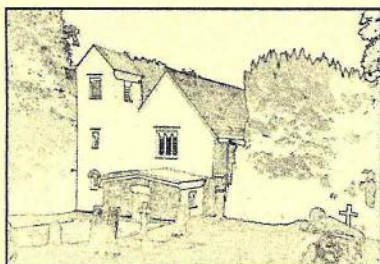
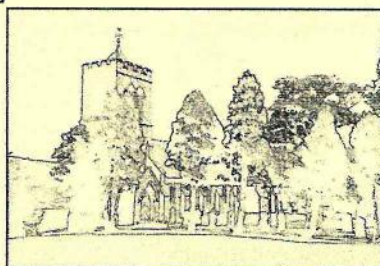

TIME

One of the great joys of living in a rural area is the dawn chorus, the singing of the birds welcoming in the new day – that is, it is a joy when you are not trying to enjoy a lie-in! But interestingly, neither the birds of the air, nor the sheep and cattle of the fields are aware of the time of day. For them, the dawn is the dawn, they do not know the hour or whether the clocks have gone forward or back. Time, the passage of time and the measuring of time is marked by human beings and is important to human beings, because time is an extremely precious commodity for human beings. We are aware of time and we are aware that we have a fixed length of time, traditionally three score years and ten but possibly 80, 90 or for the fortunate, 100 plus.

One popular Bible reading at funerals reflects this importance and awareness of time:

“There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens:

*a time to be born and a time to die,
a time to plant and a time to uproot,
a time to kill and a time to heal,
a time to tear down and a time to build,
a time to weep and a time to laugh...”*

Ecclesiastes 3.1-4

But the author of these famous words also concludes that there is nothing new under the sun; everything has already been done; there is no point to work; no point to pleasure; no point to your legacy; no point to anything – life is meaningless.

How you spend your life, how you spend your precious time is all meaningless...unless you have a relationship with God. If you have a relationship with God then your life, your time has meaning and purpose.

As the dawn breaks earlier and the evenings draw out, we will feel that we have more time, but we don't, it is an illusion. Yes, we have more daylight hours but we do not have more time. So, let us use the time we do have, wisely and meaningfully.

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are continuing in Mark chapter 13
New Living Translation of the Bible - Notes by Matt Rich

14 "The day is coming when you will see the sacrilegious object that causes desecration standing where he should not be." Reader, pay attention! "Then those in Judea must flee to the hills. 15 A person out on the deck of a roof must not go down into the house to pack. 16 A person out in the field must not return even to get a coat. 17 How terrible it will be for pregnant women and for nursing mothers in those days. 18 And pray that your flight will not be in winter. 19 For there will be greater anguish in those days than at any time since God created the world. And it will never be so great again. 20 In fact, unless the Lord shortens that time of calamity, not a single person will survive. But for the sake of his chosen ones he has shortened those days."

21 "Then if anyone tells you, 'Look, here is the Messiah,' or 'There he is,' don't believe it. 22 For false messiahs and false prophets will rise up and perform signs and wonders so as to deceive, if possible, even God's chosen ones. 23 Watch out! I have warned you about this ahead of time!"

Jesus is predicting things that will happen in the future. We don't need to worry about all of the details and exactly what they mean but it is good to focus on the fact that Jesus explained that He won't forget about His chosen ones, ie those that follow Him. No matter how bad things get, Jesus' focus will stay on doing what is best for those who love Him.

We need to be careful who we follow. Just because someone says this is what Jesus is like, or this is what He did - doesn't mean they are telling the truth. The only way we know that a church or group or person is following the real Jesus is if they are following what the Bible says about Him. Many religions have Jesus in them but only one of these talks about the real Jesus, Whom we need to worship and follow - the Jesus Who died on a cross for us, the Jesus Who offers us a free undeserved gift of forgiveness to rescue us and help us.

24 "At that time, after the anguish of those days, the sun will be darkened, the moon will give no light, 25 the stars will fall from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken." 26 Then everyone will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds with great power and glory. 27 And he will send out his angels to gather his chosen ones from all over the world - from the farthest ends of the earth and heaven.

28 "Now learn a lesson from the fig tree. When its branches bud and its leaves begin to sprout, you know that summer is near. 29 In the same way, when you see all these things taking place, you can know that his return is very near, right at the door. 30 I tell you the truth, this generation will not pass from the scene before all these things take place. 31 Heaven and earth will disappear, but my words will never disappear.

32 "However, no one knows the day or hour when these things will happen, not even the angels in heaven or the Son himself. Only the Father knows. 33 And since you don't know when that time will come, be on guard! Stay alert!

At the very end of the world Jesus, the Son of Man, will come back to the earth as a King and Ruler. The first time Jesus came to this earth He was here as a servant and rescuer but this next time He will come with great power and glory! He will save and rescue those that have chosen to follow Him. There will be people that have become Christians (Christ followers) from all over the world! When this was written there were only a few believers and they were all in the middle east, but Jesus knew that people would follow Him from all over the world. Jesus knows about the future, He knows about your future. He will gather everybody who believes in Him - will you be one of them?

Jesus told us that we can rely on His words. We think of the ground beneath our feet as being sure and certain, fixed and unchanging, as something that will always be here but Jesus wants us to know that His words (which we read in His Bible) are more permanent than even the earth beneath our feet. This means that what He has promised He will do. You can trust and rely on everything Jesus says about how much He loves you and cares about you - it is a truth that is fixed and is permanent.

We know that one day the end of the world will happen, it is something that God has promised. But we don't know when the end of the world will be. Jesus wants us all to live alert and on guard - always ready - knowing that the comforts and struggles we have in this world are just a passing thing.

The daffodils on "The Triangle" have put on a much better show this year, they seem to be multiplying, and both champions and yellow rattle are coming through. There is also a good showing of wild plants in the area between the trees and the track, hopefully many of these will flower soon. A number of wild plants have been put in along the side of the track and Rob Dove has planted some water avens in the wet area. Unfortunately the area along the edge of the track has been damaged on at least three occasions by cars driving off the track, and becoming stuck in the wet ground.

Cumbria Highways have repaired the culvert under the Coniston road but "The Well" is still not draining properly. When the ground dries up we will need to replace the section of drain between the well and the road.
