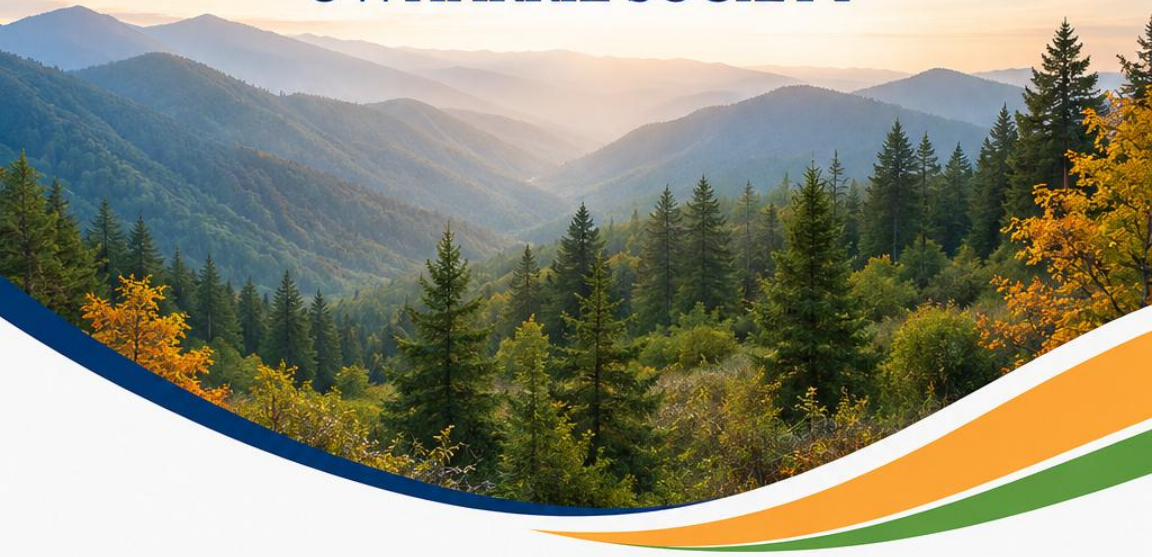

United Way Supports



- Quality childcare and early childhood education
- Essential literacy skills
- After school and summer enrichment opportunities
- College and career readiness
- Family engagement and support

- **Central Boys and Girls Club** offers after school mentoring, homework assistance, tutoring, and technology assistance for more than **200** students, ages 6-18.
- This year, **873** students depended on **CIS Backpack Pals** for food over the weekend. Another **566** received valuable encouragement and support from caring mentors.
- In county-wide **4-H Science and Agriculture** programs, **12,918** students learned to put their **STEM** skills to practical use.
- **Scouting America** helped **197 Local Scouts** learn valuable life skills, leadership, environmental stewardship, and self-reliance.
- The **Partnership for Children** served **384** children, from birth through age 5, with quality child care, school readiness, and early literacy programs.

Workforce Development is a gateway to opportunity.

The **Boys and Girls Club** partners with **Ross Dress for Less** to give teen Club members experience in a real workplace environment. They learn what it means to show up, work with others, and develop a good work ethic.

Club members begin to see themselves as capable, employable, and headed toward successful careers.

United Way Helps People Gain



- Knowledge and skills to manage income and savings
- Skills and education for good-paying jobs that can sustain a family
- Security through home-ownership

- **Christians United Outreach Center Crisis Intervention Services** offered **13,602** people short-term assistance with food, clothing, and safe shelter, and helped with rent, transportation, and utility payments. **CUOC** also offered financial literacy classes to help clients learn to budget and manage their money.
- Guidance and help from **The Salvation Army Financial Crisis Program** helped **25,720** people avoid eviction, or having their water or electrical services disconnected.

CUOC's Emergency Assistance Cleared the Way for Her to be Permanently Employed Again.

Tymesha was a resilient single mother of four and a dedicated personal aide.

When her car insurance and registration lapsed, she lost her job because she had no way to reach her multiple clients.

CUOC's Emergency Assistance covered her past-due insurance and registration fees, and now she's back on the road and can accept her new job offer.

- Healthy foods

- With In-home Care and Minor Home-Repair services from **Regional Consolidated Services**, **109 clients** can continue living safely and independently in their own homes.
- **YMCA scholarships** gave **20** children the gift of experiencing the joy of summer camp.
- Meals, transportation, Medicare Options information and counseling, and respite Adult Day Care services at **Randolph Senior Adults Association** offered a better quality of life to **5,111** people and their families last year.

After losing his beloved wife, a cherished Meals on Wheels participant faced the daunting task of living life alone.

Meals on Wheels continues to assure him of a warm, nutritious meal each day--often the only one he eats.

More than just food, the visits from the volunteers who deliver also bring much needed friendly faces and conversation that brighten his day.

Communities That Are Prepared for Emergencies Can Build a Secure Future



United Way Services Step in With

- Help and hope
- Crisis hotlines and support
- Disaster relief and recovery

- **The American Red Cross Disaster Team** steps in to provide disaster victims with emergency food, shelter, clothing, and medicines, and guide them through the months-long recovery process.
- As well as medical emergency and automobile accident responses, **Ash-Rand Rescue & EMS** personnel are certified in wilderness, swift-water, industrial, and high or low-angle rescue. Their response teams impacted **1,948** people this year.
- **NC211 Crisis Hotline** offers free and confidential local information on emergency counselings, disaster assistance, food health care, insurance, stable housing, employment services, veterans services, and family services.

When Every Second Counts, Ash-Rand Rescue is There.

Ash-Rand arrived to find three victims pinned inside an overturned vehicle on a steep bank.

Together, **Ash-Rand** and the Farmer and Westside Fire Departments stabilized the vehicle, and used winches and hydraulics to safely remove the victims and transfer them on-site to EMS for additional care.

In emergencies like these, community partners working together saves lives.
