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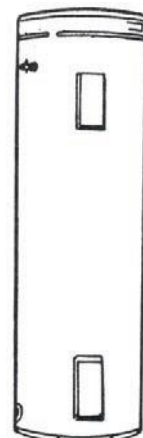

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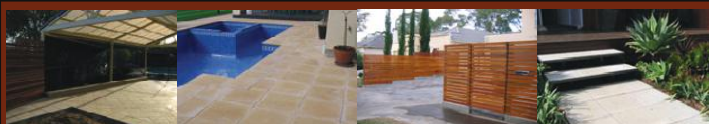

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Book on Local Artists successfully launched in two places

Christie Anthoney, Executive Officer of Festivals Adelaide, launched Lorraine McLoughlin's latest book, *George Tetlow and Mark and Jill Pearse: Lives in Art*, in front of a crowd of 110 on the lawns at Leonards Mill in early December.

Ms Anthoney, a city mover and shaker in the arts world, has a local beach hideaway. She paid tribute to the work of these three artists and to the writer of the book, saying:

"It is indeed an honour and privilege for me to be launching this book today. I'm new to committing to the area, though I've been coming down for holidays all my life.

"There are references to when George and the Pearse's first sniffed the crisp clean winds of the Fleurieu and made the sea-change, in both cases, with boots and all commitment to move their families, and importantly their art practices here. That was deeply resonating for me...

"I found this book extremely motivating. When one reads a well written, generous portrait of the most significant moments of others' lives, it seems so obvious, so completely resolute. Retrospect makes the threads one follows in life so right. How could it be any other way? It made me want to have the guts to make my life so meaningful."

A few days later, over a hundred more people attended the city launch at UniSA by Greg Mackie, Festival Fleurieu Chair and Cape Jervis part time resident, with a huge following in the art and cultural scenes in Adelaide.

"It is fitting to have both a country and a city launch because - while the artists are inextricably linked with the Yankalilla/ Normanville area - they also have had an enormous influence in Adelaide," said author Lorraine McLoughlin.

Greg noted these links in his speech. "Most of us here this evening have connections - past, present - or past and present with George and Erika or Jill and Mark Pearse - or let's not forget the author herself - the indomitable Lorraine McLoughlin and her significant other, - himself a visual



artist and man of letters - Peter Fitzgerald - or maybe all of the aforementioned."

Greg spoke with admiration "of the artists whose journeys are laid bare in text and print for the reader and the collector to behold in this fine publication, I feel that there has been an exchange of trust and perhaps mutual admiration - definitely mutual respect. It is this mutual respect that shines through in this publication.

This is an exceptionally **beautiful part of the world**. The beaches at Morgans and the Fisheries are totally different due to geological formations. Morgans is great for fishing and swimming and a beautiful beach for all. Fisheries Beach is interesting for exploration and clambering over rocks. A walk along the Heysen Trail from the Cape to Fisheries Beach provides stunning views. Deep Creek Conservation park is nearby as is Rapid Bay with its interesting history, long jetty and gentle beach. It also has a wonderful camping ground on the beach.

The **Cape Jervis Station** provides cottages, camping and a caravan park. **The Pear Tree Café** serves coffee and meals and the Station has beautiful function facilities.

Local fish can be purchased in Cape Jervis on the northern side of South Road. Look for the A-frame and flags.

The **dingy project** can be seen at the entrance to the town. This is a community art project working with Mosaics. If you see people working there you might like to stop and add a couple of pieces to the boat.

Morella farm and **Cape Jervis Holiday Units** offer different accommodation experiences. They are almost booked out for January and

February but it is worth a call to check availability. The units are in the town and the farm in the hills above the Cape. They have comprehensive web sites. On the way down to the Cape or coming back it is worth stopping to have a look at what has become known as the **Delamere Wall**. A large wall beside the Delamere store has been covered with panels of artwork created by members of the community, from school children to professional artists. Have a coffee in the relaxing picnic area as you take in the wonders of the artwork.

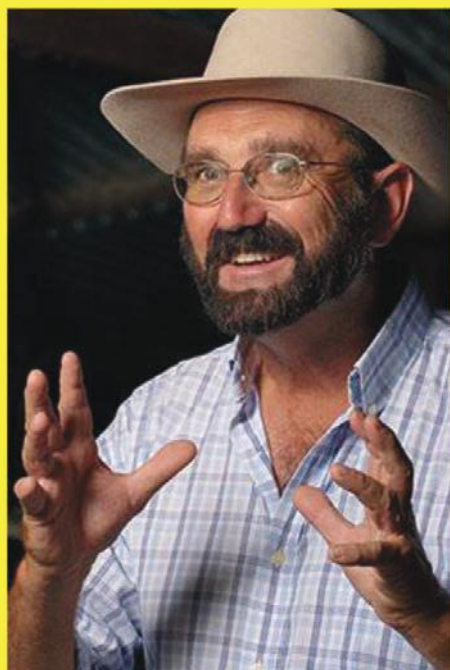

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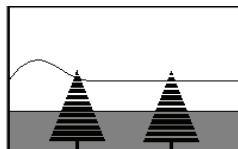

Compliments of the season to you all. I hope you all enjoyed the festive season and not over indulged too much. The New Year's Pageant has been and gone and 2016 is starting to go by. We welcomed Nigel Morris the Chief Executive at the December Council meeting and he is getting round the district.

Prior to the end of December accompanied by Council's Chief Executive, Manager Operations and Councillor Peter O'Neil I met with the new owners of the Normanville Abattoirs and their Australian managers. This was a very comforting meeting. The new owners are large Malaysian meat importers both live and slaughtered. They have bought the abattoir to process the livestock of sheep, goats and cattle from local and state producers. Council's involvement through the development stage will be minimal but our connection is vital. They are looking to open up in June 2016 after expensive upgrades internally. Further development is scheduled after June when development approvals come to hand. Initially they are looking at employing some 50-60 people and as the business grows further employment will grow. This is an exciting outcome and we look forward to them starting up.

Being an Asian export Halal meat will be processed. I hope the community is accommodating and welcomes the opportunity this business will bring to our district.

Keep a check on In the Loop for upcoming consultation meetings throughout 2016 such as Budget, Strategic Plan, Asset Management and more. This month we are consulting on Council's Rating Review, submissions closing Friday 29 January 2016, see Page 3 for more details.

ENVIROTRIM TREE TRIMMING

Council enlisted the services of Envirotrim to carry out tree trimming on some selected rural roads within our district including Mt Scrub, Law, Maylands and Tunkhead Roads.

The speed and efficiency of their operations has proven its worth to Council in that the distance covered per day and the end result is much more economical than manual tree trimming.

Ratepayer and Emergency Services / CFS feedback has been more than positive. This operation has provided a well defined cut to the trees and a clean and tidy result.

NEW LOOK STREET BINS REAP REWARDS FOR COMMUNITY GROUPS

Council has recently commenced rolling out the new look street bins with stainless steel shrouds to replace the existing "wheelie bins" which were found to be unsightly and prone to blowing over, resulting in rubbish strewn across the streets and foreshore areas. The Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority (FRWA) assisted Council in the selection of suitable stainless steel bin shrouds.

The implementation process of shrouds to cover the bins will continue to be rolled out over the next few years as budget allows. The bins are now secured within a locked stainless steel shroud. The shrouds contain two bins, one for general waste and another for recyclables. A key to the shrouds has been provided to the Yankalilla & District Inter-Church Council so that they can collect the recyclables.

"The Yankalilla & District Inter-Church Council Inc. (YDICC) is grateful to the District Council of Yankalilla, to be able to collect bottles and cans to assist us in providing our community support and welfare programs. YDICC provides financial support to the Pastoral Care Workers at the Yankalilla Area School, Rapid Bay Primary School and Myponga Primary School. They assist the schools in providing pastoral care and support to the students, staff and school community. In the wider community we also provide food parcels and other basic requirements to people in need. We are pleased to be able to help our community in this way and we value the support of Council" said Mr Jon Jaensch, presiding member for YDICC.

Council would like to remind everyone to segregate waste by making sure only recyclables are placed in the recyclable bin. In addition to financially helping the community this will also reduce landfill which is beneficial for the environment.





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RATE REVIEW

The District Council of Yankalilla is considering changing the existing method of rating.

Council is contemplating replacing its minimum rate (which was \$850 in 2014/15 and 2015/16) with a fixed charge. If a fixed charge was introduced the amount would be determined at the time Council adopts its 2016/17 budget and would depend on budget proposals and any changes in property values and revenue from other sources. It may be of the order though of \$200 to \$400 per property (single farm enterprises would be treated as one property). Total rate revenue raised will be unaffected by any change in the method of rating. Because a fixed charge would apply to all ratepayers the rate in the dollar council levies against each property's value would fall. Some ratepayers may pay more but this would be offset by others paying less.

SUCCESS IN COMBINING RESOURCES TO IMPROVE COUNCIL ROADSIDE VERGES

Council working together with Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources (DEWNR) and engaging with the residents have successfully removed over 14 truck loads of feral olive trees from Jervois Road. Working together has immediately improved the line of sight to oncoming vehicles on this narrow single vehicle road and reduced fuel levels. Roadside verge maintenance continues to be a high cost to Council. With over 840 kilometres of verges within our District, slashing and spraying is an expensive method of control. Recently Council working with the Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources (DEWNR) have commenced a community enablement program. The residents, DEWNR and Council were all aware of the invasion of feral olives to the roadside. From discussions with the community and combining resources, DEWNR and Council were able to effectively remove the truck loads of olive trees from the verges. The community were enabled to choose replacement native plants that will overtime, reduce weed growth and make the roadside aesthetically pleasing. With ongoing support, the residents, Council and DEWNR will see the verges returned to a more controlled native surround. Council envisage our community working with DEWNR to enact similar projects to make additional verges aesthetically pleasing, weed resistant and lower fuel levels from selective plantings of native ground covers and shrubs. This approach to the corridors of weed growth in our District is seen as a long term project but with a more long term solution.

FOCUS ON ILLEGAL WASTE DUMPERS

Council is committed to the protection of our environment. Of mounting concern has been illegal dumping and storing of rubbish. Working with the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) in a joint venture, particular attention has been taken of our rural bin banks and rural roads. The bin banks are a repository location for wheelie bins in rural locations. Some of these areas are being frequented by persons depositing in and around the area, hard rubbish such as mattresses, e-waste, building materials and car parts. This waste collection is an additional cost to ratepayers.

Over the Christmas period, the EPA will be undertaking covert surveillance to monitor illegal dumping in various locations. Persons identified as dumping waste face hefty fines from the EPA.

Council inspectors have been speaking with land owners in relation to properties hoarding rubbish on their properties. Land owners are being reminded of their obligations under the development and Local Government Act. Proceedings have been commenced on some land owners for non compliance.

This project is not restricted to bin banks. Other areas of our district are under surveillance to detect and record illegal dumpers for the purpose of prosecution.

We live in an environmental wonderland, but it is under threat from this activity and steps are being taken to protect it.

TREES ON COUNCIL VERGES

Council would like to remind its residents that it is an offence to plant, interfere with or remove trees or other vegetation that is located within the council verge area without the written authorisation from Council.

FIREARMS AMNESTY

A General Firearms Amnesty commenced in South Australia on Tuesday 1 December 2015 and will conclude on Thursday 30 June 2016.

The aim of this Amnesty is to make the community a safer place by removing unwanted, unregistered or illegal firearms, firearm parts, mechanisms, fittings, prohibited firearm accessories, silencers and ammunition from the community, making it harder for guns to fall into the wrong hands.

Members of the public in possession of these items are encouraged to hand these in at a participating licensed firearms dealer's premises or to police at any police station during the General Firearms Amnesty without fear of prosecution.

The Amnesty also permits any person holding a current South Australian License to surrender a firearm to a participating licensed firearms dealer to make an application to register the firearm fee-free or to sell the firearm to the participating licensed firearms dealer.

The Amnesty will not provide protection to any person using or in possession of an illegal firearm or other item for any reason other than for the purpose of surrendering it to a member of the police force or a participating licensed firearms dealer.

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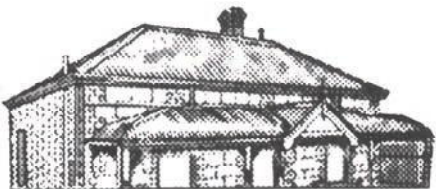
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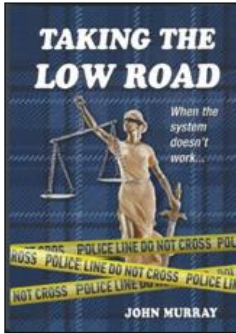

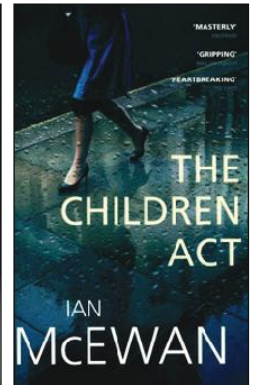
McEwan's latest novel poses some big issues to discuss over fine food and wine with people who enjoy a good read.

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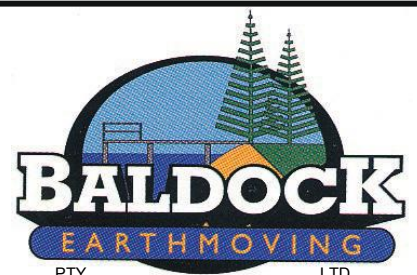

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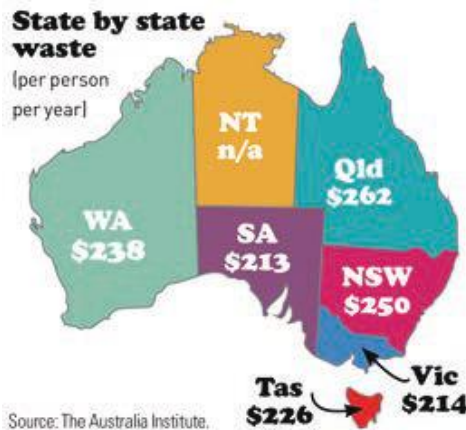
Food Waste In Australia

We see food everywhere, between popular cooking shows on TV, our local farmers' markets and an abundance of food snaps on social media, it's clear that Australians love food. However, Australians also throw away up to 20% of food they buy (that's one out of every five shopping bags purchased!) [1]. This equates overall to an

estimated \$8-10 billion worth of edible food and 4 million tonnes of food waste [2]. The map of Australia shows waste per person in 2011.

The environmental impacts of food waste are concerning. We are squandering a third of the world's food supply [3], habitats still being cleared to grow more food... and people are still going hungry. In addition to habitat loss, greenhouse gas emissions also come from growing food that is never eaten or rotting in landfill. Wasting food has a significant impact on our natural resources too. When we waste food, we also waste the resources used to grow our food (water, soils and energy) and all the energy used to process, package and transport food from markets to our homes.

Awareness of our food choices creates change. Simple plans can make an enormous difference. As a community of people who love food, together, there are a number of actions that we can take to help.



12 simple steps [4]

Shop smart

Take stock: Know what you have and plan meals based on your inventory. Make your shopping list pre shop.

Stick to your list: It's a costly waste if you don't consume what you buy, even if it is on special! Will you really eat that?

Buy funny looking produce: It tastes just as good and saves food that might be wasted because size, shape, or colour are not "right".

Sensible storage

Practice FIFO (First in First Out): Organize newest groceries at the back, oldest in the front.

Prioritize perishables: Have a section in your fridge for food that needs to be consumed ASAP.

Keep it fresh: refrigerate between 1-5 degrees C, use airtight containers.

Preserve it: If the clock is ticking, freeze it, can it, dry it, or dehydrate it.

Cooking

Understand labels: use by and best before dates are not 'expiry' dates or ultimatums! They only indicate peak freshness.

Get creative: Soups, stews, and smoothies are great "use it up" options.

Use it all: Only toss non-edible parts of produce and spatula out containers.

At the table

Put less on your plate: eat family style (shared serving bowls) or ask for smaller portions. Plate scrapes are wasted.

Save it for later: Take it to go. Refrigerate or freeze leftovers (and remember to eat them). Date and label items in transparent containers to avoid mystery meals.

If it cannot be consumed by you

Share it! Have a friend over for a meal

Feed it to an animal/pet

Compost it.

Weed of the Month from Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group Slender Thistle

(*Carduus tenuiflorus*)

This weed has been appearing on the foreshores at Cape Jervis over spring-early summer. As you can see from the photos, the plant stems sit upright, with the flower heads held high. The flowers are small (2-3cm), purple, and are around from September to December. They always occur at the end of a flowering stem, not along its length. Note the spiny bracts at the lower outside edge of these flowers. Later the flower produces two types of seeds: inner (about 85% of the seeds) and outer. These all have plumes for spreading by wind. Leaves are a dull green on top, paler underneath and hairy. There's a rosette of leaves at the base, but other leaves along the stems as well, forming 'wings'. There can be multiple stems, ribbed and a bit hairy; these might be seen still standing long after the plant dies off in summer.

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Sealand's Fundraiser for Pinery bushfire victims

Sealand Theatre Inc. will begin its 2016 program with an event in mid-February aimed at raising money for a young couple who lost everything in the Pinery bushfire in November, 2015. Whilst the focus for many people has been superceded by terrible fires along the Great Ocean Road holiday area in Victoria on Christmas Day (etc), it is important to remember that many South Australians are also homeless and suffering as a result of the fires that burnt through 85,000 hectares of land, destroyed over 90 homes, killed thousands of livestock and left two people dead and others badly injured. Tai and Jenna are just two of the people who lost everything. Tai was badly burned and Jenna lost her family home (of many generations). On the weekend of Feb 13-14, Sealand Theatre Inc. will stage an evening of music and entertainment to raise money for the couple. In particular, the theatre company hopes to raise enough to replace Tai's drum kit that was destroyed in the fire, so that when his burns heal, he can

return to playing the music he loves. When Tai's aunt Jo Hamblyn visited him in hospital at the RAH, he recounted his narrow escape from death: 'He got his motorbike started and headed off down the dirt driveway of their home towards the road; he hit a bump in the drive way, which caused him to crash the bike and fall off; his skin was burning on his arms, neck, legs, feet and lower back. He could not see anything in front of him – there was too much smoke and the flames where behind him, above him and to his right, and there was nowhere to go to the left' she said.

"The sky was on fire" and "I was literally racing against the fire", Tai said to his aunt. "I got to the end of the driveway, to the dirt road. I stopped to see if there was anyone around, what was happening, and I didn't have a plan. I was burning and the fire was coming"... "Then this car just appeared out of the smoke."

The driver took off to try to get away from the fire and go towards Freeling. After trying various ways to get out, the driver finally found a way through with Tai. At Freeling, with limited resources, a nurse and another man did their best to care for Tai. Tai's skin was hanging off him and he was in unimaginable pain. Finally, Tai was rushed to the burns unit at RAH, Adelaide.

During his aunt's hospital visit, Tai's concern for Jenna his girlfriend, was paramount. The home they lived in was Jenna's family home for some generations. "A place she had always been able to come back to" said Tai.

"I can't imagine what it would be like to not be able to go **home**. People move from house to house for whatever reason, you know, they might change a rental or sell a house, but this was Jenna's home for a really long time and we had been slowly getting it fixed up, one room at a time. I can't imagine what that is like for her." According to family members, Tai's concern for Jenna is typical of the selfless character of this young man.

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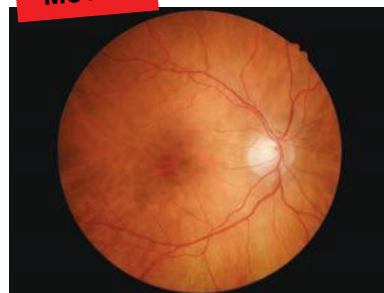
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Hair to make a difference!

Together with the wig maker FLITZ have simplified it and Rhonda from Louis Barnett Wig Makers liaises with those in need, to get a wig to them ASAP with a minimum of fuss.

To help with funds for this purpose Flitz are always pleased to accept donations to the cause - it costs about \$500 per wig and takes at least 4 hair donations as well. Proposed 'Rates Review'

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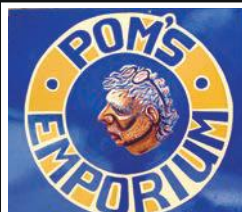
