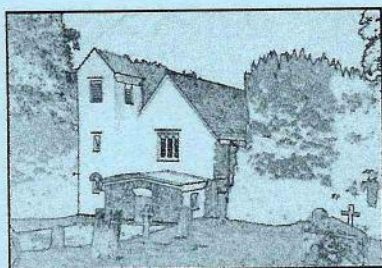


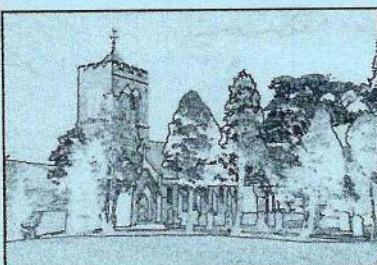

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Dear Friends

We are well into this New Year now, and I hope you are able to look forward positively to all that life will bring in the forthcoming year.

There are certainly new things to look forward to in the Benefice.

People who don't "do" church, often say these things about it

- It's dull
- I feel conspicuous in a small congregation
- I can't find my way round the Prayer Book
- The hymns are like dirges
- It's always cold in churches
- Nobody speaks to you

They are commonly held reasons, and we are trying to address them as best we can to encourage you to join us. I would really like you to just try church on the second Sunday in the month and tell us how we are succeeding. It is seeking to be different, the 3 congregations come together in one of the churches, which means that you would not be conspicuous, and there will be one near you every three months (although that is no reason not to travel a few miles to the one where the service is happening).

What you find may surprise you. We have turned up the heating, there are no complicated books to find your way around, we are moving away from those dirge like hymns and the language is respectful but the kind of English you speak; **plus**, you may even get a video during the time for reflection. And to round it off – we share food together after the service.

Just to remind and encourage you, here is what Paul wrote to the Christian family in Rome...

"For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. So you have not received a spirit that makes you fearful slaves. Instead, you received God's Spirit when he adopted you as his own children. Now we call him, "Abba, Father." For his Spirit joins with our spirit to affirm that we are God's children. And since we are his children, we are his heirs. In fact, together with Christ we are heirs of God's glory....."

We are all family with one Father, and that includes you. Please join us, we would love to welcome you.

Getting to know Jesus better...

We are half way through chapter 12 of the book of Mark
New Living Translation of the Bible - Notes are by Matt Rich

13 Later the leaders sent some Pharisees and supporters of Herod to trap Jesus into saying something for which he could be arrested. 14 "Teacher," they said, "we know how honest you are. You are impartial and don't play favourites. You teach the way of God truthfully. Now tell us - is it right to pay taxes to Caesar or not? 15 Should we pay them, or shouldn't we?" Jesus saw through their hypocrisy and said, "Why are you trying to trap me? Show me a Roman coin, and I'll tell you." 16 When they handed it to him, he asked, "Whose picture and title are stamped on it?" "Caesar's," they replied. 17 "Well, then," Jesus said, "give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and give to God what belongs to God." His reply completely amazed them.

18 Then Jesus was approached by some Sadducees - religious leaders who say there is no resurrection from the dead. They posed this question: 19 "Teacher, Moses gave us a law that if a man dies, leaving a wife without children, his brother should marry

Jesus knew the difference between people with genuine questions and those that only had an aim to prove Him wrong... when you have questions about faith and God, are you hoping to prove that it is all false and wrong, that God doesn't exist and it is all made up? Or, do you ask questions because you really want to know the truth and find out if God is really there and cares about you?

Again the religious leaders were trying to think of questions to show that Jesus was false and not from God. This particular group focused on trying to prove that we don't live on when we die - that there is no afterlife. But Jesus

the widow and have a child who will carry on the brother's name. 20 Well, suppose there were seven brothers. The oldest one married and then died without children. 21 So the second brother married the widow, but he also died without children. Then the third brother married her. 22 This continued with all seven of them, and still there were no children. Last of all, the woman also died. 23 So tell us, whose wife will she be in the resurrection? For all seven were married to her." 24 Jesus replied, "Your mistake is that you don't know the Scriptures, and you don't know the power of God. 25 For when the dead rise, they will neither marry nor be given in marriage. In this respect they will be like the angels in heaven.

26 "But now, as to whether the dead will be raised - haven't you ever read about this in the writings of Moses, in the story of the burning bush? Long after Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob had died, God said to Moses, 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.' 27 So he is the God of the living, not the dead. You have made a serious error."

explained to them that the reason it didn't seem to make sense to them that people lived on after death was because they had misunderstood things. Jesus explained that when we die we will be different to how we are now, things will not just be the same! One thing He made clear was that we do live on after death - dying is not the end of us. Jesus didn't go into all the details and tell us exactly how things would be when we die, but He did say that we do not become angels but that in 'some ways' we will be like the angels! In other places in the Bible Jesus taught that there are two places people go to when they die - a fantastic place and an awful place.

The people Jesus was talking to did not believe anybody lived on after dying - but Jesus said to them that thinking like they do is a serious error! Would Jesus say that you are believing a serious error too? The reason this is a serious error is because, if we don't choose to follow Jesus now while we are alive, then the consequences of rejecting Him don't just stop when we die - the consequences of rejecting Jesus go on forever.
