- **MEASURE:** We are committed to ensuring that our work is both meaningful and measurable by establishing consistent metrics that demonstrate accountability, celebrate success, and drive continuous improvement.
- **TRANSFORM:** Our ultimate goal is to create lasting, measurable impact that strengthens our communities for generations to come.

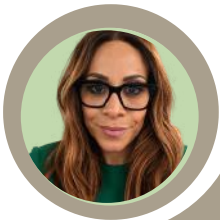

Links Foundation Awards \$1 Million Legacy Grant to Motown Museum

Landmark investment brings the museum's expansion campaign to \$73 million of its \$75 million goal

DETROIT - When Motown artists Marvin Gaye and Tammi Terrell recorded the hit song "You're All I Need to Get By," they created an enduring tribute to the power of partnership. Decades later, its title captures the spirit of a landmark commitment from The Links Foundation, Incorporated.

The Foundation has awarded a \$1 million Legacy Grant to support Motown Museum's transformational expansion in Detroit. The grant, approved during The Links, Incorporated's 45th National Assembly in Detroit, will help keep the Motown legacy alive, while also bringing new economic opportunity to Detroit's north side. This is the seventh million-dollar grantee from The Links Foundation, Incorporated, including grants to the Obama Presidential Center and St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital.

The expanded Motown Museum will be a nearly 50,000-square-foot cultural destination featuring interactive exhibits, a performance theater, recording studios, educational experiences and expanded community spaces. The project is also expected to increase tourism, create economic opportunities and inspire new investment in Detroit's historic North End.

The Legacy Grant reflects The Links Foundation's longstanding commitment to protecting all American history, advancing education and strengthening communities.

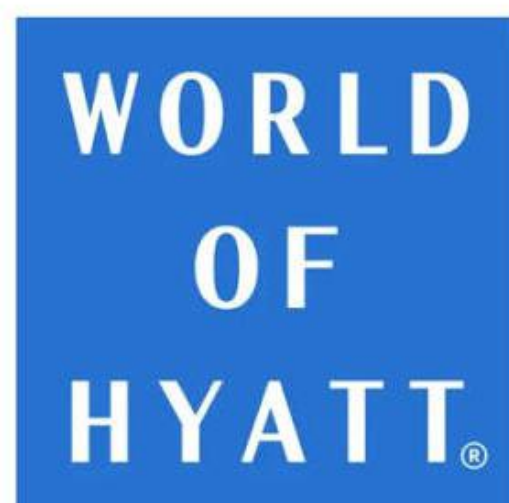
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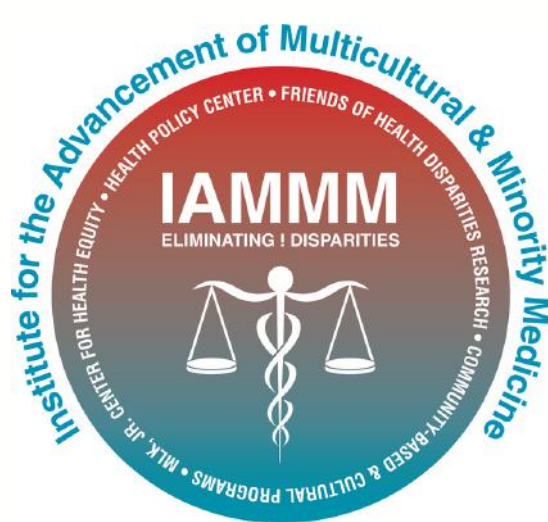
