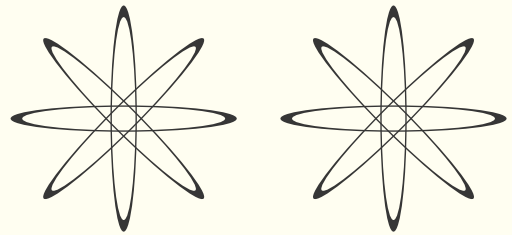

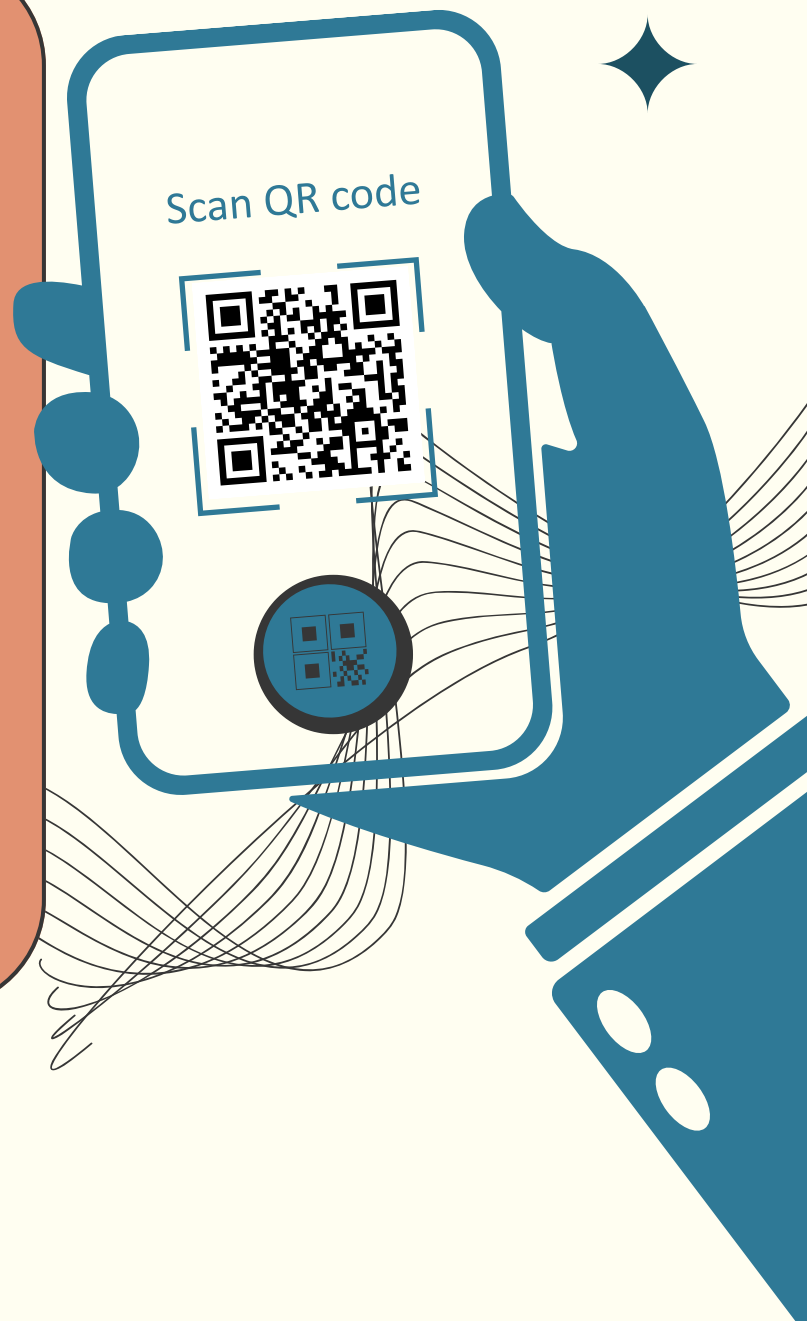

While in Adaminaby

While you're in Adaminaby we recommend parking the car and exploring the Adaminaby Heritage Trail on foot, which is the best way to immerse yourself in the experience. The trail begins and ends at the Big Trout and takes you through the retail precinct and on a short journey around the historic residential and cultural heartland of the township. Storyboards are located at key sites to interpret and explain the heritrail. There are some great places to grab a bite to eat and a beverage in the retail precinct.

Once back at the Big Trout you are invited to jump in your car and visit storyboards at the satellite villages of Anglers Reach (central bus stop) and Old Adaminaby (visitor lookout, below Rainbow Pines Tourist Caravan Park) and at Old Adaminaby Cemetery. But why stop there, when you can visit Providence Portal, Buckenderra and Eucumbene, all whilst taking in glimpses or breathtaking views of Lake Eucumbene.

While in Bombala

While you're in Bombala be sure to pop into the Bombala Platypus Country Information Centre to get advice on where the best places are to spot platypus. If you do the Bombala River Walk you might catch a glimpse of one or more. The river walk is an all-weather walking track that follows the river as it winds through the township, offering excellent platypus viewing spots. The river walk also connects to the self-guided walk around Railway Park via distinctive interpretative signage and features a number of public artworks.

There are also several great places to grab a bite to eat and a beverage, along with some unique retail spaces well worth visiting, such as Lou Lou's Boutique & Gifts, Maybe Décor, Lizzie & Rose and The Garden Shed. Monaro Country Lavender is another must-see and for the machinery enthusiast, a visit to the Bombala Historic Engine & Machinery Society is worthwhile.

If cycling is more your thing then you might like to do one of the Bombala Cycling Trails. Click on the QR code for more information.

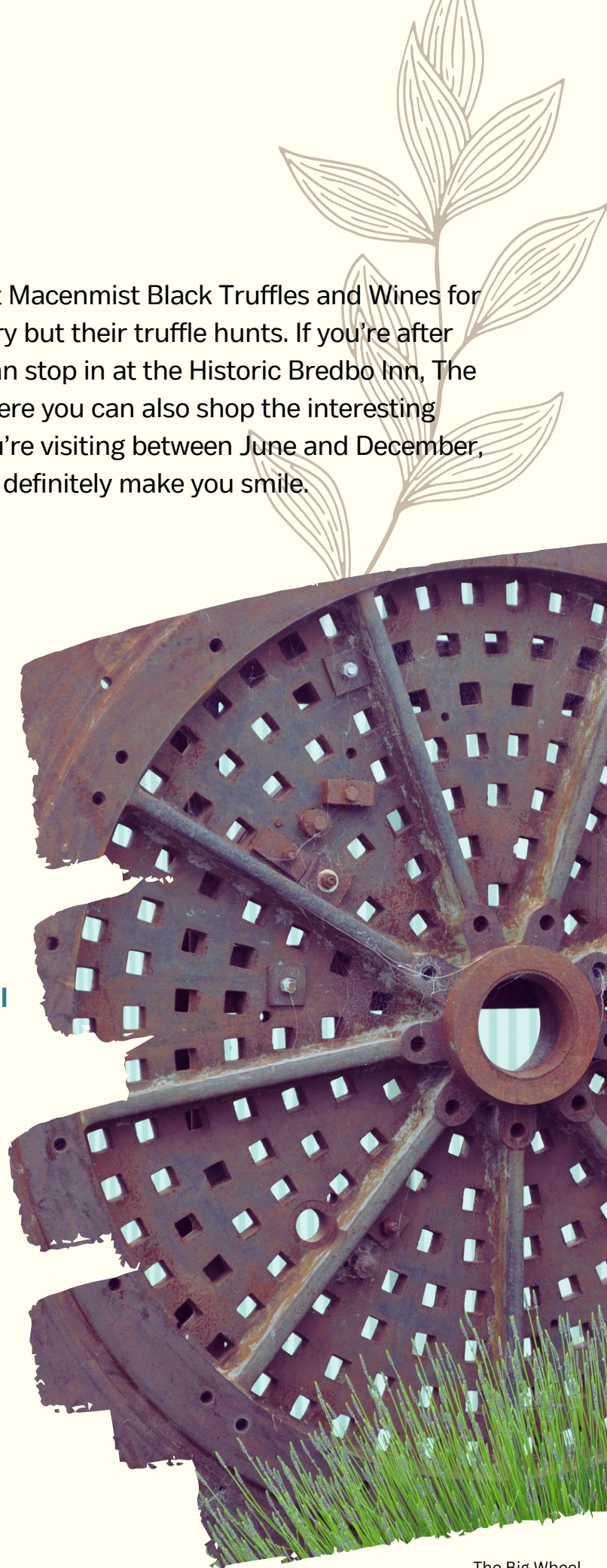

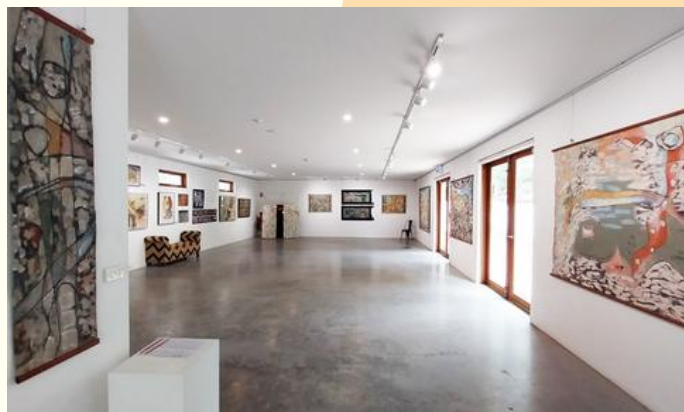

While in Cooma

While you're in Cooma there are some lovely unique retail shops to visit, including Alpine Abode, The Kitchen Bench, The Shearer's Wife, Her Cove and Cooma's own award-winning success story, Birdsnest. If you're musical then be sure to pop in to Cooma Music to see what gems you can discover or if you're a car enthusiast then a visit to the Cooma Car Club's Motoring Museum is an absolute must.

There is no shortage of fabulous eateries here as well and plenty of other sights to see. Be sure to pop into the Cooma Visitor Centre to get directions, maps and information on what to see and do, as well as view a range of local wares and produce in the gift shop. We highly recommend exploring North Ridge Reserve, where you will find a number of different trails to follow, with lots of interpretive signage to guide you on your walk. Lots of creative inspiration here!

We also recommend the Cooma Creek Reserve Walking & Bicycle Path, Nanny Goat Hill, as well as Lambie Town Walk where you can admire the stunning heritage buildings of Cooma.

While you're in Dalgety you might like to explore more by doing the Dalgety Historic Town and River Walk. Dalgety is the only town left on the banks of the Snowy River, where both Jindabyne and Adaminaby were flooded as part building the Snowy Hydro Electric Scheme. Scan the QR Code to download the brochure from the Cooma Visitor Centre website.

A visit to the historic Buckleys Crossing Hotel is also worthwhile or to experience some craft beer, head to Dalgety Brewing, where you might also catch some live music. If you still have time up your sleeve, then the 85km Dalgety Loop won't disappoint.

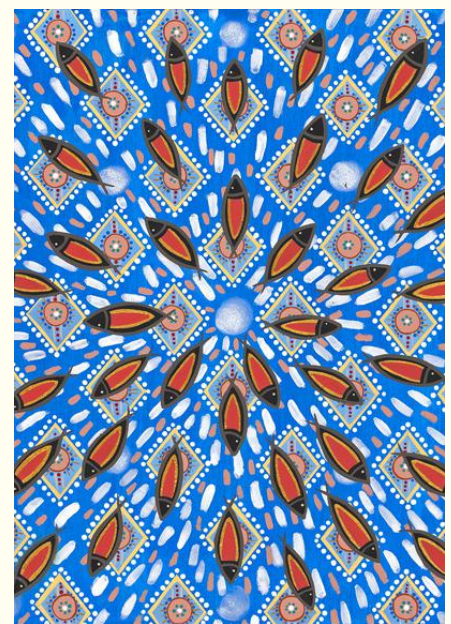

While in Delegate

A place of coffee culture, handmade and curated goods - a visit to Old Tom's is a must while you're in Delegate. We recommend you also take time to discover the Bundian Way - a shared history pathway between Targangal (Kosciuszko) and Bilgalera (Fisheries Beach) that connects the highest part of the continent and the coast via an ancient Aboriginal walking path. For more information visit the website by scanning the QR Code .

There is also the Scenic Drive that takes you into the beautiful forests of the South Eastern Plateau, where you can detour to the Errinundra Boardwalk in the most southern rainforest in mainland Australia, then continue on to other locations. If you prefer bush walks, there are a number of walks you can do in the surrounding National Parks.

There is so much to see and do in Jindabyne and a stop to the Snowy Region Visitor Centre is a must, not only to get the low down on what to see and do, but to also browse the beautiful gift shop and visit the gallery.

There are a number of unique retail stores to visit in both the Town Centre Shopping Centre and Nuggets Crossing Shopping Centre, with some surprises out at Leesville Estate as well. Both shopping centres have many great eateries from cafes to restaurants, along with great pubs and bars. We recommend Jindabyne Brewing, for a unique experience and some great craft beers.

The Jindabyne Walk is an easy walk along a shared path that starts near the Banjo Patterson Park in Jindabyne and follows the lake's shoreline around to Widows Creek, taking in breathtaking view of beautiful Lake Jindabyne.

If baking is your thing then Bluebird Baking Studio occasionally runs courses, so check out their website for details. If you're a little more adventurous, have a 4WD and don't mind a rocky country drive, then get in touch with Snowy Mountains Eucalyptus Oil to arrange a visit.
