Home Learning

- There will be reading, spelling and math practice every week
- We will have math challenges and 2 assessments for every math unit
- We will have occasional poetry challenges throughout the year

- The children are expected to read at home every day for 15 minutes and record a 5-minute video of their reading in Seesaw once per week
- The students record all the different books they read in their reading journals
- They receive weekly spelling lists on Friday
- There is a weekly spelling test every Friday

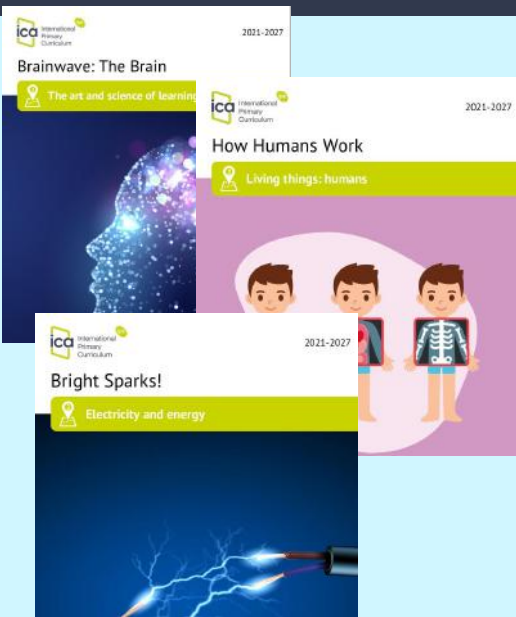

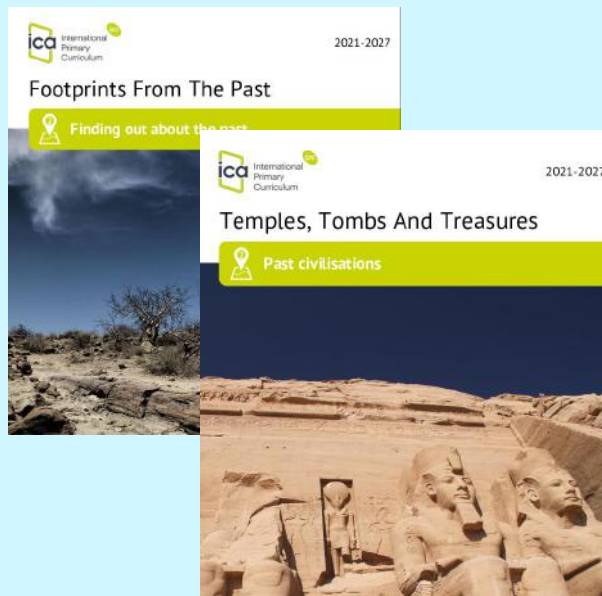

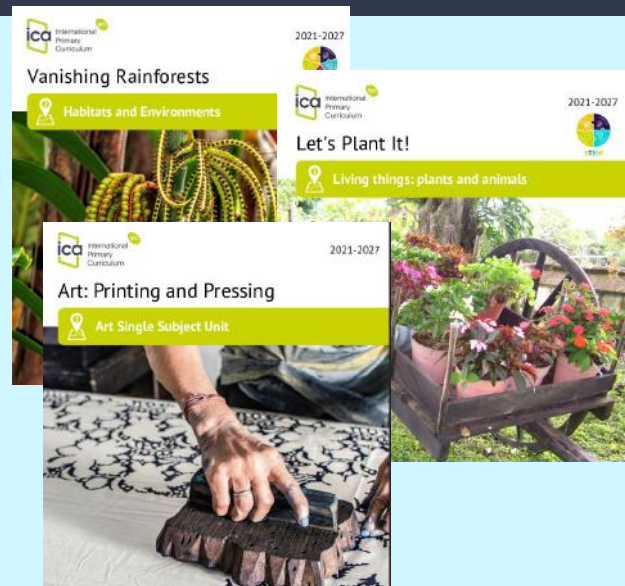

Re: Museum Visit - Children Discovery Museum

Dear Year 3 Parents,

We are planning to take the Year 3 pupils on a visit to the Children Discovery Museum to explore a range of interactive exhibitions.

This visit will give students the opportunity to experience how a museum works, what exhibitions are, and how museums help us learn about the past and the world around us.

The visit links to our IPC unit *Footprints from the Past*, particularly our learning about dinosaurs, as well as wider themes such as the environment and global issues. Students will have a chance to explore and engage with different exhibits and activities available on that day.

We believe this experience will enhance students' understanding by allowing them to explore learning in a real-world setting. Visiting a museum supports curiosity, inquiry, and meaningful connections to our IPC learning, helping students see how knowledge about the past, the environment, and science is shared beyond the classroom.

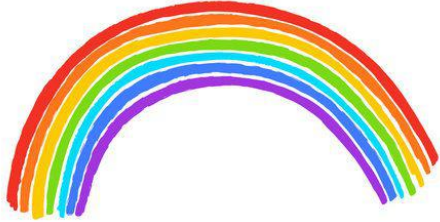

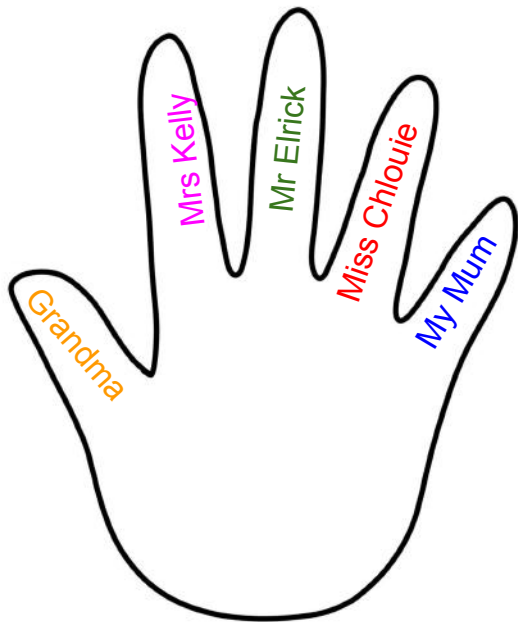
