KINGS MOUNTAIN NATIONAL MILITARY PARK

The park commemorates a pivotal and significant victory by Patriot militia over Loyalist forces under the command of British Major Patrick Ferguson. The October 7, 1780 battle destroyed the left wing of Cornwallis' army and effectively ended Loyalists' dominance in the Carolinas. The Patriot victory at the Battle of Kings Mountain is considered by most historians to be the "turning point of the American Revolution in the South." The park visitor center features a film, museum exhibits, and a bookstore. Visitors can walk the 1.5-mile battlefield trail or hike on the 16-mile backcountry trail. (Free Admission)

THE PEACHOID I-85 at Exit 92 near Gaffney

The iconic One Million Gallon water tank has long been Gaffney's claim to fame. Designed in the shape of a peach, it was built by the Gaffney Board of Public Works in 1981. Constructed by the Chicago Bridge & Iron Company, the Peachoid was later painted by artist Peter Freudenburg, who was tasked with painting the tank in colors matching the types of peaches grown in the area. Today, the Peachoid stands guard over interstate 85 near Gaffney, capturing the attention of hundreds of thousands of travelers who drive past each year.

The bridge was built in 1909 and is the oldest remaining covered bridge in South Carolina. From US Highway 25 north of Travelers Rest, take State Road 414 through Tigerville. Turn right on Pleasant Hill Road, right on Campbell Bridge Road and travel approximately 1/4 mile to the bridge.

Located in the heart of downtown Greenville, Falls Park features scenic overlooks, landscaped gardens, nature trails and the Reedy River with its impressive series of falls. The centerpiece of Falls Park is the Liberty Bridge, a one-of-a-kind curved suspension bridge that appears to float above the waterfalls and gardens below. There is a restaurant located on-site and numerous dining options within walking distance of the park. Garden tours are available by appointment.

Conestee Nature Preserve, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, opened its first trails to the public in 2006. The Preserve consists of over 600 acres of beautiful natural habitat on the Reedy River, just 6 miles south of downtown Greenville, South Carolina. The entire Preserve is protected under conservation easement and is a statutory Wildlife Sanctuary, recognized as an Important Bird Area of Global Significance by the National Audubon Society with 226 species identified to date. Open to visitors every day of the year, over 13 miles of trails traverse this unique landscape, of which seven miles are paved. There are over a mile of boardwalks, eleven wildlife observation decks, and to enhance your visit, a mobile guide featuring interactive maps, wildlife scavenger hunts, and education about the natural and human history of this area. The Conestee Nature Preserve is truly the wildest place in Greenville!

The Military History Museum displays vehicles, uniforms, weapons, and other artifacts from America's conflicts beginning with the Spanish-American War and extending through the 20th century and up to the present day. The bridge is named for Joel Roberts Poinsett, a legislator, physician and botanist from South Carolina. Poinsett was a Charleston native, a prominent early resident of Greenville and a US ambassador to Mexico. Opening in 1820, the stone arched bridge was part of the state road from Charleston through Columbia to North Carolina. Robert Mills, architect of the Washington Monument and many significant South Carolina buildings, is thought to have designed Poinsett Bridge. This preserve is comprised of 120 acres.

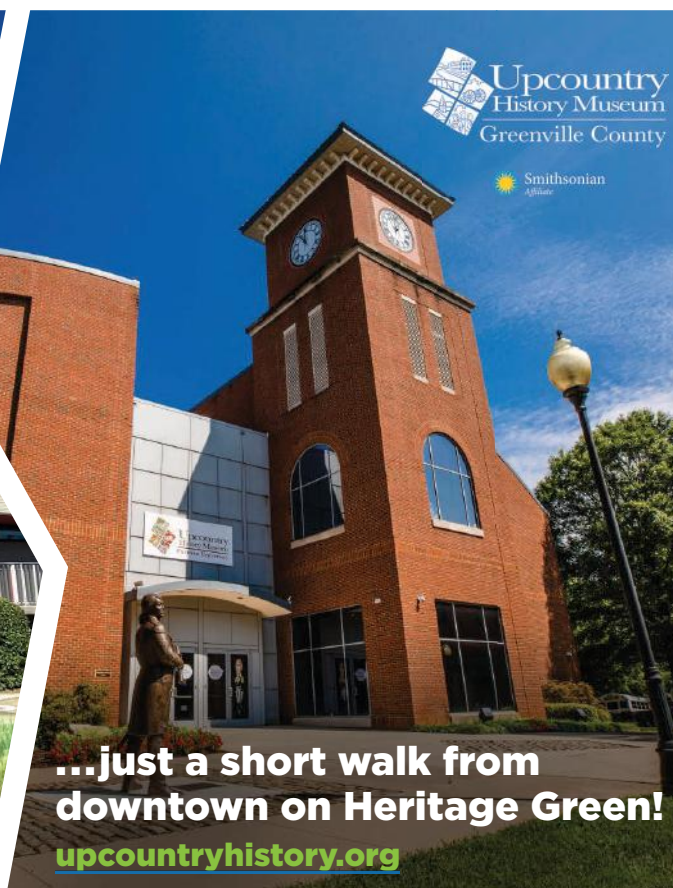
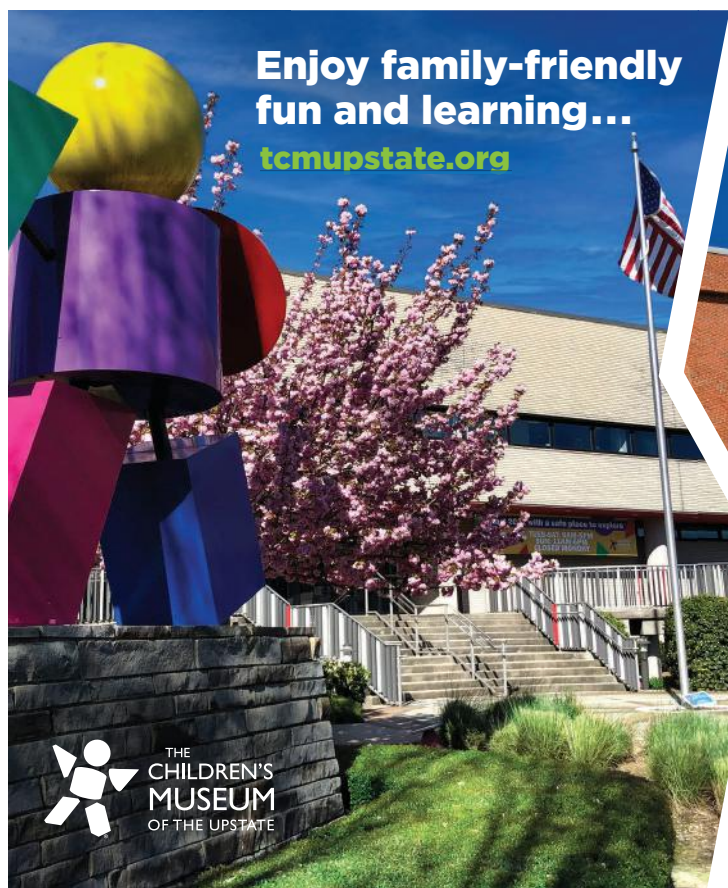

Oconee Station was built in 1792 as one in a series of blockhouses along the SC frontier and was garrisoned with troops until 1799. The buildings were established during a period of tension between European settlers and the Native American population. The adjacent William Richards House, built in 1805, is believed to be the first brick house built in the northwest corner of South Carolina and was a successful trading post. Nearby, the beautiful Station Cove Falls can be enjoyed.

CHATTOOGA NATIONAL WILD & SCENIC RIVER

Designated as a National Wild and Scenic River in 1974, the Chattooga is one of the premier whitewater rivers in the Eastern US, dropping an average of 49.3 feet per mile. The Chattooga is one of the longest and largest free-flowing mountain rivers in the Southeast that remains in a relatively undeveloped condition. The Chattooga forms the boundary between South Carolina, North Carolina and Georgia. Offering wonderful hiking and fishing experiences and also offers challenging boating and rafting experiences.

Looming majestically beyond the low, soft hills of the Piedmont, the southernmost peaks of the Blue Ridge Mountains follow the highway. Once known as "Keowee Path" or "Cherokee Path,"

this 112-mile road was the route used by the Cherokees, the English and French fur traders. The scenic highway winds its way through SC's northwest corner and passes through quaint villages and parks.

The US Congress designated the Ellicott Rock Wilderness area in 1975 where the mountainous regions of SC, NC and GA converge. The Ellicott Rock Wilderness straddles the Wild and Scenic Chattooga River and is the only wilderness area in three states and includes over 9,000 acres. The area has dense stands of white pine and hemlock in the lower coves and streams with hardwoods on the slopes. Deer, squirrels, grouse and wild turkeys are common sights, along with the elusive black bear. Remains of old moonshine stills can be seen. The terrain is rugged and lies just south of the area that receives the highest rainfall in the eastern US.

There are numerous natural sand beaches along the 962-mile shoreline in addition to campgrounds, recreation areas and boat access areas. Hartwell borders Georgia and South Carolina on the Savannah, Tugaloo and Seneca Rivers.

Points of Interest

LAKE JOCASSEE

The lake has 9,000 acres of deep water and 90 miles of shoreline. The lake, named "Place of the Lost One" because of a Cherokee legend. Jocassee, an Indian maiden, was said to have drowned herself in grief over the murder of her lover. The popular recreation area is surrounded by mountains and waterfalls. The lake is located in Oconee and Pickens Counties.

LAKE KEOWEE

Lake Keowee covers Keowee Town, site of the capital of the Lower Cherokee Nation. Keowee, meaning "Place of the Mulberries," was visited by Spanish explorer Hernando DeSoto when he came through the area in 1540. With 18,500 acres of water and a 300-mile shoreline, the Lake Keowee area is a popular place for boating, fishing, waterskiing, swimming, camping and picnicking. The lake is located in Oconee and Pickens counties.

Lake Robinson has been described as the "hidden gem" of Greer. The 800-acre man-made lake is a wonderful place to fish, kayak, canoe or paddleboard. There are two shelters for rent and both provide great views of the lake as well as Glassy and Hogback Mountains.

OTHER UPCOUNTRY LAKES

Popular Upcountry lakes include Lakes Blalock, Bowen, Edwin Johnson and Cooley in Spartanburg County; Saluda Lake, Matthews Creek and Oak Grove in Greenville County; Lake Whelchel in Cherokee County; and Lake Oolenoy at Table Rock State Park in Pickens County.

MIDDLE SALUDA RIVER

The Middle Saluda River became the first river protected under the Scenic Rivers Program in SC. Located in northern Greenville County, about 500 miles of the river and its major tributary, Coldspring Branch, are protected. Dropping almost 1,000 feet in four miles, the river is a typical mountain stream that supports reproducing trout populations. The Middle Saluda River is entirely contained in Jones Gap State Park. The Upcountry wilderness is known for its natural features and diverse plant life. More than 400 species of plants can be found here. The valley is a haven for rare and endangered plants and state record size trees.

Along the southeastern edge of the Blue Ridge Mountains lies the Mountain Bridge Wilderness Area. With 40,000 acres of public and private land focused on conservation that forms a narrow, 45-mile corridor along the state line that "bridges" the watersheds of the Table Rock and Poinsett reservoirs. The Mountain Bridge features the Blue Ridge Escarpment, where the mountains drop abruptly 2,000 feet to the Piedmont. The Mountain Bridge Wilderness Area is a 17,000-

acre area consisting of Jones Gap State Park, Caesars Head State Park, and Wildcat Wayside. The area includes four waterfalls with drops of several hundred feet and the Dismal, a dense, mature hardwood forest beneath Caesars Head. Mountain peaks over 3,200 feet offer fabulous views of Table Rock reservoirs and neighboring mountain ranges. The area is rich in wildlife that includes wild turkey, deer, black bear, grouse, peregrine falcons, and trout. An abundance of rare and endangered plants call the Mountain Bridge home.

The Andrew Pickens Ranger District is the gateway to the mountains. It encompasses an 85,000-acre portion of the Sumter National Forest and is an area of high plateaus, mountains, waterfalls and other scenic attractions. European settlement began in this area in the late 1700s and the mountains served as a stronghold for the Cherokee Indians until the early 1800s. Recreational opportunities are plentiful and the area is popular for hiking, camping, horseback riding, hunting and fishing.

Orchards

In early spring, the Upcountry's peach orchards produce lovely blossoms for the delight of visitors to the area. From mid-June to September, the luscious fruit can be found at numerous stands along the roadsides. Late September brings the enticing aroma of apples permeating the cool, crisp air and lingering until Thanksgiving. Cherokee and Spartanburg Counties are famous for their peach orchards while Oconee County is known for its many apple orchards.

Waterfalls

More than 120 waterfalls are found in South Carolina's Upcountry and range in height from 40 to 700 feet. The falls can be found in the area's parks and are easily reached, while others are hidden away and must be hiked to over rugged terrain. Issaqueena Falls, located in Stumphouse Tunnel Park, drops about 200 feet and is one of the most-visited waterfalls in the Upcountry. Whitewater Falls, located off secondary road S-39-171 north of Salem, is a set of two falls and is the highest series of falls in eastern America. The falls plunge nearly 700 feet for more than half a mile before emptying into Lake Jocassee. Raven Cliff Falls, located off Highway 276 in Greenville County, is a 420-foot high cascade in the Mountain Bridge Wilderness and Recreation Area and is one of the most breathtaking waterfalls in the state. A two-mile hike is necessary to reach the area. Don't miss the 60' waterfall in downtown Greenville at Historic Reedy River Falls Park.

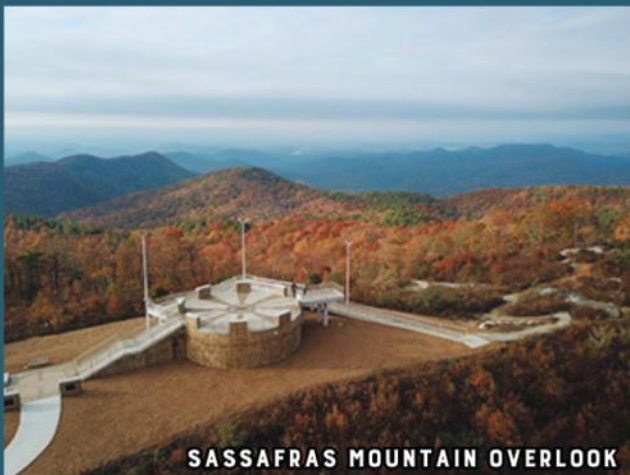

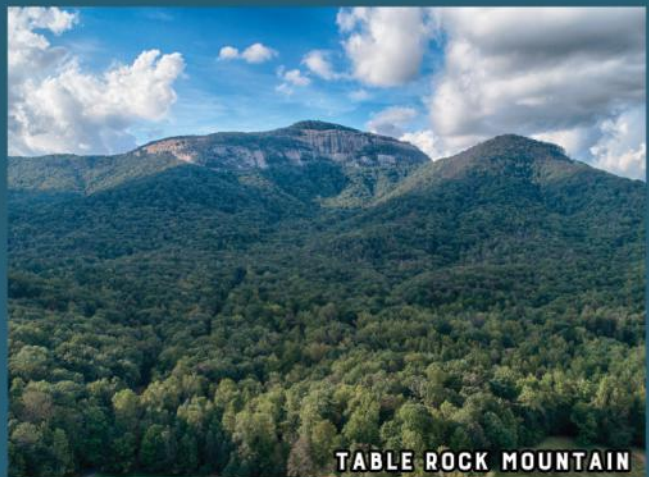

The Blue Ridge Mountains stopped with a bang several hundred million years ago along what would become the state line between the Carolinas. The Mountain Bridge is a 40,000-acre area of public and private land focused on conservation that forms a narrow, 45-mile corridor along the state line that "bridges" the watersheds of the Table Rock and Poinsett reservoirs. The Mountain Bridge features the Blue Ridge Escarpment, where the mountains drop abruptly 2,000 feet to the Piedmont. The Mountain Bridge Wilderness Area is a 14,000-acre area consisting of Jones Gap, Caesars Head, and Wildcat Wayside State Parks. The area includes four waterfalls with drops of several hundred feet and the Dismal, a dense, mature hardwood forest beneath Caesars Head. Mountain peaks over 3,200 feet offer fabulous views of Table Rock reservoirs and neighboring mountain ranges. The area is rich in wildlife that includes wild turkey, deer, black bear, grouse, peregrine falcons, and trout. An abundance of rare and endangered plants call the Mountain Bridge home.

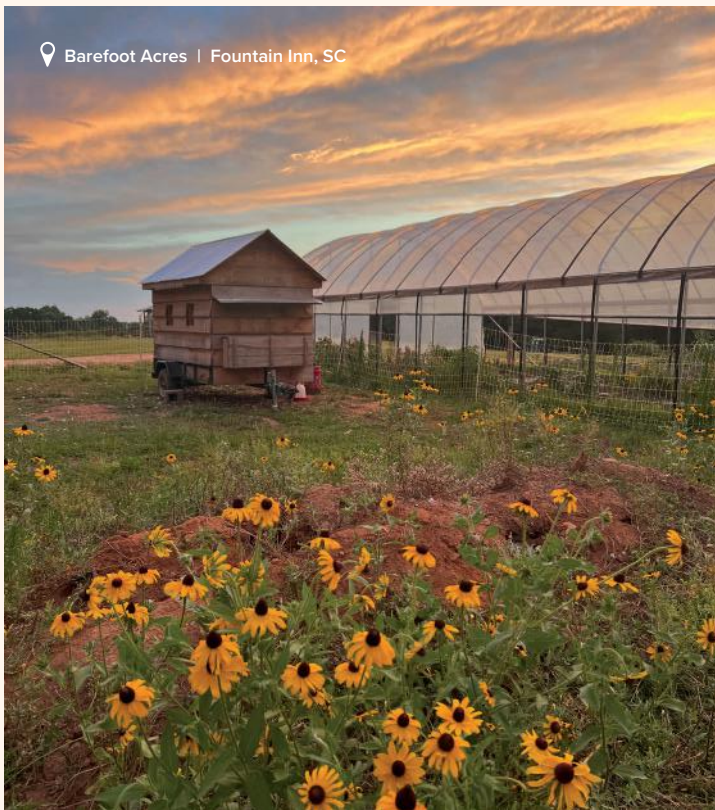

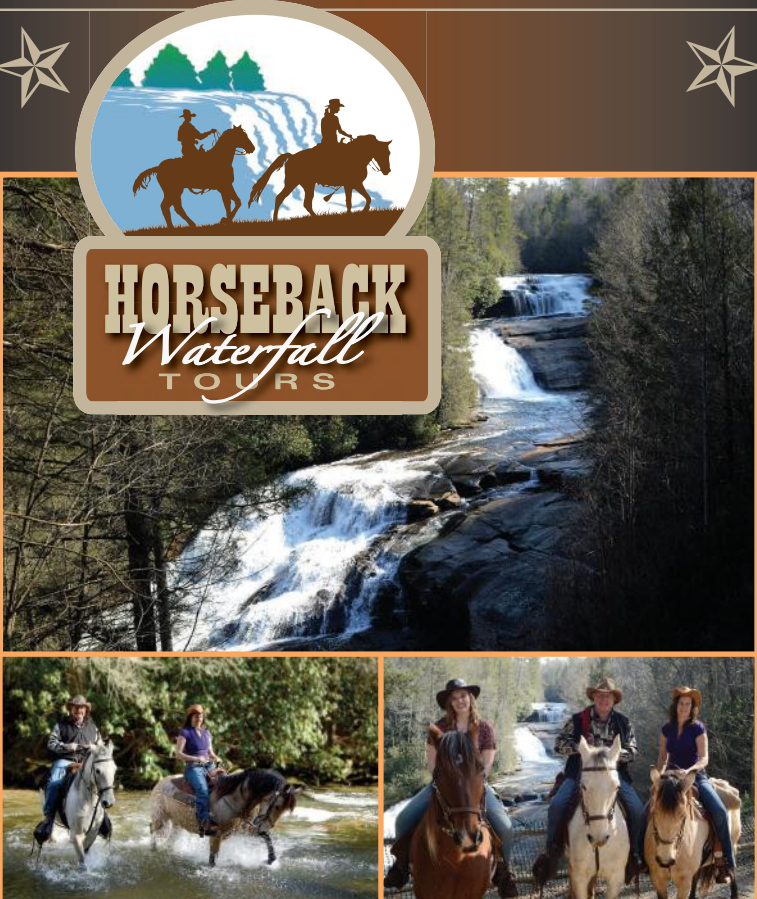

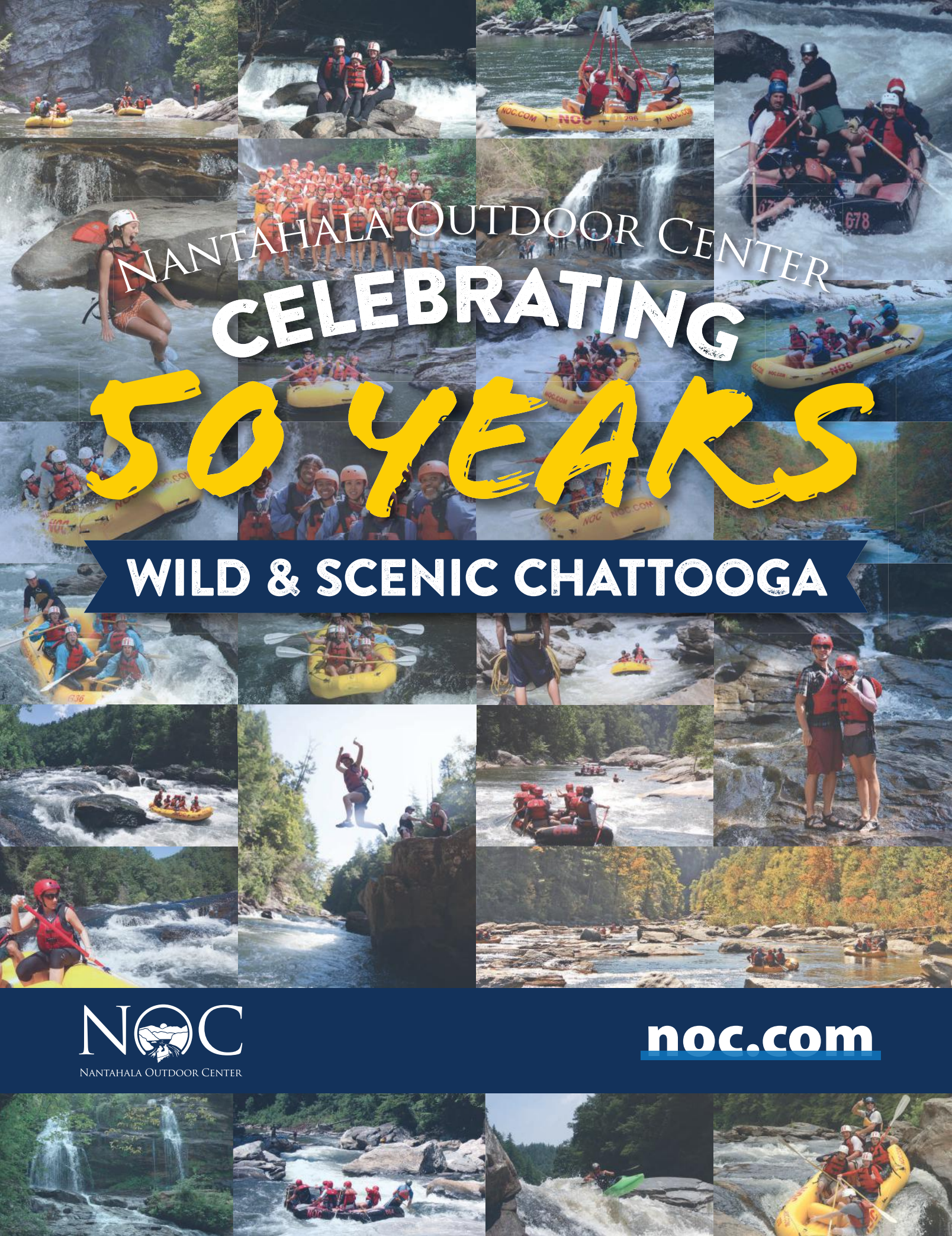

EXPLORE THE WONDERFUL WATERFALLS of the Upcountry

In South Carolina's northwest corner, the Blue Ridge Mountains emerge and create dramatic and awe-inspiring vistas, cold rivers and streams, and more than 120 waterfalls. A few of the more popular ones are listed here, but you'll want to visit SouthCarolinaWaterfalls.com as you start planning your visit to this beautiful area.

Wildcat Branch Falls

This popular waterfall, also known as Wildcat Wayside Falls, can be viewed by everyone as it is located roadside on Highway 11. This 30-foot waterfall is last in a series of three formed by the Wildcat stream. About 100 feet to the left of the falls are steps that lead to the 10-foot middle falls and the 100-foot upper falls.

Reedy River Falls

The Reedy River flows through Greenville making a spectacular 28-foot drop over the falls in the historic West End District of Greenville. The falls are the center piece of Falls Park and can best be viewed from Liberty Bridge, a one of a kind, cantilevered, 355-foot-long curved pedestrian bridge. This is the site where Greenville's first European settler, Richard Pearis, established his trading post in 1768 and later built grist mills and sawmills here.

Brasstown Falls

This easy 20-minute hike is family friendly at only 0.1 miles. Brasstown Creek tumbles 120 feet in three consecutive drops: Brasstown

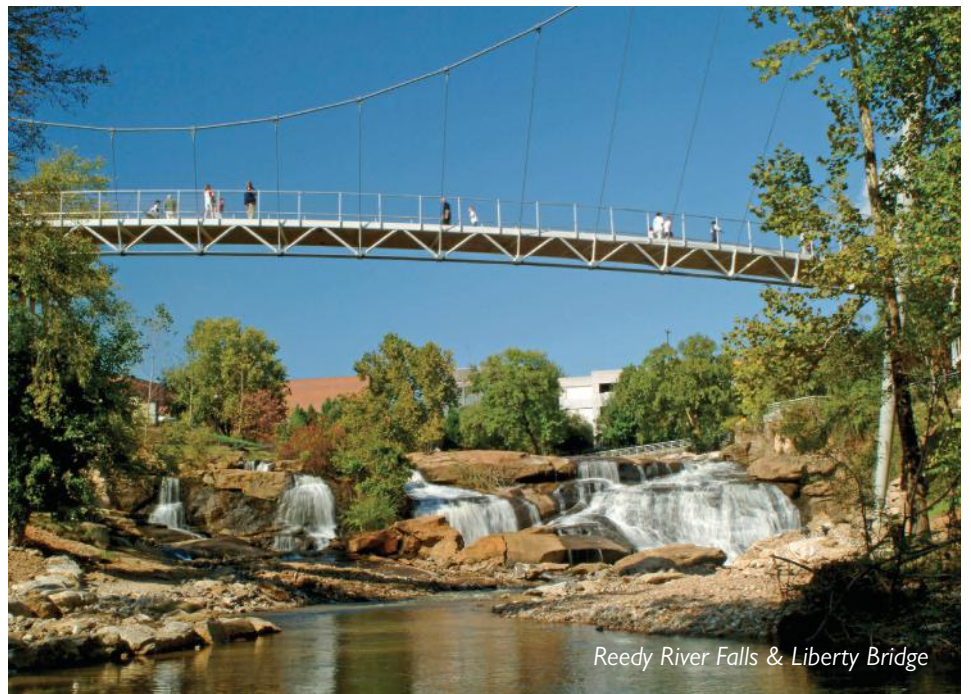
Cascades--50 feet, Brasstown Veil--35 feet, Brasstown Sluice--35 feet. The trail will lead you to the Cascades and its calm pool. To reach the other two sections requires steep descents and crossing large boulders. It is not recommended for the novice hiker. But a short distance upstream is the beautiful Little Brasstown Falls.

King Creek Falls

This might be the perfect falls to visit with the whole family. It is an easy 0.6 mile hike to a picturesque 70-foot waterfall where you feel you could relax all day with your feet in the water. King Creek topples over a tiered rock face that slants backwards, making the falls seem much higher than 70-feet. The trail runs through a mixture of hardwoods, rhododendron and mountain laurel.

Station Cove Falls

An easy, 30-minute hike through a beautiful Appalachian cove forest takes you to Station Cove Falls, a stepped 60-foot waterfall. Station Creek drops from its headwaters atop

Station Mountain to eventually form this falls. It is nearby (about 1 mile) Oconee Station State Historic Site, which the county's first European settlers built in 1792, and is also known as Oconee Station Falls or Station Falls. In the spring and summer, countless wildflowers bloom along the trail. You may see trillium, mayapple, pink lady's slipper orchids, bloodroot, and redbud. The boulders at the base of the falls make a nice area for picnicking.

This 80-foot-high waterfall is located at the head of a narrow cove at the NE tip of the Toxaway River arm of Lake Jocassee. It can best be reached by a boat launched at the Devil's Fork State Park main boat ramp. Once you navigate into Laurel Fork Creek cove and catch the initial view of the falls, find the crescent-shaped grotto behind the rocky tower. The waterfall goes into hiding until you round the last of the crescent, then, suddenly, it flares out into mid-air before plunging into the lake.

Twin Falls/Eastatoe Falls

Though this waterfall goes by many names including Reedy Cove Falls and Rock Falls, once you see it you won't forget it. 70-feet of bare granite and rushing waterfalls make this a beautiful sight. The left and larger of the falls tumbles from a height of 75-feet over a massive slab of granite, while the right side manages a short drop onto another stone and then slides down a 45-degree slope before rejoining its brother. It's a fine show

for an easy 15-minute walk along the quarter-mile trail which leads to a viewing deck with seating. The falls and trail are located on a private nature preserve.

Issaqueena Falls

Named for a Cherokee Indian maiden who hid on a ledge of the falls to avoid capture as she fled to warn her English lover of an Indian attack. A three-minute, relatively flat path leads you to a viewing platform where you have a wonderful view of this 100-foot-tall cascade. A short, but steep trail will take you to the base of the waterfall.

Chau Ram Falls

The 40-foot waterfall is made when Ramsey Creek empties into the Chauga River. This is an excellent location for a family outing as the falls are by the parking area of Chau Ram County Park which has sandy beaches, shelters, camping sites and a suspension bridge—the longest in the county. There are more waterfalls down river and well-maintained paths will lead you there. There are over 4 miles of hiking trails along the river.

Miuka Falls

Miuka Falls is a 75-foot waterfall located off a spur trail of the popular Winding Stairs Trail. It is an easy, 45-minute hike (1.2 miles) that bustles with birds, small animals and wildflowers beneath a canopy of hardwoods, mostly oaks. It is the West Fork of Townes Creek that you follow along Winding Stairs Trail, which is more gently graded than stepped. Getting an unobstructed view of the falls

requires some bushwhacking through thick growth of rhododendron, mountain laurel and azalea.

Beech Bottom Falls

Mill Creek drops 100 feet to make this multi-tiered waterfall. It starts as two tiers but the creek flows around boulders and over rock ledges to make this beautiful falls. It is a spur trail off the Palmetto Trail that will lead you to the falls. The hike is 1.7 miles round trip.

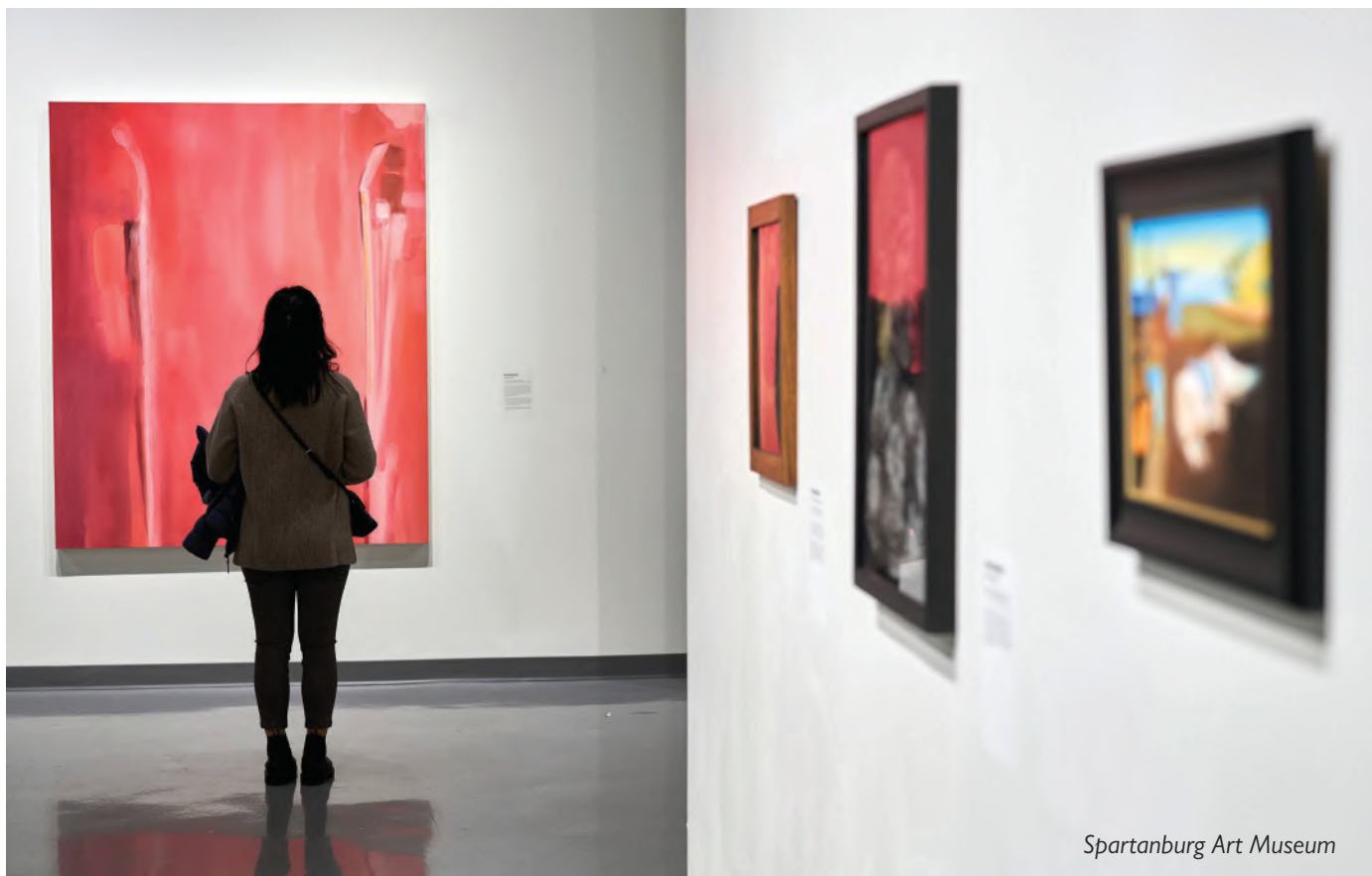

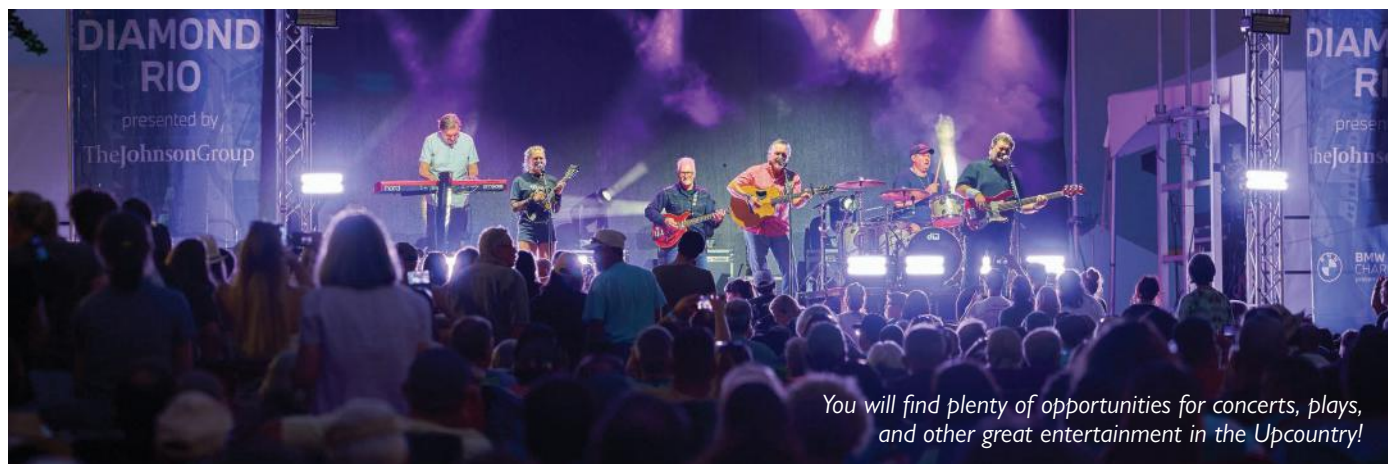

The “Coolest” Place

MOUNTAIN

in South Carolina

f course, the commanding, panoramic view of the Blue Ridge Mountains and foothills, is the featured attraction. On a clear day, you can see 40-50 miles in virtually all directions.

Four interpretive panels mounted around the perimeter of the observation deck point out the names of the surrounding prominent peaks, cities and towns. They also describe several geographic and natural features that make Sassafras Mountain and the immediate area so fascinating.

A black line painted on the floor of deck follows the dividing line between North and South Carolina, which happens to also be the Eastern Continental Divide.

One panel explains that the ambient temperature drops five degrees for every 1,000 feet you gain in elevation. At 3,553 feet, Sassafras is, on any given day, the “coolest place in South Carolina.”

Sassafras Mountain is easily accessed from Highway 11, the Cherokee Foothills National Scenic Byway. From the intersection of Highway 11 and US # 178, take #178 north toward the little mountain community, Rocky Bottom. In Rocky Bottom, turn right on F. Van Clayton Highway and follow that to the parking lot on the peak of Sassafras.

While you're in the area, you might want to check out Twin Falls, one of the most attractive and accessible waterfalls in South Carolina. On the way back toward Highway 11 from Sassafras, turn right onto Cleo Chapman Highway. After crossing the Eastatoee River, turn right onto Eastatoee Community Road, and then after 0.9 miles, turn right on Waterfall Drive, which takes you to the Twin Falls parking lot. A short five-minute walk will bring you to a covered overlook of the dramatic, very photogenic waterfall.

Gas and food are located along Highway 11, and in the nearby city of Pickens, and also in Cleveland or Marietta in Greenville County. Lodging can be found in Easley, Clemson or Greenville.

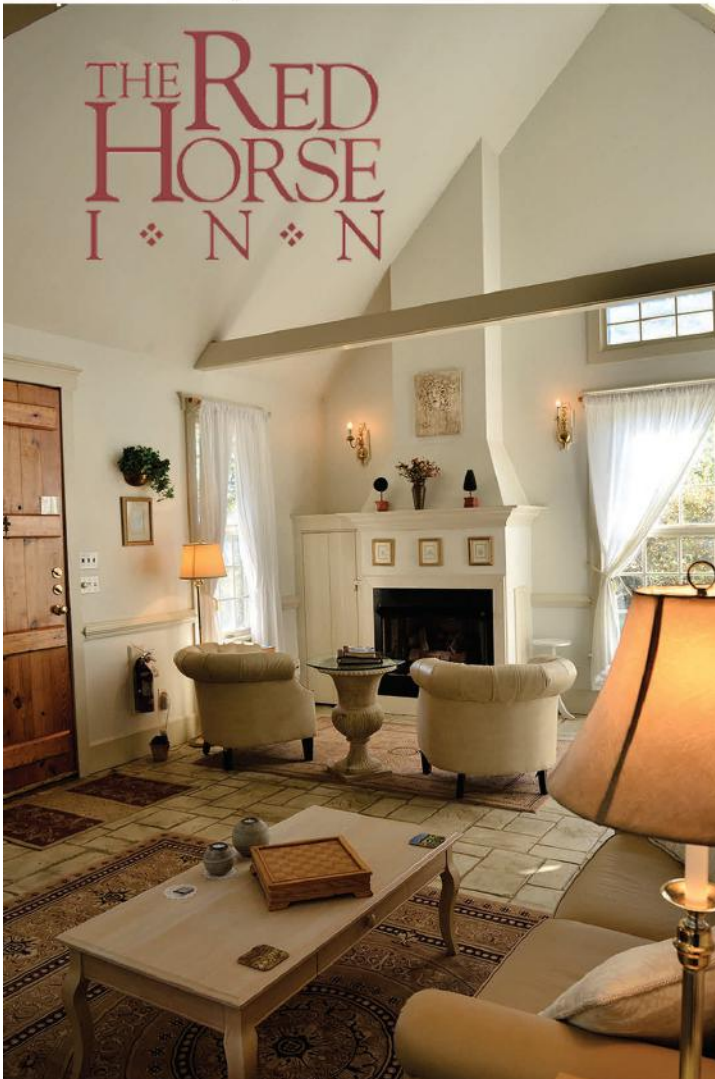

COWPENS NATIONAL BATTLEFIELD

*The site of one of the most consequential battles of the
American Revolutionary War*

Whether you have any interest in the particulars of the American Revolutionary War or not, everyone ought to know the story of the critical Battle of Cowpens. It's the story of the biblical, David, who slew the giant with nothing more than a simple sling and a well-placed stone. It's the story of a Band of Brothers assembled on a wooded knoll facing one of the most notorious British war-fighters; the feared, Banastre "Bloody Ban" Tarleton, whose no-holds barred, take no prisoners approach to war preceded him.

A war council was held the night before the battle with General Daniel Morgan, dressed in his buckskins, along with the

ever reliable, strong and steady Col. Andrew Pickens, Col. William Washington, and others. Facing a superior, better trained, better equipped force, the group landed on a strategy to set a trap for the young brash Bloody Ban.

Andrew Pickens and his militia would confront Tarleton and his legion head-on in the middle of the battlefield. They would line up in two rows with instructions for each line in turn to look for the epaulets worn by officers, make every shot count, and fire two or three rounds and then retreat to the rear. The second line would do the same. Then they were to retreat into the woods and work their way around to the rear of Tarleton's men.

The trick worked like a charm. The militia assaulted Tarleton's troops with a hailstorm of deadly accurate fire, and British officers were dropping from their horses in devastating numbers. Confusion among the British soldiers prevailed but Tarleton urged them to press forward. When Pickens' militia retreated as they had been instructed, Tarleton's troops thought they had won the day and could not believe their good fortune. As they charged forward, the trap was sprung. Col. William Washington's cavalry rushed in from their hiding place in the adjacent woods and poured in deadly, close-range fire.

Pickens' men and others had flanked the now panicked British troops. The British were now taking fire from virtually all directions. It was a total rout.

Tarleton's remaining officers surrendered their swords to Daniel Morgan and Andrew Pickens, and an embarrassed, humiliated Bloody Ban Tarleton beat a hasty retreat on his horse at a full gallop, leaving his dead and defeated men on the field of shame. The British





army, the most powerful force in the world at the time, had been badly beaten by a rag tag, poorly resourced, army of citizen soldiers, along with Continental and State Troops. The stories of bravery and valor at Cowpens fill the pages of the many books and magazine articles written about the Battle of Cowpens.

News of the heroic, unprecedented, victory of the rebel forces quickly spread around the world. Although the fighting continued for some time, the British never fully recovered from the humiliating defeat at Cowpens and eventually surrendered at Yorktown, VA in September, 1781. It was the beginning of the end of the Revolutionary War, and the rest is the history of the free and independent United States of America that we know today.

Check it out. The Cowpens battlefield is a national park and is well stocked with walking trails and interpretive panels that point out the various turning points in the game-changing confrontation between the American rebels and the supposedly superior British forces. Rangers are on hand to answer questions and fill in the details. Reenactments are periodically held at the site and always well-advertised in advance. Check the Cowpens National Battlefield website – nps.gov/cowp – for updates and also RevWarUpcountrySC.com for more about the American Revolution in the Upcountry.

After spending a morning at Cowpens, you may want to avail yourself of the many restaurants located along that segment of Highway 11, or in nearby Chesnee or the city of Gaffney on I-85 at the giant “Peachoid” water tower. A wide array of overnight accommodations are available, ranging from Bed & Breakfasts and Airbnbs near Highway 11, to more conventional hotels and motels along I-85 and in Spartanburg and Gaffney.

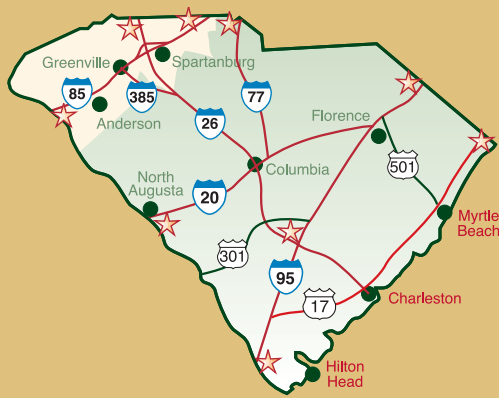

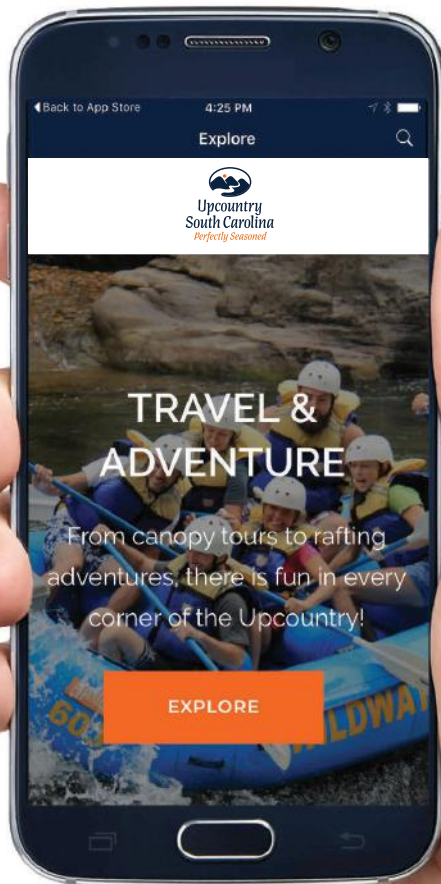
