Outdoor Adventure

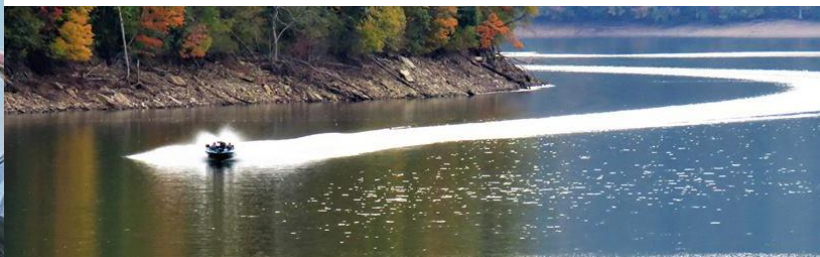
Panther Creek State Park

Located along the banks of Cherokee Lake, Panther Creek is Tennessee's third-most visited state park. Boasting 17 different hiking trails covering more than 30 miles of terrain at all levels of difficulty, hikers are sure to find a trail to test their limits. Enjoy the magnificent views of Cherokee Lake and the Cumberland



Mountains from Point Lookout Trail, which reaches 1,460 feet above sea level. There are also more than 15 miles of mountain biking trails, as well as horse trails, a popular 50 site campground, picnic pavilions, volleyball pit, tennis/pickleball courts, 18-hole championship-caliber disc golf course, playground, scenic overlook, and a boat ramp for everyone to enjoy. Cherokee Lake

Beautiful Cherokee Lake, an angler's haven, was recently ranked #12 on BASSMASTERS' list of 100 Best Bass Lakes in the United States. As one of the premier fishing lakes in the region, several highly successful tournaments are held on the lake annually. Cherokee's 400 miles of shoreline is dotted with a variety of public access areas, county and municipal parks, commercial boat docks, Panther Creek State Park, and a state wildlife management area. With a temperate climate, anglers can enjoy fishing nearly every day of the year. Grab your rod, boat, kayak, or canoe and set out for a fun day on Cherokee Lake.

Tennessee's Disc Golf Capital™

How seriously does Morristown take disc golf? Very seriously! The city boasts four championship disc golf courses, which has made it the premier destination in Tennessee for competitors of all skill levels. Morristown hosts the annual Tennessee State Disc Golf Championships, which draw over 600 professional and amateur players to the town each June. Eighteen-hole courses are located at Cherokee Park, Frank Lorino Park, Panther Creek State Park, and Wayne Hansard Park. All courses are free to play and open during each park's posted hours.

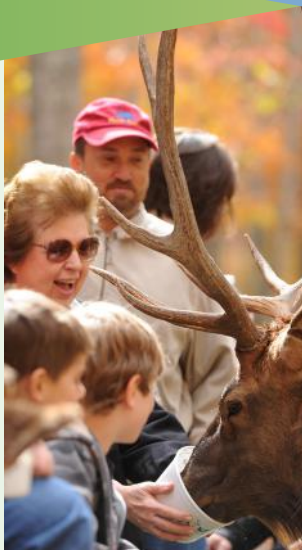


Outdoor Adventure

City and County Parks

Morristown's 17 city parks and Hamblen County's Cherokee Park provide year-round recreational activities for residents as well as visitors. Amenities include tennis courts, baseball, softball and little league fields, football and soccer fields as well as outdoor basketball courts, BMX and pump tracks, splashpads, playgrounds with picnic areas, and shelters available year-round. The newly opened Jolley Park is designed specifically for children with physical or sensory limitations. Cherokee Park features lakeside camping, a marina, boat ramp, multiple picnic pavilions, and the Citizen Tribune Jefferson Federal amphitheater. Scan this QR code for park locations.

East Tennessee's most visited family farm is a unique outdoor experience for all ages. Museums & More

Bethesda Church & Cemetery

The area's second stop on the Tennessee Civil War Trails, Bethesda Church, a quaint old building with high-backed pews and an enclosed pulpit, is one of the oldest churches in this section of the state. The church was used as a hospital for wounded soldiers by both the Union and Confederate armies. Along with graves dating back to the 1700's, there are approximately 82 unknown soldiers buried in the cemetery. A kiosk is located on the site providing information about the Civil War as well as local history of the Lakeway area.



Crockett Tavern Museum

Placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2014, this replica of the boyhood home of American frontiersman and Tennessee native son, David Crockett, contains artifacts from his childhood and tells the story of this legendary figure. Davy's Trading Post on the grounds of the museum offers a variety of Crockett and pioneer-related items for sale. The museum hosts several special events throughout the season. Open April - October Tues-Sat, 11 AM - 5 PM.

General Longstreet Museum

The historic Nenney House was occupied during the winter of 1863-64 by General James Longstreet. The house has been painstakingly restored by the Lakeway Civil War Preservation Association to serve as a museum and is the centerpiece of the Civil War Trail in the Lakeway area. The adjacent gift shop also contains an excellent Tennessee Civil War history reference library as well as Civil War related souvenirs and publications. The museum hosts several living history events annually. Open April-October Tues-Sat; 10 AM - 5 PM.

GroveWood Baseball Museum

America's favorite pastime is celebrated at this one-of-a-kind museum. Containing 11 exhibits of over 1,000 authentic pieces of curator/owner Jamison Pack's personal collection dating from the Civil War era to the early 2000s. You'll find items from Cal Ripkin, Babe Ruth, Ty Cobb, Bo Jackson, and many other well-known players. Baseballs, stadium seats, jerseys, bats, gloves as well as memorabilia from multiple baseball movies make up this outstanding collection. Special meet and greet events are held throughout the year. Historic Downtown District

Anchored by the farmers market pavilion and Downtown Green to the south and Rose Center and the Hamblen County Courthouse to the north, the district is home to a diverse variety of specialty, clothing, antique shops, restaurants, and a taproom. The 1874 courthouse is the county's third stop along Tennessee's Civil War trails. Along Main St. you'll find the unique overhead sidewalks known as the Sky Mart. You won't want to miss the free First Friday concerts held at the Downtown Green on the first Friday of April through November.



Rose Center for the Arts

Housed in an 1892 Victorian schoolhouse, Rose Center is the cultural and performing arts hub of the Lakeway area. It features an art gallery, children's museum, various dance, art and enrichment classes, a sales gallery, and a multitude of varying styles of musical performances in Prater Hall. Home of the multi award-winning Mountain Makins Festival, a celebration of Appalachian culture and folk life, Rose Center is the northern anchor of Morristown's historic downtown district. The main arena is an indoor 40,000 square foot dirt floor. The arena has 3,800 seats with restrooms and concession stands. Agriculture events such as rodeos, horse and livestock shows as well as dirt bike races are held at the center. The arena can accommodate other types of events such as graduation ceremonies and trade shows with its hard floor covering. A meeting room that will seat up to 80 people comfortably is available as well.
