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Reflections on our first year

Sealand Theatre Inc. has achieved a great deal in just over a year since its inception in August 2015 and more exciting projects and new youthful cast members are in the wings for 2017-8! The theatre has been bold in its choices of events, as well as inclusive of a range of ages and abilities with 7 – 70 year olds performing and working behind-the-scenes. In 2017-8, Sealand Theatre will

produce two Alice in Wonderland-style events for Festival Fleurieu as well as developing another new play, entitled *Shakespeare in Sequins* (or possibly *Shakespeare's Secret*), drawing on a little known story about the Shakespearean cannon.

In the last year, Sealand Theatre has produced the hugely popular *Honey Sweethearts* cabaret show with vocalist Judith Sweetman and pianist Jillian Langford; the one-act play *A Conversation with Harold Pinter* (with Terence McEwen* as Harry, Peter Gates as Dicky and Kathryn Pentecost as the waitress); the *Pinery Bushfire Fundraiser* (which assisted two young people who had lost everything in the fires); *Songs of the Sea* for the lavish *Stone Ground* event at Leonards Mill as part of SA History Festival, and the cast have appeared on Ch 7 TV news in Ron Kandelaars' segment about the Second Valley history trail. The most recent show (held at Club Fleurieu) was *Promises, Promises* which highlighted the talents of local musicians and comedians in a show designed to cheer the audience up mid-winter after the lengthy 2016 election campaign.

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Most recently, Pentecost has developed a film version of *Songs of the Sea* which is being produced at Rapid Bay, and features the romance between Colonel Light (Geoff Bromilow) and Maria Gandy (Ebony Leverington). Gandy came to South Australia with Light on *The Rapid* and they spent several days together at Rapid Bay, when it was in pristine condition before mining forever altered the natural landscape. Gandy was a generation younger than Light and she never married Light as his second wife refused to divorce him. Sadly, Light died in his early 50s. Subsequently, Gandy married Dr George Mayo and had several children but she also died a few years later because of the tuberculosis she had contracted from Light. Light's importance as the first Surveyor-General in South Australia can't be overestimated and the Yankalilla District Council area – Rapid Bay in particular – is certainly significant in the story of SA's settler foundations. 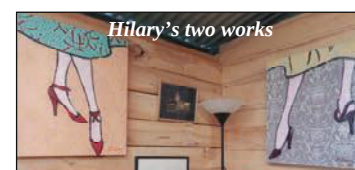

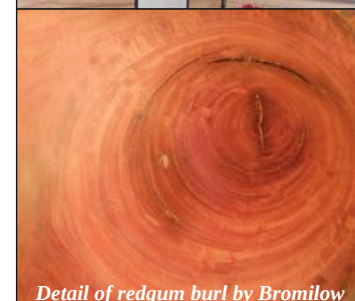

Writing Workshops at The Centre

Dr Kathryn Pentecost, artistic director and playwright of Sealand Theatre Inc. has been conducting a series of (monthly) writing workshops this year at The Centre in Yankalilla. The workshops have introduced participants to creative exercises to increase their confidence and they have been well attended by locals (and people from Adelaide). The workshops are self-contained units that act as inspirational and practical building blocks to assist writers.

Pentecost believes that 'writing is thinking'. 'Too often people see writing as something that can wait for a particular moment of inspiration to strike' she said. 'This may simply be an endless delaying tactic that leads to 'writers' block'. 'Writing is an active process' she insists, 'one where practice fuels both technical skill and creativity'.

Now Pentecost has begun another initiative to give local writers the opportunity to publish, and submissions so far have been substantial and of a high standard. The opportunity is limited to women writers as Pentecost believes that women can be more reticent about publicly exposing their creative efforts, and because her classes seem to have attracted a female following. The project is entitled *Womenwrite* – envisaged initially as four small anthologies of writing, with poetry, short stories, literary critique, illustrations and photography.

Pentecost is now extending the deadline for submissions (1st edition) to 30 November.

Writers need to keep submissions to less than 500 words, and should email with the heading *Womenwrite* to kathrynpentecost@hotmail.com or call 8598.4183 for more details. Also, if you are interested in joining the next series of classes, please email Dr Kathryn Pentecost with the heading *Writing Workshops*. For personal mentoring and manuscript editing, email her with the heading *Mentoring*.

Lastly, Pentecost (who also mentors young writers),

hopes to stimulate the creative juices of the whole community by holding a public launch of the first edition sometime in 2017. Whilst much new writing is published online these days, there is still great pleasure to be had holding an actual hardcopy as you sip your morning coffee or find a cosy corner of a favourite place to follow a good story. For the contributors, there's nothing as special as seeing your work in print and sharing it with others!

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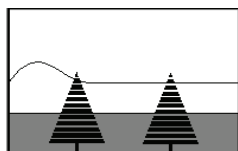
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The Rotary Club of Yankalilla Presents The 9th Annual SHANNONS Yankalilla Cruise - 20 November 2016

Cruisin' Classic Cars, Hot Rods and Rock'n'Roll

Is that time of year again! Dust off your dancing shoes and Cruise on down to the SHANNONS Yankalilla Cruise proudly presented by the Rotary Club of Yankalilla on Sunday 20 November 2016. Yankalilla Memorial Oval is the venue and the Yankalilla Cruise Team has been hard at work organising this event for several months now. It's shaping up to be not just a fabulous day, but a fabulous **weekend** of fun and activity!

The Cruise is designed primarily for Classic Cars, Custom Classic Cars, Hot Rods - anything with a chrome bumper of the pre 1979 era. If you wish to enter your vehicle, there are no entry forms or time limits to park. The idea is for this fabulous event to be accessible for both spectators and enthusiasts alike. The entry fee is only \$15 per vehicle or \$5 per person if you enter without a vehicle (children under 14 free), payable at the Oval gate. Only Classic Cars, Custom Classic Cars and Hot Rods will be allowed to park on the Oval.

The Wild Ones will perform at the Yankalilla Hotel from 8pm until late on **Friday 18th**. On **Saturday 19th** November DJ Jess will be at the oval playing his great selection of music, and there will also be a mini-cruise along the Carrickalinga coastline late in the afternoon (contact Billy Peel for details), followed by *Raunchy* performing at the Yankalilla Hotel (8pm until late). 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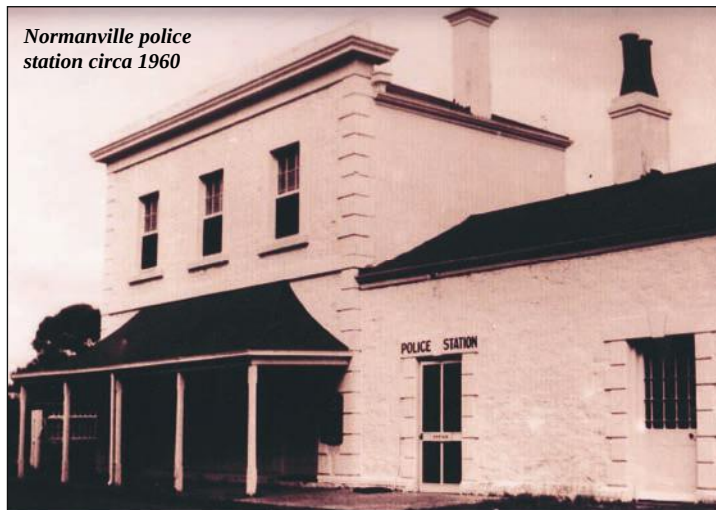

National Award for Deep Creek property

The Sanctuary, on Blowhole Beach Road at Deep Creek, has recently been awarded the 2016 Stayz holiday rental award, in the 'At one with nature' category. The award is voted on by independent judges from 'Out & about with kids' magazine.

This national award is a significant fillip for owners Bethany and Max, who only purchased the property in May this year. "We had not been planning on running a property like this" Bethany said, but after a recent holiday, they reflected on what they had (or had not!) appreciated in the accommodation they'd stayed at. They also daydreamed about their ideal house – a stone house with a mezzanine floor, in a natural bush setting. "When we came back home and saw this rammed-earth property (with a

mezzanine floor!) for sale on the edge of our favourite national park, we fell in love with it straight away."

The couple likes to make sure their guests feel at home; "an extra packet of biscuits in the pantry, or a generous supply of towels may only seem like small gestures, but together they can make a real difference to the comfort of guests." The house has a book and movie library, and a vintage video gaming system keeps the kids (and big kids) entertained on the cold winter nights.

But despite their early success, the couple are not planning to rest on their laurels. Bethany told us that they plan to make significant changes over the next couple of years: "We'd like to make the home more practical for families, while

retaining the character and warmth that our guests appreciate." These character features include the loft bedroom, a large claw-foot bath and a log fire.

The couple also has big plans for the garden of the 4 acre property. There are already a large number of established fruit trees, but they plan to install raised garden beds to provide seasonal vegetables, herbs and berries for guests to enjoy.

In the longer term, the plan is to revegetate more than half the property with local native plants, so that the garden becomes an extension of the adjacent Deep Creek Conservation Park. and even a southern brown bandicoot. We'd love to have even more wildlife visiting The Sanctuary." At the back of the property, a small dam is home to at least three species of native frogs, who can be heard calling most evenings.

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Does the arithmetic defy rhyme or reason?

Nigel Morris, in the October issue, responded to my letter concerning rate hikes, published in that very same issue. Mr Morris says it's difficult to compare one Council to another. He says the average increase in rates this year was 2.7% where our increase was 4.1%. He says the 163% disparity in rates with the other council must be due to 'other factors'. He, of course, has the rate records to find those factors. The simple truth is that in the year 2000 rates across those two councils were at parity.

In the past five years alone our Yankalilla rates have increased by 35%. That's 7% per annum on average and an actual increase of \$850. The comparable increase by the other council was just \$380, less than half. I'm sure we are no orphans in that regard. I also doubt the Yankalilla district's burden has increased over double that of the other council. So a reasonable person would conclude this year's increase is no aberration.

Perhaps Mr Morris might like to give his "cogent justification" to us all via this publication, his chosen method of communication. I'm sure we all cherish our rural environment, fast diminishing as this council

approves three storey height dwellings. But a reasonable person would struggle to find the "cogent justification" Mr Morris refers to. Perhaps its time to raise the "A" word again (amalgamation), if as a district, we have a too small rate base and disproportional overheads.

As a footnote, the empathy of our council gets better. For whatever reason, we did not receive our rates notice this year. Why or how is not important. I rang, and emailed, the council to that effect on 12 September. We received an emailed notice the next day, 13 September and we then paid the whole year's rates on 15 September, noting our council, unlike others, gives no discount for payment in full.

Having sent the notice on the 13 September, our council, that same day, 'reviewed' our rates account and discovered to its surprise, the payment was 12 days overdue. Could the two events be related? Our council then, for good measure, charged interest for those 12 days at a rate of 59% per annum. I think I'll forgo the offer of coffee, I doubt I could afford it.

Glossy Black Cockatoos

Glossy Black Cockatoos will soon begin winging their way across the seas from Kangaroo Island back to the Fleurieu Peninsula – fingers crossed.

The endangered bird hasn't been seen in the area in more than 40 years, but efforts to replant the species' native vegetation around Cape Jervis will hopefully entice it back.

Through the 20 Million Trees project and a Federal Government grant, 70 hectares of revegetation including more than 100,000 plants are the primary focus of efforts.

"There's only around 300 birds left on Kangaroo Island and the birds can live up to 100 years old, so many of these birds aren't in breeding condition," said Corey Jackson, Coast, Estuary & Marine Officer for the Southern Fleurieu Peninsula.

"The decline in numbers came as a result of a lot of clearance after the Second World War and the last birds that were seen regularly around Cape Jervis were seen in the 1970s."

"The stories I've heard is that during the 1970s they were flying across from Kangaroo Island daily to feed, until one day they just stopped flying over and haven't really crossed since."

Rapid Bay Primary School recently assisted in the revegetation works. Students planted hundreds of stems in conjunction with children's television show Totally Wild filming a story about the bird. Each year the school takes part in a revegetation program with the Council.

CEO'S CORNER

After coping a battering in our wet and wild start to Spring, road maintenance and much needed repairs remain at the top of our priority list. We had a comprehensive roads plan in place prior to the storms. I can reassure you this plan is even more significant in the aftermath of the extreme weather.

There is no denying there are a lot of roads in our district needing work. We have brought some road repairs forward, brought in extra resources and will be working weekends and we'll be undertaking other work to make roads safer as we expect – and plan for – more people travelling in the area over coming months. We will be doing initial repairs and patrol grading and then will be returning again in summer to address drainage issues. All roads will be addressed in priority order and we have a big job ahead of us.

As you're aware, the storms caused damage not just to our roads, but also to our beaches. A number of beach access points have been destroyed and dunes have been eroded causing extensive damage. The main access points requiring repair are at Carrickalinga Sands, Pitman's Leap and near the Carrickalinga toilet block. All these are scheduled to be fixed by December. At the October Council meeting funds were allocated to reinstate some of the dune fences that were recently damaged as well as reinstate signage.

With the weather now on the improve, we are also able to get back out there and commence our weed spraying programme. Results from this will soon be seen.

HOODED PLOVERS

Birds of all sorts are flocking to the district this Spring, with the recent addition of a Hooded Plover Display in Normanville.

The display, which was put together by the Normanville Natural Resource Centre and Hoodie Volunteers, is designed to raise awareness about the threatened bird.

There are less than 70 Hooded Plovers on the Fleurieu Peninsula.

The NRM Board also funded an educational sign - one of the new permanent signs installed across the Fleurieu at key breeding sites.

Beachgoers should be aware the breeding season is now underway and the following steps should be taken to help protect the bird:

- Keep dogs on a leash around designated Hooded Plover breeding areas during Spring and Summer
- Don't disrupt dune areas where key breeding sites exist
- Move away quietly when you see Hooded Plovers

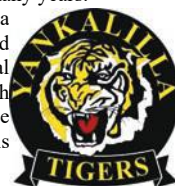

If you are bitten go straight to your nearest doctor with the spider in the jar.

The Normanville Natural Resource Centre and the Yankalilla Show Society presented 'Living with Wildlife'. This included the popular snake pit which housed the poisonous brown, tiger and red bellied black snakes. Various pythons came out and were very sociable. It is a great way for kids to get close to these amazing animals and learn what an important role they play in our environment. Lots of children also created some lovely colourful bags whilst learning about the Hooded Plover. We gave away nearly 200 plants as well as seeds for our younger gardeners.

Love them or hate them snakes are a part of our lives on the Fleurieu. Learning to live with them and respecting their presence in our lives will make it easier for us both.

Snakes are ectothermic. This means they maintain their body heat by absorbing heat from external sources. A snake's body temperature and activity levels are controlled by the surrounding air and ground temperature.

Snakes become inactive during winter when their metabolism slows down and they lie dormant, using almost no energy. In early spring, they emerge and bask in the sun to warm up.

They also gain body heat by lying on warm surfaces (eg. asphalt, concrete and rocks which absorb heat) or under warm surfaces (eg. building materials, such as corrugated roofing iron).

Snakes are often inactive when it is very hot and will seek refuge to avoid overheating.

Spring is the time when snakes become more active and less wary as they go about feeding (to build up body reserves after winter) and breeding.

All snakes are an important part of the natural environment as they reduce populations of some of their prey species, such as rats and mice.

There are many ways to discourage snakes from your property: -

- Do not leave food out for chooks and pets which will encourage rats and mice
- Make sure your compost bin is covered.
- Reduce hiding areas, keep grass low and keep wood piles away from the house
- Remove rubbish
- Store building materials vertically or on racks
- Store boots upside down
- Put water for wildlife away from the house
- Never attempt to catch or kill a snake. They will defend themselves if confronted or threatened. Most snake bites occur when people try to catch or kill a snake. Contact a licensed snake catcher if you wish to have the snake removed from your property. It is



important to keep an eye on the snake from a safe distance until the snake catcher arrives. This will increase the chances of the snake catcher locating and removing the snake from your property.

Weed Of The Month From Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group Guilford Grass (Romulea rosea)

These little weeds grow from small perennial corms. In late autumn they produce smooth, cylindrical, wiry, bright green leaves which are followed until November by the flowers. Each star-shaped flower has its own stem from the base, like the leaves. The short-lived flowers are 6-petalled, pale pink-purple with a short yellow tube at the centre. Plants die off in summer heat, when roots pull the corms further underground to survive the surface heat until the following year. Pigs will eat the corms, but otherwise the plant has no fodder value. It can take

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over a lawn in just a few seasons. This is not really a grass as the common name would suggest; that name is from the fact that heavy infestations occurred around Guilford, WA. The botanical name is from Romulus, one of the founders of Rome...a bit international, given the plant is originally from South Africa!

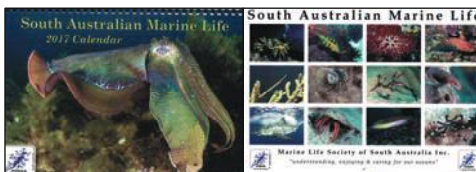

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Yankalilla Ladies Probus

Sept 28 - Our President Jennifer Hill opened the meeting and welcomed us all. The Probus concept was read and birthdays celebrated.

Notices followed regarding the organisation of our birthday lunch which is in November. Future events were announced including a group outing in December to "Singing in the Rain" at the Festival theatre and a mystery play at the January meeting. In addition members were invited to join the Encounter Bay Probus Club for a picnic on October 12th.

Our guest speaker for today was Paul Frost accompanied by his wife Heather. Paul is a member of the Beekeeper's Society of SA and has a wealth of knowledge about the Honey Bee and bee keeping.

Paul's talk focused on the European Honey bee, its history, the benefits to agriculture, to the future of our food industry and our health. Paul also described why bees swarm and how to control swarming. Most importantly he talked about the production of pure honey.

Paul's talk was the most comprehensive account I have ever heard and it answered many questions regarding the how, why and where to keep bees. Paul used a power point presentation which illustrated different types of bees enabling us to identify a honey bee as well as get an understanding of how the hive operates, with the Queen bee, workers and drones.

The European Honey Bee was first brought to Australia in the 1820's on the convict ship 'Esmeralda'. More recently in 2007 an Asian bee was brought by ship to Queensland but this is a smaller bee and not so good for the production of honey. Kangaroo Island is now a sanctuary for the honey bee and there is a research centre enabling scientists to learn more about the many benefits of the honey bee for future generations.

65% of Australian agriculture depends on pollination by the European honey bee, with many industries dependent upon that pollination. Crops vary as to

how much they rely on pollination by bees but industries such as almonds, apples, pears and cherries depend almost totally on bees for their fruit and nut production.

New research has resulted in a report 'Pollination Aware' which calculates and maps where and when bees are needed. In 2006-2007, 20% of registered bee keepers were paid for providing pollination services. Australia has almost 10,000 registered beekeepers operating around 500,000 hives.

As the demand for pollination services increases the bee keeping industry faces threats from exotic pests and diseases. Three of our neighbours, namely New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and Indonesia already have the Varroa mite which weakens the bee's immunity to infections.

Since 2007 Australia has been working to promote research and ultimately protect the honeybee from extinction.

We all thoroughly enjoyed Paul's presentation and the detailed knowledge he shared with us. Afterwards we had

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Keeping Fit: Counter One Arm Row

Actions like reading, driving and computers place our bodies in a position where our shoulders can become rounded towards the front. 'Pulling actions' can encourage the shoulders back into a more neutral position.

finishing near the side of your chest (don't shrug the shoulder).

- Repeat 10-15 times per arm.
- Exhale as you pull the weight towards you.

As always what has been suggested is general information and doesn't take into account an individuals limitations or needs. Seek a medical opinion to see if this exercise is appropriate for you.

The 'One Arm Row', if performed correctly, also helps with shoulder stability and requires your core muscles to actively assist in maintaining form and good posture.

- Stand in front of kitchen bench and place one hand on its edge, (soften with a towel if its a sharp edge), your feet are a shoulder width apart and your back is in a neutral position rather than arched.
- With your free hand take from the counter a full 2 litre milk bottle.
- Allow the 'bottle arm' to hang down towards the ground, before pulling it towards your body with your elbow pointing to your hip and your hand

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Kate Swaffer at ACH Book Group

ACH Group's 4th Tuesday Book Group invited Kate Swaffer to talk about her book: 'What the hell happened to my Brain?'

In June of this year the 4th Tuesday Book group in Yankalilla invited Kate Swaffer to talk about her experiences as a published author. This was done with the knowledge of her extraordinary journey with early onset dementia. Kate replied back within an hour. Using her words, it was a 'fluke' that she was available on the 4th Tuesday of August and she energetically accepted our invitation. We didn't know it then, but we were to all be inspired by her vision and advocacy for communities that are dementia enabling.

Some of what Kate shared with us I have attempted to write here in a few words. I would recommend you read her book to really identify with the insights that she shares. There's a strong chance you will be thinking more intently not just about her experience but how as a community we can support a dementia friendly environment.

One experience that Kate returned to throughout her talk was the discussion that followed her diagnosis. She was effectively told to go home and get her end of life matters in order. She was not expected to continue life as she knew it, that is, working, studying, and raising children. Her question was 'Why should my life have to end?' Kate now advocates globally and encourages many of us to consider that if we are not supporting people with

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dementia to live to their capacity we are taking away a basic human right. A cultural change is needed to support people with dementia to live their lives as who they are and with choices they can feasibly maintain. In Kate's words, we need to normalise [not stigmatise] dementia. Kate went on to share a myriad of experiences highlighting personal grief and discrimination. She spoke with honesty, integrity and with occasional humour. Finally, I have listed what she calls **Gifts of Dementia**: Don't assume people with dementia do not understand; Have higher expectations of people with dementia to assist

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their self esteem; 'Help us find new ways to live our lives.' *Kate Swaffer 23/8/2016*
