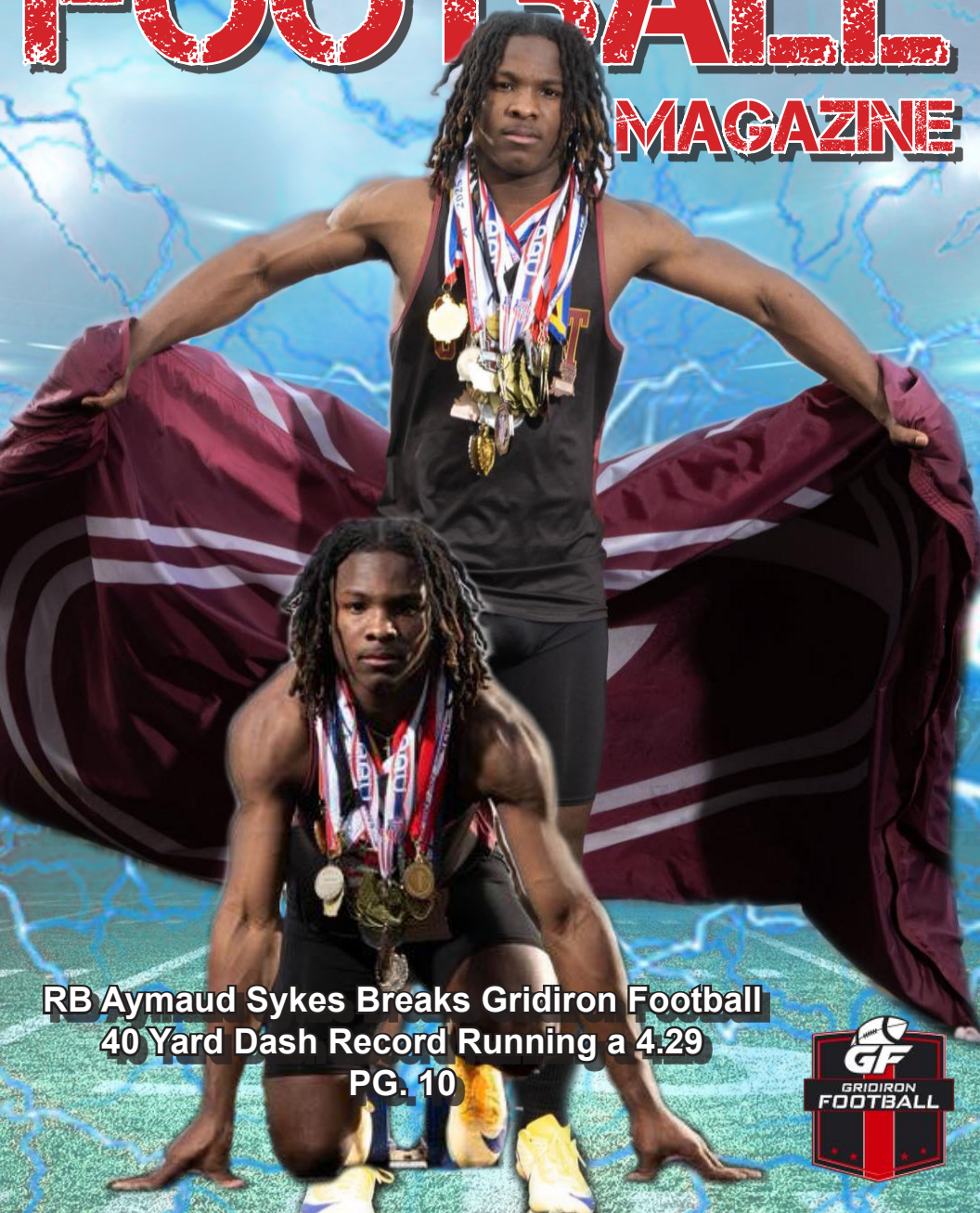

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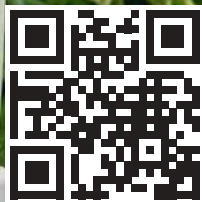
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TE William Hawkins **St. Thomas More (Lafayette, LA)**

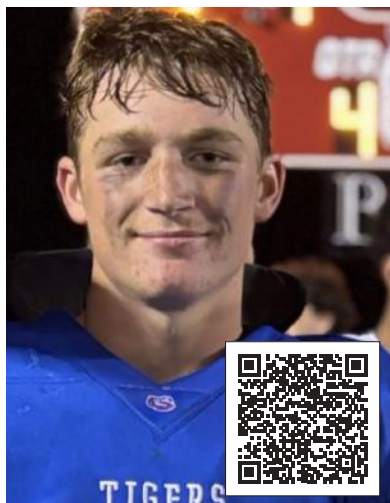

North Iberville Duo Receives 2026 Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game Invites!

This is the first year in which players from the first ever Gridiron Football Junior High All-American Bowl Game back in 2022 are now eligible to play in the 2026 Gridiron Football Senior All-American Bowl Game. Two North Iberville Bears that were a big part of that first junior high bowl game back at Orange Beach, Alabama received their invitations to play in the senior All-American Bowl Game last month at our Gridiron Football office. Those two players are WR Bra'jon "BJ" Melancon and RB Jeremy Favorite.

Bra'jon "BJ" Melancon:

Bra'jon Melancon is the first player to receive his official invite. At 6'2, 165 pounds, this Bear star athlete has been a rising star and one of the top players for the 2027 class. As a two time 1st Team All-District selection, Melancon had a 1st Team All-State campaign in 2025 with five interceptions and 11 PBUs on defense to go along with 23 touchdowns on offense. After leading the Bears to 19 wins the last two seasons, he is hoping for even more his senior season.

"The whole year ahead of me, I just want to get bigger, faster, stronger, and continue striving to play at the college level. Obviously, the goal is always going to be a state championship. We have been striving hard for that the last two years."

His stock has been rising this offseason as he has picked up multiple DI offers including from New Mexico, South Alabama, McNeese State, Memphis, Tulane, and UCF.

"The University of Houston, UL, Tulane, LSU, and UCF have been some of the schools that have been really pushing right now. Everybody has been telling me the same thing. They want me to get in front of the head coach. Everybody's trying to figure out what I am. Am I a receiver? Am I a defensive back? Some coaches think I am just an athlete and a return guy, but wherever I get on the field, I feel like I can excel there."

LSU cornerbacks coach Corey Raymond has shown a lot of interest in the Maringouin prod-

uct as Melancon fits the mold of what Raymond wants in his defensive backs.

"Obviously, he is one of the best defensive back coaches out there in the country to learn from. The conversation has been cleaning up my technique. He is very technique oriented. He loves that I'm an athlete playing multiple sports. He is trying to get me on campus, get me in camp in front of more coaches and we will move on from there."

Bra'jon Melancon received the first offer to this year's bowl game not only because of the success he has on the football field, but how Gridiron Football has been there for him since the beginning. Players from the first ever junior high All-American Bowl Game are now eligible to be invited for the Senior All-American Bowl Game and for Melancon, this invite really comes full circle.

"It's great. It was amazing to go and compete against other kids even though I was only in 8th grade and see where I was at and see where I needed to work on. It was such a great experience also being able to watch the senior guys compete. Back then, I was kind of scared. They were hitting the heck out of each other. I didn't think that I was signing up for that, but it was great. It was an overall great experience. Great coaching staff, great people. I kept hearing people say, 'Pick up gold nuggets. Just pick up gold nuggets.' I didn't understand what it meant back then, but every coach is dropping gems and you have to be a sponge."

Jeremy Favorite:

Another offensive star for the North Iberville Bears also received an invite to the 2026 Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game and that is running back Jeremy Favorite.

At 5'7, 180 pounds, Favorite is one of the most underrated running backs in the state of Louisiana that is coming off a great junior campaign in which he ran for 813 yards and 21 touchdowns on 145 carries. The 2nd Team All-State running back was pleased by his performance last season.



"I would give myself an A after last season but I always can improve. I can get better at ball carrying skills and blocking."

Favorite has impressive ability as he has 4.4/40 speed and also set a school record with a 500 pound squat max showcasing both power and quickness.

"I'm really elusive and can really make you miss. I can run over you if I need to even though I don't do it a lot. My teammates compare me to Jahmyr Gibbs because he is very elusive and fast."

While his counterpart Bra'jon Melancon has received buzz in recruiting by getting multiple offers, Favorite is trying to get his name out there as he is searching for his first offer.

"The recruiting process has been kind of quiet. I sent a lot of my film out. I have a camp invite from Louisiana Tech. I'm going to that, show myself, and get some more exposure to a lot of the coaches out there."

What will help Favorite get his name out there even more is playing in the 2026 Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game. For the North Iberville playmaking running back, this has been a moment he has been waiting for since his 8th grade year in which he played in the 2022 Gridiron Football Junior High All-American Bowl Game.

"I've been waiting for five years for this. It's

been a long time. I remember in eighth grade, I had the first touchdown in the bowl game. I loved Orange Beach and it was a great experience. I never did morning practices before so that was pretty cool. It was cold and I remember that. I loved that game. It was a great game. Getting to play in the senior game is going to be a fun experience."

From scoring the first touchdown in the history of the junior high All-American Bowl Game to getting an invite for the senior bowl game, Jeremy Favorite is excited about the opportunity to perhaps make even more history at the end of the year.

Once again, the Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game will be held at Louisiana Christian University in Pineville, Louisiana on December 30th. 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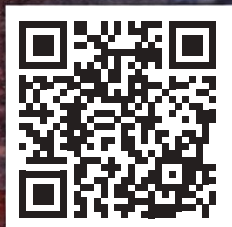
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Grant High School RB Aymaud Sykes Runs Blistering 4.29/40 At Gridiron Football Elite Camp

This past Saturday, Grant High School star 2027 running back Aymaud Sykes shocked everyone at Breau Bridge High School with the fastest recorded time ever at a Gridiron Football Elite Camp with an official 4.29/40 time which was timed by former Southeastern and LSU coach Andy Bryson. It was a big surprise to everyone even Sykes himself when he was told his 40 time at the camp.

"I was surprised by the time I ran because it was the fastest time that I ever ran. I wanted to go out there and show coaches what I can do and I feel like I did that today."

Just to show that the first time was not a fluke, he followed it up with an impressive 4.35/40 time. To put that in comparison on how impressive Sykes' run was, it would have made him the fourth fastest player in the 2026 NFL combine behind Brenen Thompson (Mississippi State), Lorenzo Styles Jr. (Ohio State), and Zavion Thomas (LSU).

Not only did Sykes impress in the 40, but he also had a quick 4.15 shuttle time and was tearing it up in 1v1 and 7v7 competition. His standout performance earned him an invite to play in the 2026 Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game, which will take place at Louisiana Christian University on Wednesday, December 30th. Grant High School has produced plenty of players that have participated in the bowl game over the years and Sykes is excited that he can be the next one.

"I really enjoyed the camp. It's a big deal to get invited to the bowl game. I mean everybody at Grant really wants to go to it. We have had at least three or four play in it the last couple of years, so it means a lot to me. I am really excited about the opportunity and ready to show my talents."

Sykes, who is one of the top running backs in the state of Louisiana entering the 2026 season, has plenty of talents as a multisport athlete with a 3.3 GPA. Sykes' 4.29 time is no coincidence as he is a standout track athlete that finished third in the state in the 100 meters as a sophomore and fifth in the state in the 200 meters.

"Track helps by keeping me in shape and helping me develop more and it gets me faster."

As crazy as it sounds, running under a 4.3/40 is actually not the most impressive feat that Sykes has accomplished in his prep career at this point. Coming off an incredible junior season in which he ran for 2,188 yards and 35 touchdowns while averaging 11 yards per carry, it was highlighted by an individual performance for the ages. In a 76-50 season opening win against Montgomery, Sykes had 420 yards and 10 touchdowns in one game. Those numbers are a single game LHSAA record and also earns him a spot in the NFHS record books.

"I was very shocked that I scored that many touchdowns and ran for that many yards, but it was my offensive line that led me to putting up great numbers."



As the saying goes, "Speed Kills", but it is not just speed that makes Sykes stand out at the running back position.

"I feel like some of my attributes are my vision, acceleration, and breakaway ability. I can always improve on my game, but I want to improve on my pad level." Despite posting gaudy numbers last year, Sykes wants even more for his senior season as his goals are to run for 4,000 yards this season.

"I want to have more rushing yards this season and I want to continue to develop more as an individual and team player."

While the record setting two sport star is working on watching film to critique his game, it has been an encouraging start to the offseason for him as he not only impressed at the Gridiron Football Camp, but has received offers from McNeese State, Grambling, and Tulane.

"It has been great conversations, and I love both because they are really good programs."

Aymaud Sykes' aspirations are to play football and run track at the next level, but already with a stacked resume heading into his senior year, it is pretty scary knowing that this is only the beginning for the Grant star.

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2026 Gridiron Football Elite Camp Series: February Recap!

Through the first month and first two camps of the 2026 Gridiron Football Elite Camp Series, there has been a lot of action as the offseason is off to a hot start after productive camps at Live Oak High School and Breaux Bridge High School during the month of February. Here is a brief recap of the top numbers and performances from both camps.

At our first Elite Camp of the offseason at Live Oak High School, 40 players participated in the event. Each player got the chance to get interviewed by one of our writers Charles Fleicher while also getting their measurables and times for the 40, shuttle, and broad jump. Albany High School 2027 DB Jayden Lapine had the fastest 40 of the camp with a 4.56 and the fastest shuttle with a 4.31 time while Parkview Baptist 2027 DB Marvin Dixon had the longest broad jump with a 9'5. While everybody got to learn special techniques with their position groups, they also got the chance to compete each other. Offensive and defensive linemen competed against each other in the trench war and the popular tire pull. Meanwhile, during 7v7 action, East Ascension High School 2027 WR Jeremyah Merriwether was the standout making catch after catch no matter who was at quarterback during 1v1s and 7v7s. Merriwether had two leaping grabs including one in which he went up and snatched a ball over the middle of the field from a rifling pass by Zachary High School 2028 QB Willie Johnson III. While Merriwether was making plays on offense, the defense had their fair share of plays with defensive backs Cade Hebert (Prairieville), Dixon, Scott Brumfield (Dutchtown), and Lapine getting interceptions during the competition.

At the end of the camp, six players received invites to play in the Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game. Most of them were defensive backs as Hebert, Dixon, and Denham Springs CB Jaydn Washington received invites. Because of his impressive performance as a pass catcher, Merriwether received an invite to the bowl game as well. In the trenches, during the OL vs. DL drills, there was one defensive lineman that really stood out and that was Prairieville High School DE Daniel Williams, who impressed with his quickness off the snap and his length. He along with Madison Prep 2027 DL Rocco Duhon received invites to the bowl game.

There were also three underclassmen that were named top performers of the camp, and they were QB Willie Johnson III, who showed off his strong arm and ability to throw the ball in tight windows, Northeast High School 2029 RB Jayden Jones, who had one of the nicest plays of the day with a finger catching pass for a touchdown, and then, finally, Live Oak High School 2028 OL Daston McGee, who showed some potential with his 6'3, 280 pound frame. It was a great first start to the camp series and we would like to thank Live Oak High School and their coaches for their help and support.

Although not one of the bigger turnouts Gridiron Football has had at a camp, the sure quality of talent did shine at Breaux Bridge High School at the end of February. Perhaps, the biggest shockwave happened at the beginning of the camp as Grant High School 2027 RB Aymaud Sykes made the quickest 40 yard dash in the history of the series with a 4.29/40 timed by our very own Andy Bryson. To show that the first time was not a fluke, he then followed it up by a very quick in its own right a 4.35/40 time.

During 7v7 action, both quarterbacks St. Thomas More High School 2028 QB Mark Guthrie and Albany High School 2027 QB Jake Milton got plenty of reps during the session. While the previous camp at Live Oak was highlighted by the defense even though there were two interceptions by Comeaux High School 2027 LB Alexander Satchell and Albany High School 2027 LB Kaleb Smith-Hiley, this one was more highlighted by the offense. Guthrie got it started with a long touchdown pass to his teammate William Hawkins from St. Thomas More. He then threw another touchdown pass to Acadiana Renaissance RB Ayden Louis, who took a short pass and outran everybody else to the pylon for a score. The speedy Sykes also showed his ability to take a short pass and take it for six on multiple occasions during the 7v7 session. Perhaps, the best throw of the day also went to Guthrie who threw it right on the money towards the front end zone pylon into the arms of Louis, who got a foot in for a touchdown. Milton had a nice touchdown dime himself as he threw it past a couple of bodies in heavy traffic into the arms of Comeaux High School 2028 RB/WR Torrin Ledet for a score.

A lot of 2027 prospects impressed at the camp and earned invites to the Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game along the way. Working in the trenches, Notre Dame High School OL Scott Sibley and St. Martinville High School OL Samuel Coleman had great outings on their way to getting an invite along with Episcopal High School DL Chandler Amacker and Bunkie High School DE Mitchell Couvillion, who both showed quickness and great leverage during 1v1 drills. Sibley and Kaplan High School 2028 OL Carter Hebert had some tough battles against each other in one of the more entertaining tire pulls that you will see as well.

In all, counting the four linemen, 10 prospects received invites to the Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game with other 2027 prospects being on our radar for the bowl game along the way. Sykes, Louis, St. Amant High School WR/DB Cedrick Jones Jr., St. Thomas More LB Tristan Klock, who was a standout throughout the day, and Albany teammates Kaleb Smith-Hiley and Live Oak camp standout Jayden Lapine were the other players to receive bowl game invites that day.
