

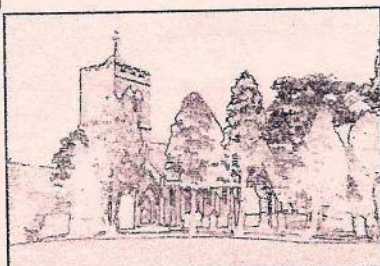

Pastoral Letter

The Vicarage, Penny Bridge LA12 7RQ

Being grateful, saying thank you and giving thanks are an important part of our social interactions and one of the oils that smooth relationships in a community. And yet given the importance of gratitude to our social well-being, you would have thought it was our natural state.

Unfortunately, this is not the case and in a fallen world, the natural state of the human heart is ingratitude. There is a natural inclination to want more and a tendency to give neither time, thought or thanks for what we already have or what we have already received. Our eyes are very much on to the next possession or the next experience, instead of savouring and appreciating what we already have or have done.

When someone responds to Jesus' call to follow him, to repent, to re-orientate our lives and live according to Jesus' teachings, then one of those changes to the heart concerns gratitude, the giving of thanks. Jesus not only taught this but exemplified it. When his friend Lazarus had died, Jesus travelled to his graveside, and after weeping bitterly, said, "*Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me*". So, in spite of his grief, Jesus still gave thanks.

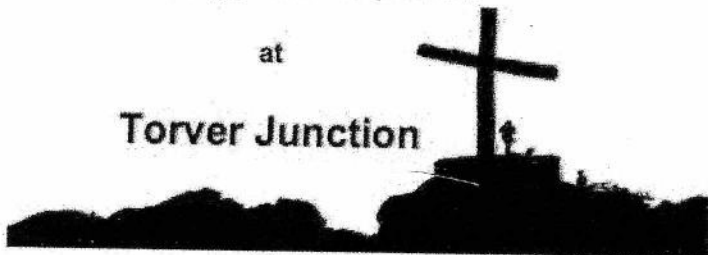
But wait! Should we give thanks for everything? Even death? Well, the Apostle Paul writing to the Church in Thessalonica, said "give thanks in everything". Crucially, Paul did not say "give thanks for everything". As Christians, we should always be giving thanks, every day despite our circumstances. Because we are not giving thanks for the circumstances, good or bad, but instead we are giving thanks that God is good in every circumstance, and that never changes.

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are finishing John, chapter 4

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

So he came again to Cana in Galilee, where he had made the water wine. And at Capernaum there was an official whose son was ill. When this man heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went to him and asked him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. So Jesus said to him, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe." The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my child dies." Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and went on his way. As he was going down, his servants met him and told him that his son was recovering. So he asked them the hour when he began to get better, and they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him." The father knew that was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." And he himself believed, and all his household. This was now the second sign that Jesus did when he had come from Judea to Galilee.

When Jesus was here, physically walking around on the earth, He did many healings and miracles which were to prove to the people that He was the Messiah, the anointed one that God the Father and promised to send to rescue them.

This is the reason why we read about so many miracles in the Gospels and why we are specifically told in this story that "he himself believed and all his household" - John is telling us that they had understood the sign, they had understood that Jesus was the promised one that all of the Old Testament was pointing towards.

When we read about all the amazing things that Jesus did - are we sceptical and say "that's impossible" or do we understand that if Jesus is God, then all things are possible!?

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Lowick Parish Council

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 17 January.

Councillors considered a letter sent by a local resident about traffic issues: namely the possibility of having solar signs on the A5092 to remind motorists of the 40mph speed limit and improved signing at the Coniston road junction to try and prevent motorists – cars, caravans and coaches – using the narrow road along Lowick Green. The idea of solar signs is a positive one but the Parish Council will have to consult with CCC Highways on this, as well as sign improvements. This would not be the first time but little has happened so far It seems to be related to cost and priorities.

As part of the Parish Plan, the Council has delivered a newsletter to all households. This was collated by Councillor Edmondson, with contributions from various sources. It has been well received – if anyone has an issue to raise appertaining to the parish and of interest to residents, please contact Councillor Edmondson – or any councillor.

Mr Ellwood, Chairman of Lowick Green Management Committee explained that he was hoping to improve the parking area outside Cosy Cottage/Green View and asked for views about improving the roadside parking outside Hopefield Cottages to avoid the need for residents to park on the grass, which easily gets damaged.

The Public Enquiry about Kirkby Moor will take place in January and Lowick Parish Council is supporting the Kirkby Moor Protectors. Councillors Mitchell and Sanderson will give evidence at the Enquiry. The result will be eagerly awaited.

Councillors agreed to request a precept of £3000 from South Lakeland District Council to cover costs and any projects.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on 21 March at 7.30pm in Lowick Community Hall. All are welcome. Remember to use the website **lowickpc.wordpress.com** for information about your parish and your parish council.

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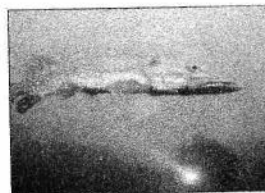

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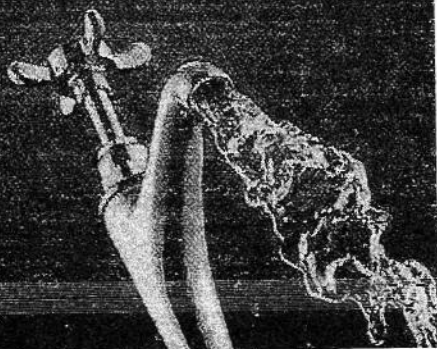

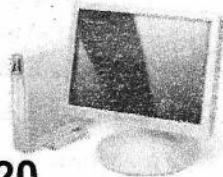
