## **Meet the family**

My wife, Jennifer, and I have been blessed to share 12 years of marriage. Looking back on how we met and the journey that brought us together, we clearly see God's faithful hand guiding each step. We are grateful for the life He has given us and strive to keep Christ at the center of our family.

## **Tell us your testimony**

Growing up as the child of a teenage mother, my early years were marked by significant challenges. Poverty, instability, loneliness, and depression were constant realities throughout much of my childhood. Because of our circumstances, my mother and I moved frequently, resulting in my attending 28 different schools. The lack of stability left me searching for acceptance and purpose in all the wrong places. As a teenager, I turned to drugs and alcohol, hoping they would provide an escape from the brokenness and chaos that surrounded my life.

When I was in the eighth grade, our financial circumstances became so difficult that I moved in with my aunt and uncle. At the time, I believed it was simply because my mother could no longer provide for me. Looking back, however, I clearly see God's sovereign and gracious hand at work, orchestrating circumstances that would ultimately lead me to Himself.

Across the street from my aunt and uncle lived a family with a son close to my age. We quickly became friends, and his family faithfully invested in my life. Recognizing my need for Christ, they consistently invited me to attend church with them. One Sunday, having run out of excuses, I accepted their invitation and found myself in a small church in Hurst, Texas.

That morning, the Holy Spirit opened my eyes to my need for redemption through Jesus Christ. As I listened to the gospel, I became deeply convicted of my sin and understood that only Christ could save me. In a simple but sincere prayer, I cried out, "Lord, if You truly are who these people say You are, I need You to forgive me, come into my life, and transform me."



In that moment, God graciously answered my prayer. Through faith in Jesus Christ, He forgave my sins, gave me new life, and began the lifelong work of transforming my heart. The peace, hope, and purpose I had spent years searching for were found only in Him.

The family who first introduced me to Christ continued to walk alongside me, faithfully discipling me and teaching me what it means to follow Jesus. Their investment in my life became a powerful example of Christian love and discipleship, and it laid the foundation for the person and ministry God has called me to today.

## **What should students and parents know about you as a professional?**

Throughout my 30 year career in education, I have worked with students from a wide variety of backgrounds and aspirations—from those pursuing opportunities at institutions such as Harvard and West Point to those entering the workforce immediately after graduation. Regardless of their path, my passion has always been the same: to encourage students to discover God's calling for their lives and to pursue it with excellence, integrity, and a heart that honors Christ. My desire is to equip and encourage each student to faithfully use their God-given gifts wherever He leads them.

## **Give a brief professional overview.**

The Lord has led me through a rewarding career in education spanning more than three decades. I began as a social worker in the public school system and later served as a Health teacher for five years while completing my graduate studies. After earning my master's degree, I became a school counselor and cross country and track coach at Clear Lake High School.

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## A message from our Director of Student Support, **MIKE AMMONS**

Welcome back!

One of the things we love most at BACS is the energy students bring when they return to campus after summer break. The halls are full again, friendships are reconnecting, and it seems like every student has grown at least a foot since May!

The beginning of a new school year also brings something many of us need: rhythm and routine.

After the flexibility of summer, our calendars take on a predictable pattern. Wake up. Get ready. School. Practice. Homework. Dinner. Bedtime. Repeat.

Even though our schedules may become more full during the school year, consistency often helps us manage our responsibilities more effectively. We organize our time, discipline our attention, and devote ourselves to the things that matter.

That kind of consistency is essential for growth.

A student does not improve in math through one marathon study session. A musician does not become proficient by practicing once a month. An athlete does not dramatically improve by shooting 100 free throws one afternoon and then putting the basketball away for three weeks.

Growth comes through consistently applied effort over time.

Practice an instrument consistently, and difficult pieces become manageable. Read every day, and comprehension grows. Shoot 100 free throws each day, and accuracy improves.

There are very few shortcuts.

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The same principle is true of our spiritual lives.

Scripture reminds parents that passing our faith to the next generation happens through the normal rhythms of everyday life. Deuteronomy 6:6-7 says:

"And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

Psalms 145:4 similarly declares:

"One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts."

Notice how ordinary these moments are: sitting at home, traveling together, going to bed, and getting up in the morning. Biblical discipleship is not limited to special events or dramatic spiritual experiences. Much of it happens through small, faithful conversations repeated over many years.

Our Family and Discipleship Pastor, Eric Davis, says it clearly and concisely:

**"Consistency creates legacy."**

That is true because our God is faithful to His people.

As we consistently expose ourselves and our children to God's Word, prayer, fellowship, worship, and service, God uses those ordinary means to shape us. Romans 12:2 reminds us to "be transformed by the renewal of your mind." God uses His truth to renew our thinking, reshape our desires, and increasingly produce lives that reflect Christ.

But the beginning of school also brings a temptation.

Our schedules can quickly become dominated by schoolwork, activities, GPAs, athletics, lessons, practices, tournaments, performances, and accomplishments.

Those are not bad things. Many of them are very good things. We want our children to work hard, develop their gifts, pursue excellence, and learn responsibility.

But good things remain good only when they stay in their proper place.

If our families have time for homework, practice, tournaments, tutoring, workouts, and extracurricular activities, but consistently have no time for Scripture, prayer, worship, fellowship, or service, we may unintentionally communicate something very different from what we say we believe.

Our children learn what matters to us not only from what we tell them, but also from the way we organize our lives.

So as we establish new routines this school year, consider intentionally placing spiritual rhythms at the center of your family's schedule rather than fitting them into whatever time remains.

Here are a few practical ways to begin:

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## **Read Scripture together consistently.**

You do not need to be a theologian or prepare a lesson every night. Do not allow the pressure to “do it perfectly” to keep you from doing it at all. Even a few minutes of Scripture and a simple conversation can be meaningful.

Resources such as Joel Beeke's [Family Worship Bible Guide](#) or [The New City Catechism](#) provide reliable, accessible guidance without extensive preparation.

Most importantly, learn God's Word together. Ask questions. Talk about what you do not understand. Connect Scripture to situations your children are experiencing. Make God's Word a normal part of meals, car rides, and bedtime routines.

At BACS, we want to partner with you in creating these opportunities. Our Home Connection Guides, available through the BACS app, will highlight what students are learning in chapel and other spiritual events and help those conversations continue at home.



## **Create a rhythm of family prayer.**

Prayer does not have to be complicated. Begin by regularly asking, “What can we pray about tonight?” Consider keeping a family prayer journal. Write down needs, concerns, and people you are praying for, then record how God answers those prayers over time. It can become a tangible reminder to your children that God hears His people and faithfully cares for them.



## **Prioritize fellowship and service through the local church.**

Regular involvement in a Bible-believing, Bible-teaching church gives our children relationships with other believers who reinforce the truth they are hearing at home.

Bay Area Church offers Sunday worship services at 8:30, 10:00, and 11:30 a.m., along with small-group opportunities for children, students, and adults each Sunday morning. There are also many wonderful Bible-teaching churches throughout our community.

The important thing is to find a church, commit to it, build relationships, worship faithfully, and serve alongside God's people.

This school year will move quickly.

There will always be another assignment, practice, game, activity, and responsibility competing for our attention. Our challenge is not simply to become better at managing busyness. It is to make sure our busyness never causes us to neglect what matters most.

As we settle back into the rhythm of school, may we use the gift of routine to build habits that point our families toward Christ.

Because the small things we faithfully repeat today become the patterns our children carry tomorrow.
