When to Travel:

April to October - during the summer months when sunlight hours are at a maximum and warm weather is in abundance. Note: August is generally the hottest and busiest time of the year.

Duration:

4-10 day itineraries, with the week-long Dubrovnik/Split being the most popular.

When to Book:

It's recommended to book more than 6 months in advance as dates book out quickly particularly for the peak period June - August.

Pre-/Post- Cruise Options:

- There are many options to add on a Adriatic adventure such as the Greek Islands, Italian coast or Turkey.
- While it may already be on your itinerary, it could be worthwhile spending more time to explore Mljet National Park which covers 5,400 hectares of land and sea, and provides amazing opportunities for hiking, cycling and exploring

Other handy tips?

- When considering your full itinerary, it's worthwhile noting that the popular week-long Croatian voyages generally start on a Saturday and end on a Sunday
- The euro is the currency of Croatia
- Many operators will dock in town in the evening, allowing you visit local restaurants for dinner. Try local dishes like cevapi (grilled minced meat), pasticada (slow-cooked beef), and seafood along the coast

This delightful seaside port town is the home of Diocletian's Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the stunning Cathedral St Domnius, the historic Kils Fortress, and the well-preserved Temple of Jupiter.

Dubrovnik

Medieval city surrounded by stone walls and forts and home to the grand Rector's Palace, a symbol of the city's historical governance, and the scenic Srd hill, offering a breathtaking views of the entire city and the Adriatic Sea.

Bol

This seaside destination, is home to the iconic Zlatni Rat beach, renowned for its unique shape that changes with the tide. Additionally, visitors can explore the mystical Dragon's Cave and Branislav Deskovic Art Gallery.

Hvar

Hvar is home to attractions including Dubovica (bay), Fortica (medieval castle), Trg Sv Stjepana (central square).

Vis Island

Here highlights include Stiniva (an isolated cove), Blue Cave, Hum (mountain), Issa Archaeological Museum.

Dubrovnik Old Town

No Croatia experience is complete without a visit to Dubrovnik's UNESCO World Heritage-listed Old Town. Famous for its medieval stone walls and terracotta rooftops, it also starred as King's Landing in *Game of Thrones*. Wander its maze of cobblestone streets, where hidden cafés, tucked-away bars and breathtaking sea views await around every corner. "My favourite discoveries were the tiny cafés and bars overlooking the sea, and the stories woven into the medieval architecture that truly captivated me," says Wild Earth Travel Marketing Specialist, Nyssa Erskine.

Korčula

Often referred to as 'Little Dubrovnik', Korčula Town is known for its medieval walls, stone streets and distinctive historic architecture. Beyond the old town, the island is dotted with charming villages, vineyards and olive groves, offering a slower pace and plenty of opportunities for immersive exploration.

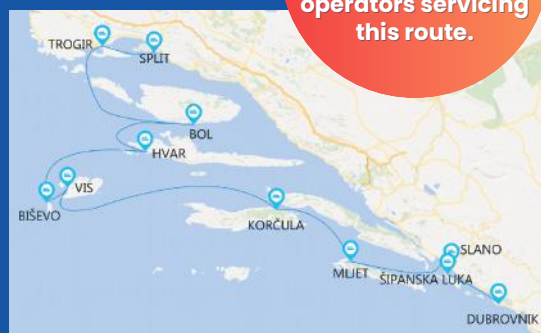

DAY 1: Trogir. Embark in historic Trogir, a UNESCO-listed town filled with palaces, churches and medieval charm. Enjoy a guided city tour before a welcome dinner on board.

DAY 2: Trogir – Split – Milna. Discover Split's UNESCO-listed Diocletian's Palace before cruising to peaceful Milna on Brač Island, with its charming harbour, stone houses and relaxed Mediterranean atmosphere.

DAY 3: Milna – Bol – Vis. Visit Zlatni Rat beach in Bol before sailing to unspoilt Vis, where traditional architecture, pristine beaches and authentic island life await.

DAY 4: Vis – Biševo Blue Cave – Hvar. Explore the stunning Blue Cave before cruising to sunny Hvar, where a guided walk reveals the island's rich history, culture and vibrant atmosphere.

DAY 5: Hvar – Korčula. Cruise to Korčula, birthplace of Marco Polo, and explore its medieval streets, historic landmarks and charming old town known as "mini Dubrovnik".

DAY 6: Korčula – Mljet National Park – Slano. Discover Mljet National Park's lakes, monastery and natural beauty before cruising to Slano for a Captain's Dinner with live music.

DAY 7: Slano – Dubrovnik. Cruise past the Elaphiti Islands to Dubrovnik, the Pearl of the Adriatic. Explore the UNESCO-listed Old Town and iconic city walls.

DAY 8: Dubrovnik. After breakfast, bid farewell to your fellow travellers following an unforgettable journey through Croatia's islands, history and coastal treasures.

A note on your ship...

Vessel options on the Classic Croatia itinerary generally fall into the following categories:

DELUXE SUPERIOR SHIP: Deluxe superior ships are newly built or refurbished with high quality materials. They have hot tubs and spacious air-conditioned en-suite cabins with double or twin beds. Some of the yachts in this category have VIP cabins on the upper deck and/or cabins with private balconies.

DELUXE: These fully air-conditioned vessels feature a spacious sun deck which includes a hot tub and sun beds to enjoy the scenery. The cabins are air-conditioned and en-suited with double or twin beds. These vessels are similar to deluxe superior vessels in size and amenities.

PREMIUM SUPERIOR / SUPERIOR: These modern vessels feature a spacious sun deck, air-conditioned salon, cosy lounge area and cabins with double or twin beds and en-suites. They are built in a more traditional style and the cabins are slightly smaller than the other vessels options mentioned.
