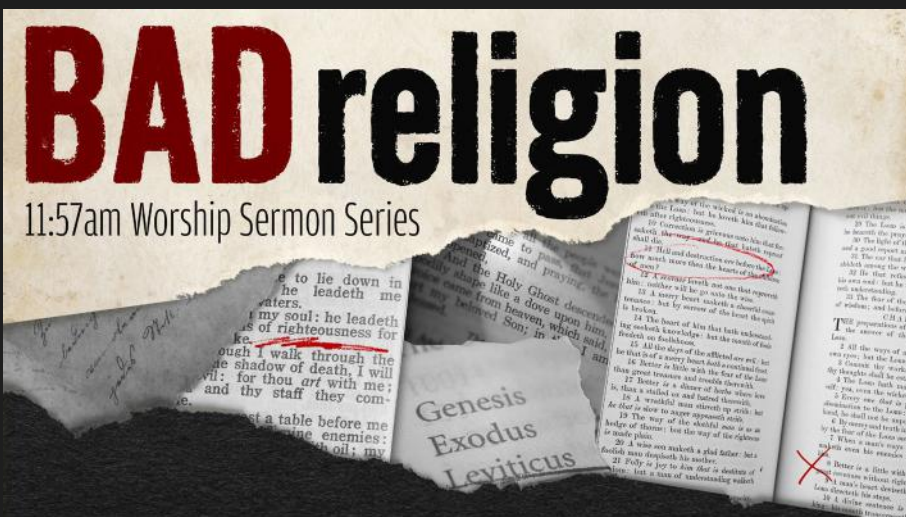

Religious Ethics of War

First-Plymouth Partners with Food Bank to Feed Thousands

Ron Ramsey is stepping down as volunteer coordinator

For nearly eight years, Ron Ramsey has found joy in helping others through First-Plymouth's monthly food distribution, a partnership with the Food Bank of Lincoln that now serves as many as 800 families each month.

On the first Saturday of every month, a long line of cars winds through First-Plymouth's east parking lot. Volunteers unload food from pallets and place it directly into open trunks—or gently hand a dozen eggs through a car window into waiting hands.

Many of the families served live in the First-Plymouth neighborhood. Some arrive in cars that also serve as their homes, while others walk from nearby with carts or wagons.

Ron has coordinated the volunteers for nearly eight years, watching participation grow from about 40 families at the first distribution in January 2019 to a line that sometimes stretches down 21st Street nearly to O Street.

Distribution Saturdays begin with the arrival of one or two refrigerated Food Bank trucks and the

unloading of pallets of available food. Volunteers organize the pallets into two lanes, with teams assigned to make sure each car receives the available items. Drive-through distribution runs from 8:45 to 11 a.m., with walk-up distribution beginning at 10 a.m.

The need has grown significantly, particularly

The ministry began when Ron was serving on the Board of Christian Outreach. Along with Ray Zeisset, Lowell Nickolaus, their spouses and others, he explored how a monthly food distribution could be established at First-Plymouth. Ron soon took on the leadership role.

down as volunteer coordinator and handing the responsibility to John Reinhardt. The two have worked closely together to keep the monthly distribution running like a well-oiled machine.

John, a retired faculty member from the University of Nebraska Medical Center's College

of Dentistry, has also devoted years to serving others. He has served as a First-Plymouth trustee, served on the board of Lincoln's Community Health Endowment and currently volunteers with the Clinic with a Heart. He and his wife, Claudia, have been regular First-Plymouth Food Bank volunteers since the program began.

For John, volunteering is more than a responsibility—it is a passion.

"I feel truly blessed to have this opportunity to serve others," he said.

As Ron passes the coordinator role to John, the monthly food distribution continues to reflect First-Plymouth's commitment to serving its neighbors—and the power of a community coming together to meet a growing need.

since the COVID-19 pandemic and the reduction of federal food assistance through SNAP benefits. With more than 90 volunteers on its roster, First-Plymouth is now the second-largest Food Bank distribution site in the Southeast Nebraska network, behind the Food

His years of service at First-Plymouth extend well beyond the food distribution. He has been an usher for 30 years, served as a deacon for nine years and participated in a mission trip to Guatemala with a church group that included his wife and daughter.

Experience Sacred Harp Singing

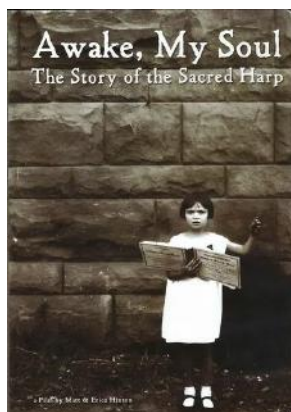
