Psalm 23 (KJV)

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever."

When I read Psalm 23, I do not just see Scripture, I see my life. I see long nights overseas serving in the United States Navy, deployed throughout Southwest Asia and Africa. During my eight years of service, five were spent in the sandbox in places like Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Djibouti, Bahrain, and Qatar. There were moments filled with uncertainty, exhaustion, and fear, but through every deployment, God reminded me that He was always present.

Psalm 23:4 says, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me." Those words became real in combat zones where tomorrow was never guaranteed. In those difficult moments, I learned that God is not only with us during peaceful seasons, he walks with us through the valleys too.

Looking back now, I realize the military was preparing me for more than service. God was teaching me leadership, discipline, resilience, and perseverance. At the time, I did not fully understand why I was walking those difficult roads, but God was building the foundation for my future.

When my military career ended, another challenge began. At 29 years old, I stepped onto the LSU campus as a college student pursuing a degree. It was humbling being older than many of my classmates, but that season taught me the value of persistence and faith. God showed me that sometimes growth requires us to step outside of our comfort zone and trust His direction.

During my time in football and college athletics, I started noticing how many young athletes were falling through the cracks. Talented kids lacked exposure, mentorship, and opportunity. That burden eventually became the vision for Gridiron Football.

Gridiron Football was built on more than sports. It was built on faith, leadership, and the belief that helping one child can impact an entire community. The lessons I learned in the military, in college, and through life's struggles all became part of the mission we live out today.

Psalm 23:5 says, "Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies." There were people who doubted the vision, questioned the mission, and did not understand the purpose behind Gridiron Football. But God has a way of opening doors no one can shut. Through His grace, we have helped thousands of athletes gain exposure and opportunities they may never have had otherwise.

Today, when I look back on my journey from military deployments to LSU and now leading Gridiron Football, I can honestly say that God's goodness and mercy have followed me every step of the way. And if He did it for me, He can do it for you too.

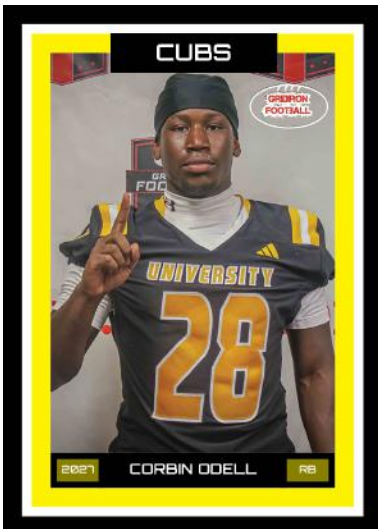

Former Gridiron Football All-American Wydett Williams Signs With The Arizona Cardinals

Former Gridiron Football All-American Wydett Williams has signed an undrafted free agent deal with the Arizona Cardinals. Williams becomes the second player in the Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game's history to sign with a NFL team joining AJ Gillie, who was the first to do so when he signed with the Seattle Seahawks coming out of UL.

Williams' story is a spectacular one as he started his football career at General Trass High School located in Lake Providence, Louisiana with a population of 3,500. Growing up in a poor area of the state with a median income of \$36,700, Williams became a star for his football team leading the Panthers all the way to the Quarterfinals with a 12-1 record losing to eventual state champion Amite. Along the way, he excelled accounting for over, 2,200 total yards and 16 touchdowns.

At the conclusion of a great senior season, Williams played in the 2021 Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game where he earned Offensive MVP honors for the East Team. His experience playing in the bowl game showed him what

collegiate life was going to be about.

"I enjoyed every moment of it especially because it was the next thing closest to practice. Close to college practices and similar events. It was just being out there, being tuned in to what I have to do when I was playing quarterback and making the right reads and getting the ball out in time."

After playing quarterback his high school career, Williams made the switch to safety at Delta State University, which is a Division II university located in Cleveland, Mississippi. During his two years there, Williams recorded 72 total tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, a sack, and 6 pass deflections, earning all-conference honors along the way.

That captured the attention of the ULM Warhawks as Williams made the move from Division II to Division I. The step up in competition did not phase the former quarterback as he earned 1st Team All-Sun Belt Conference honors with 100 total tackles, four PBUs, a sack, a forced fumble, and

three interceptions.

For his final year of eligibility, Williams decided to take his talents to the SEC and play against the best of the best college football has to offer at Ole Miss. Once again, Williams showed that he belonged and not only did he belong, but he proved to be a defensive leader for a Rebels team that made it all the way to the College Football Playoff Semifinals. Earning 1st Team All-SEC honors and being graded as the highest safety by Pro Football Scouting Network, Williams finished with 73 tackles, 9 PBUs, and 3 interceptions.

"It doesn't matter where you start. Everywhere you go, you gotta have a work ethic. You gotta work hard. You gotta be disciplined. Just because you're playing a smaller division of ball doesn't mean you gotta take days off." - Wydett Williams Jr.

At the conclusion of his senior season, Williams entered his name in the NFL Draft and that has led him to this point. From his humble beginnings at General Trass High School to now being in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals, Wydett Williams has shown that it does not matter where you start, but it is how you finish. Being one of the first players in Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game history to make it to the NFL, it is only appropriate that a player like Williams that flew under the radar is the one to show everybody that nothing is impossible.

"Going through the whole journey of coming from a small area to going to a small college and just building on and taking each step in faith is really what built me to who I am today." -Wydett Williams Jr.

Lake Arthur High School (Lake Arthur, LA) LB Wyatt Monceaux has committed to play in the 2026 Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game, which will be played on Wednesday, December 30th at Louisiana Christian University in Pineville, Louisiana.

At 5'11, 185 pounds, Monceaux is a tackling machine that led the Tigers in tackles the last two seasons. Despite a shortened season that included two cancelled games, he still managed to put up 72 tackles after having 92 tackles the season before. His high football IQ and commitment to the game was displayed earlier last season as Monceaux was our Gridiron Football Player of Week 5 when he had a staggering 22 tackles, 2 sacks, 2 TFLs, and an interception in a 47-8 win over Rosepine High School.

He later would not only receive his national player of the week letterman jacket patch at one of our earlier camps at St. Louis Catholic High School, but he was one of the camp's top performers and received his invite to play at the Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game at the event.

"They really had a lot of talent at the camp, but I knew if I worked for it, I think I would achieve that goal of getting the invite to play in the bowl game."

With a 3.7 GPA in the classroom and having a 4.31 second shuttle on the field, what sets Wyatt Monceaux apart is his drive for excellence in all facets. He has already achieved many accolades including not only being a Gridiron Football National Player of the Week, but being named All-District twice, All-Parish, and All-State as well. Still, his goals are to only improve and get better. Monceaux's goals are to get over 100 tackles, 10 sacks, and two interceptions. Right now, he is at 185, but he has been putting a lot of work in the gym to bulk up to 200 pounds, which he is currently approaching.

His quickness and ability to dissect plays as well as shed off of tacklers to get to the ball carrier have impressed many colleges with Monceaux receiving offers from Grinnell College and Eureka College. Entering his senior season with two college offers, Wyatt Monceaux is looking forward to showing college coaches what he can do not only at this year's bowl game, but throughout the 2026 season.

"Colleges should recruit me because my grades are at a 3.7 GPA. I am always determined to get better. If you tell me something, I am going to get it done and I am going to show up." -Lake Arthur LB Wyatt Monceaux

Bunkie High School (Bunkie, LA) DE/OLB Mitchell Couvillion is the fifth player to commit to play in the 2026 Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game, which will take place at Louisiana Christian University in Pineville, Louisiana on Wednesday, December 30th.

The Panthers have been known to produce a lot of great Gridiron Football All-Americans including QB Dillon Compton (Southern) and RB Zion Lee (Navy).

"It's exciting. It's almost like carrying on the tradition because the past three years, we've had people play in it. It's just really exciting for me to get to play in the bowl game this year." -Bunkie DE Mitchell Couvillion

The 6'3, 190 pound pass rusher is the next on the list after having a great camp performance at Breau Bridge High School earlier this offseason with a 4.91/40, a 4.41 shuttle, and a 9'6 broad jump.
