Steels are South Yorkshire's only remaining representatives in this season's Emirates FA Cup as they travel to Redcar Athletic in Saturday's First Round Qualifying tie.

Jordan Lemon's side face opponents who have made an outstanding start to the campaign. Redcar are unbeaten after their opening eight Northern Premier League Premier Division matches, collecting five wins and three



draws while scoring 15 goals and conceding just four.

Their recent run includes victories over Lancaster City, Warrington Rylands, FC United of Manchester and Stockton Town, underlining why they are among the early pace-setters in the Premier Division following promotion.

Stocksbridge head into the tie looking to build on Monday's goalless draw at Silsden. The Steels are still seeking their first league win of the season in the Northern Premier League East Division, but the point in West Yorkshire ended a run of three

successive league defeats.

The visitors secured their place in the First Round Qualifying with a 1-0 victory over Cheadle Town in the Preliminary Round, a result which kept their FA Cup campaign alive despite their difficult start in the league.

Saturday's match is believed to be the first competitive meeting between the clubs.

There is also a division separating the sides, with Redcar competing in the Premier Division and Stocksbridge playing in the East Division. Redcar's strong early-season form makes them favourites on paper, but the Steels will hope their cup run can continue against one of the North East's form teams.

Victory would send the winners into the Second Round Qualifying and a step closer to the competition's later stages.

HALLAM READY FOR RUNCORN RETURN

Hallam will attempt to stop Runcorn Linnets from claiming a second successive South Yorkshire scalp after the clubs were paired together in the FA Trophy Second Qualifying Round.

The Countrymen earned their place in the draw with a dramatic penalty shoot-out victory over Mossley on Saturday and have been rewarded with a home tie at Sandygate.

Runcorn arrive back in Sheffield having already

ended the FA Trophy hopes of Stocksbridge Park Steels. The Cheshire club produced an impressive performance to eliminate Jordan Lemon's side and now face another trip across the Pennines in search of further progress.

That gives Hallam an added incentive, with the Countrymen looking to succeed where their South Yorkshire neighbours fell short.

The tie also presents Hallam with the opportunity to build on one of their best results of the season. Their vic-

tory over Mossley provided a welcome boost after a difficult opening to the campaign and ensured continued involvement in one of non-league football's most prestigious knockout competitions.

While Runcorn will travel with confidence following their success at Stocksbridge, Hallam can take encouragement from having home advantage at Sandygate, where a sizeable crowd is expected for a tie that has quickly become one of the most attractive in the regional draw.

CUP DRAW HANDS HALLAM AND STEELS TESTS



Hallam and Stocksbridge Park Steels have both been handed potentially difficult away ties after the draw for the second round of the Sheffield & Hallamshire CFA Senior Cup was made.

While holders Worksop Town will be expected to progress from

a home tie against Central Midlands Alliance League side Burngreave United, two of the competition's most intriguing contests involve clubs currently enduring difficult starts to the campaign.

Hallam travel to Dearne & District knowing they will face a stern examination despite the hosts playing a division below them. The Sandygate side have found victories hard to come by in the early weeks of the season, while Dearne have started brightly after their promotion to the NCEL Premier Division

and will see the visit of higher-ranked opposition as a major opportunity.

Stocksbridge Park Steels also face an awkward assignment at Worsbrough Bridge Athletic. Jordan Lemon's side have struggled to build momentum so far this season and now come up against a club still carrying confidence from reaching last season's Senior Cup final. Worsbrough have also made an encouraging start to the new campaign and will fancy their chances of causing an upset on home soil.

Elsewhere, Sheffield FC have been drawn at home to Maltby Main in an all-South Yorkshire clash, while Parkgate's reward for reaching the second round is a home

meeting with fellow NCEL Premier Division side Penistone Church.

Denaby Main and Rossington Main will meet in another local derby, guaranteeing one of the Doncaster area's clubs a place in the next round, while Handsworth host Doncaster City.

Worksop Town begin the defence of the trophy against Burngreave United, while Emley face a trip to Brodsworth Main as they continue their latest bid for county cup success.

Barnsley FC Under-21s travel to Swinton Athletic and Sheffield Wednesday's Under-23 Development side have been paired with Armthorpe Welfare.

From Montagu To The Champions League

Three years ago, Manasse "Manny" Kianga was playing Sunday League football in Doncaster and featuring in the Montagu Cup.

Now he is preparing to take on Paris Saint-Germain, Inter Milan and Roma in the UEFA Champions League.

The remarkable rise of the former Rossington Main forward has become one of the most extraordinary football stories to emerge from South Yorkshire in recent years.

Kianga's journey has been highlighted by Rossington Main (issue 74, p2) following his role in helping Slovak champions Slovan Bratislava qualify for the Champions League league phase. The striker scored a vital winning goal in the qualifying rounds before Slovan secured their place among Europe's elite.

For those involved in local football, however, his story makes his rise all the more remarkable.

In the 2023-24 season, Kianga appeared in the Montagu Cup for Scawthorpe Athletic,

featuring in a Round of 16 defeat against AFP Pewter Pot. At the time he was playing in the Doncaster Sunday League, far removed from the glamour and riches of Europe's premier club competition.

Born in South Africa, Kianga moved to England with his family around 2016 and spent time in non-league football with clubs including Worksop Town, Grantham Town, Sheffield FC and Rossington Main.

His route into the professional game was far from straightforward. Despite attracting interest from professional clubs, visa issues limited his opportunities and left his future in England uncertain.

A turning point came in September 2025 when he made the move from Rossington Main to Slovak third-tier side Lokomotiva Kosice. Just five months later he earned a move to Slovak giants Slovan Bratislava.

The progression has been astonishing.

From the ninth tier of English football with

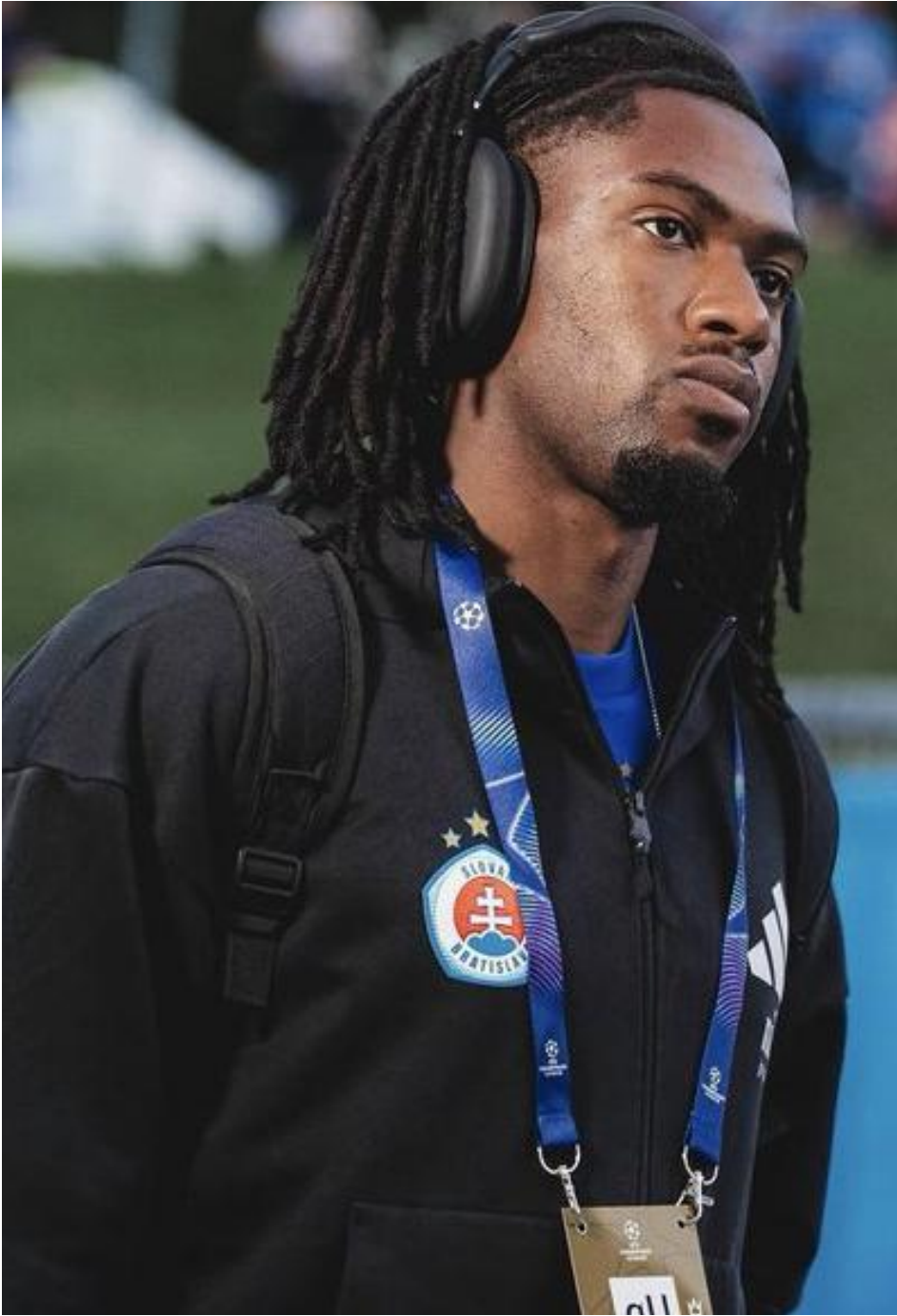
Rossington Main, Kianga is now set to test himself against some of the biggest clubs in European football. Slovan's Champions League campaign will include fixtures against Paris Saint-Germain, Inter Milan, Roma, Real Betis, Lille, Stuttgart, Shakhtar Donetsk and LASK.

For Rossington Main, his success is a source of immense pride. The NCEL Premier Division club recently congratulated their former player after Slovan reached the competition's league phase.

His story is also a reminder of the depth of talent within South Yorkshire football. Few would have predicted that a player appearing in the Montagu Cup in 2023 would be facing the reigning stars of European football just three years later.

Yet that is exactly where Kianga finds himself.

From Scawthorpe Athletic and Rossington Main to the Champions League, it is a football journey unlike any other.

Steels Finally Find Some Breathing Space

It's weird to be quite pleased with a 0-0 draw. But sometimes, a bit of peace and quiet is needed.

On Saturday, Stocksbridge fell out of the FA Trophy in possibly the most traumatic way they could have. After doing well against a Runcorn Linnets side that were fourth in the NPL West, things took a very positive turn. A corner was whipped in and Finlay Dyer, who had come on as a substitute, headed towards goal. Calvin Hare made a brilliant save, but it fell back to Dyer who looped the ball back into the net at the second attempt.

So as the game approached its end, it looked like the Steels were going to claim their most impressive win of the season against a Runcorn side who last year made the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup and dumped Bury out of the FA Trophy with a 7-0 win. But no, that's just not the Stocksbridge way.

In the 88th minute when the end started to be in sight, Runcorn finally struck. The initial ball into the box was cleared but only to Connor Day who was able to slam the ball into the bottom corner. The

game was level. Runcorn did appear to take the lead a minute later, but this would become an odd situation. The looped ball in was headed in at the far post by Nick Rushton, but the linesman raised his flag for offside. After protests though, the referee had further discussions with the linesman, and then he indicated a goal. However, the referee then changed his mind again, ruling offside to be the correct decision.

But that was a stay of execution. The initial ball from a free kick into the box was cleared but only to Rushton who was able to slam the ball into the bottom corner. And if you noticed that's basically a copy and paste from a couple of paragraphs up, that's deliberate because it was a copy and paste goal of the first. It would send the Steels out of the FA Trophy.

But the benefit of a bank holiday is that Stocksbridge could bounce back right away. This was with a trip to Silsden, a side that had done ok but not sparkling so far. An opportunity for a win then.

And Stocksbridge certainly had their chances to win the match. Silsden almost have a helping hand, with Tommy Brown in the Cobbeydalers net having to make a diving save to deny a goal

coming off the bottom of his defender Jake Cassidy. Tommy Marshall probably should have scored too when Romario Dunne played the ball into him, but the winger kicked the air rather than the leather. Will Sutton almost had an unlikely long range goal as well, but Brown was equal to that.

In the second half, Stocksbridge had more chances. Josiah Dyer and Tommy Marshall both had similar chances, moving in on the wing and into the box. Both were denied

by Brown. Like most games it seems, the goal wasn't coming.

And in the last ten minutes, Silsden were turning the screw and were being assisted by Stocksbridge giving away daft fouls. That led to a free kick in a perfect position for Luke Brooksbank. He got his effort on target, but Ben Townsend made an impressive diving save to prevent another last minute dagger to the heart. It wasn't a bank holiday to remember, but at least it wasn't two losses.

Trophy Joy Sparks Turning Point

Could the past three days prove to be the moment Hallam's season finally clicked into gear?

After a difficult start to life in the Northern Premier League East Division, there were genuine signs of progress over the Bank Holiday weekend as the Countrymen secured their first victory of the campaign before backing it up with an impressive draw against one of the division's fancied sides.

The positivity started on Saturday with a dramatic FA Trophy victory over Mossley.

At one stage Hallam looked to be cruising into the next round. Jesse Omoregbee put the Countrymen ahead before Leon Howarth struck twice to establish a commanding 3-0 lead by half-time.

For a team that had spent much of the opening weeks creating chances without always taking them, the clinical nature of the first-half display was particularly pleasing.

Richard Patterson certainly thought so. "Obviously we're really happy with that," he said. "I thought first half we were tremendous, 3-0 at half-time.

"I think to a man, the work-rate, the togetherness and the desire to win the game.

"On another day, probably 5-6 at half-time."

The only disappointment was that Hallam allowed Mossley back into the contest.

A goal midway through the second half gave the visitors hope before two late strikes completed a remarkable comeback and forced the tie into a penalty shoot-out.

After everything that had gone before, there would have been a few nerves around the ground.

Instead, Hallam showed the composure that had previously deserted them from the spot this season, converting their penalties to secure a place in the next round.

Patterson believes the result could be an

important moment for a group that has often played better than its results suggest.

"Hopefully it's a monkey off the lads' back and then we can hopefully go again," he said.

Danny Patterson felt the victory had been coming.

"It's been coming," he said.

"The 3-0 at half-time, again, that could have happened in two or three games we've played this season.

"So it was good that we took our chances because we looked dangerous every time we went forward."

While pleased with the result, Danny admitted there were still lessons to be learned.

"We should have killed the game off to make it four or five," he said.

"They've scored a good goal and they're a good side.

"We've gone a bit too deep at times.

"But again, we're making endless chances, which is the most encouraging thing.

"And we're getting that togetherness now."

One aspect of the afternoon that particularly pleased the management team was the ability to rotate their squad ahead of Monday's league clash with Matlock Town.

Hallam used 16 players over the course of the contest, ensuring fresh legs would be available just 48 hours later.

Danny was also keen to recognise the supporters who continue to back the side despite a difficult opening few weeks.

"Just a massive shout-out to all the fans that travelled through," he said. "We know it's been a tough start with a new group, but everybody feels that support in there."

If Saturday felt important, Monday's clash with Matlock may have been even more encouraging from a league perspective.

The visitors arrived at Sandygate with a strong squad and lofty ambitions, but Hallam matched them throughout and finished the afternoon wondering how they had not taken all three points.

Matlock struck first before the break, leaving the Countrymen with work to do.

Once again it was Leon Howarth who stepped forward.

His equaliser shortly after half-time sparked Hallam into life and for much of the second period there looked only one team likely to find a winner.

Richard Patterson certainly felt his side deserved it.

"Superb, brilliant, but again just a bit disappointed because we should have won the game," he said.

"They're hanging on at the end.

"We've hit the post, we've gone through, we've had a couple of chances at the end.

"It's 2-1 all day."

The Hallam joint-manager was especially pleased with the commitment shown throughout the side.

"We're getting them positioned to a man every single one and they're absolutely superb for each other," he said.

"They're just working their knackers off for each other. That's all you can ask. If we do that, we'll be fine."

There was further praise for the collective effort.

"From defence through to Leon up front, they just work

their knackers off," he added.

"That's why you make one of the biggest-spending teams hang on for a point. We were the best team second half."

Danny Patterson shared that optimism.

"We've set the standard now," he said.

"You can tell when the players are getting back as well. It's making a big difference. We've got a few more to come back and hopefully the momentum will be going our way now."

That may prove to be the biggest takeaway from the week.

A fortnight ago Hallam were discussing missed chances, narrow defeats and frustration.

Now they have a cup victory, progression in the FA Trophy and a performance against Matlock Town that suggests they are beginning to find their feet.

There are still areas to improve and there will undoubtedly be tougher tests ahead.

But for the first time this season there is a growing feeling that everything is starting to come together.

The results are improving. The confidence is growing.

And Hallam suddenly look like a team capable of turning a difficult start into a very promising campaign.

Bottesford Town maintained their perfect start to the Macron NCEL Premier Division season with a 4-0 victory at Retford FC.

Jack Varley opening the scoring before Owen Vincent netted a second half hat trick to secure a fifth straight win and return the Poachers to the top of the table.

Worsbrough Bridge Athletic briefly led the division following a 5-0 home win over Tadcaster Albion on Friday evening, Charlie Austerfield striking early before second half goals from Lance Friedrich, Lewis Oie'Connor and a brace from Lloyd Smith sealed the result. Dearne & District moved back into second as Jamie Austinie's goal earned a 1-0 win over Albion Sports.

Barton Town beat Frickley Athletic 2-0 through Andy Norfolk and Danny Earl, while Knaresborough Town edged Golcar United 4-3 thanks to Alex Inghamie's stoppage time winner. Penistone Church and Retford United shared a 1-1 draw, Jacob Carter putting the visitors ahead before Jack Cawthorn levelled.

Parkgate and Pickering Town both claimed important wins near the foot of the table. Harry Day scored twice in Parkgate's 2-1 success at Champion, while Souleymane Coulibaly hit a hat trick in Pickeringie's 4-0 victory over struggling Keighley Town. Horbury Town drew 1-1 at Rossington Main where Myron Gibbons scored first for the hosts after 17 minutes with Lucas Smith netting a second half equaliser.

Thackley rescued a dramatic 3-3 draw with Handsworth thanks to two stoppage time goals. Dan McDaid gave Thackley a half time lead but Handsworth seemed destined to take all three points when goals from Jordan Hines (47 mins), Mitch Dunne (61) & Luke Mangham (80) gave the visitors a 3-1 lead. Luke Brooks 94th

minute penalty gave Thackley hope and a goal in the 98th minute scored by Marcel Stephiewski rescued a point for the hosts.

In Division One, Brigg Town stayed top with their seventh straight win, defeating Club Thorne Colliery 5-2 despite seeing their run of six successive clean sheets ended. The sides were level at 2-2 at half time with Marc Newsham and Wilfey Woodham scoring for Club Thorne while Dayle Southwellie's brace drew Brigg level.

Second half strikes from Reece York, Josh Batty & Archie Davidson ensured the points were brought back to Lincolnshire. Field Olympic and Goole AFC both struck six to remain second and third, Olympic beating Crowle Colts with six different scorers and Goole overcoming South Leeds 6-1 in front of an impressive crowd of 510.

Selby Town climbed to fourth as Joe Rawcliffe hit a hat trick in a 4-0 win at Immingham Town. Leeds UFCA beat Armthorpe Welfare 3-1 with two late goals from Kalaab Daniel & Dawud Shendi, while Doncaster City edged Winterton Rangers 2-1 with a goal in each half. Scorers for City were Sam Giles & Danny South.

Ilkley Town recorded their first win of the season, defeating LIV 5-2 with doubles from Matthias Britton and Luke Baldwin. Appleby Frodingham also claimed their first victory, Josh Fraiwald striking late in a 2-1 win at Wombwell Town.

Harrogate Railway Athletic beat Kinsley Boys 3-2, Athersley Recreation came from behind to defeat Wakefield AFC 2-1 with goals from Nathaniel Dyer & Nathan Perks, and Hemsworth Miners Welfare drew 1-1 with Route One Rovers.

Champion's dramatic late show, Barton's efficiency on the road, and a flurry of goals across the Macron NCEL set the tone for the first midweek matches of September.

Albion Sports and Champion produced Tuesday night's most breathless contest, a

seven goal thriller in the Bradford derby. Champion struck first through Ewan Gregson's sixth minute penalty and doubled their advantage just three minutes later when Sonny Whittingham found the net. Lewis Waddington's tidy finish on 15 minutes briefly gave Albion hope before Gregson & Whittingham added a third and a fourth before the break to give the visitors a 4-1 half time lead, leaving Albion with a mountain to climb. Talent Ndlovu converted a 55th minute penalty and the hosts sensed a route back. Joseph Poxon's 90th minute strike made it 3 4, but Champion held on to go home with all three points.

Barton Town continued their strong start with a controlled 2 0 victory at Dearne & District. Danny Earl's composed finish on 13 minutes gave Barton the platform, and Craig King's penalty ten minutes from time ensured

the points were secure. Dearne battled gamely but rarely found a way through Barton's disciplined shape.

Horbury Town were left frustrated after leaders Bottesford Town claimed the points late on to maintain their 100% record in the league. With the game locked at 0 0 heading into the final stages, Clayton Bryant pounced on 81 minutes to give Bottesford a valuable away win. Horbury had shaded the first half but couldn't convert pressure into chances, and Bottesford's patience paid off.

Retford FC and Thackley shared the spoils in a match of two contrasting halves. Retford FC were sharp early, with Iren Wilson finishing confidently on 13 minutes and Bradley Hexall adding a second midway through the half. Thackley regrouped after the interval, Marcel Stephiewski pulling one back on 58 minutes be-

fore levelling seven minutes later. Retford steadied themselves but couldn't find a winner, the 190 strong crowd witnessing a fair 2 2 draw.

In Division One, Goole AFC were edged out by LIV in a tight affair settled by a single moment. After a cagey first half, Eric Onyeka struck on 49 minutes, guiding home the decisive goal. Goole pushed hard in front of a sizeable 345 attendance, but LIV held firm.

Harrogate Railway Athletic slipped to a 2 1 home defeat against Route One Rovers. After a goalless first half, Lucas Stephens gave the visitors the lead on 66 minutes, only for Elliot Holmes to respond a minute later. The game looked set to finish level until Bubacary Conteh Samateh struck in the 90th minute, sealing a dramatic away win.

Wednesday's Premier Division fixture saw Retford United and

Tadcaster Albion play out a goalless draw. Both sides carved half chances but neither found the precision required, leaving the 172 in attendance with a stalemate that nonetheless carried plenty of competitive edge.

Division One rounded off the midweek programme with a six goal contest at South Leeds, where Club Thorne Colliery twice came from behind in an entertaining 3 3 draw. Deven Hannan's 19th minute opener was cancelled out by Mark Ferguson before the interval. Charlie Parker put South Leeds ahead on 50 minutes, but Jackson Yates levelled nine minutes later. Wilfey Woodham's 67th minute strike swung the momentum back Thorne's way, only for Emmanuel Amissah to equalise six minutes from time. Both sides chased a winner but ultimately shared the points.

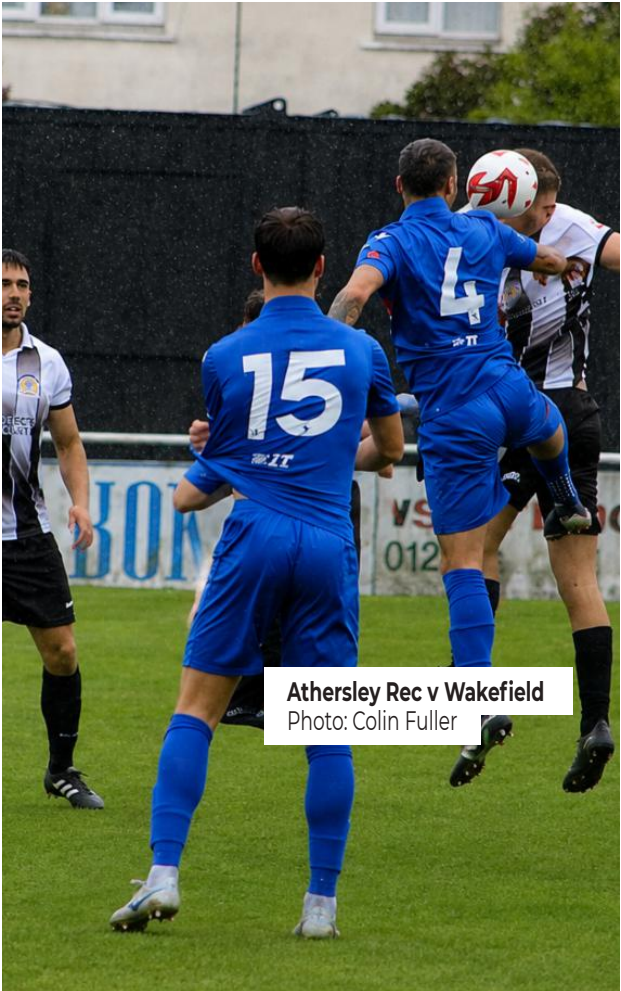

Langdale’s Long Road to National One

Kyle Kennealey speaks with Sheffield RUFC Chairman Andrew Langdale ahead of their first ever season at National League One

September not only marks the start of autumn, but also the National League 1 campaign.

Sheffield RUFC 1st XV are preparing for a historic campaign at this level, following several years of sustained improvements. Chairman Andrew Langdale has overseen this rise, enjoying well over a decade at the helm.

Their most recent promotion wasn’t 12 months of hard work; it was a project that had been gathering pace over a handful of years, culminating in an exceptional year. After winning 24 of their 26 matches, the South Yorkshire outfit will compete at a level never previously seen since the league structure first came into effect.

“It’s phenomenal. We have been building. Three years ago we were third, two years ago we were second, and then last year first, which was the stated target at the start of the season.

“It’s a big leap in standard, and in terms

of the travel, but the fact that we’ve prepared and planned for it over the last three years will make it achievable.”

As alluded to, the step up in divisions means there are more miles to be covered. However, the club have become accustomed to long away trips over the past few years. This coming season, they will be swapping journeys to the north-east for the south-east of England.

“We’ll do two or three overnight stops on Fridays to break up the journeys,” Andrew said. “For the Plymouth game later this month, the boys will leave at 6:30. They’ll stop over in Bristol on the Friday night, play the game on Saturday and then come back.

“There are a couple of long nights. We’ve had Tynedale, Alnwick and Cumbria in the past, so they’ve always been fairly late nights. They’ll enjoy it, have a good coach trip, a few beers.”

Success is very rarely attributed to one person. However, it is more likely that one individual

starts building the momentum, and as such, the rest begin to follow. Andrew was able to name Sheffield RUFC’s very own example of that.

“Three years ago we signed Ryan Burrows, who had just retired from the Championship at Coventry. He again took us to another level with that level of professionalism. Then last year, once the wheel starts turning, people join you because they want to play.

“Ants (Anthony Posa) was a huge factor in that. It was the offensive style of rugby and his extensive experience with the Yorkshire U20s, which he did for over 12 years, winning a lot of times at Twickenham as well.

“The boys that have played for him in the past know the style of rugby; they all want to play for Ants. So now you’ve got lads who are coming up and saying, ‘I want to play for Sheffield rugby’.”

Going into unknown territory brings its own unique qualms, and



means that they may need to venture into the unknown this season. However, promotion into a higher division unlocks a new calibre of players that they can sign. However, it feels like the project remains very similar to how Sheffield RUFC have got to this point.

“We’ve only ever recruited twice from leagues above that we’re in,” Andrew added. “It’s very much the story it’s been for the last three years: Ant’s coaching and bringing the players on in an environment where there are one or two senior pros.

“There’s now the continual presence of Dom Parsons, and there’s Zak Poole that we signed two years ago; he was a cap-

tain at Rotherham. So that was a real blessing and a boost for us. But he’d seen it all and done it all and did it again with us.”

Andrew is under no illusions about the challenge that lies ahead. He is fully aware that they’re a small fish in a big pond, but it’s about laying the foundations once more, before trying to continue their upward trajectory.

“Just surviving in that league will be fabulous. Then it’s just building steadily again. I’ve been chairman for 15 years, and we were in Yorkshire One. We’ve had several promotions, one or two relegations when we went a bit too quickly.

“When we went up to

National 3 North, as it was then, and now National 2 North, where the aim was to consolidate and build. We did that. So it’s the first time that with Ants, when we got promoted into that level 4, that we actually stayed up and built on it. We’ve earned the right to have a crack at the level above.

“I think we’ll be dangerous at home. On the road, we’ve got a lot of lessons, and that’s when you’ll find your teammate next to you. A few hard tackles or a missed tackle, then they’ll show the team spirit they’ve got.

“They are all in it for each other.”

Those final eight words might just be what keeps Sheffield RUFC in this division this season.

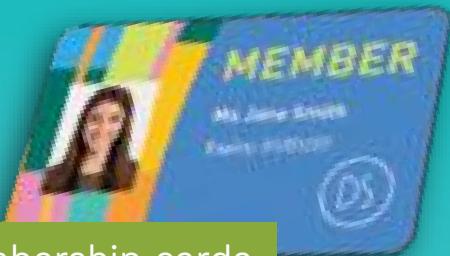
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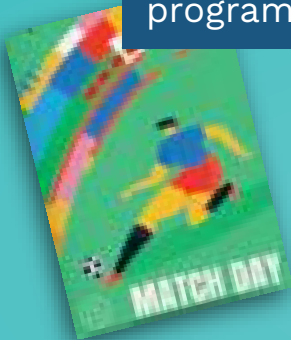
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2nds to 115-9 before the abandonment at Queen Street.

Sheffield Stars riders had five podium places from the bank holiday weekends racing for the British Individual Championships.

The one gold medal win was from Laura Watson, who defended her Women's Over 30's title. Laura won with a perfect score of 16 points from four races, six points clear of the silver position.

Oliver Banyard won silver in the Open Under 16 Final, after scoring 19 points and forcing a gold medal run-off. Oliver was drawn with the difficult outside grid position for the run-off, despite a herculean effort he ultimately had to settle for second place. A highlight for Oliver was a last ditch 20 metre sprint that took him past the current under 16 world champion for a vital three points in his third race.

Sheffield's other three silver medals were all won by Lacey Ackroyd, the only rider to be on the podium three times over the weekend. Lacey was beaten by the same rider in the Under

16 and Under 18 Girls events.

In the Women's Open Final, she scored 17 points (which included a defeat over the eventual champion), to put her in a three way run-off for the Silver medal. The run-off saw her beat the current World Champion (and three time British Champion) to make it three silver medals and gain the moniker 'The Silver Machine'.

Sheffield's other two riders in the Women's Final suffered falls which restricted their scoring. Lizzie Rigley won three of her remaining four races to score 15 points and a fifth place finish. Laura Watson scored 12 points to finish 9th.

Oliver Banyard, at 15, was the youngest rider to make the final as a reserve. This had been achieved by scoring 13 points in his semi-final (which included a race win over the current Men's World Champion). Oliver got one race, from which he scored three points with a second place.

Will Banyard (Oliver's dad) finished fourth in the Over 50's final, after losing in a three way run-off for the Bronze medal.
