Take it to the next level when you earn the Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, or Gold Awards—our highest awards—to make a sustainable impact.

Lead Your Way

Girl Scouts have endless opportunities to lead. Anyone can tell others what to do. A true leader can make smart decisions, act fairly and responsibly, and let others on the team shine as they work together. Whether it's running their cookie business, inspiring younger kids as part of earning a Leadership Award, or directing a team of volunteers for a Gold Award project.

Earn Badges and Awards

Learn new skills, then take them further with a Leadership Award or a Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, or Gold Award. These awards allow Girl Scouts to show that they know how to take action and make a difference in their community. Our highest award demonstrate that they know how to solve a problem, permanently.



Badge Work

Girl Scouts at each level have their own earned awards and badges.

When a Girl Scout earns a badge, it shows that she's learned a new skill, such as how to make a healthy snack or take great digital photos. It may even spark an interest at school or plant the seed for a future career. Please remember that we don't expect you to be an expert in badge topics; just have fun learning by doing with the girls!

While you're having fun, keep in mind: badges are for educating girls, not for decorating their sashes and vests. The quality of a Girl Scout's experience—and the skills and pride she gains from earning leadership awards and skill-building badges—far outweighs the quantity of badges she earns.

Leadership Awards

Girl Scout Leadership Awards help a Girl Scout discover her own strengths and turn her ideas into action. She can choose the path that feels right for her—whether she loves working alone, with friends, or with younger kids. Here is what each path offers:

True North: It Starts with Her

Before she leads others, she gets to know herself. This award helps her figure out what she truly cares about and gives her the courage to stand up for it. It is her first big step in building inner confidence.

Torch Awards: Working with Her Peers

This is all about being a great teammate. She learns how to support a group, listen to others, and take the lead on a team project at school, in her community, or within her troop.

Teaching Awards: Becoming a Mentor

If she enjoys helping others, this path lets her become a role model. She starts by assisting with an activity for younger Girl Scouts and can work her way up to leading full meetings or helping at a summer camp.

Advocacy Awards: Make a Difference

This is about turning passions into action. She teams up with others to tackle a real issue she cares about—whether it is helping the environment, supporting a local shelter, or connecting with a global cause.

Volunteer as a troop leader: Guide a group of Girl Scouts by creating a fun, safe space. We'll help you get started with easy-to-use tools like the Girl Scout Experience Box and ready-made Troop Year Plans so you can focus on fun, growth, and connection.

Be a supportive adult volunteer: Help girls thrive by assisting with meetings, activities, or special events, no matter your schedule or experience.

Activities, Travel & Events: A Planning Guide

As you plan your Girl Scout year, you may want to add activities and travel that require extra steps and council approval. This guide highlights what you need to know. For full details and forms, visit gssgc.org/forms.

Safety First

The *Safety Activity Checkpoints* guide provides safety standards for Girl Scouts of the United States of America and Girl Scouts of San Geronio-approved activities. This resource offers a framework to evaluate and manage safety during Girl Scout activities. It directs planning and helps ensure that you feel confident and prepared with the rules and standards Girl Scouts expects you to follow.

Activity Approval

Approval is required for activities like horseback riding, rock climbing, swimming, and overnight stays longer than 24 hours. Always check the full list in the Activity Approval Process document at gssgc.org/forms. The checkpoints are updated regularly by GSUSA.

Hosting Events

Troops or individual adults can host events for other Girl Scouts. This is a great way to share a passion, teach a badge, or raise money for travel or a Take Action project (with approval as a Money Earning Activity). Contact your Region Unit Event Chair for training and support with the Intent to Event process.

Extended Travel Planning

Extended trips are girl-planned, girl-led experiences lasting more than two nights and/or traveling over 700 miles round trip or outside the continental U.S. These are open to bridging Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors,

and Ambassadors. The Extended Trip Travel Planning document provides a step-by-step checklist for forms, training, and approvals, plus links to planning tools for domestic and international travel.



Girl Scout Destinations

Destinations are individual adventures for Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors. Girls apply on their own, travel with new Girl Scout friends from across the country, and push past their comfort zones. Learn more at: girlscouts.org/destinations.

Volunteer Safety Steps

GSSGC policy is to conduct a criminal background check on all volunteers. We require a live scan to be completed for volunteers that expect to be in direct contact with Girl Scouts for more than 16 hours per month or more than 32 hours per year.

You must complete both screening and training to participate in GSSGC activities.

Mandated Reporter Training

1. Sign on to your gsLearn account.
2. Go to the Content Library, and search to complete “GSUSA Girl Scouts Child Abuse Neglect and Prevention”.
3. Complete the training.
4. Screenshot the achievement once training is completed and email it to mandatedreportercert@gssgc.org.

This training requirement can be waived if you hold a current, professional mandated reporter certification.

This training does not come with a certificate of achievement. Completion of this training is recorded as an achievement in gsLearn. For assistance, please contact Customer Care at customercare@gssgc.org.

Live Scan

All persons completing a live scan must be a registered Girl Scout Adult Member.

1. Visit gssgc.org/livescan or scan the QR code below.
2. Register and watch the video completely at the end of the registration.
3. Receive your appointment confirmation QR code.
If you did not receive confirmation, the system has determined that the video was not watched in full. Go back and watch the video to proceed.
4. Take the QR code to your appointment.



Live Scan from other organizations does not transfer to GSSGC.

Adult Training

Elevate your skills with GSSGC training. We offer practical and empowering courses for adults. Check our website for upcoming dates and details—new sessions added often!

CPR First Aid Training

This required training teaches individuals how to perform lifesaving first aid techniques to help someone who is not breathing or whose heart has stopped.

Basic Outdoor Training

This training is required for outdoor camping overnights of more than 24 hours and distances of 30 minutes or more from emergency medical services. Training includes the basics of outdoor cooking, fire safety, and *Leave No Trace*.

Co-Leader Basic 3 Training

Leader Orientation is a one-time training required for all new leaders starting or taking over a Girl Scout troop in San Gorgonio Council. This orientation will cover the specific policies, standards, and guidelines that Girl Scouts of San Gorgonio holds for each troop.

Extended Trip Travel Training

This is required training for all adults who plan to travel internationally or for trips of more than two nights.

The Fall Product Program is a financial literacy activity that allows girls to be entrepreneurs who learn and practice the “Five Skills”—goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics—by offering delicious nuts and chocolates, magazines, Tervis Tumblers, custom stationery, candles, and Girl Scout-themed BarkBoxes for sale.

Participating in the Fall Program is more than just a fundraiser—it’s an opportunity to kickstart a year filled with exciting activities, learning experiences, and personal growth.

Fall Product Program

Fall Product Coordinator Registration

As a Troop Product Coordinator for fall, you'll help girls shine, learn new skills, and reach their goals by guiding them through our product sales programs. This team-oriented role is perfect for someone who enjoys organizing, communicating, and supporting girls as they grow into confident leaders. No prior experience is needed—just enthusiasm, reliability, and a willingness to learn.

In order to participate in the 2026 Fall Product Program and earn Troop Proceeds, it is mandatory that one registered adult from each troop becomes the Product Coordinator and completes the online training learning pathway. The Product Coordinator does not need to be a co-leader, but must have the following completed:

- Must have 2027 membership
- Current cleared background check
- Completed mandated reporter training
- Live Scan with GSSGC

Once registered, coordinators can access the Mandatory Online Training in gsLearn (accessed by logging in to MyGS) beginning September 8, 2026. Once training is completed and eligibility is verified, coordinators will be added to M2OS. Please complete training by September 21, 2026 to attend material pick-up and ensure your troop can begin the Fall Program, which begins October 1, 2026.

Independent Entrepreneurial Program Opportunities (IEPO)

Is your troop not participating in Fall Product season? Whether your girl identifies as a Juliette, Family Girl Scout, or a solo Girl Scout, she can still join in this educational and fun experience. Participating Girls earn additional Nutty Dough above the standard schedule to use toward GSSGC programming, events, or camp.

By joining a Girl Scout Entrepreneurship Club, girls build the Five Skills, set goals, make new Girl Scout friends, earn rewards and Nutty Dough, and work together to choose an experience to celebrate the club's success.

Girls who can't join a Club can still participate independently and earn Girl Scout rewards, Nutty Dough, plus \$5 in additional IEPO Nutty Dough for every \$100 sold.

Note: Girls active in a troop that is NOT participating in the 2026 Fall Product Program may participate through the IEPO. However, no troop proceeds will be earned.



Troop Proceeds

The Standard Troop Proceeds rate is 20% of total sales including nuts and candy, I Care to Share donations, magazines, BarkBoxes, candles, and Tervis Tumblers.

Additional Troop Proceed Opportunities

Troop \$350+ Per Girl Average (PGA): Additional 5% of total sales added to Troop Proceeds. Minimum three Participating Girls to qualify.*

2027 Cookie Program Bonus: Troops with a PGA of \$275+ in the 2026 Fall Program can earn an additional three cents per box for the 2027 Cookie Program. Minimum three Participating Girls to qualify.*

**Participating is having earned the program theme patch for \$75+ combined sales.*

Troop Opt-Out

The Opt-Out Rewards Plan is the process of choosing an additional 10% of total sales instead of receiving the reward lineup. Girls will not earn the reward items like the plush, events or Nutty Dough, or anything else in the standard reward roster with the exception of the program patches. Girl Scouts may not opt-out on an individual basis. The decision to opt-out is a troop decision. A vote must be made, as it will apply to everyone.
