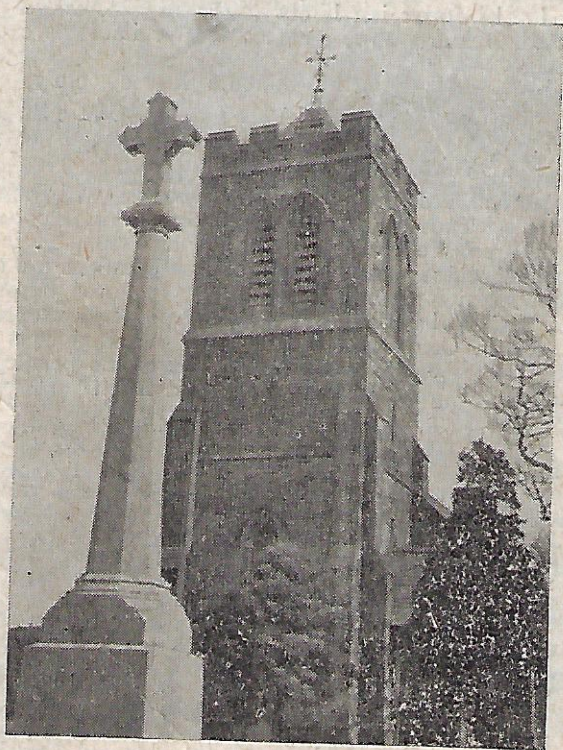

LOWICK (From West's "Antiquities of Furness," 1774).

Between Kirkby Ireth, and the division called Furness Fells on the south-east side of Kirkby moor, near the river Crake, lies the manor of Lowie, or Lowick; once the seat of the family of that name, whose coat is argent, two bars gules; in chief, three mullets of the second.

This manor, at the Conquest, was given, inter alia, to Ivo Taillebois, the Norman, baron of Kendal: William de Lancaster, fifth baron of Kendal, granted the same to Robert de Turribus (Towers) in the reign of King Henry II, and it was afterwards conveyed by Gilbert de Turribus to William, son of Robert de Lofwic (to be held by knight's service) in the reign of King John.

TORVER

LENT. We enter upon this season on Ash Wednesday, which this year is on March 3rd, when Ante-Communion service will be held at 2-45.

FURNESS ASSOCIATION FOR SOCIAL AND MORAL WELFARE. The Association have asked us to notify readers that they have moved their offices from 2 St. George's Square, to the National and Provincial Bank Chambers, Ramsden Square, Barrow in Furness. We have pleasure in doing so.

TORVER SCHOOL. This Foundation is a Church of England Educational Foundation, and under a section of the Education Act the Carlisle Diocesan Education Committee is empowered to dispose of such closed Church Schools by sale so that the proceeds can be used for Church schools elsewhere. The Rector has been informed that if Torver Church Council is anxious to purchase this building out of the Educational Trust so that they become the owners of it, they should make representations to the Archdeacon of Westmorland to this end without delay. The Church Council has therefore met and decided to purchase it, and accordingly informed the Archdeacon of their desire. We have now to await the valuation of the premises etc.

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
