Expectations

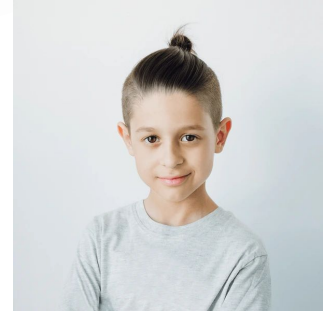
- Many of the notices come from the school office so keep an eye on your emails and Line messages

Home Learning

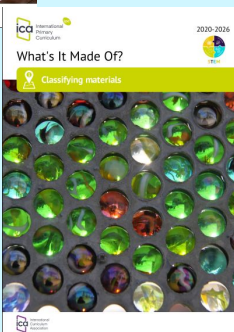
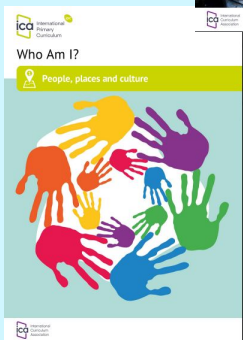
- There will be reading and spelling practice every week

- Please can you support your child to learn these.



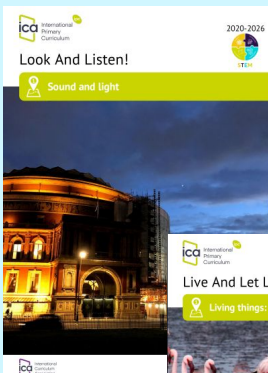
