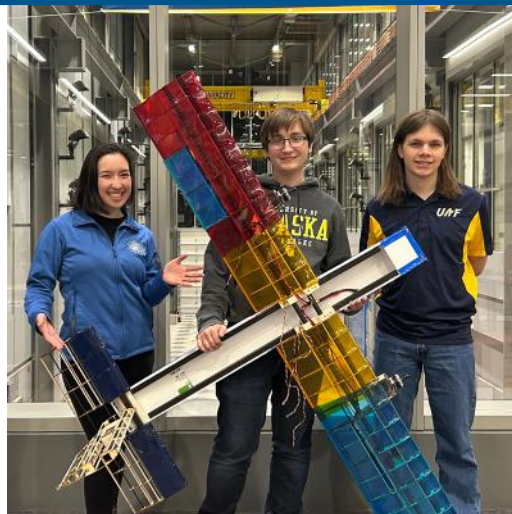
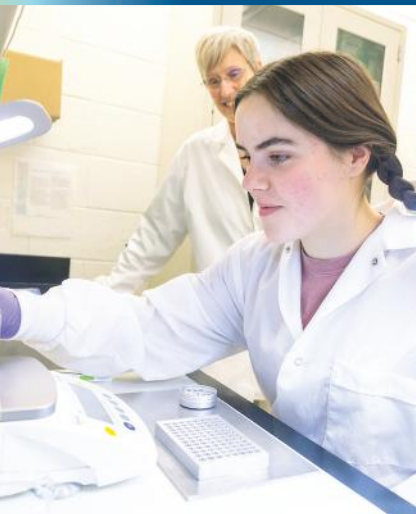

With **Alaska Unlocked**, all students who attend the University of Alaska Fairbanks starting in fall 2027 will automatically receive the in-state tuition rate, regardless of where they're coming from. There are no additional requirements or applications — when you enroll at UAF, you'll pay at the Alaska resident tuition rate.

When you apply to UAF, you're automatically considered for the **Nanook Pledge Scholarship**. This merit-based scholarship gives you four years of predictable financial assistance, with awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$4,000 per year.

Even with UAF's low tuition, everyone can use help paying for college. Make UAF work for you and your future through grants, scholarships, student jobs, work-study and loans. First-year students receive grants or scholarships averaging \$12,625 per year.

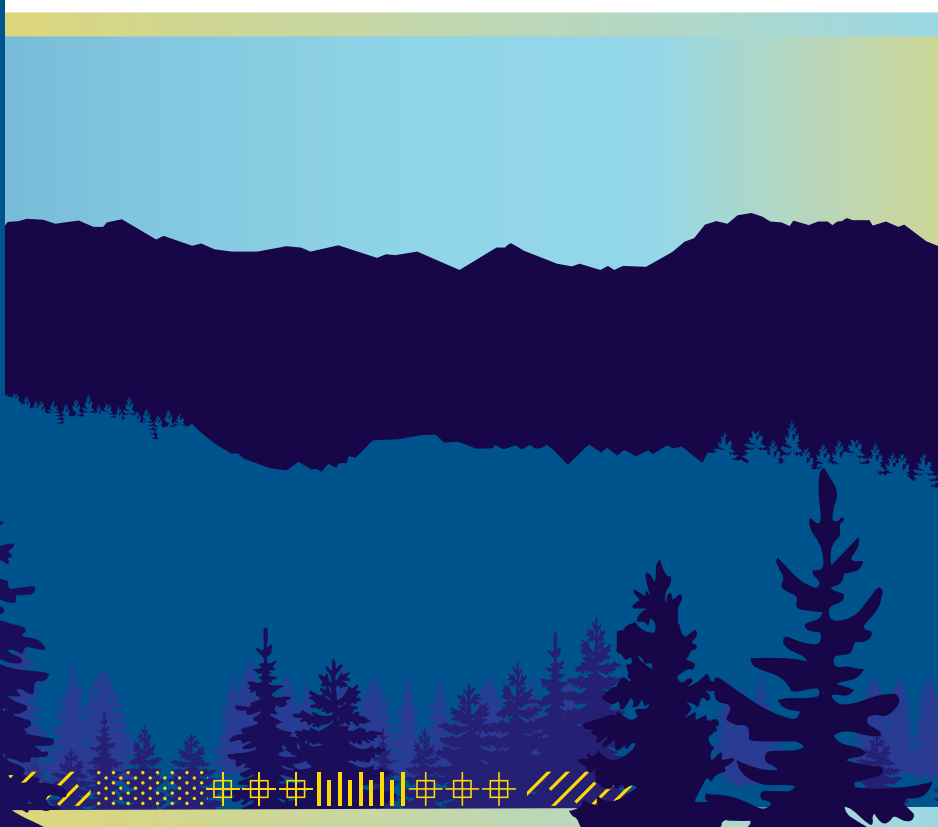
