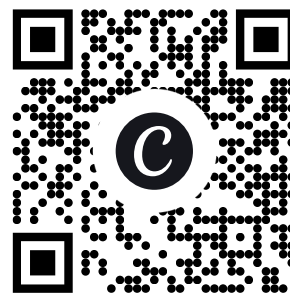

- Beyond safety issues with ChatGPT, META & Grok, hundreds of other “indie” adult-themed apps are easily accessed by our students.

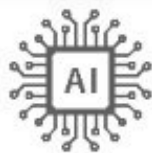

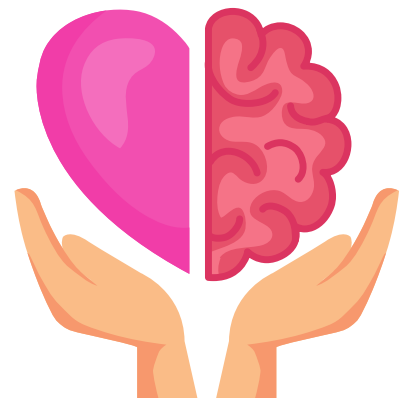
