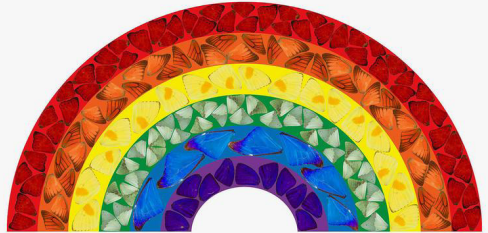

Introduction

The coronavirus crisis has shown us to be a resilient Island, neighbours coming together to help the vulnerable and self-isolating, entrepreneurs turning their business models upside down to serve the community, and now, artists are donating their canvasses to help raise money for the cause.

In the UK the NHS 'Charities Together COVID-19 Urgent Appeal' aims to raise millions to help front-line staff do all they can to save lives in the wake of the coronavirus crisis and internationally famous artist Damien Hirst, a fellow alumni of Goldsmiths College, has created a new rainbow artwork to show his support. The work, titled *Butterfly Rainbow*, is made up of bands of coloured butterfly wings, one of the artist's best known motifs.



A limited edition set of signed prints has also been produced which will be sold with all profits donated to the NHS and the artist has recently said: *"I wanted to do something to pay tribute to the wonderful work NHS staff are doing in hospitals around the country. The rainbow is a sign of hope and I think it is brilliant that parents and children are creating their own version and putting them up in the windows of their homes."*

The British artist Banksy has also revealed his latest tribute to frontline workers which celebrates their super hero status. The drawing which is titled 'Game Changer' is a meter square and is currently on display at Southampton Hospital until September. It will then be auctioned to raise money for NHS charities. It is thought that the drawing could fetch as much as £5m.

Banksy left a note for hospital workers, saying: *"Thanks for all you're doing. I hope this brightens the place up a bit, even if it's only black and white."*



Here in Jersey it has indeed been heartening to see so many windows filled with paintings of rainbows whether they've been displayed in large residential properties or social housing developments. This type of creative artistry has warmly engendered a real sense of community whilst helping to unify households around a common cause.

So it gives me great pride to announce that a group of 21 artists, all with local connections, have come together to help raise funds by donating paintings, sculpture and photography at Private & Public Space. The proceeds from sales are going towards the Bailiff's Covid-19 fund and the Women's Refuge. The exhibition will be accessible by appointment only or via the gallery website where you can view a short film to provide context, a 3D virtual tour of the gallery spaces and this digital exhibition catalogue.

Internationally acclaimed artists such as Emily Allchurch and Jason Martin have joined ranks with well-known resident artists such as Ian Rolls, Nick Romeril, Gina Socrates, Mark Guest and John Paul Kilshaw.

This uplifting exhibition will showcase bright, colourful and upbeat paintings as well as humorous and more serious works. The exhibition also has a distinctly international flavour with works by the Danish photographer Martin Toft, Latvian painter Eliza Anna Reine and the Russian printmaker Yulia Makeyeva all donating beautiful and thought provoking artworks to the cause.

Now that the States have allowed small businesses to re-open we are delighted to invite people to visit the Gallery.

I hope you will find the time to visit the exhibition either online or in person and that most importantly you buy an artwork for your home safe in the knowledge that the proceeds will be ploughed back into the community.

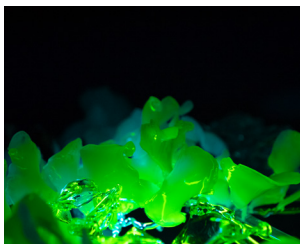

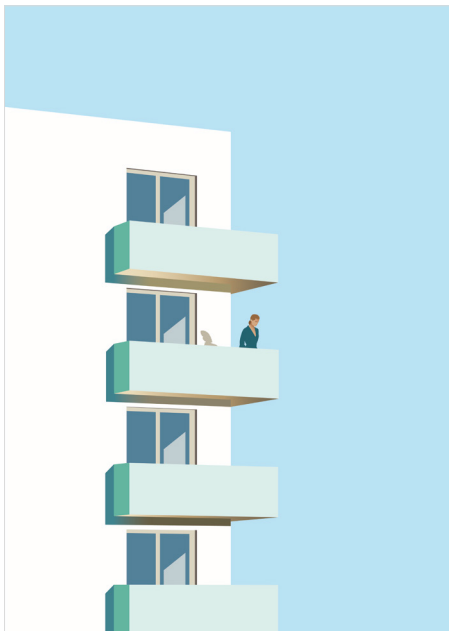

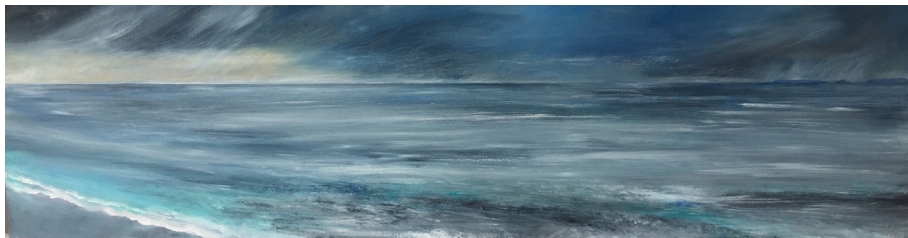
