A Year of Learning, Discover

GRADE 1 EXPLORED MEXICO

As part of an immersive, interdisciplinary unit of study, Grade 1 students spent several weeks exploring the vibrant geography and rich traditions of Mexico. Their hands-on learning included designing custom maps and flags, studying historic adobe architecture and constructing miniature clay houses, exploring traditional Mexican clothing using paper dolls, and learning about the cultural significance of Día de los Muertos. The unit also featured a tasting of traditional Mexican dishes. To cap off this global exploration, the classes took an exciting field trip to ¡Viva México!, the interactive cultural exhibit at The Magic House.

WEST AFRICAN DANCE & DRUMMING

Forsyth's annual two-week West African dance residency brought rhythm and cultural exploration to campus through an immersive, multidisciplinary collaboration. Led by Diádié Bathily, founder and artistic director of Afriky Lolo, students in Junior-Kindergarten through Grade 6 explored African geography, languages, and cultures while developing their movement skills. The program follows a progressive curriculum: younger students practice fundamental rhythm and syncopation, while Grades 5 and 6 learn faster, more advanced steps. Concurrently, students in Grades 4–6 studied traditional African drumming with Yehalelel Bynum in music classes. This rich unit culminated in vibrant grade-level performances—complete with family participation on the dance floor!

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. ASSEMBLY

Continuing an important Forsyth tradition, students in Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 6 walked together to Graham Chapel at Washington University, where Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. delivered a historic address in 1957, for an all-school assembly honoring his enduring legacy. Each grade level participated in the assembly, with Grade 4 singing “This Little Light of Mine” and Grade 6 sharing their personal dreams for a better world. Head of School Rob Butler closed the assembly program with an inspiring message of hope and civic unity. Eyas students and teachers met on Falcon Field to send everyone off with signs and a special song.

GRADE 6 BROUGHT SHAKESPEARE TO LIFE

Per Forsyth tradition, Grade 6 students took the stage to perform an abridged, three-act production of William Shakespeare's pastoral comedy *As You Like It*. Building on a previous partnership with the St. Louis Shakespeare Festival, Grade 6 expanded their theatrical studies this year through a comprehensive, trimester-long drama residency with professional teaching artists. Working directly with these trained actors provided an extraordinary creative opportunity for Forsyth's oldest students.

GRADE 4 HOSTED MINIATURE GOLF SHOWCASE

Grade 4 students transformed The Rand Center into an interactive miniature golf course for the entire school community to enjoy! Working in teams during Innovation & Design classes, the students spent weeks collaborating and problem-solving to design and build nine different electric-powered miniature golf holes. Their creative designs featured impressive interactive technology, including coded micro:bits, servomechanisms, motors, lights, and sensors.

NICHOLAS AARON AITKEN ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE PROGRAM

The New House Lunchroom was transformed into a stunning exhibition space to celebrate the culmination of the 2025/26 Nicholas Aaron Aitken Artist-In-Residence Program. Grade 5 students collaborated with St. Louis-based artist and educator Anna Schenker to create *Winter Collections*, a series of intricate rubbings on paper and fabric made from collected natural materials. Established by the Aitken Family in 2010 to honor the life of Nicholas Aaron Aitken, FS '04, this unique endowment continues to provide an annual opportunity for fifth-grade students to learn from and work alongside professional local artists.

GRADE 5 BUILT & LAUNCHED A CANOE

In a remarkable display of hands-on learning, Grade 5 students successfully completed Forsyth's inaugural canoe build in partnership with the Urban Wilderness Program. While constructing the beautiful 15-foot, skin-on-frame vessel on campus, students applied complex math and science concepts, mastered traditional hand tools, and discovered how heat and water can bend and shape wood. The ambitious project culminated with the students proudly portaging the finished canoe across the street to Forest Park for its maiden voyage on Post-Dispatch Lake.

JUNIOR-KINDERGARTEN YOUNG NATURALIST PROGRAM

Junior-Kindergarten students bundled up for their winter "tracks and trees"-themed walking field trips to Forest Park. The young naturalists sharpened their observation skills by making tree-bark rubbings and learning how to spot animal prints in the wild. To commemorate their outdoor exploration and deepen their connection to the natural world, each student received a special "tree cookie" necklace harvested directly from the trees, capping off a joyful experiential learning adventure.

GRADE 2 ROCKED AESOP'S BOPS

Grade 2 students brought their energy and creativity to a lively performance of *Aesop's Bops*! 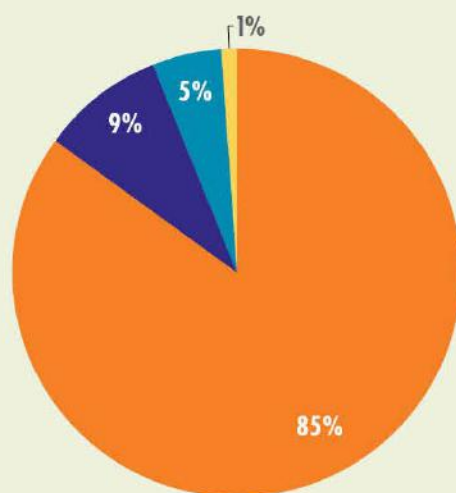

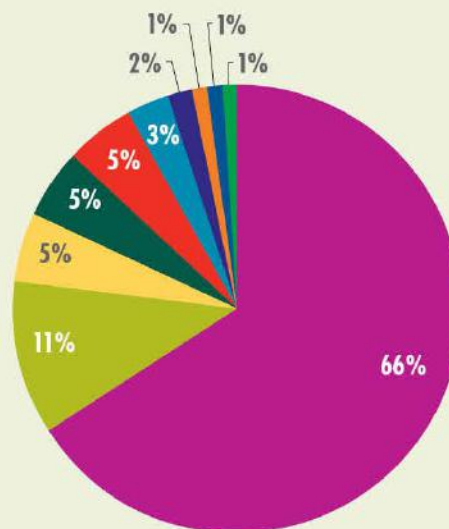
